1. Establishment of a Quorum and Call to Order

K. Dunbar called the meeting to order at 6:02 p.m. The roll was called and a quorum was present.

2. Consent Agenda

A. Approval of Minutes – Finance Committee Meeting – March 24, 2026

A motion was made by T. Mack-Mohammed and seconded by K. Dunbar for the Finance Committee to approve the minutes from March 24, 2026, as presented.

3. Old Business

A. District Response to Budget – Current and Future

Dr. Tracy Youngberg, Superintendent shared a PowerPoint regarding a follow-up to the 2026-2027 Board of Education approved budget. She referenced her presentation to the Town Council and outlined possible areas for budget reductions contingent on whether the Town Budget is approved. She also discussed the current plan for the alternative learning center and a proposed strategy to further reduce costs. The committee engaged a discussion about moving the Alternative Learning Center, reviewed the long-term savings by reducing the number of building occupied, program reductions and inquired about incentives for staff retirements.

B. Sharing of the 1% Set Aside Account Report

Domenic Greco, Executive Director of Finance and Operations provided a report to the Finance Committee from fiscal year 2023 and fiscal year 2024 expenses for the 1% non-lapsing set aside account. He also provided an overview of expenses from 2022 to present. Mr. Greco noted that \$382,218 has been spent in FY 26 due to the “blue water” at Bloomfield High School and refurbishing the gym floor. In addition,



Wintonbury Early Childhood Magnet School had a heater replaced and there has been water remediation at Metacomet Elementary School.

4. New Business

A. School Based Health Centers

Dr. Tracy Youngberg, Superintendent provided an overview of data regarding the School Based Health Centers. She shared that the district does not currently incur any expenses for these centers. She shared data around the use of these centers by visitors, noting a high percentage for behavioral health and a minimal percentage for medical visits. Dr. Youngberg noted that Integrated Health Services, Inc. is seeking further grant funding to continue the programming in Bloomfield.

5. Adjournment

At 6:52 p.m., a motion was made by T. Mack-Mohammed and seconded by K. Dunbar to adjourn.

The motion passed unanimously 2-0-0.
