

FPC Rahll Campus Board Report August 2026

- Christy attended a virtual meeting for the Windham School District, the PEP program. FPC staff has assisted in the Prison Education Program, and we have around 50 students who have been approved to participate in the program. The students have completed applications and necessary paperwork along with taking the ELAR TSI exam. The students performed very well on the exam. FPC will offer BCIS and FYIS for the upcoming semester. We will administer the TSI Math this semester to prepare for next semester when we plan to offer Math, Speech, and History. The courses the students will take depend on their TSI exams.
- Dimmitt ISD reached out to Christy to inquire about FPC offering the Agriculture Pathway for their new P-Tech Program. AC will continue to offer all academic courses for Dimmitt High School; however, they do not offer Ag classes. I met with Mary and Kamron regarding this request. Courtney and Christy traveled to Dimmitt on July 29th to attend a parent/student P-Tech meeting. We also met with Amarillo College and the P-Tech staff. Christy has collaborated with the same regional director that is serving the needs of Dimmitt the past few years in Hartley. Christy met with Mary and the school counselor to develop a course rotation. They will begin classes this fall. They are starting only with 9th grade and a few 10th grade students this year. The program will increase in the number of students each year.
- Christy attended the TCOLE Annual meeting and Training in Borger on July 8th.
- We hosted an Area Student Council Leadership training event as well as a 4-H Leadership event.
- Dallam Hartley Counties Hospital District assisted with our Community Phlebotomy event. We had around 80 members of the community volunteer to help our students with their required “sticks.”
- Hilmar, UP, and DHCHD have held CE classes on campus this summer.
- Community Connect was a tremendous success this summer. We served around 425 students throughout the summer and offered 38 different camps.
- Courtney and Christy attended the Emergency Management meeting in preparation for XIT.
- We have both GED and ESL classes scheduled to begin August 24th.
- EMT Basic classes will begin on August 18th. We have a full class of 12 students. The students will attend class at the campus of their choice.
- The Dalhart EDC Director proposed a grant to purchase two Virtual Welding training devices plus a tv to display the students’ work as they are welding. Christy met with the EDC on August 4th, and they approved the grant proposal to move forward to the City Council.
- The welding students have been remarkably busy this summer completing various projects for our community. We are proud of their dedication to giving back to others in the surrounding area.
- Christy met with local counselors regarding fall enrollment, required documentation, and enroll students. Dual Credit enrollment has increased for the upcoming year.
- Rahll Campus staff participated in the XIT Parade.
- Fall registration is going well and we have multiple CE courses planned for the upcoming semester.
