



Interim council is now acting council for the Ambler Tribe.

Regular school board meeting is held next week, August 23<sup>rd</sup> and 24<sup>th</sup> via teleconference due to Covid.

The Ambler Gym is still a concern. There was a discussion about the gym and concerns about its safety.

**Principal Reports:**

*Mitigation Plan:* Constantly being updated and followed. Masks are required by anyone entering the building. District is in the process of ordering more masks for the youth. Social distancing is required. A minimum of 3 feet is required. We are consistently reminding students proper handwashing etiquette. Hand sanitizer is available through teachers. Disinfecting of desks and other materials is done with spray bottles in the classrooms. Contact tracing and quarantining are laid out in the mitigation plan along with testing.

*Student Activities:* Working on getting a breakdown of funding for the school. Last purchase was in March, balance: \$12,417.57.

*Culture Trip:* Mitigation plan in place to do some local things with the HS, new drones, arctic ovens, and lots of other equipment to use. Plan a date for a weekend at Illisagvik. 8/19-8/20 dates for possible four-wheeler ride with primary.

*Sports Update:* Job postings posted for volleyball, cross country, and wrestling. We are working on travel, sports schedules, physicals. Brett is working with Maniilaq to get a provider out to complete physicals.

Lawrence- Welcome Sarah back and to her new position and looking forward to hopefully having family nights again.

Nellie- So happy to hear Sarah's name in the list of applicants and happy she took the position. I am excited for monthly meetings. Today is Tobi's birthday and my grandbaby was born today!

Gladys- So happy to have Sarah back and excited for the year. We are off to a good start with ASC meetings and will continue to meet. Wish the staff good luck with the school year. I hope we can get something started with open gym and gathering for sewing nights.

**Principal Reports:**

- Sports/Clubs/ANSEP- Desirae Cleveland placed 1<sup>st</sup> at the Kiana meet. We are super proud of Desirae and excited to see where the season takes us. We are needing to hold interviews for Mixed-Six Volleyball and will need 2 members of the ASC to help with those. We are looking to CO-OP with upriver. Sarah will be in communication with Brett. Nellie Cleveland is our Spelling Bee advisor and Aubrielle Champagne is the Battle of the Books advisor. ANSEP applications are due for students in grades 6<sup>th</sup>-8<sup>th</sup>. Applications are due by September 24<sup>th</sup>. The applications have been handed out and students are working on those in their LA class.
- Attendance: Our attendance was at 82% for the first 24 days of school. The school will be announcing weekly attendance percentages on the VHF and morning announcements. The ASC recommends looking/purchasing incentives for attendance. We will be holding Quarterly celebrations for students with good attendance.
- Covid Update: The Ambler School is looking to hire a Covid Screener. The position is a part-time position that consists of them completing the antigen screener for staff and students. Sarah will bring pictures of the school lunchroom and classrooms with the desk shields in place.
- Student Account: Using a purchase card for orders. A monthly statement is sent to District with receipts of purchases. Ivisions will be updated with current account amount.
- Culture trip: Our high school Inupiaq class planned a culture trip to Onion Portage for 2 nights, 3 days. They took 8 high school students and chaperones were Mary Douglas, Andrea Kelly, Alex Kurtzer, Nellie Cleveland, and certified staff member Harry Schrimsher. All attendees had a negative antigen screener prior to the trip. The students

set net, hiked, cooked, and cut wood. Nigraugruk made a slideshow from the pictures taken at camp and shared that with the ASC. We would like to get something going for the elementary students. The ASC mentioned working with Maniilaq to see about money for supplies and if there is money for new teachers to be taken out.

- Staff Appreciation: There is planning going on to show staff appreciation throughout the year and inviting local/region/state entities to help with boosting morale. Events might include game night with prizes, staff birthday celebrations, potluck, staff camping trip, etc.. Looking at John Hattie's effect size chart, Collective Teacher Efficacy is at 1.57 for effect size. Having collective teacher efficacy is crucial in ensuring student growth.

**ASC Comments:**

Nellie Cleveland: Great to have a 2<sup>nd</sup> meeting. It seems every year we get to the 2<sup>nd</sup> meeting and then we start slacking. Let's continue to have meetings. I am excited for staff appreciation and looking forward to hopefully having staff attend an ASC meeting.

Lawrence Jones: Congratulations to Desirae. I hope she continues to do well in Cross Country and her times get better. It's good to see someone from Ambler coming out on top. Its positive and exciting for the community. I am glad you had the Culture Trip. It was awesome to see the slideshow and the fun the kids were having. I want to see our attendance go up. It seems attendance is always like this in the fall, but we do need to find ways to encourage our students to attend.

Gladys Jones: I want to see another big trip with the parks service again, like the Sand Dunes trip. It is priceless seeing kids happy and carefree while out on the country. I am glad the culture trip happened. We appreciate the hard work of staff and all that they do. It would be fun to get a day trip for students and staff. It is great to have meetings and let's continue to make sure we meet.






