5421 - **GRADING**

Grading systems shall be designed to report to parents the progress of their children. The system used shall report the student's achievement.

The School District shall not discriminate in the methods, practices, and materials used for evaluating students on the basis of sex, race, national origin, ancestry, creed, pregnancy, marital or parental status, sexual orientation or physical, mental, emotional or learning disability. Discrimination complaints shall be processed in accordance with established procedures.

Un-Weighted Course Grading Scale

Letter grades for un-weighted courses are assigned the following "grade point" values:

A+	=4.0				
A	=4.0	B-	=2.67	D+	=1.33
A-	=3.67	C+	=2.33	D	=1.0
B+	=3.33	C	=2.0	D-	=0.67
B	=3.0	C-	=1.67	F	=0

Weighted Course Grading Scale:

Letter grades for ~~college level course work and/or~~ advanced placement courses are assigned the following "grade point" values:

A+	= 5.0				
A	= 5.0	B-	= 3.67	D+	= 2.33
A-	= 4.67	C+	= 3.33	D	= 2.0
B+	= 4.33	C	= 3.0	D-	= 1.67
B	= 4.0	C-	= 2.67	F	= 0

Credits

A high school credit is based on successful completion of a course taken the entire school year for one period. A half (.5) credit is based on successful completion of a course taken for one semester of the school year for one period. Variations of this format are allowed for correspondence and Internet classes. College level course work and/or advanced placement classes are based on the same formula.

Student Academic Performance

"Grade Point Average" (GPA) will be used as a means of rating students' over-all performance in high school and to
