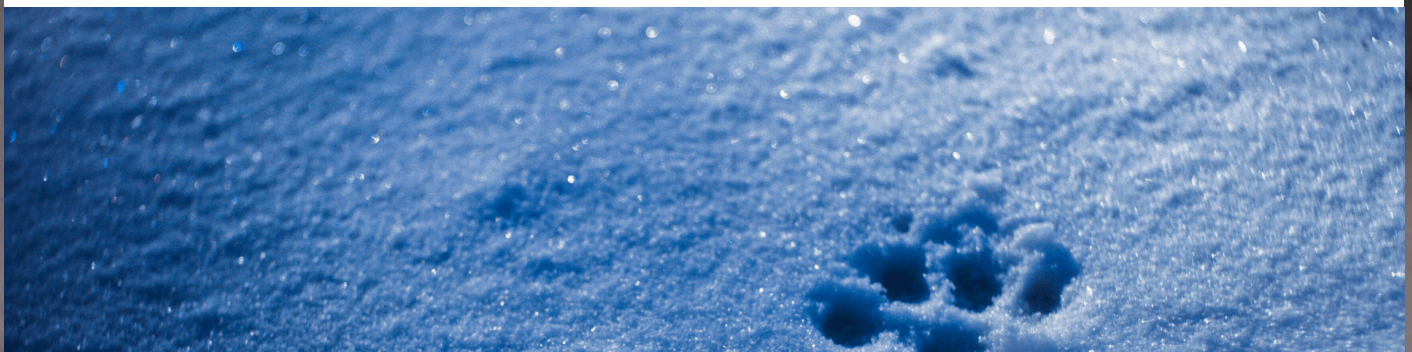

sun warms the earth. The rotation of the earth creates night and day. The weather and seasons affect our clothing choices.

**Math, science, social studies**

In math, science, and social studies we will be learning, a cycle is a repeating pattern. Patterns can be represented in a circle or in a line. Patterns can be coded (classified and described) by the order of their elements, such as AB, ABB, and ABC. Lastly, we will continue learning how to have honor, doing the right thing, being honest, and showing others they matter.

**Literacy**

In literacy we will be learning, words can be separated into two parts (onset and rime) and blended back together. Sentences begin with an uppercase letter and end with a punctuation mark. Each letter of the alphabet has a unique name, sound, and shape. Words can be classified into groups.

# 1st Grade

## Math

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encouraged to consider charitable giving as an option for using their money, time, and resources.

Students will apply financial literacy vocabulary to word problems. They will use strategies they have learned to help them practice comparing numbers and finding missing parts and wholes.

Students will be provided more time to practice the various problem types and to learn to persevere in problem solving. We will finish the week with our Module 6 assessment.

Vocabulary: giving and charity

### Reading

We will be completing our unit 11 as an introduction to adventure stories set around the world and challenge students to dig into the adventures through research. By listening to the read-alouds and trade books, students will be able to increase their vocabulary and reading comprehension skills, learn valuable lessons about perseverance and teamwork, and become familiar with gathering information for research. They continue to make connections to personal experiences, ideas in other texts, and society with adult assistance. They also continue to use text evidence to support our answers. We will be able to describe plot elements, including the main events, the problem, and the resolution, for texts read aloud and independently and discuss the author's purpose for writing the text.

Vocabulary: adapt (to change to adjust to a situation)

### Skills

We will continue with unit 7 in skills. Students will continue to expand sentences using the decodable junctions and, but, so, and or. They will review adding inflectional endings -ed and -ing to root words and review doubling the final consonant in words with short vowel sounds when adding inflectional endings. Students will continue to use commas to separate words in a series and be able to insert commas between words in printed sentences. We will decode words with /oe/ as in 'o\_e' as in home and 'oa' as in boat. Students will continue to read from their new reader that incorporates Grade 1 history and geography topics from our curriculum. Each story has a set of discussion questions that we will discuss orally, but students are encouraged to answer the questions in complete sentences.

### Science:

We will continue with topic 7 about animals. Students will be able to record observations of and describe basic life cycles of animals, including a bird, a mammal, and a fish.

Vocabulary: adult, life cycle, mammal, and stage

## 2nd Grade

2nd grade will be completing their iReady End of Year Assessments in Reading and Math this week.

In Skills we continue to working on writing paragraphs. Students will read a paragraph and label the

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Of 1012, by answering literal questions about key details in the text and will brainstorm additional questions about the topic.

Things to practice at home: reading a book and writing with your student's class spelling words.

In Math we will apply fractions to tell time. Students will construct a paper clock by partitioning a circle into halves and quarters, and tell time to the half hour or quarter hour. We will tell time to the nearest five minutes and relate a.m. and p.m. to time of day. Things to practice at home: homework pages in the Succeed homework book. Vocabulary this week: quarter past, quarter to, half past.

In Social Studies we will explain the choices people can make about earning, spending, and saving money and identify ways in which people are both producers and consumers. In Science we will record and compare how the structures and behaviors of animals help them find and take in food, water, and air. We will also investigate and describe some of the unique life cycles of animals where young animals do not resemble their parents, including butterflies and frogs.

## 3rd Grade

This week in Reading, we will finish up our unit on Native Americans. We will read about Native Americans in all of the different regions. In addition, we will read historical fiction. We will use our text to identify key ideas, cause and effect relationships, and use vocabulary in our writing. We will also identify plot elements in our stories and describe characters. In Math, we will conclude our unit on Geometry and Measurement. Then, we will move into fourth grade foundational skills. In Science, we will be continuing our study of ecosystems, organisms, and plant structures. In Social Studies, we will review map skills and cardinal directions. It's going to be a great week in third grade!

## 4th Grade

This week in ELAR, students will work on their memory books by writing personal reflections, adding meaningful details, and practicing strong writing skills to bring their memories to life! In Social Studies, students will explore the impact of World War II on Texans, learning how the war changed life in Texas economically, socially, and politically.

In Math, students will strengthen their understanding of 4th-grade financial literacy concepts by practicing real-world money skills such as budgeting, saving, and making thoughtful spending decisions.

In Science, they will continue with activities to explore and learn about natural resources.

## 5th Grade

ELA – Students are diving into our biography research project! They are learning how to research using reliable, non-biased sources, gather important information, take organized notes, and turn

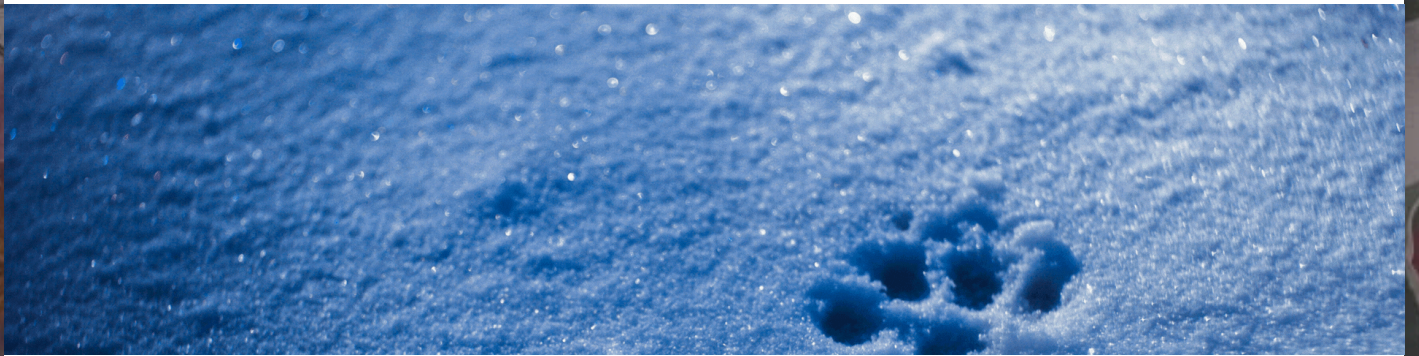
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about inspiring people from history and today.

Math – We are reviewing important 5th grade skills from throughout the year, including multiplying decimals, calculating volume, division strategies, and decimal division. Students are sharpening their problem-solving skills and building confidence as they prepare for middle school math concepts.

Science – Students are continuing project-based learning within individual classrooms, using creativity, teamwork, critical thinking, and hands-on investigations to explore scientific concepts in exciting ways!

## What's Happening

### Hi JES Families!

This month, we are focusing on **perseverance!**

**Perseverance** means continuing to try, even when something is difficult or doesn't go as planned. It's about not giving up, learning from mistakes, and putting in effort to reach a goal. It looks like sticking with a tough assignment, practicing a new skill, and trying again after a setback.

As we move through May, practicing **perseverance** helps students build confidence and resilience. When children learn to keep going, even when things are hard, they develop problem-solving skills and a strong belief in themselves.

We're excited for the growth ahead this month and look forward to supporting our JES students as they practice **perseverance** in their daily learning and interactions at school and at home!

## Perseverance at Home

### Model It!

Show perseverance in everyday situations by working through challenges instead of giving up. Let your child hear you say things like, "This is really hard, but I'm going to keep trying," or "I didn't get it right the first time, so I'll try again." When children see adults push through difficulties, they learn how to do the same.

### Encourage It!

Notice and praise your child's effort, not just the outcome. Highlight moments when they keep trying, practice patience, or bounce back after a mistake. Encourage them to take small steps toward a goal and remind them that progress takes time.

### Talk About It!

- "What is something that feels hard for you right now?"
- "What can you do if something doesn't work the first time?"
- "Why is it important to keep trying, even when something is difficult?"

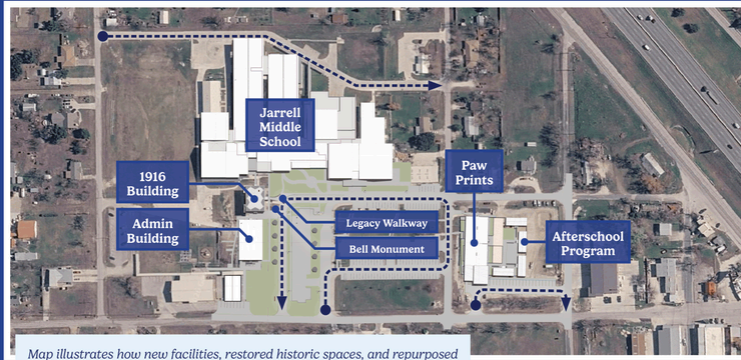

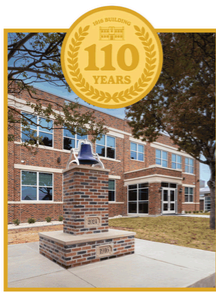
#### THE FINAL STEPS OF A BIGGER PICTURE

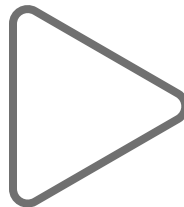

To ensure that children continue receiving delicious and nutritious meals throughout the summer, Jarrell ISD in partnership with the district's child nutrition provider, SFE, will offer its annual free summer meals program. The free meals are made possible through the federally funded Summer Food Service Program.

Participating families do not have to apply, register or provide identification. The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) funds the Summer Meals Program – including the Summer Food Service Program (SFSP) and the Seamless Summer Option (SSO).

Starting May 25 through June 25, children up to age 18 and adults with special needs up to age 21 can receive complimentary breakfast and lunch. Meals will be served Monday through Thursday.
