1. BHS graduated 145 Browning Public-School students- 96 from BHS and 48 from BHA. We also did 2 memorial diplomas.
2. Drivers Education- Update: The first cohort did amazing. 11 completed the course and will earn high school credit for this class.

4. School Counselors will be starting to place students in their Fall classes based off of their current grad plan.
 - a. All counselors will have digital grad plans before the end of the year (refined this year to help collaboration and students' success at BHA).
 - b. BHA/BHS referral system is going to be implemented in the fall. The referral system is giving information and sending the grad plan to BHA so they have all the information to best meet the needs of the students we are referring to them. Students and parents will be informed before the end of the year so BHA has a Fall plan in place and we aren't referring after the school year starts.
5. BHS sound system is still waiting for the subwoofers to be installed and will be completed within the next 2 weeks by John Plank. The subwoofers will help with carrying sound throughout the gym.
6. ACT testing for BHA/BHS tested 130 juniors out of 156= 83% completion
7. Pre ACT testing for BHA/BHS tested
8. April 22nd, students participated in Earth Day activities/Beautification at BHS. The front of the school looks amazing and we want to thank Abigail Klauk for helping get this set up.
9. BHS students also did more tree planting during Arbor Day.
10. Ms. Angie Pepion's class is working with Abigail Klauk on creating planters and growing their garden at the Food Service Building and this will go into the next school year.
11. BHS hosted a track meet at our facilities. We had great support from the students and staff that day. It was a beautiful day for our track meet.
12. We had 39 parents/students who showed up for 8th Grade Transition Night in May.
13. Upward bound trip to Washington for college visits- 9 students attended for the week.
14. UM Journalism Camp- 4 students attended (picture below)
15. Graduation was held on May 27th, 2026 at 3 p.m. Thank you to all the board members who showed up. BHS leadership team will be sending out a survey in regards to
16. BHS Math data- We are seeing movement with the students' math skills based off of their finals this semester. As of now
 - a. 100+ student moving from Algebra 1 to Geometry
 - b. 55 moving to Algebra 2 (3 from Algebra 1 and 52 from Geometry)
 - c. 9 students who are ready for Pre- Calculus in the fall
17. I am now attaching the school wide Aimsweb and Writing Assessment data. As a school our first goal was to do our best to get all students tested. We started the year off with problems getting our 9-12 grade students into Aimsweb so it pushed back our Fall testing into almost Winter testing windows, so we didn't test in the Winter. We met after Fall testing and had guiding questions for staff and great discussion came out of the data meeting.
 - a. Next steps this 26/27 school year. Hold 3 data meetings during extended day where we discuss numbers of students at each tier. Then identify next steps to help move Tier 2 and Tier 3 students to the next tier up.
 - b. Look at deficits in the student learning and identify strategies and scaffolds that can help the students but also look at what students do well and build off of that. This will require content level teachers to use the reading and math data to refine the teacher's instruction based on students' current levels and knowing where they need to take them.

- c. We will also use this data to identify students who continue to need interventions for English and Math.
- d. Another way to use the data is to print off reports for parent teacher conferences and go over what it means with parent/guardians and help them identify what can be practiced at home to help the student's skills.

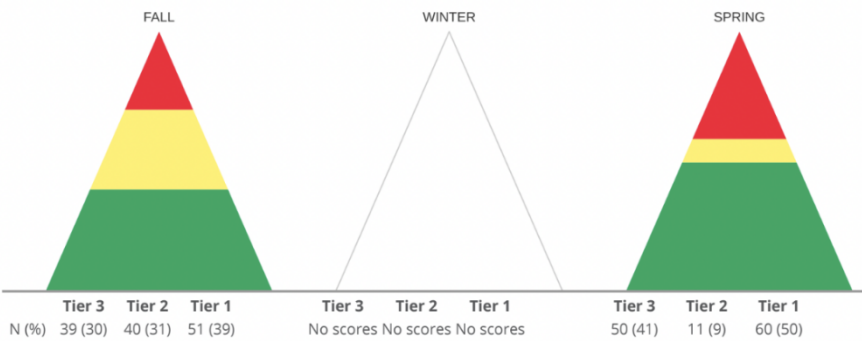

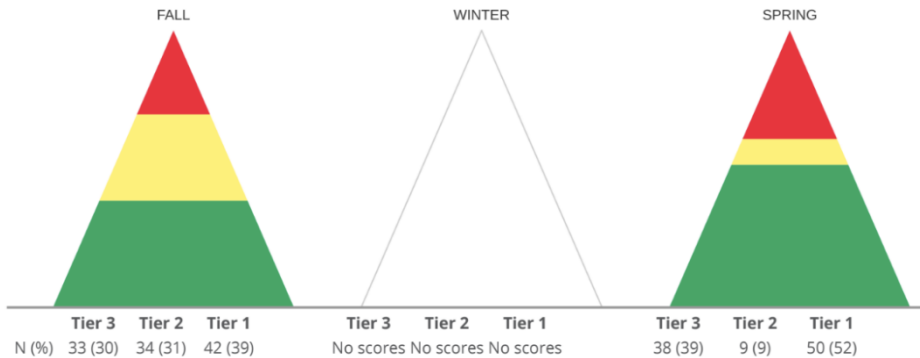
