School Health Advisory Council Annual Progress Report to the Board of Trustees May 18, 2026

As Required by [Texas Education Code, Section 28.004](#)

Background

Senate Bill 1, 74th Legislature, Regular Session, 1995, amended Chapter 28 of the Texas Education Code (TEC) by adding [Section 28.004](#). This section requires the establishment of a local school health education advisory council (SHAC). A SHAC is a volunteer advisory council to the school district Board of Trustees. A SHAC is composed of majority parents, community leaders, school personnel, and other representatives, as needed. Under TEC Section 28.004, the SHAC's duties include recommending policies, procedures, curriculum, and strategies for health education appropriate for specific grade levels. SHACs can provide invaluable advice to the district on methods to advance student academic performance by promoting, practicing, and coordinating school health education and services. If utilized, SHAC contributions to coordinated school health programming can lead to a greater positive impact on student health and learning. In addition to providing recommendations to the Board, Section 28.004 requires SHACs to submit a written report to the Board at least once annually. The report must include:

- Any SHAC recommendations not previously submitted to the Board regarding health education curriculum and instruction or related recommendations.
- Any suggested changes to previous SHAC recommendations.
- A detailed explanation of the SHAC's activities since the last annual report.

2025-2026 SHAC Goals

- To create SHAC Bylaws to ensure we are consistent with state law and District policies governing SHAC.
- To review the Wellness Plan by the end of the 2025-2026 academic year.
- To attempt to increase availability of food to all students.

2025-2026 SHAC Activities and Accomplishments

- During the 2025-2026 academic year, the SHAC had membership elections in accordance with the SHAC Bylaws.
- The SHAC met four times this academic year. The meetings included updates from the district health services coordinator, mental health awareness programs, human sexuality curriculum, and supporting the district's wellness policy.

All committee members have been invited to return as members for the 2026-2027 school year. The committee reviewed the Sweetwater ISD: Physician's Standing Order for School Year 2025-2026 school year and felt it was necessary to continue to have narcan on all campuses with trained staff to administer in the event of an emergency.

When reviewing the wellness plan, all nine goals were reviewed with minimal updates.

- Goal 1: recommended to implement surveys in the place of scorecards and benchmarks to increase participation in the federal child nutrition programs within Objective 2.
- Goal 2: No changes recommended. The committee suggested ways in which we can make progress toward the goal.
