1. Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 10:00 a.m. in the Pahrump boardroom with a videoconference link to the Tonopah boardroom. Board members, administrators and guests recited the Pledge of Allegiance. Mrs. Ward called roll; Mrs. Wescoatt was absent but arrived at 10:25 a.m.

2. Adoption of Agenda

Dennis Keating moved adoption of the agenda, and Dawn Murphy seconded. Those voting aye: Edna Forsgren, Nicole Genet, Dennis Keating, Cindy Marcotte, Dawn Murphy and Tracie Ward. Those voting nay: none. Mrs. Wescoatt was absent for this vote. The motion carried with a majority vote.

Dennis Keating made the motion to approve the consent agenda, and Dawn Murphy seconded. Mrs. Marcotte moved that the library contracts be removed from the consent calendar for discussion, and Edna Forsgren seconded. Those voting aye: Edna Forsgren, Nicole Genet, Dennis Keating, Cindy Marcotte, Dawn Murphy and Tracie Ward. Those voting nay: none. Mrs. Wescoatt was absent for this vote. Those voting to approve the remainder of the consent agenda items were: Edna Forsgren, Nicole Genet, Dennis Keating, Cindy Marcotte, Dawn Murphy and Tracie Ward. Those voting nay: none. Mrs. Wescoatt was absent for this vote. Both motions were approved with a majority vote. (There were no submissions for d, e and f.)

- 3i. Approval of 2005-06 Contracts with Amargosa Community Library, Gabbs Community Library & Round Mountain Community Library

Mrs. Marcotte said it was her understanding that in 2004-05 \$37 went to the Amargosa Library, and \$30 went to the school for library books. She thought that at the end of last year the principal gave the books located at the school to the library to create extra space at the school. She asked that the Amargosa contract be increased to \$67 per student to be in line with the other two contracts. She had personally visited the Amargosa Library, which has a separate area for kids. Mr. Ritchie said the increase would cost \$5,250 and suggested it be taken from the educational endowment fund this year and then budgeted in general fund in the future. He explained that the schools get so much per elementary student and so much per middle school student, and the principal has the discretion to use the money for textbooks, supplies or equipment.

Tracie Ward made the motion to amend the Amargosa contract to increase the amount to \$67 per student and to approve the library contracts. Cindy Marcotte seconded. Mr. Keating asked if the school could utilize their own funding to pay for the increase this year considering the shortfall in DSA money. Mrs. Ward said the school has to decide whether to purchase workbooks or textbooks with the \$90. Mr. Keating asked if the school had ever spent \$30 on library books, and Mr. Ritchie said they never have. Mr. Keating said his concern is that \$37 was okay with the library board when they asked to resume the contract. He felt a change was unnecessary this year. Those voting aye: Edna Forsgren, Nicole Genet, Cindy Marcotte, Dawn Murphy, Tracie Ward and Deborah Wescoatt. Those voting nay: Dennis Keating. The motion carried with a majority vote.

4a. Superintendent's Report

Dr. Roberts displayed a plaque presented to the district from the Sheriff's Office in appreciation of Mr. McRae driving a school bus to transport prisoners in an emergency. He said the ROTC did an outstanding job representing the district at the Wild West Extravaganza as did other school entries in the parade. Everyone has been working hard in the first month of school. He and Mr. Ritchie attended a Superintendents' finance meeting in Reno. The District should have an idea of what the audit figures will be by October 15. Most of the schools in Pahrump have made a significant reduction in water usage. The district has been notified that a restaurant serving alcohol within 1500 feet of a school is requesting a waiver of that ordinance and asked for board members' comments. The district just responded to a survey asking how many teachers and additional classrooms would be needed for all-day Kindergarten. The only schools that qualified for it were Amargosa, Beatty, Gabbs and Manse. The district requested five teachers and modulars funded by the state. Washoe County invited other districts to participate in their bid for modulars. Tonopah High held a fundraiser with Jerry Tarkanian as the speaker. He would like to go to bid for keypad entry and surveillance video for the Southern District Office.

4b. Administrator Reports

Mr. Whimpey updated the board on the modulars. Mr. Pekarek said there are still 10.5 vacancies. A committee will soon meet to look at changes to classified personnel evaluations. Mrs. Decker said she had to make a change to her calendar in order to attend the state team meeting in Amargosa.

4c. Board Reports

Mrs. Marcotte met with representatives of the Amargosa Senior Center and said they are very receptive to writing to state legislators and want to know how they can help on the bond issue. She assisted at the Harvest Festival booth. Mrs. Forsgren said she was impressed with the Manse newsletter. Mrs. Genet attended the policy committee meeting, assisted with the booth and with Lifetouch. Mrs. Murphy assisted with Lifetouch and helped out at the booth. Mr. Keating attended the Boys and Girls Club meeting, helped at the booth, and plans to help with Oktoberfest. Mrs. Ward attended the Boys and Girls Club and policy committee meetings and assisted at the booth.

4d. Board Committee Reports

Mrs. Murphy reminded the board of the United Way Oktoberfest. Mrs. Wescoatt said the construction committee still hasn't made its visit to Arizona. She announced a policy committee meeting after the board meeting on October 21.

5. Public Input

None provided.

6. Board Appointments

7. Change of Date/Location of Future Board Meetings

Mrs. Wescoatt said she added a public hearing on October 12 at 6:30 in Pahrump regarding a proposed policy and regulation on middle school sports. She will read the policy and then conduct the hearing. Comments will be directed to the chair, Board member discussion will be limited to questions only, which will be directed to the chair.

Mr. Whimpey said he had received another map for Mountain Falls with another 96 lots.

11. Discussion/Possible Decision Regarding School Construction

Mrs. Wescoatt said U.S. Modular's plans for a school based on the Hafen design would cost \$8.2 million. Mr. Whimpey said he had received the soils report on the Jane Street site, and there is no expanding soil. He expects to receive the site plan next week and hopes to have the bid package ready in a couple weeks. He invited board members to review the plans and will also have his employees review them.

12. Update on Professional Learning Communities

Mrs. Decker handed out information provided by schools in binder form so that information may be added. It will show due dates, completion dates and comments from principals. Some schools are further along in the process than others due to new principals, Pathways moving into a new facility and emergencies. Dr. Roberts said high schools are also working on Northwest Accreditation reports at this time of year. Mrs. Decker said the next update would be in early December, but Mrs. Wescoatt asked for it on November 18. Mrs. Murphy asked if principals want to implement Professional Learning Communities. Mrs. Decker said she feels the majority of teachers are supportive. She said each time the team meets, the members complete a reflection form that helps them focus on goals. They also have an audit of commitment which looks at the kinds of specific tasks the teacher believes have or have not been taken related to PLCs. There are critical issues on forms twice a year that look at the scaffolding necessary to implement the program. They have built in safety nets that point out if everybody isn't on board. Dr. Roberts asks teachers how they feel about PLCs each time he visits a school, and the majority is positive. The culture of schools is being changed,

and they have to work together. Some principals say their staffs are pushing them. The only criticism he has heard is that timelines are too short. Mrs. Decker said a toolkit was purchased for each school that will help them move forward as they learn more about the program.

13. Approval of Plans of Progressive Discipline

14. Approval of Application for Teacher Signing Bonuses

Tracie Ward moved approval of the application. Dennis Keating seconded, and a unanimous vote was registered.

15. Approval of Request to Hire Additional 5.5 Hour Custodian for Central Support Services

Dennis Keating asked if this was being taken out of grant funds. Mr. Ritchie said it will be paid from special education funds because it is not budgeted in general fund. Mrs. Wescoatt asked if it would impact anything the early childhood program needs, and he said it wouldn't. Dennis Keating made the motion to approve the request. Tracie Ward seconded, and a unanimous vote was cast.

16. Approval of Request to Add & Raise Food Service Substitute Pay to Cafeteria Personnel Salary Schedule

Mr. Ritchie said sub pay was never on the salary schedule. Mrs. Garlin felt that raising sub pay from \$6.25 to \$7.00 might make it easier to find subs. Mr. Keating wondered if that was enough of an increase. Mr. Ritchie said the food service program must support itself without help from the general fund, and Mrs. Garlin felt that was all they could afford. Tracie Ward made the motion to approve the change to the salary schedule. Dennis Keating seconded, and a unanimous vote was recorded.

17. Approval of Application for Impact Aid & Authorization of Representative

Tracie Ward made the application to approve the application and appoint Dr. Roberts as the representative authorized to apply for impact aid. Dennis Keating seconded, and a unanimous vote was cast. Mrs. Marcotte asked how much the district received last year. She said several years ago the district decided it wasn't worth the cost to apply and because students dwindled. Mrs. Mays explained that the district won't receive a check until January 2006 for the 2005 application, and they don't know how much they'll receive. Dr. Roberts felt it would be around \$20,000. He acknowledged the additional workload on school staff and said if the board doesn't feel it's worth it, they can stop applying. The District could also decide to distribute the receipts to the schools. Mrs. Wescoatt asked for an update on January 20.

**CONTRACT AGREEMENT FOR ADMISSION
OF NON-RESIDENT PUPILS**

(Pursuant to NRS 392.010 and CA Ed. Code §2000, et seq.)

STATE OF NEVADA

COUNTY OF NYE

THIS CONTRACT AGREEMENT made and entered into this 25nd day of August, 2005, between

NYE COUNTY SCHOOL DISTRICT, hereinafter called Attendance District, and

MONO COUNTY OFFICE OF EDUCATION, hereinafter called Residence District, for the purpose of providing educational services to non-resident pupils of the Nye County School District.

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the respective parties under the laws of their respective states are authorized to enter into a contract whereby all or part, of the children of school age residing in the Residence District shall be entitled to be taught in the School District of the Attendance District for the school year commencing August 22, 2005 and terminating at the end of the 2005-2006 school year.

WHEREAS, the Attendance District hereby agrees to admit into the public schools of the Nye County School District the children of the Residence District referenced in Part 3-A of this agreement.

WHEREAS, the Attendance District hereby agrees to provide to the pupils of the Residence District comparable instruction and facilities for learning as are furnished the pupils of the Attendance District.

WHEREAS, the Attendance District may also provide for pupils who are identified as needing Special Education. The Residence District will transmit (when applicable) the Individual Education Plan for each identified pupil to the Attendance District. Documented extraordinary costs that require services above and beyond a typical special education classroom are the responsibility of the Residence District. The Residence District must be represented in the IEP process for those pupils receiving special education services in the Nye County School District. Parental disagreement with the determination of the IEP shall be filed with the Residence District, provided said Residence District has participated in the IEP.

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties hereto agree as follows:

1. **Period of Agreement.** This agreement is effective only for the school year beginning August 29, 2005, and ending June 30, 2006. Neither district is bound by said agreement or any of its covenants herein contained after the expiration of said school year.

2. The Attendance District shall provide the educational services listed below to pupils of the Residence District that are listed in Part 3-A of this agreement that are usual to the educational services provided to similar pupils residing in the Attendance District. The Attendance District shall also provide attendance data to the Residence District on a monthly basis. In addition, the Attendance District shall provide a list of all pupils requiring services. The list is to contain the pupil's name, age, grade, parents/guardians, county of residence, and if possible should include a location map of the residence.
3. The Resident District shall:
 - A. Verify to the Attendance District that the pupils listed on the attendance reports are residents of Mono County. (For the purposes of this Agreement, see Exhibit A.)
 - B. Transportation of pupils is to be provided by the Superintendent of the Mono County Office of Education, the Residence District.
 - C. Pay the Attendance District for and in consideration of the services described an amount based upon the average costs per ADA of tuition, less actual transportation expenses, of all pupils for 2005-06 who are identified to be attending Nye County School District.
 - D. All payments shall be completed within ten days following receipt of billing provided by the Attendance District for the 2005-06.
4. Special Conditions:
 - A. The parties hereto agree that this agreement shall not become valid or binding upon either party until approved by the governing bodies of the Attendance and Residence Districts, the County Superintendent of both parties, and the Nevada Department of Education.
 - B. The Attendance District and the Residence District each reserve the right to terminate its commitments hereunder by either party upon sixty (60) day's prior written notice of such termination.
 - C. During the performance of this agreement, the Attendance District and the Residence District agree as follows:

There is hereby incorporated by reference the same as if specifically written herein all rules, regulations and all other requirements including, but not limited to, compliance with the Nevada Revised Statutes governing Nevada Public Schools; Laws of the State of Nevada; the rules, regulations and policies of the Nevada State Board of Education; and the rules and regulations of the governing board of the Attendance District. In case of conflict between any provisions of this agreement and such laws, rules and regulations of the Attendance District shall prevail.
 - D. When a pupil of the Residence District ceases to be a member of the Attendance District, a record of the withdrawal shall be established on the same document that contains his/her enrollment information, and the Residence District is to be immediately notified of the withdrawal.

E. Prior to final payment the Attendance District will provide the Residence District with documentation of any extraordinary costs associated with special education services provided to pupil(s) of the Resident District.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the parties have caused this agreement to be executed in quadruplicate originals on the 25th day of August 2005.

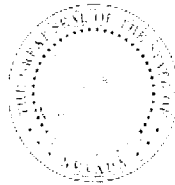

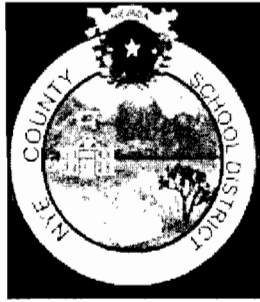

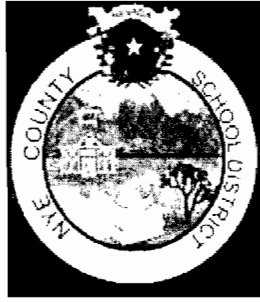

Board/Superintendent Operating Protocol

The professional relationship that exists between the Board of Trustees and its superintendent is integral to a highly efficient and successful organization. Knowledge of what each can expect of the other can promote team work and strong working relationships, and an uncommon focus on student achievement.

This strong professional working relationship calls for a high order of devotion, statesmanship, loyalty, openness, and integrity. It is paramount for the good of those whom the District serves that the Board of Trustees and the Superintendent function in an atmosphere of mutual respect, trust, and cooperation.

Given these beliefs, the Board of Trustees and the Superintendent agree to the following:

Only the Board as a whole has authority. The Board agrees that individual members will not take action and do not expect staff to act on individual statements, suggestions, or advice of an individual Board member.

The Board Chair is the spokesperson for the Board regarding decisions made by the Board. The Superintendent is the primary spokesperson for the school district. All Board members are encouraged to assist with District communication and will accurately and fairly reflect Board decisions and process.

Board meetings are for decision-making, action, and votes. Board discussion should be concise and pertinent to the issue. If a Board member needs more information or has questions, the Superintendent should be contacted before the Board meeting.

In order that the Board can make the best decision possible, there should be no surprises at Board meetings.

The conduct of a Board member is very important. Board members agree to avoid words and actions that create a negative impression of an individual, the Board or the District. The Board encourages debate and differing points of view, and will do so with care and respect.

Board meetings are where the Board does its work in public. The Board agrees to speak to the issues on the agenda and attend to fellow Board members. Facts and the information needed from the administration will be referred to the Superintendent or Board Chair.

The last stop, not the first, will be the Board. The Board agrees to follow the chain of command and insists that others do as well. While the Board is interested in hearing from its constituents and staff, each inquiry is to be referred to the person who can properly and expeditiously address the issue.

Unless there is an imminent threat to District students, staff or property, the Board will refrain from calling the Superintendent after the close of the workday or on weekends. Although the Board may send him email communication, a response is not expected any earlier than the next normal workday unless it is a matter of compelling urgency.

As a general rule and as a matter of courtesy, Board members will call ahead to schools and District offices prior to making visits so as not to interrupt the flow of day-to-day operations of the District.

MIDDLE SCHOOL ATHLETIC PROGRAM PHILOSOPHY

Activities should function as an integral part of the total school curriculum. In striving for excellence, the District's goals are to produce young men and women who have the capacity to become successful citizens in our highly competitive society.

Young people gain a great deal from participating in interscholastic athletics and activities. Accordingly, dedication should be stressed, and appropriate skill levels should be established and taught so that students can participate with pride in athletics.

Lessons in sportsmanship, teamwork, competition and how to participate, win and lose gracefully are a vital part of each team in the District's athletic program. The Board of Trustees does not condone "winning at any cost" and discourages any pressures which might tend to neglect good sportsmanship, as well as physical and mental health.

The interscholastic program shall be conducted in accordance with existing Nye County School District Board of Education policy.

Title: 7472 – Middle School Athletic Program Philosophy

Purpose and Background: To provide procedures to govern middle school student participation in extra-curricular athletic activities

Applicability: All students in middle school

Monitoring Responsibility: Site administrators, athletic directors, coaches and sponsors

Outline of Procedure: The middle school athletic program in NCSD provides interscholastic activities for both boys and girls. The District believes that all students should have the opportunity to participate in sports in an educational environment under the direction of the most qualified staff. NCSD values the middle school athletic program as an integral part of the overall education program. The middle school athletic program is progressive in scope, provides age appropriate opportunities and appropriate playing time for all students, teaches appropriate skills and enhances students' connection to the school.

1. The middle school athletic program exists to promote the following values for students:
 - To develop and maintain sportsmanship
 - To develop proper attitudes towards competition
 - To encourage and develop respect towards fellow competitors and the game
 - To promote mental and physical well being for participants
2. The operations and management of the middle school athletic program must be in harmony with the policies of the NCSD.
3. Student participants in the middle school athletic program must, in order to participate in any athletic activity, be in good standing in the following areas:
 - Attendance
 - Academic Eligibility
 - Citizenship
 - Code of Conduct
 - Other policies determined by the NCSD, administration and/or coaches.
