PARENT ENGAGEMENT, RESPONSIBILITIES, AND RIGHTS:

Education succeeds best when there is a strong partnership between home, school, and community. A partnership that thrives on communication. Parents are partners with teachers, administrators, and the Board and are encouraged to:

- ❖ Encourage your child to put a high priority on education and commit to making the most of the educational opportunities provided.
- ❖ Attend Board meetings to learn more about District and Campus operations, including the procedure for addressing the board when appropriate. Regular board meetings are scheduled for the third Monday of each month at the Union Grove JH/HS Library.
- ❖ Review the information in the Union Grove ISD Student Handbook, including the attached Student Code of Conduct, with your child, and sign and return the acknowledgement form(s). Parents with questions are encouraged to contact the school office.
- ❖ Become familiar with all your child's school activities and with the academic programs offered on the campus. Discuss with the principal any questions, such as concerns about placement, assignment and the options available to your child. Monitor your child's academic progress and contact teachers as needed.
- ❖ Exercise your right to review teaching materials, textbooks, and other aids, and to examine tests that have been administered to your child.
- ❖ Review your child's student records when needed. You may review attendance records, test scores, grades, disciplinary records, counseling records, psychological records, applications for admission, health and immunization information, teacher and counselor evaluations, reports of behavioral patterns, and state assessments administered to your child.
- ❖ Review the annual school report card. Title I campuses and districts must disseminate an annual local education agency report card that includes information on the district and each campus.
- ❖ If an instructional activity in which your child is scheduled to participate interferes with your religious or moral beliefs, you may temporarily remove your child from the classroom. The removal cannot be for the purpose of avoiding a test and may not

extend an entire semester. If your child is removed, your child must satisfy grade-level requirements as determined by the school and by TEA.

- ❖ Become a school volunteer. For further information, contact the specific campus.
 - Volunteer to read to classes.
 - Volunteer to help at morning and afternoon drop-off and pick-up.
 - Sign-up to be a room-parent volunteer to help your student's teacher.
- ❖ Participate in campus parent organizations. For further information, contact the school office.
- ❖ Any student who becomes a victim of a violent criminal offense while on the grounds of the specific campus, the parent is entitled to transfer their child to a safe campus under Legal/Local Policy FDD.
- ❖ As a parent of a student on a Title I designated campus, parents may request, and the LEA must provide information regarding state qualifications of the student's classroom teachers and paraprofessionals providing instructional services to the student.
- ❖ The school district must provide each individual parent timely notice if a student has been assigned or taught for four or more consecutive weeks by a teacher who does not meet state certification or licensure requirements.

Statement of Purpose

In support of strengthening student academic achievement, each school that receives Title I, Part A funds must develop jointly with, agree on with, and distribute to, parents of participating children a school Parent and Family Engagement Plan that contains information required by section 1118(b) of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). Parent and Community Input in Plan Development

Our Campus Improvement Committee, CIC, is comprised of parents, community members, business representatives, teachers, administrators, and staff members. They have the responsibility of annually reviewing and revising this plan. Any changes are shared with the CIC to receive input on this plan on an annual basis. The campus actively recruits volunteers for each of these committees through various forms of publicity. Committee selections provide a diverse group of stakeholders that is representative of the community. Meetings are held at times and locations convenient to all members. CIC meetings are scheduled at different times of the day at 7:30a.m. and 4:00 p.m. to encourage parent participation as much as possible. If a translator is needed, one will be provided when possible. A copy of the Union Grove Elementary and district Parent and Family Engagement Plan is available on the district website.

Parent Engagement Activities to Improve Achievement and School Performance

One of the functions of the Campus Improvement Committee will be to identify means for the campus to create and provide assistance and support for effective parent engagement. The administration will assist the school's staff in understanding the requirements of Title I, Part A

and in planning for effective programs to assist parents in improving academic achievement. Campus assistance may consist of the distribution of informational handouts which explain state academic standards, assessments and curriculum. The district will promote and encourage staff development on establishing effective relationships with parents as a means to increase academic achievement. The campus will host events informing and including parents in the educational processes of their students.

Building Capacities for Strong Parent Engagement

Definition of Title I and Title I Components: Title I provides Federal funding to schools to help students who are low achieving or are most at risk of falling behind academically. Title I funds are allocated to schools based on the percentage, at least 40%, of students that are eligible to receive Free-Reduced lunches. Union Grove Elementary operates under the Title I Schoolwide Program.

A. Annual Parent Meeting

An annual meeting is held to review Title I guidelines and services provided by the elementary campus. Copies of the current Parent and Family Engagement Plan are available at the meeting. Parents are encouraged to become involved in revising and updating the plan as necessary, and parent volunteers are invited to become members of the District and Campus Improvement Committees. These meetings are held at convenient times and locations. These meetings are held at Meet the Teacher and Open House. Notice of the meetings are posted on the district website. If necessary, a translator will be available. The elementary campus will identify and eliminate barriers to effective family engagement. The elementary campus will involve parents in the process of school review and improvement by providing a campus Texas Academic Performance Report, TAPR, Report Card. The elementary campus will communicate and explain the TAPR as well as providing opportunities for parents to participate in district and campus decision making through Site-Based Decision Making-Committee, SBDM.

B. Home/School Compact

In accordance with Title I regulations, the elementary campus has developed a home/school compact which is reviewed annually. The compact explains how students, parents and staff share responsibility for student performance and success. The Elementary Campus Improvement Committee is responsible for reviewing and providing revisions as needed. All parents are given a copy of the compact at an annual Title I meeting which is held on the

elementary campus to discuss the contents at the beginning of the year. Teachers, parents and students are encouraged to discuss the contents of the compact. The compact is also available for parents to review during Union Grove ISD Online Student Registration during the summer break. They are also encouraged to sign that they have received a copy of the compact.

C. Staff/Parent Communication

Parents are informed of school activities through a variety of different means of communication throughout the school year. Newsletters, conferences, notices on the district website, articles in the local newspaper, personal contacts, emails by principal(s) and teachers through our student data system, and written notices are used to establish and maintain an open line of communication. Staff development includes strategies to promote effective parent engagement activities and to foster two-way communication with parents and the school.

D. Decision Making Opportunities

Union Grove Elementary School will engage parents and encourage participation in decision-making by administering and then reviewing a Parent Satisfaction Survey. The campus will identify and eliminate barriers to effective family engagement. The district will involve parents in the process of school review and improvement by providing a district and campus Texas Academic Performance Report, TAPR, and Report Card. The district will communicate and explain the TAPR as well as providing opportunities for parents to participate in district and campus decision making through Site-Based Decision-making Committees, SBDM.

F. Student Achievement:

Each Union Grove campus provides parents with information on how individual students and student groups enrolled in Union Grove ISD performed on the State of Texas Assessment of Academic Readiness, STAAR/EOC. Instructions on how to access district, campus, and individual student assessment reports are sent to parents via email; and posted on the Union Grove ISD website and Facebook Page.

G. Curriculum and Assessment:

Union Grove ISD's curriculum is based on the Texas Education Agency's Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills, TEKS.

- Pre-K utilizes Frog Street as the core curriculum.
- Kindergarten–2nd Grade use Pearson's Pearlized Math to teach the Math TEKS.

- 3rd–5th Grade use Sharon Wells to teach the Math TEKS.
- 6th Grade uses Maneuvering the Middle to teach the Math TEKS.
- K–5 Reading instruction is based on Bluebonnet Reading to teach the Reading TEKS.
- 6th Grade RLA uses Mirrors and Windows to teach the RLA TEKS.
- K–5 Science uses HMH to teach the Science TEKS.
- 6th Grade Science uses Summit K-12 to teach the Science TEKS.
- K–6 Social Studies uses Studies Weekly to teach the Social Studies TEKS.

Students are assessed using formative and summative assessments throughout the school year. Union Grove ISD employees the use of diagnostic evaluations from NWEA MAP, IXL, mClass, STAAR (grades 3-6), and other student assessments that are designed to show student growth from year to year as well as beginning of the year to end of year growth.

Student Pledge

1. I pledge to come to school on time every-day unless I am ill.

School Pledge

1. We pledge to do all that we can to see that your child has a positive school experience each day.
2. We pledge to notify you of all occurrences that we believe may have contributed to any negative school experience for your child.
3. We pledge to keep parents/guardians informed of student progress on a regular basis by sending home 3 week progress reports, sending home report cards every 9 weeks for grades PK-12 and sending home the results of State assessments annually.
4. We pledge to provide translations of written notifications and interpreters at parent conferences, meetings and training sessions for non-English-speaking parents/guardians as much as possible.
5. We pledge to be available to meet with parents/guardians and students when necessary by providing parents with teacher conference periods at the beginning of school, scheduling at least one Open House event annually, and posting the UGISD contact information on the school's website.
6. We pledge to model the belief that learning is a life-long process that takes place at school and home.
7. We pledge to provide high-quality curriculum and instruction in a supportive and effective learning environment that enables children to demonstrate mastery on all required State assessments by following the State mandated

curriculum; responding to student academic difficulties in a timely, effective manner; hiring only highly-qualified personnel; and providing on-going professional development to instructional personnel.

8. We pledge to do all we can to have parents realize that we have an “open door” policy, and that you are always welcome at Union Grove ISD Schools!
9. Communication with families occurs through a weekly Tuesday note from the office, while important updates are sent via Skyward and Blackboard.
10. Join the PTO to volunteer in your student’s classroom and participate in activities around the school.
