

**FPC Allen Campus
Board Report
August 2026**

- The Allen Campus wrapped up another successful season of Kid's College at the end of July. Over the course of June and July, the program offered 40 classes and served 297 children from the Perryton area and surrounding communities. The wide variety of classes provided students with opportunities to learn, explore new interests, build skills, and have fun in an engaging college environment. A special kudos to Rene Schwalk, Nancy Angeles, and Yadira Ontiveros for their hard work, organization, and dedication in coordinating and supporting this year's Kid's College activities.
- The team hosted the annual Pathways Pulled Pork and Silent Auction fundraiser on June 23rd, bringing together community members, local supporters, and college friends in support of student scholarships. The event was truly a community-wide effort, with local supporters providing the meal, preparing and cooking the pork, and generously donating all the silent auction items. Thanks to the tremendous generosity and support of the community, \$6,000 was raised in just two hours for the Pathways Scholarship Fund. This annual event continues to demonstrate the strong partnership between Frank Phillips College and the Perryton community and the community's commitment to helping local students pursue their educational goals.
- Borger hosted the Annual TCOLE Advisory Board Training and Annual Meeting on July 8th. Each year, the board rotates the location of the annual meeting and training, providing an opportunity to engage with law enforcement officers and community partners throughout the region. During this year's meeting, the board nominated and appointed Chairman Derrin Ginter and board members for the 2026–27 year and completed the required TCOLE training for all advisory board members. The meeting was also well attended, with more than 25 law enforcement officers and community members participating.
- All Perryton facilities and departments participated in an Open House on July 20th from 5:00–7:00 p.m. Faculty and staff welcomed students and families, provided campus tours, answered questions, and assisted with ApplyTexas and FAFSA applications. It was a great opportunity to connect with our community, showcase the resources available at Frank Phillips College, and help students take the next step toward their educational goals.
- The Perryton CDL Department closed out the year with 93 students attending, including 57 CDL students, 21 bus drivers, 2 students completing restriction removals, and 13 students completing hazardous materials training. The continued demand for these programs demonstrates the important role the CDL Department plays in meeting the transportation and workforce needs of the Perryton community and surrounding area.
