1. Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 6:30 p.m. in the Pahrump boardroom with a videoconference link to the Tonopah boardroom. Board members, administrators and guests recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

2. Adoption of Agenda

Mrs. Ward moved adoption of the agenda, and Mr. Tokerud seconded. Those voting aye: Mr. Floyd, Mrs. Forsgren, Mr. Keating, Mr. Pape, Mr. Tokerud and Mrs. Ward. Those voting nay: none. Mr. McNeely had not been appointed. The motion carried with a majority vote.

Mrs. Ward made the motion to approve the consent calendar with a correction to item 3a: page 4, item 16 first line, NCSSO should be changed to NCCTA. Mr. Pape seconded. Those voting aye: Mr. Floyd, Mrs. Forsgren, Mr. Keating, Mr. Pape, Mr. Tokerud and Mrs. Ward. Those voting nay: none. Mr. McNeely had not been appointed. The motion carried with a majority vote.

Mr. McNeely said he has lived in Nye County since 2003 and would have no restrictions on traveling to communities. If appointed, he said he would run in the next election. In response to a question about alleviating overcrowding, he said he lacked sufficient background information with which to make a sound judgment but would look at each community's school and make a choice from the list of considerations because there are different situations in each community. He felt in building schools to house more than 1000 students, the District would run into problems that need to be alleviated. He was not crusading for a particular cause in seeking appointment but would present needs from his area. He espoused a prudent balance between effectiveness and economy.

Ms. Bienenstein said she moved to Nye County a year ago and would have no restrictions on travel. She said she would run for the seat. She said that without understanding the situation at each school, she would set up modulars first, and then investigate year-round schools, which she felt should be optional. She felt schools of less than 1000 students are more effective. She hasn't seen anything in the District that makes her unhappy but felt her enthusiasm would add to the Board team.

- 5. Appointment of Area II Trustee

Mr. Tokerud felt that each of the candidates would do a good job but made the motion to appoint Mr. McNeely because he would better represent Amargosa and Beatty. Mr. Floyd seconded the motion. Mrs. Ward and Mr. Keating both thanked the candidates but agreed with Mr. Tokerud's assessment on representation. There was a unanimous vote in favor. Mr. Keating administered the oath of office, and Mr. McNeely assumed his seat.

- 6a. Superintendent's Report

Dr. Roberts thanked the board for giving him time for a vacation. He was very pleased with the final AYP designations and congratulated principals and teachers. He acknowledged the degree with which principals have been hiring staff. There will be a three-day administrators' meeting in August.

- 6b. Administrator Reports

Mr. Pekarek said his department has gone from 50 vacancies in mid-May to 21. Mr. Hill attended the Career/Technical Education conference in Lake Tahoe. His department is absorbed in writing consortium grants such as staff development using the STAR protocol, drop-out prevention and response to intervention. One would provide for a drop-out specialist. One grant would be for ELL remediation, and another would continue the middle school disruptive program. He announced that Maria Descamps-Pape was selected as Curriculum/ESL Director. Mr. Norton said he has been conducting disciplinary hearings that carried over from the 2006-07 school year.

6c. Board Reports/ Board Committee Reports

Mr. Tokerud said there was a spirited discussion at the Policy Committee meeting.

7. Public Input

None offered.

8. Board Appointments

Mr. Keating appointed Mr. McNeely to the Park and Recreation Committee.

9. Change of Date/Location of Future Board Meetings

Mr. Keating asked board members to state whether they planned to attend the administrators' meeting or the New Teacher Orientation in case there is a quorum.

Mr. Keating made reference to the letter sent by Senator Harry Reid congratulating Dr. Roberts on being named Nevada Superintendent of the Year.

13. Approval of Adequate Yearly Progress Designations & Appeals

Mrs. Olson said there are five high achieving schools with the appeals granted for Clarke Middle School and Round Mountain Middle School. She is requesting the State recognize Hafen and Manse as exemplary turn-around schools after being needs improvement. Manse was needs improvement year 4 and is now high achieving. All appeals were granted. She was not able to appeal two designations but was able to appeal part of the data. Mrs. Ward moved approval of the designations. Mrs. Forsgren seconded, and a unanimous vote was cast. Mr. Keating thanked Mrs. Olson, principals, teachers and students. Dr. Roberts pointed out that about 30% of the District's schools are high achieving. There is about \$80,000 left in AB-580 money that will be dispensed to licensed staff of schools that made AYP.

14. Approval of Middle School Science Curriculum & Textbooks

Mrs. Liberty said the State revised standards on middle school science, which prompted the textbook committee to integrate standards. The new standards require students to have exposure to life, earth and physical science each year in middle school. The committee found a book published by Glencoe that integrates all three in courses 1, 2 and 3. Mrs. Ward made the motion to approve the curriculum and purchase of textbooks. Mrs. Forsgren seconded, and a unanimous vote was recorded. Mrs. Ward said she wished adoptions could be done in January so that teachers have time to prepare.

15. Adoption of High School Science Textbooks

Mrs. Liberty said it would cost \$30,592 to replace outdated textbooks. Mrs. Ward made the motion to approve Integrated Principals of Zoology, Physics: Principles and Problems, and Holt Earth Science. Mr. Pape seconded, and a unanimous vote was cast. Mr. Floyd asked if they could be notified of the funding source in the future.

16. Discussion/Possible Approval of New Advanced Placement Courses & Textbooks

Mrs. Liberty said the cost would be about \$28,000. Mrs. Ward made the motion to approve the new AP courses and the following textbooks: A People's History, volumes 1 and 2; Global History and Geography; Understanding Statistics; Pre-Calculus with Limits; AP U.S. Government; and Perrine's Literature. Mrs. Forsgren seconded, and a unanimous vote was registered. Dr. Roberts said these would be Pahrump High courses although he would like to see if some could be videoconferenced with smaller schools although it is difficult to align schedules. Mr. Hill gave approximate enrollment numbers in the courses. Mrs. Ward said students who take AP courses in high school often aren't challenged enough in those courses in college. Dr. Roberts said students take a national exam at the end of the course, and those with top scores get college credit. Students with AP courses on their transcripts have a better chance of being accepted into universities. Mr. Tokerud asked for a report on how many students enroll in AP courses.

17. Discussion/Possible Approval of School Building Bond Resolution

Mr. Ritchie informed the board that the Debt Management Commission will meet July 31, and the sale of bonds will take place in August. Mrs. Ward moved approval of the bond resolution. Mrs. Forsgren seconded, and a unanimous vote was recorded.

18. Discussion/Possible Approval of New Mileage Rates

Mrs. Ward made the motion to approve District convenience mileage at 48.5 cents per mile and personal convenience mileage at 24.25 cents per mile. Mr. Tokerud seconded, and a unanimous vote was cast.

19. Award of Bid: Sale of Two Modular Classrooms in Round Mountain

Mr. Ritchie said no bids were received. He will re-advertise and expand the area of advertising.

20. Approval of Capital Projects Plan, Report of Indebtedness & Debt Management Policy

Mrs. Ward made the motion to approve all three reports. Mr. Floyd seconded, and a unanimous vote was registered.

21. Discussion/Possible Decisions Regarding SB-328 Concerning Board Member Salaries

Previously, statutes provided for a salary of \$80 per meeting for members and \$85 for the president and clerk, not to exceed six meetings per month. The new legislation provides for a flat salary of \$400 per month. Mr. Tokerud made the motion to change the salary to \$400 per month, and Mrs. Ward seconded. Mrs. Ward said there is no accountability, and there were some trustees in the past who were elected but didn't necessarily do anything. Mr. Keating said he had some of the same concerns. Mr. Tokerud amended his motion to make it effective September 1, 2007. Mrs. Ward declined to amend her second so Mr. Tokerud withdrew his amendment.

Dotty Merrill, NASB Executive Director, said this discussion is no different from that of the legislators. She gave a brief history of board salaries. Legislators recognized that board members do more than just attend board meetings. She said if the board chooses to do nothing, the salaries would change on January 1, 2009. The vote to approve the motion was unanimous and effective immediately.

22. Discussion/Possible Decision Regarding Population of Next High School in Pahrump

Mr. Floyd asked for this item so board members could give their opinions. Dr. Roberts said students in smaller schools get more attention but have fewer courses to choose from. They have more opportunities to play on teams. He recommended looking at the needs in Pahrump. There are currently over 1200 high school students, and Pahrump experiences three to five percent growth each year. The District has land and \$65 million. A second story could house 600 students. They have to consider how big they could build for \$65 million. Money will be the deciding factor. It won't build a school to house 2500. Assessed valuation is down considerably. The population has stalled for now, but it won't stay that way for long. Lower income housing generates more students than big homes.

Mr. Floyd pointed out if they build another high school, they will have to build a middle school also. Mr. Pekarek said the high school nets about 120 students a year. Five years from now it could be 1700. Mr. Keating said another pod could be built onto the middle school. Mr. Norton said that would house close to 400, but the support facilities are bursting at the seams. Mr. Keating suggested that board members prepare questions for staff to research and then have a workshop. Mr. Tokerud said they could consider different configurations at lower grade levels. His concern is the drop-out rate. Mr. Keating said a vo-tech center would help. Dr. Roberts said they could save \$7 to \$9

million on site development if they use the acreage at the existing high school. Building a second school will mean busing more students. Mr. McNeely pointed out that AP courses would be the advantage at larger schools. Mr. Keating said renovating and expanding would save a lot of money. Mrs. Ward said decisions should be based on what is best for the students. Dr. Roberts said it is important for board members to meet once to brainstorm so that staff can set courses of action and gather information. It would be a good idea to ask for public input as well. Mrs. Merrill said most school districts have identified needs and then sought funds, but this District has the advantage of having the funding first. Identifying needs is a community-specific activity. Other districts also have limited geographic areas. She offered to look for pertinent data.

TEMPORARY AND PART-TIME PERSONNEL (SUBSTITUTE TEACHERS)

The Board of Trustees recognizes that changing conditions in the community and unusual personal circumstances of employees make necessary the recruitment and employment of temporary and part-time personnel.

It shall be the responsibility of the Superintendent/designee to develop procedures and regulations governing the employment of temporary and part-time personnel.

Temporary employees are not covered by provisions of the district's negotiated agreement and may not participate in the Nevada Public Employees Retirement System.

A student teacher who has completed not less than four weeks of student teaching may apply to the district for employment as a substitute teacher. The application must include the written approval of the teacher who supervises the student teacher through the Nevada System of Higher Education or accredited postsecondary educational institution and the teacher who is responsible for supervising the student teacher in the classroom. Before assigning a long-term substitute who is not a licensed teacher, the District shall assign a student teacher who satisfies the following requirements.

The District shall ensure that the student teacher is assigned to teach in the subject area and grade level in which the student teacher is completing his/her student teaching. The student teacher must be supervised by a licensed teacher who is available to assist and observe the student teacher on a periodic basis and oversee the management of the classroom, instructional duties and administrative duties of the student teacher. A student teacher so employed is entitled to compensation at the rate of pay authorized for substitute teacher but is not entitled to compensation for time spent completing his/her student teaching or course work.

SCHOOL BOARD NEGOTIATING AGENTS

The Board of Trustees is ultimately responsible for negotiations with employee units. The Superintendent will appoint the Personnel Director and a team of other administrators to conduct direct negotiations, or the Superintendent may recommend that a professional negotiator be appointed. Members of Nye County Association of School Administrators (NCASA) may not be members of the District team negotiating with NCASA. Neither the Superintendent nor board members will serve as the chief negotiator.

If a professional negotiator is appointed, the negotiator's fees or salary will be determined by the Board of Trustees. Whether a professional negotiator or a member of the administrative staff, the duties of the chief negotiator will be as follows:

1. To negotiate in good faith with certified bargaining units to arrive at a mutually satisfactory agreement on wages, hours, and working conditions of employees represented by the units;
2. To interpret the signed negotiated contracts to administrators, and coordinate all aspects of contract administration during the term of various contracts with employee organizations; and
3. To plan, organize, direct, and represent the district in all aspects of contract negotiations including fact finding and arbitration insofar as these activities directly relate to pursuance of negotiated agreements.

The chief negotiator will:

- assemble the members designated by the Superintendent to serve on the negotiation team.
- direct accumulation of data needed for negotiations.
- follow guidelines set forth by the superintendent and/or Board of Trustees as to acceptable agreements and report on a regular basis as to progress being made.
- present projected issues for negotiation to the Board prior to the first meeting with the union's negotiating team and at subsequent Board meetings during the process and follow the directions of the Board of Trustees in presenting the district's positions.
- make recommendations to the Superintendent, the Leadership Team and/or the Board of Trustees as to acceptable agreements.

EMPLOYMENT OF STUDENTS

Students' school responsibilities are to take precedence over non-school related jobs. However, students who need or desire to work part time while attending school will be encouraged to do so, provided their work commitments do not interfere with their achievement in school.

Any child who between the ages of 14 and 18 who has completed the work of the first eight grades may be excused from full-time school attendance and may be permitted to enter proper employment or apprenticeship, by the written authority of the board of trustees excusing the child from such attendance.
