Join us for a guided tour of the Minnesota Aquatic Invasive Species Research Center Containment Lab, where you'll get an inside look at our state-of-the-art facility and discover the innovative research underway. It's a perfect opportunity for individuals curious about the world of science. In 2016, the building underwent substantial upgrades and currently has 10,400 square feet of laboratory space available for researchers to use for aquatic invasive species research and teaching.

**No Disease! Biosecure Habits Can Keep Animals Healthy- Monday at 10 and 11 AM (Student Center 110)
Presenter – Diane DeWitte, University of MN Extension!**

This workshop will focus on prevention of both endemic and foreign diseases; Participants will learn how to keep their home animals healthy, how to prevent entrance of new disease into the herd, and, if there's an outbreak, how to avoid spread within the herd. Workshop will demonstrate biosecurity basics!

Get the inside scoop on manure! Youth will explore how manure helps plants thrive and what can happen when nutrients run off into water. Using a creative visual simulation, participants will learn practical strategies farmers use to protect both crops and the environment. Through hands-on modeling and problem-solving, youth will see how timing, placement, and soil health practices make a big difference in keeping nutrients where they belong—feeding plants instead of flowing into lakes and rivers. Participants will think like environmental scientists and farmers as they test ideas, observe results, and discover how responsible manure management supports strong crops, clean water, and healthy communities.

Mission: to safeguard animal and public health by providing rapid and accurate diagnosis of animal diseases, identification of emerging diseases, development of innovative diagnostic methods, and training for future diagnosticians and veterinarians. As Minnesota's only full-service animal health diagnostic laboratory, the VDL: supports the livestock and poultry industries, assists animal research scientists and educators, serves companion animal owners, acts as the official laboratory of the Minnesota Board of Animal Health, and plays a vital role in

the national animal and human health system! The VDL is proud to be part of the University of Minnesota College of Veterinary Medicine.

EXPECTATIONS FOR THE Veterinary Diagnostics Lab TOUR:

- During the tour, hazards may be encountered including human and animal pathogens, slippery floors, and trip hazards. All participants must remain with the Tour Leader and follow all instructions.
- Participants will be required to sign a **Tour Waiver and Release prior to the tour** (this can be signed upon arrival if you are 18; under 18 requires a parent signature and must be brought with you). Individuals without a signed waiver will not be permitted to participate.
- No food or beverages are allowed, and filming or photography is not permitted.
- Participants must wear closed toed shoes with heel covering and full length pants/skirts.

Beef Quality Assurance (BQA) is a voluntary, nationally coordinated program that provides U.S. cattle producers with science-based best practices for raising cattle. It focuses on animal well-being, food safety and environmental stewardship, aimed at producing healthy, high-quality beef while reducing defects like injection-site lesions or bruises. BQA certificates are good for three years.
