1. Call to Order

The board meeting was called to order at 6:30 p.m. in the Pahrump boardroom with videoconference links to the Tonopah boardroom and Beatty High School and a telephone connection to Mrs. Forsgren. Board members, administrators and guests recited the Pledge of Allegiance. All members were present.

2. Adoption of Agenda

Mrs. Ward moved adoption of the agenda. Mr. Pape seconded, and a unanimous vote was recorded.

Mrs. Ward made the motion to approve the consent calendar with the removal of item 3c for a separate vote, and Mr. Tokerud seconded. The motion to approve the consent calendar was unanimous. Mr. Tokerud made the motion to approve item 3c, and Mrs. Church seconded. Those voting aye: Mrs. Forsgren, Mr. Keating, Mr. Tokerud and Mrs. Church. Those voting nay: Mr. Floyd, Mr. Pape and Mrs. Ward. Mrs. Ward asked to revisit the original motion and made the motion to approve the consent calendar with the removal of item 3i instead. Mr. Tokerud seconded, and the vote was unanimous. Mrs. Forsgren made the motion to approve item 3i, and Mr. Tokerud seconded. Those voting aye: Mrs. Church, Mrs. Forsgren, Mr. Keating and Mr. Tokerud. Those voting nay: none. Mr. Floyd, Mr. Pape and Mrs. Ward abstained because their spouses are licensed employees. The motion carried with a unanimous vote.

4a. Superintendent's Report

Dr. Roberts said that he will add an item to the next agenda for the purchase of modulars to replace single modulars, two of which will be given to Round Mountain Gold in exchange for three lots that will be donated for school district housing.

4b. Administrator Reports

Mr. Pekarek said there are 18 vacancies, four of which are unfilled from 2006-07. Mr. Wombaker thanked the board for giving money for the purchase of musical equipment to support his school's performing choir, band and hand bell choir.

4c. Board Reports

Mrs. Ward attended the book fair at Johnson Elementary. Mr. Tokerud visited Manse's all-day kindergarten and spoke of the benefits of all-day kindergarten. He also toured Pahrump High with the Superintendent and saw first hand how crowded the school is. He participated in the car promotion at Clarke Middle School. He reported on legislation.

4d. Board Committee Reports

Mr. Floyd attended a Career and Technical Committee where they discussed a construction trades class and a work release program. He reported the Construction

Committee is choosing colors and carpet. Mrs. Ward also attended the Construction Committee meeting. Mr. Keating attended the Policy Committee meeting.

5. Public Input

Kelly Varden expressed concerns about the homebound program, specifically the elective classes that aren't covered, how instructors make work available, accountability and grading of assignments turned in, and how monitoring takes place. She also felt that students can't be expected to dress appropriately if professional staff does not.

James Baker requested placement on the April 19 agenda on behalf of NCCSSO.

6. Board Appointments

Mr. Tokerud replaced Mr. Floyd on the Policy Committee.

7. Change of Date/Location of Future Board Meetings

Mr. Keating changed the location of the April 19 meeting to Beatty at 5:00 p.m.

8. Decision Regarding Subdivision Maps

Item withdrawn.

9. Approval of Grants

Mr. Hill requested permission to apply for a state-level grant to start a construction trades class. He expected it would be in the amount of \$75,000 to \$90,000 for equipment and student transportation. The individual who would teach the class is already on staff. Mrs. Ward made the motion to approve the request. Mr. Floyd seconded, and a unanimous vote was registered.

10. Recognitions

Length of service certificates were presented to Rebecca Oikawa, John Toomer, Robert White and Rosalind Jarrett for 20 years each and to Pat Garlin for 25 years.

11. Discussion/Possible Decision Regarding Request for Increase in Transportation Contract Rates

Mr. Leavitt explained that he was withdrawing his request because he had decided to home school his grandson. He only wished to be reimbursed for the months he transported the student to Tonopah Middle School.

12. Discussion/Decision Regarding Request for Educational Travel Funds for Pahrump High Student

Mrs. Ward questioned whether this was a reimbursement. Mr. Ritchie explained the student just found out about the trip. He felt the word was not getting to the parents. Mr. Keating suggested putting something in the Student/Parent Handbook. Dr. Roberts urged the student to take advantage of the tours in Germany and congratulated him on his efforts both as an athlete and as a student. Mr. Floyd said he couldn't think of anyone better to represent the school. Mr. Floyd made the motion to approve the request. Mrs. Ward seconded, and a unanimous vote was cast.

13. Award of Bid: Security System at Tonopah High School

Bids were opened March 16, and the only bid received was from Ashworth and Belcastro Systems. Mrs. Ward made the motion to award the bid in the amount of \$46,000. Mrs. Forsgren seconded, and a unanimous vote was recorded. Mr. Whimpey said the system would have cameras inside and outside and would be completed within 60 days of award. Dr. Roberts said one of the goals is to have security systems installed in every school.

14. Discussion/Possible Decision Regarding Construction of a New High School or New Middle School

Mr. Pekarek said the capacity of the main Pahrump High building is 650, and the capacity at Clarke Middle School is 1250. The last pod at the middle school was not constructed. The average increase for Clarke Middle School the past three years was 6.49%. The average increase for the high school during the same period was 9.75%. He projected the student population through 2010 using the same percentages. Although there is a lot of home construction, the District picked up very few students from Mountain Falls. In the next few years both the high school and the Great Basin building will be over capacity.

Dr. Roberts said the modulars will relieve some of the pressure at the high school. If Early Childhood was relocated, that would accommodate another 75 students. He believes it is time to build another high school. There are 82 acres available at Gamebird and Pahrump Valley Boulevard. It is a central location with major access roads. Water and sewer are moving that direction. Current problems due to the size of the high school are long passing periods and truancy. He displayed a plan for a two-story building to house 2500 students with all the amenities, including two gyms. It might be possible for the college to also relocate especially if a four-year college becomes a reality.

Mr. Tokerud made the motion to work on building a new high school first, and Mrs. Ward seconded. Mr. Tokerud said he would also support building the additional pod at the middle school. Mr. Pekarek said the present high school could be renovated to house a second middle school. Mr. Tokerud liked the emphasis on vocational that was discussed by the previous board. Dr. Roberts said there are 60 acres available at the Hafen site. Mrs. Ward said she didn't like that big of a high school because she felt the students would have fewer opportunities in sports and scholarships. Dr. Roberts said there would probably be more teams, and more staff would be available to monitor clubs; however, it

would limit the number of varsity athletes. Mr. Floyd liked the idea of a 2500 student high school. Brian Hug said it shouldn't limit scholarships. Mr. Keating said they can't build too small because they can't predict what will happen in the valley. He would like to find out the size of families who are purchasing homes. The board needs to commit to the other grade levels as well. The vote on the motion was unanimous in favor.

15. Discussion/Decision Regarding Replacement of Bleachers at Pahrump Valley High School

Mr. Whimpey said the existing bleachers are dangerous, and the footings are sinking. He estimated bleachers with 950 seats would cost around \$300,000. Seating for 1500 would cost around \$400,000. There would be a large press box with camera platform and two ADA accessible areas. The bleachers could be dismantled and moved if a new high school is built. Mrs. Ward made the motion to permit going to bid for bleachers that would seat 1500. Mr. Floyd seconded, and a unanimous vote was cast. Mr. Ritchie said there is bond money available.

16. Approval of First Reading, Policy 6147a – Drug-Free Workplace, Testing

Mrs. Ward moved approval of the revised first reading. Mr. Tokerud seconded, and a unanimous vote was recorded. A copy of this policy is attached to the minutes.


Dear Superintendent Roberts:



2. Power for test (not negotiable). (25 kW diesel generator runs at idle continuously for 48 hours);
3. Complete test results and report according to the test specifications cited above;
4. All drill fluids, cuttings and containment waste shall be left on site. **Site cleanup is not included in this contract. (Clean-up arrangements are the responsibility of the Client.); and**
5. **Additional Services as required in writing. (see description below).**

Specifications for In-Situ-Thermal Testing of Ground-Coupled Heat Pump Heat Exchangers

PART 1 - VERTICAL TEST BORE

1.1 SCOPE

A vertical bore shall be installed according to these specifications. The completed bore shall be located so that it is incorporated into the final ground-loop heat exchanger design. A completed vertical test bore shall consist of the vertical bore with an approved polyethylene u-bend assemble installed to the completed bore depth with an approved grouting material installed in the bore annulus. Vertical bore can be drilled either by a mud-rotary drilling rig or by a compressed-air drilling rig which ever is most feasible based on geological conditions.

Drilling contractor shall provide a detailed test bore report. The report shall include the following information:

- * Each formation type encountered (drill log)
- * Each formation depth (in feet)
- * Depth of any significant cracks, fissures or caverns encountered
- * All water bearing zones and if encountered:
 - Zone depths
 - Estimated flow rate
- * Type of drilling equipment used (i.e. mud-rotary, air-rotary, air-hammer, etc.), and rig model number
- * Bag quantity of drill mud used where applicable
- * Total time to drill the test bore excluding shut-downs to obtain water or mechanical break-downs.
- * A completed, signed report shall be supplied immediately at the conclusion of the drilling process.

Drilling contractor shall be responsible for all permits and following all applicable codes and regulations. Where any discrepancy exists between local codes and regulations and this specification, the more stringent of the two documents prevail.

Drilling contractor shall take all necessary precautions to protect the site from any damage resulting from the drilling operation.

1.2 BORE DIAMETER

The diameter of the vertical bore shall not be greater than 6 inches (152.4 mm) and shall not be less than 4.5 inches (114.3 mm). The final diameter shall be determined by the drilling contractor's available equipment.

1.3 COMPLETED BORE DEPTH

The completed bore depth shall be within 5% of the final estimated design bore depth for the specific project. The completed depth shall be determined by the placement of the u-bend. The distance from the bottom of the u-bend to the surface shall constitute the completed bore depth. At minimum, an additional 5 feet (1.52 m) of pipe length (on both the supply and return legs) shall be left above the installed u-bend assembly, above ground level/finished grade.

1.4 POLYETHYLENE U-BEND ASSEMBLY

The polyethylene u-bend assembly shall be manufactured from a polyethylene extrusion grade material having a minimum cell classification of PE345434C per ASTM D-3350 and shall fully comply with the ISGHPA standard IC "Ground Heat Exchanger Materials". The u-bend shall be factory assembled and pressure tested to 100 psi prior to insertion into the vertical bore. The u-bend pipe diameter shall be 3/4 inch (19 mm), 1 inch (25.4 mm) or 1-1/4 inch (31.8 mm) IPS-OD as determined from the table below:

U-Bend Pipe Diameter	Completed Bore Depth
3/4 in. (19 mm) Polyethylene	100 - 200 ft (30.48 – 60.96 m)
1 in. (25.4 mm) Polyethylene	150 - 300 ft (45.72 – 91.44 m)
1-1/4 in. (31.8 mm) Polyethylene	250 - 500 ft (76.20 – 152.4 m)

Any and all connections made below grade shall be done using heat fusion. Pipe manufacturer and total installed u-bend length shall be reported immediately following bore completion.

1.5 GROUTING MATERIAL

The annular space between the vertical bore wall and the u-bend assembly shall be filled with a bentonite-based grouting material with a minimum solids content of 20%. The grouting material shall be mixed in strict accordance to the manufacturers mixing instructions. Grouting material shall be placed using a pressure pump with a tremie pipe system. The material shall be installed from the bottom to the top of the vertical bore. If any settling occurs during the initial 24-hour period after installation, additional material shall be added to insure that grouting material remains at surface level. In the event that a geological formation is encountered that prevents the grouting material from forming a solid seal, either a 3/8 inch (9.5 mm) or 3/4 inch (19 mm) granular bentonite material may be use through that specific formation zone. Upon completion of that specific zone, the grout slurry shall continue to be use until reaching the surface of the vertical bore. Grout manufacturer and percent solids shall be reported immediately following bore completion.

PART 2 - FORMATION THERMAL CONDUCTIVITY TEST

2.1 SCOPE

The formation thermal conductivity test is designed to determine the average thermal conductivity of the formation for the completed bore depth. The testing device shall be designed so that a constant rate of heated water is supplied in an uninterrupted fashion to the u-bend assembly. The testing device shall have the capability of automatically collecting data at predetermined intervals. Collected data shall be available to the design engineer in an electronic format compatible with Microsoft Excel®.

2.2 INSULATION

The testing device shall be designed to prevent as much heat loss, or heat gain to the environment as possible. Each end of the u-bend assemble shall be insulated with a closed-cell insulation to prevent heat loss or heat gain.

2.3 ELAPSED TIME BEFORE TESTING

AIR ROTARY DRILLING: A minimum delay of fourteen days between loop grouting and testing is required.
MUD ROTARY DRILLING: A minimum delay of fourteen days between loop grouting and testing is required.

2.4 INPUT HEAT RATE

The testing device shall be designed so that a constant rate of heat input into the vertical u-bend assemble shall be no less that 51 Btu/hr (14.9 W) per bore foot. If a lower rate is anticipated, prior approval must be obtained before hand. In any event, the heat rate shall not fall below 45 Btu/hr (13.2 W) per bore foot. Heat rate shall not be altered during the duration of the thermal conductivity test. The selected heat rate shall not be greater than 85 Btu/hr (24.9 W) per bore foot. The average input heat rate shall be reported in the final analysis.

2.5 DATA ACQUISITION FREQUENCY

Data shall be taken at a frequency of no more than every 5 minutes throughout the duration of the test. Data collected shall consist of the following as a minimum: temperature into the loop, temperature out of the loop, ambient air temperature within the test unit compartment, ambient outdoor air temperature and Watts.

2.6 TEST DURATION

The duration of the formation thermal conductivity test shall be a minimum of 40 hours from the initial starting time.

ANNUAL LEAVE

Annual leave is granted to qualifying employees who work 260 days per year, eight hours per day. Annual leave is earned at the rate of 6.66 hours per month for the first year of employment. Thereafter, employees earn at the rate of 10 hours per month. **Central office administrators accrue 13.33 hours per month. Employees must be in pay status two weeks before accruing annual leave. Employees in non-pay status do not earn leave. Annual leave will not be advanced to any individual or classification of employee.**

Employees are encouraged to use their annual leave for rest, relaxation and personal pursuits. It is in both the employee's and the District's best interests for the employee to take time off occasionally. Except in case of emergency, leave requests should be submitted to the employee's direct supervisor at least seven calendar days prior to the requested leave time if at all possible. Supervisors have the right to deny vacation requests not submitted in a timely fashion or when the vacation time falls at a time that would be inconvenient due to work demands or limited staffing.

In order to encourage the use of annual leave, the District will cap accrual at 240 hours (30 days). Employees who currently exceed this cap will be given until June 30, 2008 to bring their balance below the cap either through using their leave or selling their excess leave. Beginning June 30, 2008, employees must use annual leave above the cap or they will lose any hours accrued above 240 hours.

The Payroll Department will notify supervisors which employees have reached, or are close to reaching, this cap. Supervisors will promptly meet with each employee to create a "work off" plan, a copy of which will be submitted to the Superintendent's office.

PERSONAL LEAVE

At the beginning of each fiscal year, each nine or ten month employee will be credited with two (2) personal days of leave at full pay. Unused personal days will be allowed to accumulate up to a total of three (3) days (prorated for hourly employees).

At the beginning of each fiscal year, each twelve month employee will be credited with three (3) personal days of leave at full pay. Unused personal days will be allowed to accumulate up to a total of five (5) days.

Administrators who work 10 months will be granted 24 hours of personal leave, which may accumulate to a maximum 40 hours. Administrators who work 12 months will be granted 32 hours of personal leave which may accumulate to a maximum 52 hours. Personal leave is not to exceed 52 hours in any 12-month period.

Any hours not used at the end of the fiscal year beyond what is allowed to accumulate will be forfeited.

EXCHANGE TIME

Overtime-exempt personnel are generally expected to work eight to ten-hour days and, by nature of their positions, are considered to be available for work assignments within their salary at times other than their regularly scheduled hours. However, there are circumstances under which it is in the District's interest to utilize such personnel for extra assignments with additional remuneration.

Exchange time is considered discretionary time off with pay in recognition of extraordinary or excessive time worked over an extended period or for work on a scheduled day off when required by the employer. Exchange time is only available to overtime-exempt employees and carries no entitlement.

STAFF RECRUITMENT, SELECTION AND HIRING
