1. Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 5:02 p.m. in the Amargosa Community Center. Amargosa students sang the national anthem. Roll call was conducted with all members present.

2. Student Musical Performance

Students performed under the direction of Gerald Martin.

3. Adoption of Agenda

Mrs. Ward moved adoption of the agenda. Mrs. Forsgren seconded, and a unanimous vote was recorded.

Mrs. Ward made the motion to approve the consent agenda. Mrs. Church seconded, and a unanimous vote was cast.

5a. Superintendent's Report

Dr. Roberts had just returned from a State Superintendents' meeting in Carson and passed on Governor Gibbons' regards to the Amargosa community. He said the District gave input into the language on the draft legislation on empowerment schools. He had contacted Senator Reid's office about obtaining FEMA trailers. The Leadership Team continues its budget work.

5b. Administrator Reports

Mr. Pekarek said there are five vacancies for 2006-07 and two for 2007-08. Mr. Hill shared current proficiency exam results and explained the remediation program and various diploma options. Mr. Keating asked if he would update the board next fall on graduation results. Mr. Norton attended regional and state basketball games and the honorary induction of former principal Ray DePalma into the NIAA Hall of Fame. He accompanied Vern Van Winkle throughout Nye County to prepare a recruitment video. He is working on the final draft of the crisis management plan.

5c. Board Reports

Mrs. Forsgren thanked Amargosa for the meal. Mrs. Church reported on Beatty PTA events. Mr. Keating attended the new board member training in Carson City, which was very well attended by all 17 districts. Mr. Floyd also reported on this training. Mr. Pape attended the new board member training and reported on a couple of the speakers. He attended math and literacy night and read to several classrooms during reading week.

5d. Board Committee Reports

Mr. Tokerud felt the school design process was too slow. Mr. Floyd attended the construction committee and was confident the school would be ready on time. Mr. Pape attended a United Way meeting. Mrs. Ward reported that Valley Electric proposed a geothermal cooling system for Floyd Elementary at the construction committee meeting.

6. Public Input

Debbie Baker spoke on behalf of the Beatty PTA. She thanked the board for visiting outlying communities and said her community would welcome a board meeting there.

9. Decision Regarding Subdivision Maps

Mr. Whimpey received maps for three small subdivisions and a revised map for Adaven.

10. Approval of Grants

Mrs. Boggs requested permission to apply for a Safe and Drug Free Schools grant in the amount of \$264,000 and to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding with the Nye County Sheriff's office and Nye Communities Coalition. She planned to request funding for two half-time school resource officers, training for parents and businesses about underage drinking, assembly speakers and expansion of existing programs throughout the county. Mrs. Ward made the motion to approve the grant and enter into a Memorandum of Understanding. Mrs. Forsgren seconded, and a unanimous vote was recorded.

11. Recognitions

Mr. Whimpey displayed the Cashman Good Government finalist award for the District's water conservation program. Service awards were presented to Richard Stephens and Gary Torstenson for 30 years of service each and to Lynn Jordan and Vern Nelson for 25 years of service each.

12. Discussion/Possible Decision Regarding Request from Boys & Girls Clubs to Offer Summer Program at Manse Elementary

Mike Meyer requested permission to use the Manse Multi-Purpose Room for an eight week summer program for 150 children. The Club would pay janitorial expenses. Mrs. Visser said she planned to waive the rental fees because it was both educational and recreational. Mr. Floyd asked who would pay the utility charges, but Mr. Meyer was unsure. Mrs. Ward made the motion to approve the request, and Mrs. Church seconded. Those voting aye: Mrs. Church, Mrs. Forsgren, Mr. Keating, Mr. Pape, Mr. Tokerud and Mrs. Ward. Those voting nay: Mr. Floyd. The motion carried with a majority vote.

13. Discussion/Possible Approval of Educational Travel to Edwards AFB by Gabbs & Tonopah Students

Mrs. Ward made the motion to approve the request following District guidelines. Mr. Tokerud seconded, and a unanimous vote was registered.

14. Discussion/Possible Approval of Educational Travel Funds for Round Mountain High School Students

Mrs. Ward moved approval. Mrs. Church seconded, and a unanimous vote was cast.

15. Discussion/Possible Approval of Educational Travel Funds by Clarke Middle School Students

Mrs. Ward made the motion to approve the request. Mr. Tokerud seconded, and a unanimous vote was recorded.

16. Discussion/Possible Decision Regarding On-Line Diplomas

Mrs. Ward moved that Nye County School District will not recognize on-line diplomas that do not provide proof of the classes taken. Mr. Tokerud seconded the motion, and a unanimous vote was recorded.

17. Selection of 07-08 Calendar

Mr. Tokerud made the motion to accept option 1 because there is not much education going on during split weeks. Mrs. Ward seconded, and a unanimous vote was cast.

18. Approval to Offer Resignation Incentive

Mr. Pekarek explained the incentive was devised to get a jump start on recruiting due to school starting earlier next August. Mrs. Ward made the motion to approve the incentive. Mrs. Forsgren seconded, and a unanimous vote was registered. Mr. Tokerud asked for a future report on its effects.

19. Approval to Hire Project Manager

Mr. Tokerud made the motion to authorize this new position, and Mrs. Ward seconded. Dr. Roberts said with the number of bond projects coming up in the next few years, this position is necessary to oversee everything. The District is seeking someone with engineering or architectural skills. Mr. Keating said one of the board's goals is to create a safe learning environment, and this is one step towards that. The motion and second were amended to also approve the salary schedule. The vote was unanimous in favor.

20. Approval to Hire Extra Help to Complete Fixed Assets Inventory

Mr. Ritchie requested approval for an individual to work eight hours per day for \$10 per hour to complete the fixed asset inventory. Over 400 obsolete computers that were still on inventory were taken to Carson City to be refurbished for a program that provides computers to low-income families. Mrs. Ward made the motion to approve the request. Mrs. Forsgren seconded, and a unanimous vote was recorded.

21. Discussion/Possible Approval to Fill Vacant Grant Writer Position

Mr. Hill explained this position became vacant when Karen Holley became Coordinator of State and Federal Projects. The individual selected will probably not start until early May. Mrs. Ward made the motion to approve the hire. Mr. Tokerud seconded, and a unanimous vote was cast.

22. Discussion/Possible Approval of Second Reading, Policy 7551 – Disciplinary Hearings

Mrs. Ward moved approval of the second reading. Mr. Pape seconded, and a unanimous vote was recorded. A copy of this policy accompanies these minutes.

Dear Mr. Leavitt:

This will confirm our conversation yesterday regarding your transportation contract.


You submitted a transportation contract for the 2006-07 school year. Contrary to what you indicated in our conversation, this was not a blank contract. Your contract was presented to the board of trustees on October 20, 2006. The board did not approve your contract because you had added this language: "My signature on this contract does not bind me to this contract unless there is a rider put in said contract stating that if gas prices rise to or above \$3 per gallon there will be an increase in mileage payment accordingly." The board could not approve the contract with this language because this violates the rates established by the board of trustees. In order to get an increase in mileage rates, you must get on a board agenda to request such a change.

You cannot be paid for your travel this year until you have an approved contract. Once the board approves the contract, you can be paid for all travel from the first of this year. However, if you do not submit a contract before June 2007, you forfeit any claim for mileage in the 2006-07 school year. Your alternatives are:

1. Submit a new contract at the existing rate of .375 cents per mile without adding additional language (copies attached).

2. Find a family in Tonopah willing to board your grandson during the week and submit an "in lieu of" contract. You would be paid \$10 a day for four days each week and would be paid a round trip for driving him in on Mondays and a round trip home on Fridays at the established rate of .375 cents per mile. Copies of these forms are attached and must accompany the milcage contract. One of these forms must be notarized, and we have a notary in our office.
3. Submit a letter requesting placement on a board agenda to ask the board to raise the rates.
4. Home school your grandson using an approved course from the list provided with the home school packet previously given to you. You would assume the cost and the responsibility for educating him because he would no longer be considered a student of Nye County School District. 

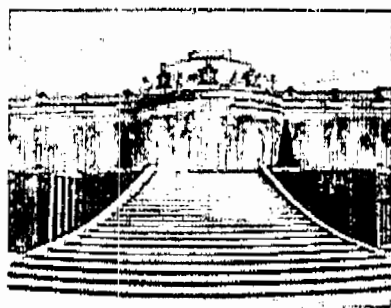

SUBJECT: PVHS Bleachers

The existing bleachers are unsafe. All footings need to be replaced and bleachers rebuilt, installing kick plates under all seats.

Capacity is only 600 seats. Enrollment is 1288 now and may reach 1700 students in two years.

Estimated cost is \$300,000 to \$400,000.

6147(a) DRUG-FREE WORKPLACE, TESTING

Failure to comply may subject an employee to **disciplinary action in accordance with the applicable Negotiated Labor Agreement and NRS 391** and will preclude an applicant from an offer of employment.
