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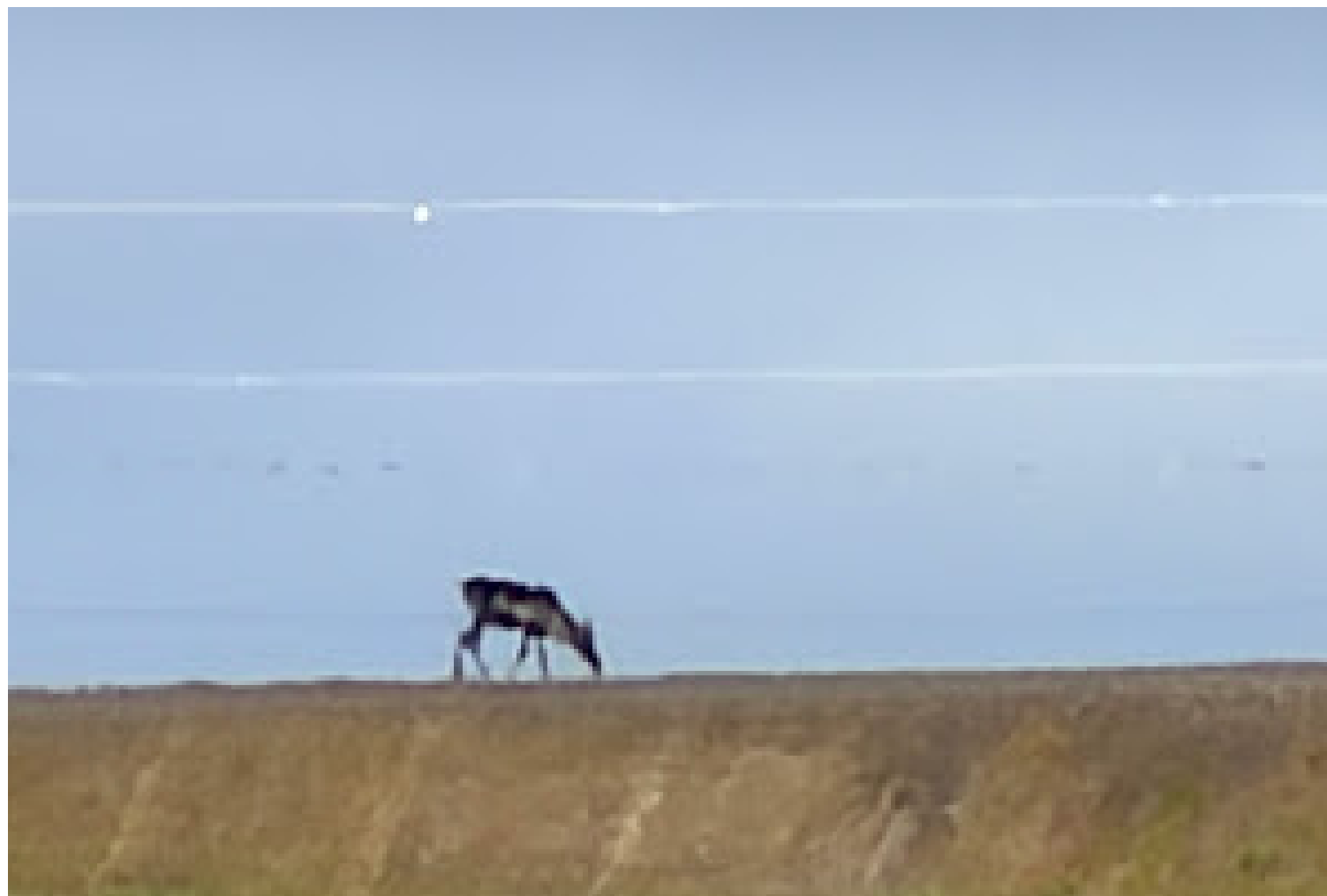
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Classrooms on the Nuna: Future

Ipalook and Kiita will collaborate to host spring camps, while Meade River School will continue its Ice Fishing Camp and Niglik Camp in the spring. Alak School will also explore opportunities to develop additional camps during the coming school year.
- Looking ahead, **Point Lay will be offered the opportunity to participate in COTN during the 2027–2028 school year**, continuing the expansion of this districtwide initiative.
