



Cannon Valley Special Education Cooperative E-learning Plan: 2026-2027

E-learning days allow students to continue their learning outside of the traditional classroom. E-learning days provide a positive opportunity to approach learning in a different setting **when Minnesota weather requires schools to close**. As part of the E-learning process, students will be given the necessary resources for each class/subject in order to successfully complete their learning. Lessons created by teachers through E-learning will expand and/or build upon lessons that have already happened in the classroom.

Expectations for an E-learning Day:

- Students will be notified of an E-learning day at least 2 hours before school starts through the district-wide messaging system, JMC.
- Assignments and/or lessons will be online via E-learning materials or emailed by 8:30 AM. Lessons will be specific to the class/subject area. Teachers will avoid “busy work” and instead will focus on enrichment activities, review, and/or activities that can be completed independently by the student.
- Teachers are responsible for reporting student attendance by 11:00 AM. Attendance will be taken by the teacher/case manager via email, text, phone call, or by receiving completed assignments. Students/parents/guardians will contact their teachers for attendance purposes. Teachers are available for student/guardian questions via TalkingPoints, texting, or email during the E-learning day. Teachers will be available from 7:30 AM - 3:30 PM.
- Accommodations for students without internet access will be addressed on an individual basis before the start of the school year. In most cases, there will be a set standard for what is expected from students without access.
- Students with an Individual Education Plan will follow lessons provided by their teachers and will be accommodated and modified as required.

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● Parents/guardians or students will email/text the teacher to verify attendance. Attendance can also be confirmed by returning completed work. ● Teachers will be available during the students’ normally scheduled class periods through email, text, and virtual classroom. ● Teachers will provide a virtual classroom with online assignments. ● As an alternative, teachers will provide an E-learning folder with independent practice activities for students to take home.	● Parents/guardians will email/text the teacher to verify attendance. Attendance can also be confirmed by returning completed work. ● Teachers will be available during the students’ normally scheduled class periods. ● Teachers will communicate with parents/guardians to schedule a virtual meeting. ● Teachers will provide an E-learning folder with independent practice activities for students to take home.
