The meeting was called to order at 10:04 a.m. in the Pahrump boardroom with a videoconference link to the Tonopah boardroom. Board members, administrators and guests recited the Pledge of Allegiance. All members were present.

4a. Superintendent's Report

Dr. Roberts thanked the Pahrump Rotary Club for donating dictionaries to every third grader. He attended a fact finding meeting in Tonopah on the proposal to close the Tonopah Test Range.

4b. Administrator Reports

Mr. McRae said there has been a drop in ridership in November. He was able to acquire six 1991 wheelchair buses from Clark County School District. Mr. Whimpey said the Pahrump fire marshal's office has temporarily closed, and he cannot get occupancy permits for modulars. There will be a meeting Wednesday to see if he can get help from the local building department. Mr. Pekarek said there are presently eight vacancies.

Mrs. Forsgren was impressed with the NASB conference. Mr. Keating said Mossi White and Joan Schmidt, past presidents of NSBA, gave presentations. NASB now has its first full-time director. He said he was elected to be the NASB legislative representative. Mrs. Ward attended meetings with the architects and family reading night at J.G. Johnson.

5. Public Input

Harold Tokerud expressed thanks for the opportunity of attending the NASB conference and said it was probably the best in years. He found the Open Meeting Law and iNVEST

presentations especially good. Al Daniels of Great Basin College thanked Jerry Hill and Karen Liberty for assistance with grants and ordering to get the biology room ready. He said enrollment in all but one of the dual credit biology classes is at capacity. He asked for placement on the next agenda for assistance in purchasing textbooks. Mrs. Wescoatt asked him to wait until the new board takes office in January.

McKenzie Dean was present to accept recognition as State champion in girls' cross country. Mark Howard introduced assistant football coach Harvey Gonzalez and team captains Eric White and Mike Dolfin of the State 1A runners up team.

12. Discussion/Possible Decision Regarding Lockers at Rosemary Clarke Middle School

Mrs. Ward made the motion to approve the purchase and installation of lockers, and Mrs. Murphy seconded. Mrs. Forsgren felt there are other necessities that took precedence at this time. Mrs. Ward said if there were lockers, the district would no longer have to fund the second set of textbooks. Mr. Keating said people were told at a few town hall meetings that northern schools would have first consideration of some issues, and now Pahrump is being placed first. Those voting aye: Mrs. Genet, Mrs. Marcotte, Mrs.

Murphy, Mrs. Ward and Mrs. Wescoatt. Those voting nay: Mrs. Forsgren and Mr. Keating. The motion carried with a majority vote.

13. Presentation & Acceptance of Independent Audit for Year Ending June 30, 2006

Mr. McArthur said the District operated 80 funds in 2006. The difference between the opening fund balance of \$16,972,217 and the ending fund balance of \$27,852,557 represents bonds that were sold. Ending Fund Balance should be four percent, and the District's Ending Fund Balance is about half of what it should be. There was an eight percent increase in expenditures from the previous year. Salaries and benefits amount to 80.67%, which is consistent with 2005. The impact fee and health insurance funds were over-expended from what was authorized to expend. He acknowledged both are hard to predict. The District entered into contracts over \$25,000 which were not advertised for bids. Comments included a suggestion to improve on accounting for credit cards, not paying employees as contractors, elimination of handwritten checks, preparing and posting daily deposits, monthly reconciliation on fuel card receipts for the transportation and maintenance departments, and controls over check signatures so that passwords are not divulged and can only be entered from the individual's work station. Mr. McArthur issued a clean audit opinion. He expressed concern over the ongoing low Ending Fund Balance. However, he said he can see consistency from year to year. Mrs. Ward moved approval of the audit. Mrs. Murphy seconded, and a unanimous vote was cast.

14. Approval of Letter Regarding 2005-06 Professional Development Provided by Regional Professional Development Program

Mrs. Ward made the motion to approve the letter. Mr. Keating seconded, and a unanimous vote was cast.

15. Discussion/Possible Ratification of Master Contract between NCSD and Nye County Support Staff Organization

Mrs. Ward made the motion to ratify the contract with NCSO. Mr. Keating seconded, and a unanimous vote was recorded.
