## Operations Reports: April 2026

**During Spring Break**, our facilities team completed a full cleaning and disinfecting of all district buildings, ensuring schools were reset and ready for students and staff.

### **Clackamas River Elementary Library**

We removed large countertops in the library to create a more open and cohesive environment that better supports teaching and learning.

### **High School Maintenance**

The high school dry room kitchen floor was painted in accordance with inspection guidelines to maintain compliance.

### **Grounds Maintenance**

We completed our third round of spraying along fence lines and around building perimeters as part of our ongoing weed control program.

### **School-Based Health Clinic**

Annual maintenance has been completed at the health clinic. This included repairing areas of dry rot, removing a hazardous tree, and clearing debris around the building to improve safety and long-term maintenance.

### **High School Office Project**

Office remodel drawings are currently being finalized. Framing is scheduled to begin on April 18.

### **Stormwater / Bioswale Work**

A cottonwood tree was removed from the Clackamas River Elementary bioswale. The tree's roots had grown into the culvert, contributing to flooding during heavy rain events. This summer, we plan to remove the remaining roots from the culvert to restore proper drainage.

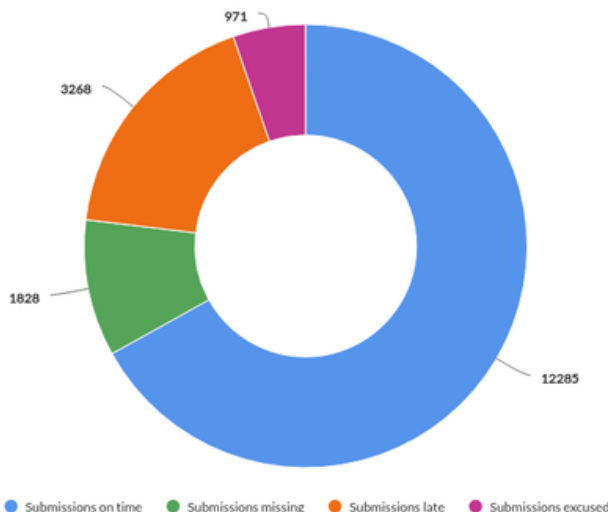
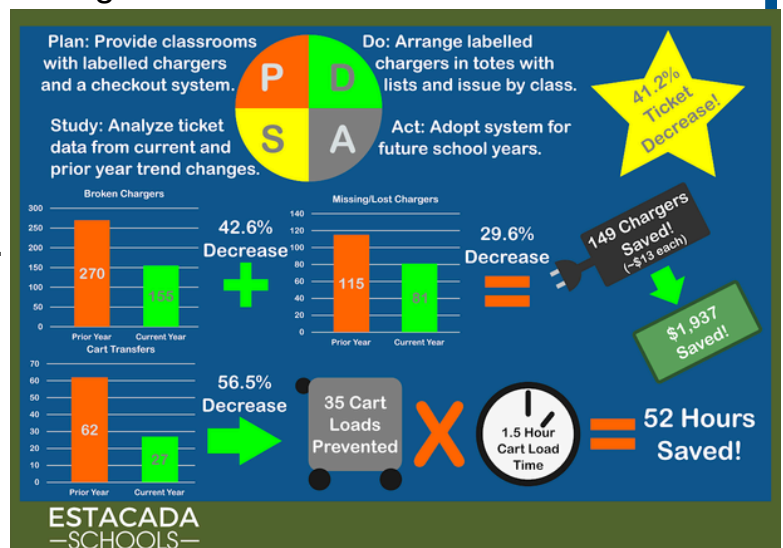


## Technology Department

### 3 Wins:

- A built-in quarantine utility successfully intercepted multiple phishing emails and placed them in quarantine before reaching users' Gmail accounts.
- PDSA cycle to provide classrooms with labeled chargers and a checkout system. Improves student ownership while reducing staff time through better device management.
- Installed two additional security cameras at Estacada High School to enhance campus visibility and overall safety coverage.



### 1 Focus:

- An internally developed application for classroom Chromebooks requires a room code and restricts use to the district network; pilot testing has begun at EHS.

### 2 Things Learned:

- Canvas analytics provides powerful insights into student learning
- Classroom Chromebook sets are occasionally being relocated or used outside their assigned rooms, highlighting the need for improved tracking and monitoring systems.

Lunches Served: 120,170

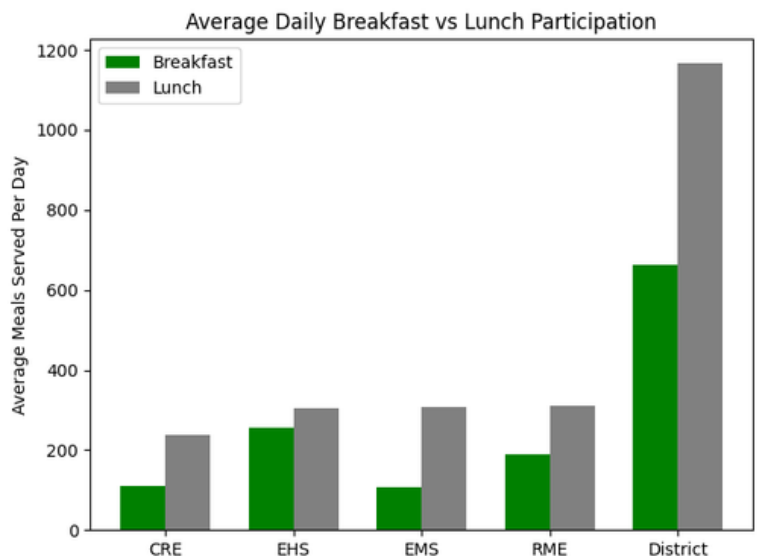
REID Meals: 7,289

### Nutrition Services continues to prioritize staff development and food safety. We now have four ServSafe Manager certified nutrition staff -

\*ServeSafe Manager Certification is a nationally recognized food safety certification that requires weeks of studying and passing a 90- question timed exam, demonstrating strong knowledge of food safety, sanitation, and safe kitchen practices.

When comparing lunch to breakfast participation, breakfast is significantly lower across schools showing an opportunity for growth.

## Transportation Department

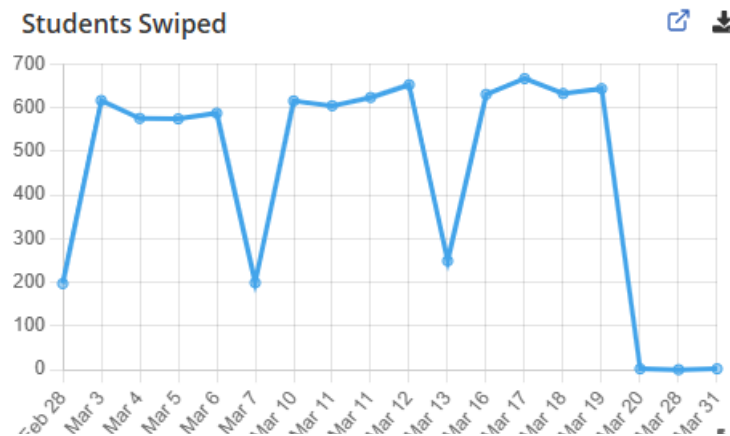

### 3 Wins

- The Transportation Department is collaborating with Grote and the Oregon Department of Education (ODE) to pilot a program testing newly added lighting on school buses, aimed at improving visibility and enhancing student safety
- Successfully traveled 29,300 miles safely, without a single incident.
- Scored an 92.5% on time rate for the month of March.

### Something learned

- During non-Reid days, an average of approximately 617 students are utilizing their bus cards.
