

PARENT CONSENT TO TREAT

Blanket Consent Form for Health Care Services for Minor Children

Providing blanket consent is optional and may, instead, be given on a case-by-case basis.

Consent to Treat
Policy 3500F

In accordance with Idaho Code 32-1015, the McCall-Donnelly School District (MDSD) requires parents or guardian consent for health care services provided to students under the age of 18, except in emergency situations where consent cannot be obtained. In the school setting, health care services include:

- Treatment of minor injuries: Cuts, scrapes, bruises, and sprains.
- Management of minor illnesses: Headaches, stomachaches, colds, and fevers.
- First aid: Basic first aid for various minor health issues.

I hereby consent to the treatment and screening of my minor child by a designated staff member of the MDSD while on or adjacent to any school grounds, including sanctioned activities, trips, and events. This consent is valid until revoked in writing by the parent or guardian. Please note, if consent to treat is not given, but your child experiences a life-threatening emergency, the MDSD staff may administer emergency services (e.g., CPR, epinephrine for anaphylaxis, or naloxone for possible opioid overdose). The consent does not extend to the administration of vaccines, immunizations, or treatments related to sexual activity (e.g., STI's pregnancy).

Dear Parent or guardian,

The purpose of this form and policy 3500 on Student Health/Physical Screenings/Examinations is to provide notice of all health services offered or made available through the school by the District or by any private organizations and to provide notice of the District's policy on physical examinations and screening of students and to obtain parent/guardian consent for these services.

The District will provide, under reasonable circumstances, nonemergency first aid services to a



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child appearing or representing to be sick or injured, such as dressing minor wounds, applying topical agents, providing fluids or ice, and performing checks to identify minor illnesses.

The District may also provide health care services without parent/guardian consent if District staff reasonably determines that a medical emergency exists and:

1. Furnishing the health care service is necessary to prevent death or address a serious bodily harm to the minor child; or
2. District staff can't contact the parent/guardian despite a reasonably diligent effort, and the health care service is furnished to prevent loss of life or serious physical illness or injury to the minor child.

The District will provide the following additional health services or examinations which can only be provided with parental permission or in the event of an emergency as described above:

<u>Administering or assisting with the administration of medication as described in Policy 3510</u>
