<p><b>Basic information:</b></p> <p>The administration is asking the Board to approve an agreement with Community Solar pending legal review and approval.</p>
<p><b>Background or historical information:</b></p> <p>A community solar project is a shared, large-scale solar energy system in which multiple customers, such as individuals, businesses, and nonprofits, can subscribe to receive credits on their electricity bills for the power generated by the shared solar array. Unlike traditional solar that requires installation on one's own property, community solar makes clean energy accessible to everyone, including renters and low-to-moderate income households for whom rooftop solar is not an option. Participants receive bill credits for their share of the solar energy produced, providing financial and environmental benefits without installing panels on their homes.</p> <p><b>How it Works</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Shared Solar Array: A central solar farm is built to serve multiple customers in a geographic area.</li> <li>2. Subscription: Participants subscribe to a "share" of the solar system's output over a specific period.</li> <li>3. Bill Credits: The electricity generated by the shared array provides credits on the subscribers' monthly electricity bills, reducing their overall costs.</li> <li>4. Billing: The community solar farm then bills the district for 90% of what was credited, resulting in a savings of 10%. For District 33, this is estimated to be about \$38,000 per year.</li> </ol>
