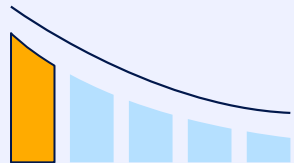
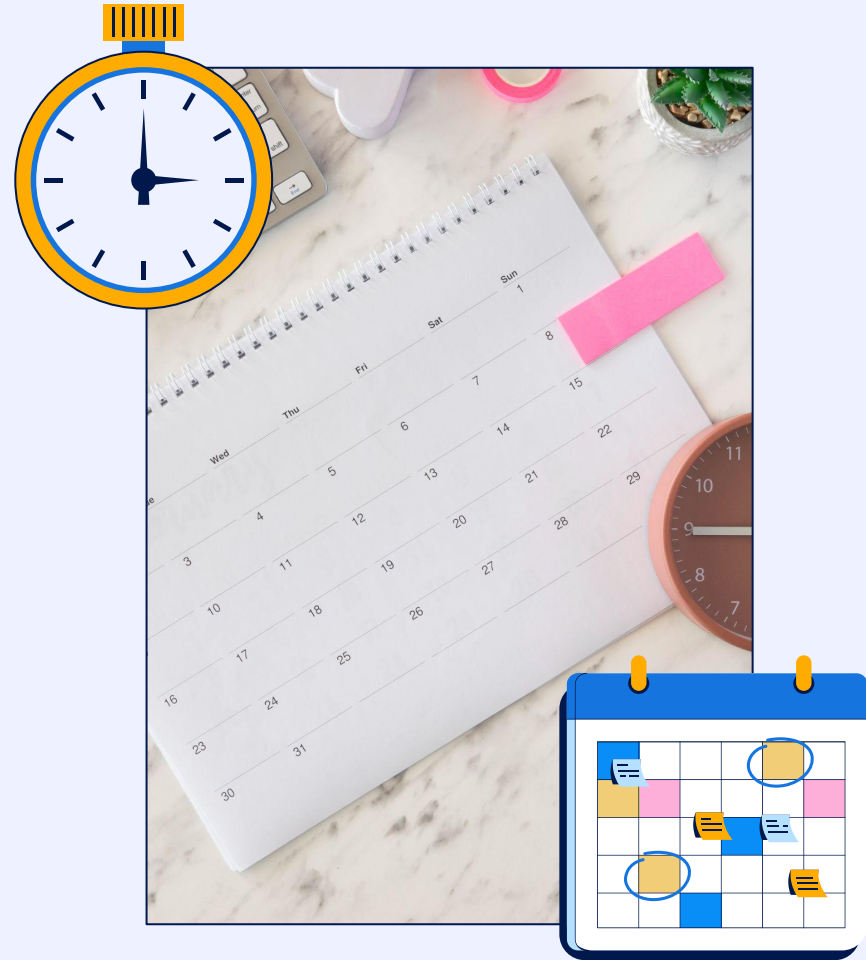
Special Education Evaluation Timelines



The Law

IDEA Sec. 300.301(C)(1)

- (i) Must be conducted within 60 days of receiving parental consent for the evaluation; or
- (ii) If the State establishes a timeframe within which the evaluation must be conducted, within that time frame;

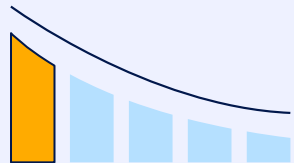
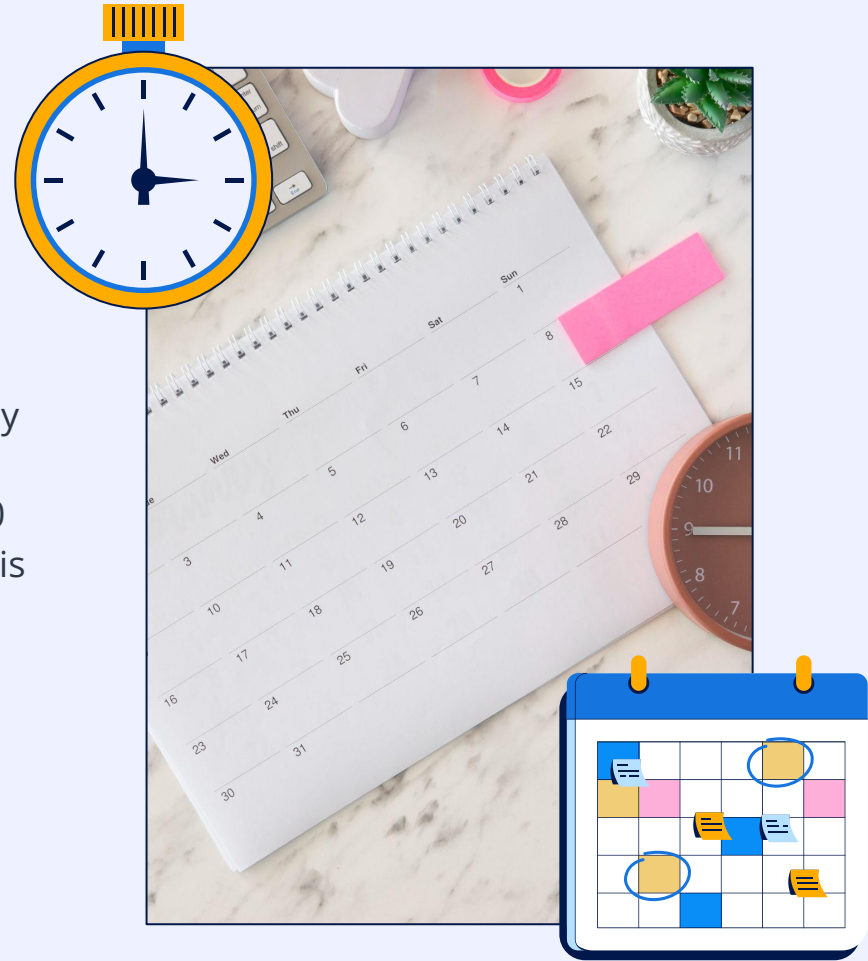


The Law

NAC § 388.37

1. Except as otherwise provided by subsections 2 and 3, when a public agency determines that good cause exists to evaluate a pupil pursuant to NAC 388.330 to 388.440, inclusive, and section 10 of this regulation, it shall conduct the initial evaluation within:

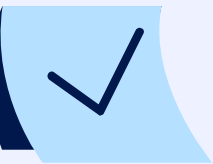
- (a) **Forty-five school days** after the parent provides informed written consent;

Once a Local Education Agency (LEA) suspects a disability, it must promptly seek parental consent.

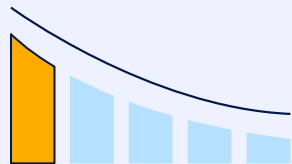
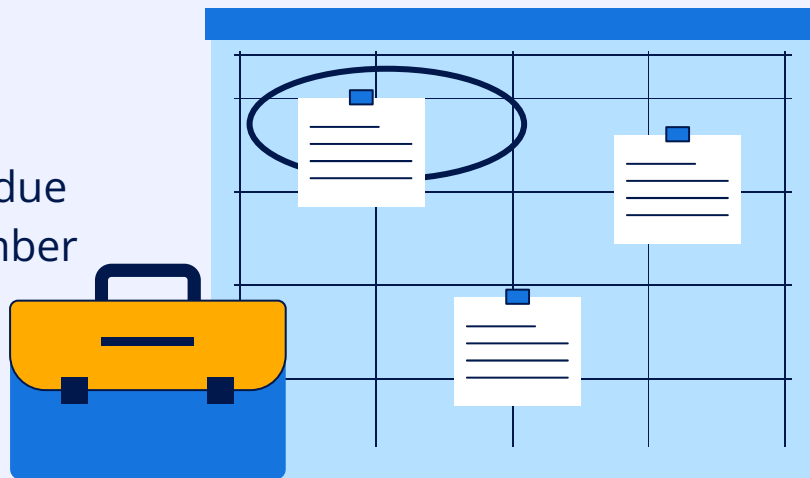
Special Education Waitlists

We do have a testing log for Early Childhood Special Education (ECSE).

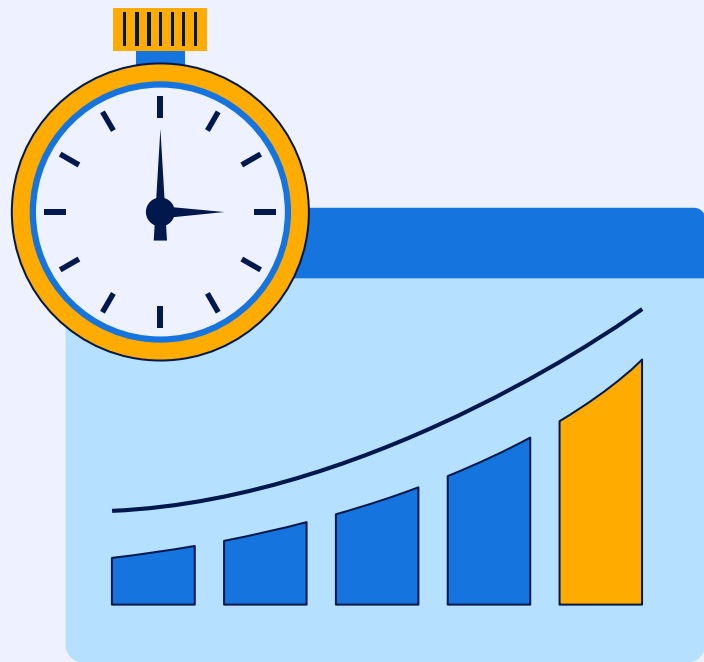
Currently in the remote rural areas:
