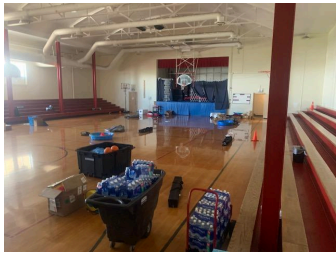
June 2026 Board Report

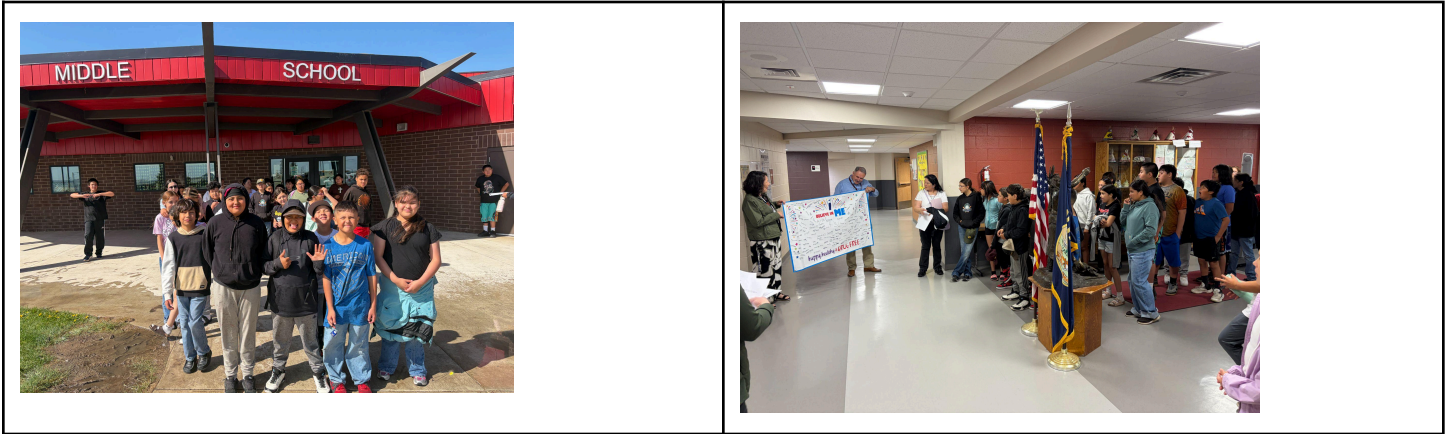
Aimsweb Testing

Aimsweb testing is completed! Fourth grade showed huge growth in Math with Tier 1 increasing from 13% to 28% and decreasing T3 from 73% to 65%. Fifth grade showed great growth in ELA with Tier 1 increasing from 34% to 42%, and Tier 3 decreasing from 46% to 41%. Fifth grade Math data for Tier 1 showed an increase from 26% to 33%, and a decrease in Tier 3 from 58% to 53%.
