CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 6:02 p.m. in the Amargosa School cafeteria. Board members, administrators and guests recited the Pledge of Allegiance. Roll was called; all members were present except for Edna Forsgren.

ADOPTION OF AGENDA

Mrs. Ward moved adoption of the agenda. Mr. Floyd seconded, and a unanimous vote was recorded.

CONSENT CALENDAR

Mrs. Ward made the motion to approve the February 21 minutes, seven GED requests and 10 home school applications. Mr. Pape seconded, and a unanimous vote was registered.

APPROVAL OF WARRANTS

Mrs. Ward made the motion to approve the warrants, and Mr. McNeely seconded. There was a unanimous vote in favor.

REPORTS

Dr. Roberts reported that the money that has to be paid back to the State isn't due until April 15 although school districts are still hoping for a reprieve. He congratulated the ROTC for scoring a 93.7 on their inspection. Cadets were awarded blue stars for their uniforms. A total of 44 teachers received grant money to pay for 71 Praxis tests.

Mr. Pekarek said there are 16 vacancies, four of which are for 2008-09. There is now a five-day limit for employees to apply for transfers. Mrs. Liberty reported on physical improvements to the school, the new synergistic science lab, many educational programs and accomplishments, and she thanked community partners for their assistance to Amargosa School.

Mrs. Ward read to Manse all-day Kindergarten students, attended three rezoning meetings, attended the ROTC inspection and participated in truancy hearings. Mr. McNeely attended the Beatty PTA meeting. Mr. Pape helped distribute dictionaries. Mr. Tokerud attended rezoning meetings, the ROTC inspection and a meeting with the contractor and architect. He expressed appreciation for the ROTC program. Mr. Floyd attended the ROTC inspection and thought the bleachers and the construction site looked great. Mr. Keating thanked the Amargosa staff for their hospitality.

PUBLIC INPUT

Allison Salmon thanked Mr. Pekarek and Mr. McRae for their work on the rezoning maps and said she prefers map C. She felt an advisory committee of parents, staff and board members might have alleviated some concerns that came up and said there are parents who would like to be involved at the district level.

DISCUSSION/DECISION REGARDING 2008-09 SCHOOL CALENDAR

Mr. Tokerud made the motion to approve option 1, which matches Clark County. Mr. McNeely seconded, and a unanimous vote was recorded.

DISCUSSION REGARDING LOCATION FOR NEW HIGH SCHOOL IN PAHRUMP

Mr. Whimpey provided a written summary of costs associated with the land near Hafen Elementary and the land on Gamebird. He explained that unknown variables, such as the size of water main and whether fields are sod or artificial turf, would certainly influence the cost. Dr. Roberts had suggested the possibility of the college using land near the new high school. There were discussions regarding water rights and possible impacts of a high school placed next to an elementary school. Mr. Whimpey felt the best location was Gamebird, but the lowest cost would be Hafen. Mr. McRae said the no-walk zone would be better at Hafen. Dr. Roberts recommended the Hafen site as well. He felt the personnel costs of a second high school would be around \$1.5 million, and the population isn't growing at the rate to pay for that. He urged the board to take a second look at their decision in light of the anticipated loss of revenue due to home foreclosures.

UPDATE ON REZONING

Mr. Pekarek provided information on the types of questions that came up at rezoning meetings. Mr. McRae provided a list of student counts among the four scenarios. Mr. Tokerud suggested moving sixth graders next year rather than doing it later and possibly having to rezone again. Dr. Roberts felt sixth graders belonged in elementary school, and that would give Clarke Middle School another five years before it would be at capacity. Mr. Pekarek said that would require building another elementary school sooner. Dr. Roberts said there's a tremendous amount of work to be done in preparation for rezoning in a short amount of time. Mr. Pekarek said they need to know how many students will be at each school and at each grade level before they can start the transfer process. Mr. McRae said once boundaries are set,

they would identify students attending schools they are not zoned for. The board requested updated information on adding sixth graders at the next meeting.

DISCUSSION/DECISION REGARDING POLICY READINGS

The board discussed the letter from Attorney Paul Anderson, which stated that the board's own policy required there be two policy readings. In addition, as long as copies are provided to the public, the policies do not require formal reading.

DISCUSSION/POSSIBLE APPROVAL OF FIRST READING, POLICY 0520 – OFFICERS, DUTIES & SALARIES

Mrs. Ward moved approval of the first reading with the following sentence added to the first paragraph "No trustee shall serve as president more than two consecutive terms." Mr. Tokerud seconded, and a unanimous vote was recorded.

DISCUSSION/POSSIBLE APPROVAL OF FIRST READING, POLICY 5556 – INTERNET & SCHOOL NETWORK ACCEPTABLE USE

Mrs. Ward made the motion to approve the first reading and changing the first sentence of the sixth paragraph to read "No individual will install software, diskettes or other media from home on school district equipment due to licensing, virus and support issues unless the software with appropriate licensing is donated to and approved by NCSD." Mr. Pape seconded, and a unanimous vote was cast.

DISCUSSION/POSSIBLE APPROVAL OF FIRST READING, POLICY 7142 – ASSIGNMENT OF HOME-SCHOOLED STUDENTS

Mrs. Ward moved approval of the first reading, and Mr. Floyd seconded. There were concerns that a parent could override the principal on placement when a student is two years behind, and that would affect the school's scores. Mr. Tokerud made a motion to table this policy until the next meeting. Mrs. Ward seconded, and a unanimous vote was recorded.

Mrs. Ward made the motion to deny the appeal and uphold the dismissal, and Mr. McNeely seconded. Those voting aye: Mr. Floyd, Mr. McNeely, Mr. Pape, Mr. Tokerud and Mrs. Ward. Those voting nay: Mr. Keating. The motion passed with a majority vote.

DECISION REGARDING POSSIBLE STUDENT RIGHTS VIOLATIONS

Mrs. Ward moved that no rights were violated. Mr. McNeely seconded, and a unanimous vote was cast.

APPROVAL OF FUTURE AGENDA ITEMS

Mrs. Ward said she would like a discussion on all-day Kindergarten.

ADJOURNMENT

Mr. McNeely moved to adjourn at 9:31 p.m. Mr. Floyd seconded, and a unanimous vote was registered.

SUBJECT: Sixth Graders

I recommend that sixth graders remain at Rosemary Clarke Middle School for the coming school year. While I view it as educationally sound to move them to the elementary schools, I do not feel we can accomplish this for the next year for the following reasons:

- There are currently 14 instructors for the sixth grade at the middle school
- At least 20 teachers would be required to provide enough sections at elementary schools
- We do not know what financial hits the District will take in the biennium
- In the short time we have after the rezoning decision, we don't know the impact on classrooms, books, furniture, etc.
- We could expect a negative impact on RCMS teachers with such short notice of job assignments for next year and the resulting effect on staff morale.

It might be feasible to look at this option in another year.

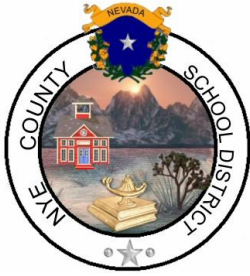

We are requesting approval to go self-insured for Workers Comp effective July 1, 2008.

We would like to contract with Tom Nelson of FirstTier Administrators to administer the plan. Tom Nelson has administered this same plan for Lyon and Douglas Counties for the past 10 years and both counties have been extremely happy with him.

In doing a review, we have compared the total premium paid out versus claims and have realized that if we had been self-insured our savings would have been approximately \$1.1 million dollars.

Our start-up fees to go self-insured for Workers Comp are budgeted through the general fund and would be approximately \$76,985 (breakdown below):

OFFICERS, DUTIES & SALARIES

Officers of the Board of Trustees:

The officers of the Board of Trustees of the Nye County School District shall be President, Vice-President and Clerk. Officers shall be elected at the first meeting in January of each year. Each shall serve for a term of one year. **No trustee shall serve as President more than two consecutive terms.**

Immediately after the organization of the Board of Trustees, the Clerk shall file the names of the officers and members with the Nevada State Department of Education and the County **Auditor**.

All members of the Board of Trustees shall be bonded in the amount of no less than \$100,000.

Salaries of President, Clerk and other Trustees:

Each member receives a salary of \$400 per month. Board members are covered under worker's compensation while performing their duties.

Duties of Officers:

1. The President of the Board shall have powers as prescribed by Robert's Rules of Order, Newly Revised.
 - a. All committees shall be appointed by the President of the Board unless ordered by the Board.
 - b. The President shall preside at all meetings of the Board of Trustees. He or she shall conduct all meetings in accordance with the policies, regulations and by-laws adopted by the Board. He or she shall appoint committees of study when directed by the Board. He or she shall have the right, as other members of the Board, to discuss questions.
 - c. It shall be the prerogative of the President, if there is no objection from a board member present, to move an agenda item to a different position during the course of any meeting.
 - d. The President shall have the authority to sign all necessary documents related to the functions of the Nye County School District and those required by law under Nevada Revised Statutes.
2. The Vice-President of the Board shall perform the duties of the President in the absence of the President and shall perform other functions as designated by the Board.

3. The Clerk of the Board shall preside in the absence of the President and Vice-President, sign papers, and perform other functions as designated.
 - a. The Clerk shall keep the minutes of all meetings and transactions of the Board of Trustees, and shall sign all necessary documents related to the functions of the Nye County School District and those required by law under Nevada Revised Statutes.
 - b. The duties of Clerk, with the exception of signatory powers, may be assigned to a competent employee of the Nye County School District.

INTERNET AND SCHOOL NETWORK ACCEPTABLE USE

INTENT: The use of the Nye County School District (NCSD) networks and Internet access is intended to aid in education process and research.

The access, provided by the NCSD, to the Internet and school networks shall be used to facilitate the exchange of information consistent with the district educational objectives.

NCSD school network access shall not be used to transmit any communication where the meaning of the message, or its transmission or distribution, would violate any applicable law or regulation, or which is obscene, abusive or otherwise likely to be offensive.

Users of NCSD Internet and school network access shall promote efficient use of the school networks to minimize and avoid, if possible, congestion of the networks and interference with the work of other users of the networks. Users of NCSD access to the Internet and school network services shall respect the rights and property of others and shall not improperly access, misappropriate or misuse the information or files of other users. When using dial-in access from home, the user agrees not to be on-line during regular school hours for non-school business.

Access, beyond the NCSD networks, shall conform to acceptable use policies of those sources. This includes, but is not limited to, NCSD policies, administrative regulations and procedures.

No individual will install software, diskettes or other media from home on school district equipment due to licensing, virus and support issues **unless the software with appropriate licensing is donated to and approved by NCSD. Staff may install NCSD software on home/personal computers when home use is expressly permitted by the software license.**

Teachers will use the current grading software approved by the District.

This policy is subject to annual review.

7142 ASSIGNMENT OF HOME-SCHOOLED STUDENTS TO CLASSES AND GRADE LEVELS

Students will be assigned to grade level and classes based upon records kept by parents, other evidence of course completion, standardized test data **and/or school assessments**. The site administrator/designee will determine grade placement and assignment to classes.

NRS 392.033 Regulations prescribing requirements for promotion to high school; effect of failure to comply; evaluation of course of study or credits of pupil who transfers from junior high or middle school; placement on academic probation; enrollment of homeschooled children in high school.

1. The State Board shall adopt regulations which prescribe the courses of study required for promotion to high school, including, without limitation, English, mathematics, science and social studies. The regulations may include the credits to be earned in each course.

2. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 4, the board of trustees of a school district shall not promote a pupil to high school if the pupil does not complete the course of study or credits required for promotion. The board of trustees of the school district in which the pupil is enrolled may provide programs of remedial study to complete the courses of study required for promotion to high school.

3. The board of trustees of each school district shall adopt a procedure for evaluating the course of study or credits completed by a pupil who transfers to a junior high or middle school from a junior high or middle school in this State or from a school outside of this State.

4. The board of trustees of each school district shall adopt a policy that allows a pupil who has not completed the courses of study or credits required for promotion to high school to be placed on academic probation and to enroll in high school. A pupil who is on academic probation pursuant to this subsection shall complete appropriate remediation in the subject areas that he failed to pass. The policy must include the criteria for eligibility of a pupil to be placed on academic probation. A parent or guardian may elect not to place his child on academic probation but to remain in grade 8.

5. A homeschooled child who enrolls in a public high school shall, upon initial enrollment:

(a) Provide documentation sufficient to prove that the child has successfully completed the courses of study required for promotion to high school through an accredited program of homeschool study recognized by the board of trustees of the school district;

(b) Demonstrate proficiency in the courses of study required for promotion to high school through an examination prescribed by the board of trustees of the school district; or

(c) Provide other proof satisfactory to the board of trustees of the school district demonstrating competency in the courses of study required for promotion to high school.
