HABITUAL DISCIPLINE PROBLEMS

A student may be declared a habitual disciplinary problem if written documentation exists that:

1. In one school year, the student has threatened or extorted or attempted to threaten or extort another **pupil student** or a teacher or other personnel employed by the school two or more times, or the student has been suspended five times for any reason.
2. The student has not entered into and participated in a plan of behavior.

The student declared a habitual disciplinary problem may be suspended for a period not to exceed one semester, or be expelled under extraordinary circumstances. Pursuant to NRS 392.466, a student declared a habitual disciplinary problem that is expelled or suspended for one semester is required to enroll in a private school, a program of independent study or be homeschooled during that time. The Superintendent/Designee may, for a good cause shown in a particular case, allow a modification to the suspension or expulsion requirement, if such modification is set forth in writing.
