At the Secondary Level, curriculum meetings are ongoing with teachers in various departments to continue the development and refinement of our Guaranteed & Viable Curriculum (GVC).

We are revisiting our GVC as a secondary team this year because we will benefit from more organization and clarity around our instructional tools. We have phenomenal teachers who are seeing success using the resources they have access to. Again, this effort is more to organize materials and create consistency around the district based on what's working, rather than re-invent anything.

At the Elementary Level, we recently completed our second "Expo" of the school year. During the Expo, we were able to launch our Teaching and Learning Site, which houses all approved instructional materials in a way that is accessible and consistent for all teachers. There is one more Expo remaining in May.

Our "Expos" are what replaced what we previously referred to as "grade level collaboration". Expos are still highly collaborative, but now involve all teachers, and give teams from each school an opportunity to present what's working well in their classrooms so it can be shared around the district.

This month, all schools completed Spring parent-teacher conferences, and were able to connect with families whose students are in need of extra support.

Safety & Security:

The KCSO contract for our three SROs will remain a 70/30 split for the upcoming school year.

The only update we are still navigating is that **the 70/30 split will now apply to overtime.**

We're working with our impacted school principals, SROs and the KCSO supervisor to problem

solve how we want to approach overtime for the deputies. We currently have an agreement with Rathdrum PD to cap overtime, and this arrangement works well.

Coming up, we have D.A.R.E. Graduations for 5th Graders at both Garwood Elementary and Twin Lakes Elementary. We're excited to see more students going through this impactful program, and we've received a great amount of positive feedback on the program from families.
