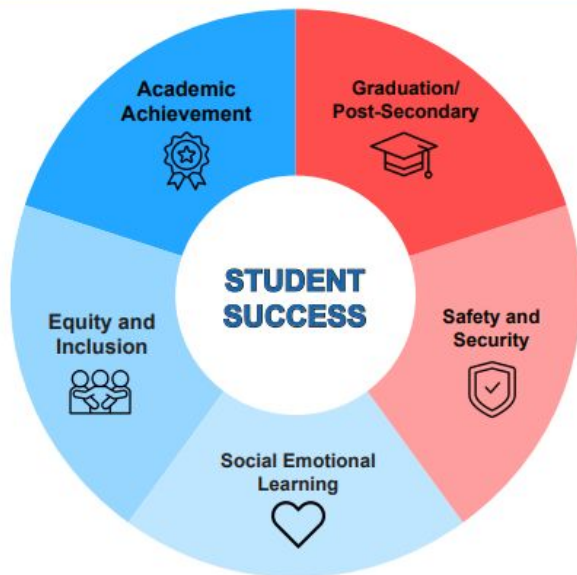

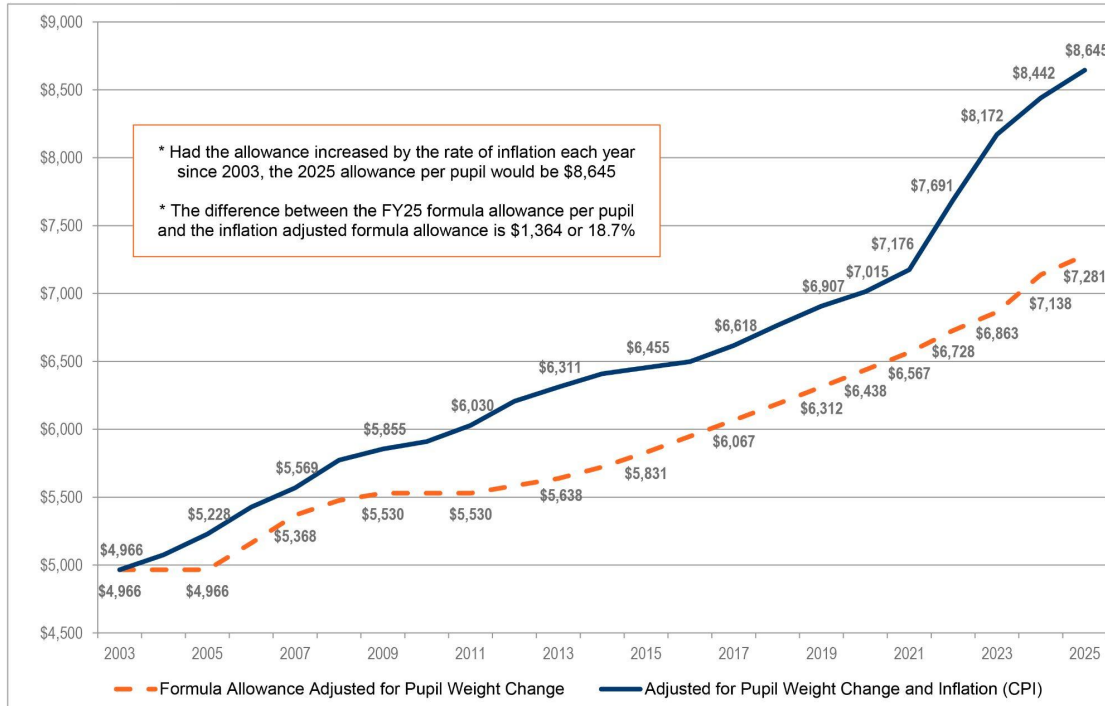

General Education Formula Allowance, 2003-2025 Adjusted for Pupil Weight Change and Inflation (CPI)

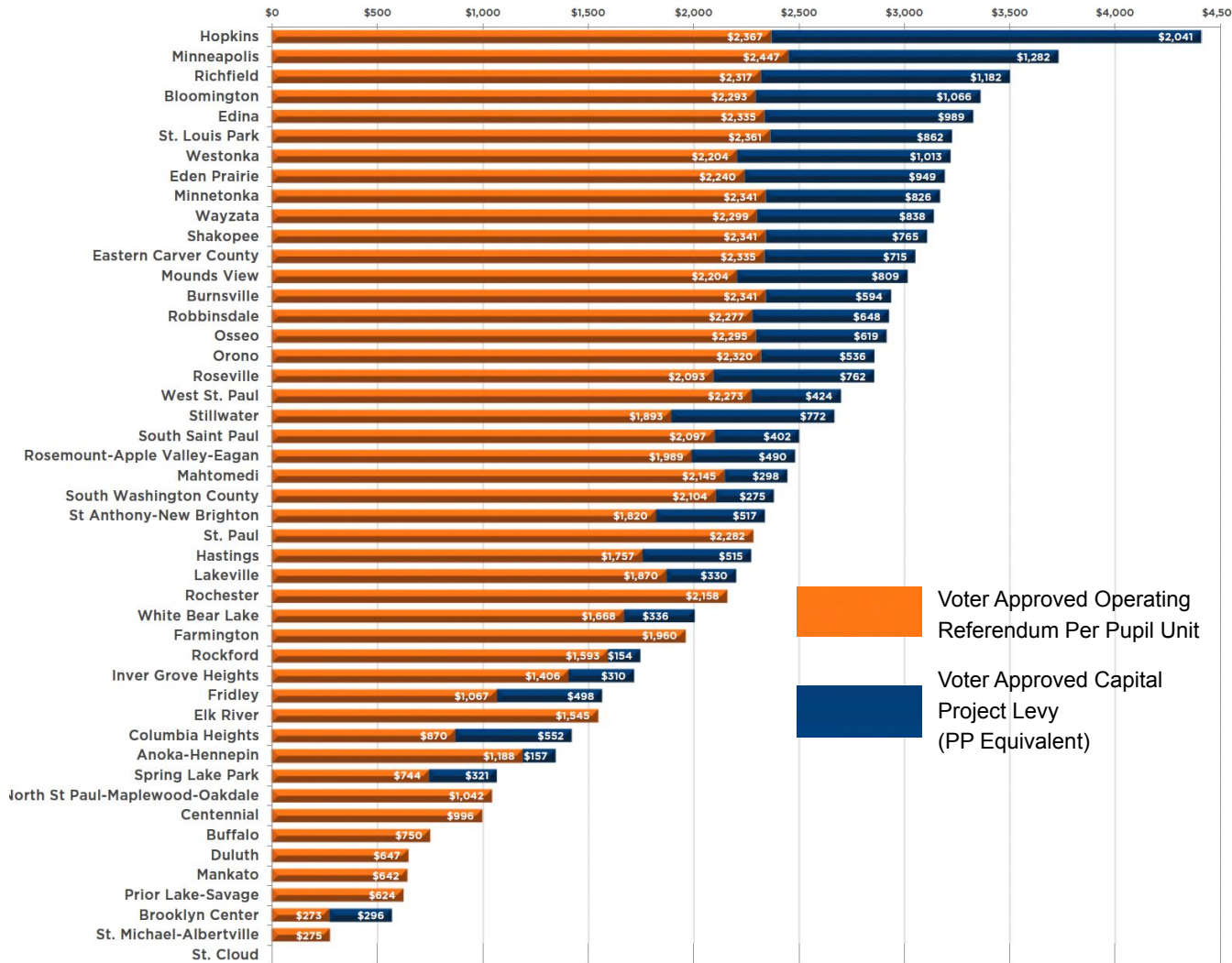

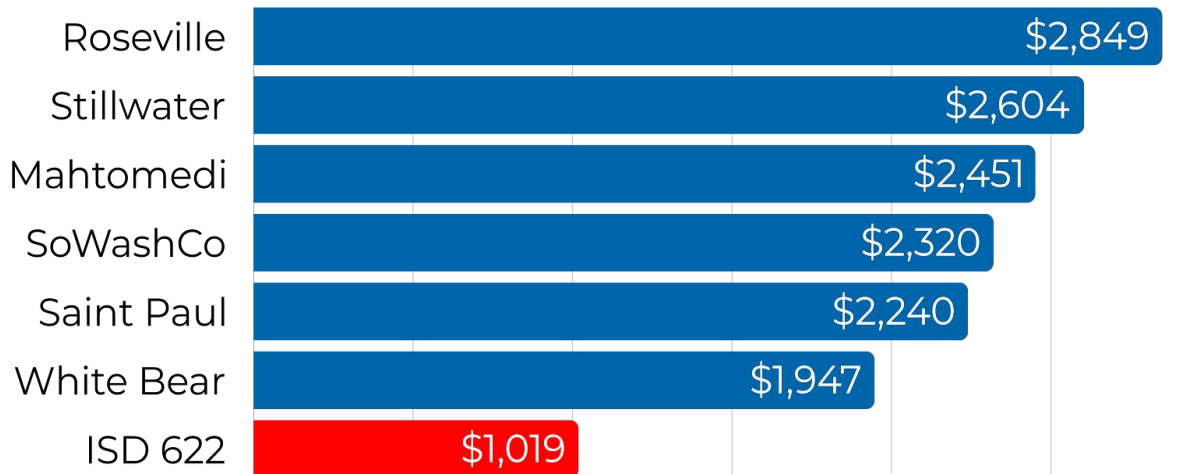


Current Voter Approved Authority Per Pupil 2026

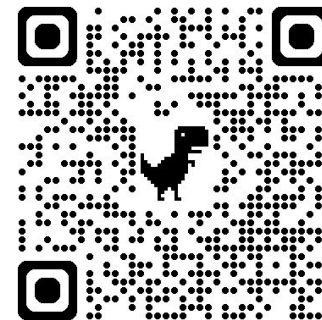

School District Question 1 Approval of School District Referendum Revenue Authorization

The school board of Independent School District No. 622 (North St. Paul-Maplewood-Oakdale) has proposed to increase its general education revenue by \$800 per pupil. The proposed referendum revenue authorization would be applicable for ten years beginning with taxes payable in 2027, and increase each year by the rate of inflation beginning with taxes payable in 2028, unless otherwise revoked or reduced as provided by law.
