Nutrition –

Program Staffing & Leadership

Chartwells is continuing to onboard new Child Nutrition team members to support consistent and efficient meal service across the district. A new Director has also been hired for the Food Service Management Company (FSMC), providing additional leadership and support for the program.

Technology – The team has been working hard to serve the district and keep up with work orders as we enter our busy season. We currently have 25 open work orders. We are receiving good feedback from teachers regarding the new MacBooks. We are starting a new intern this week from Jim Thorpe Academy. We will have her assist with student devices, new device setups, and other projects as needed. We have Iron Scales officially up and running as part of our E-Rate funded, three-year cybersecurity pilot program. This will help prevent and detect phishing attempts across the district and, hopefully, reduce the number of compromised accounts.

Maintenance/Construction –Stucker construction is going well. Utilities are being run to the dome and the wrestling area. Sequoyah is coming to a close. We are shooting to be complete with all punch items by the end of September. Maintenance staff completed 188 out of 275 new work orders and 29 previous tickets. They averaged a 2.7 day response time with a 4.2 day resolution time. Maintenance Staff have completed several projects that include assisting with the Sequoyah remodel, finding and repairing a large gas leak at the high school, and finding and repairing a large water leak under the middle school. With the summer heat and an extreme heat wave we have worked on 50+ HVAC units and refrigeration units.
