- ✓ Updates to clarify when staff may go unmasked within NWABSD facilities

2. Physical Distancing

- ✓ Desk shield use during instruction and mealtimes
- ✓ Minimum distance is 3ft; strive for 6ft
- ✓ Cohorting or podding is being used to reduce the number of close contacts per exposure
- ✓ Update to allow whole school gatherings while physical distancing and total capacity does not exceed 50%

3. Handwashing & Respiratory Etiquette

- ✓ Taught and reinforced in all schools



4. Cleaning & Maintaining Healthy Facilities

- ✓ Schools have regular cleaning schedules
- ✓ Contaminated areas are closed off and then deep cleaned
- ✓ Air filters provided to areas in need

5. Contact Tracing

- ✓ Schools work with families and student/staff schedules to contract trace within our buildings
- ✓ Parents and/or staff of possible exposed students are notified of that exposure

- ✓ Updates to allow students and staff that are up to date on vaccinations to remain out of quarantine if they are a close contact or have a positive household member

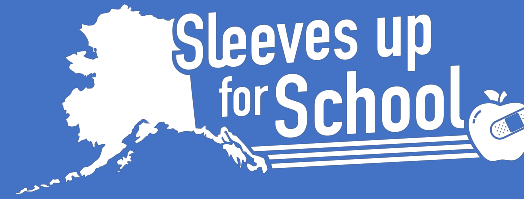


6. Diagnostic Screening Testing

- ✓ CUE Covid diagnostic screening testing on hold at all sites including the District Office
- ✓ Updating informed consent letters and diagnostic protocols
- ✓ Update to include required testing before District travel for all staff in addition to the students
- ✓ Update on suspending travel for an additional full 5 days after recovering from COVID per Maniilaq guidance
- ✓ Update to include exemptions for people with the 90-day letter

- ✓ Coordination with Maniilaq and Public Health
- ✓ Staff booster and flu vaccination clinic for all Kotzebue-based staff
- ✓ 5+ vaccinations available regionwide
- ✓ Open gym facility use requires individual participant vaccination and full masking
- ✓ **Facility use is a HUGE incentive for vaccinations**
- ✓ **85% Vaccination rate with students and staff allows for the discontinuation of desk shields**

8. Appropriate Accommodations for Children with Disabilities



Depending on individual needs:

- ✓ Cellular iPads are available for assessment as needed
- ✓ Students may be still attending in person during a Red High-Risk Operational Zone
- ✓ Transportation modifications as needed
- ✓ Increased use of tele-therapy services

Continuity of Services

Green Low-Risk Operational Zone

- ✓ Services regularly provided for in-person
- ✓ Meals occur at the schools
- ✓ Teachers prepare 2 weeks of remote learning materials ahead “just-in-case”

Red High-Risk Operational Zone

- ✓ 1:1 student devices go home for remote learning
- ✓ Food is packed to go home
- ✓ Learning materials go home
- ✓ Arrange for students to get help as needed

Other COVID Related Updates

- ✓ On 1/26/22 the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) withdrew the enforcement of the Emergency Temporary Standard (ETS) that included mandatory vaccinations or testing for organizations with at least 100 employees
- ✓ OSHA is prioritizing its resources to focus on finalizing a permanent COVID-19 Healthcare Standard
- ✓ Alaska has an approved OSHA Plan that may need to be updated to include any new standards
- ✓ The District is not required to implement new OSHA standards until the State updates the State plan

any questions? **Tillie Ticket:** I don't have any questions. I hope all the teachers that have COVID are ok. It's just so heartbreaking. What can we do to help our kids raise grades and attendance? Breaks my heart why we're not eligible to play sports. It's what keeps our kids in school. The travel for basketball and cross country. **Norma Ballot:** We started off really strong, the kids were on task. Makes me want to cry. The boys were on task-we have evidence, we'd take pictures and send them in. We got disorganized-just stopped submitting because we weren't getting feedback. My youngest was on his computer. Parents and kids got burnt out. As a parent I'm tired from teaching kids. We're still trying to adjust from October. As parents we just gave up. **Maureen Ticket:** I also work full-time and have health issues. I also get frustrated I can't help my kids during the day. **Tanya Ballot:** The tribe is doing everything we can and helping our community that our staff is over worked and we're falling apart. There's strife in the community. We're trying to do the best we can. It's hard to understand what everyone is going through. I think it's only going to get worse before it gets better. There's limitations and expectations. **Andie Zink:** We hear you and also feel the frustration. The entire school staff has been doing everything possible to help students with homework and instruction. Teachers have made over 5800 log entries, which means, they have tried to contact parents and students over 5800 times since the beginning of the school year. Teachers have shared their frustration on not being able to get in contact with parents or students because telephone numbers are blocked, they get hung up on, have incorrect numbers, won't respond to vhf announcement (teachers make countless announcements on vhf over the day), emails or letters sent home. So, we hear and share your frustrations. However, we need to concentrate on the positive. How can we help you help us help the students? How can we help parents/guardians with getting their students to school when in green? As a collective group, all entities involved, we need to work together on solutions. **Maureen Ticket:** There's a lot of money in the account from senior funds, we can use that for incentives for students. We also need encouragement for vaccinations for the community so we can have open gym. We're at 52% we need to help raise that. **Norma Ballot:** It's hard to have kids go to school when it's cold and dark. The school has honda's they can use to pick up students. I have 3 boys that could use a ride.

I still argue for a bigger school, bigger gym and we're working on it at the Regional School Board meetings. We're going to lobby soon. I won't give up on mentioning it. We are on the priority list for funding for pre-k and new high school. We need to keep encouraging kids to come to school. **Norma Ballot:** I will try to give it my best shot. It's my first time being on a board. **Tanya Ballot:** Thank you. I would like to see our kids back at school. If anyone, we need a bigger school and bigger gym. We need to be careful also because there's apprehension about the vaccine. People have a right to vaccinate or not vaccinate their kids or themselves. Right now, we're at 52%. Remember, our village has more kids than adults. I

2020 Senior Class Funds Recommendation – attachment C: **Clyde Ramoth**- Can Andie Zink speak to this. **Andie Zink**- read attachment C, explained the need to Establish a sunset clause in which the unexpended funds will revert to the Davis-Ramoth Memorial School general student activities account at the end of the school year, May 10th, 2024. Just like scholarships such as the UA scholarship, they have up to a year to utilize it for educational purposes. Most scholarships have an expiration date. The recommendation is that we also have an expiration date for the equal use of the monies raised by the students in that graduating class, so that it is not carried over indefinitely. The monies within the timeframe can be used for those students for academic endeavors only or can chose to donate it back the students general activity funds account to be used to benefit all students. **Tanya Ballot**- if a student did not graduate, can that student use their portion of the money towards their GED. **Andie Zink**- if there is a cost associated with the GED program for that student, then yes. The monies can only be used within the legal parameters set forth by the state, and the board policy. **Clyde Ramoth** – Any other questions. Article 12 - Section 7 - Semester Credit Rule

All first semester freshmen are immediately eligible for the first semester. After the first semester of the freshman year, all students must meet the following criteria to remain eligible for interscholastic competition (Any credited course listed on a student's transcript may be counted toward the semester units needed for eligibility.):

A. Credit

All second-semester freshmen, sophomores and juniors, as well as seniors who are not on track to graduate, must have passed at least 2.5 units of credit, or the equivalent, toward graduation, during the previous semester.

All second semester seniors who are on track to graduate must have passed at 2.0 units of credit, or the equivalent, toward graduation, during the previous semester.

All first semester seniors must have passed at least 2.5 units of credit, or the equivalent, toward graduation, during the previous semester in order to be eligible anytime during the current semester.
