REGULATIONS: 207-R

I. OFFICER'S RESPONSIBILITIES

A. Chair.

1. The chair, when present, shall preside at all meetings of the School Board, countersign all orders upon the treasurer for claims allowed by the School Board, represent the School District in all actions and perform all duties a chair usually performs.
2. In case of absence, inability, or refusal of the clerk to draw orders for the payment of money authorized by a vote of the majority of the School Board to be paid, the chair may draw the orders, or the office of the clerk may be declared vacant by the chair and treasurer and filled by appointment.

B. Treasurer.

1. The treasurer shall deposit the funds of the School District in the official depository.
2. The treasurer shall make all reports which may be called for by the School Board and perform all duties a treasurer usually performs.
3. In the event there are insufficient funds on hand to pay valid orders presented to the treasurer, the treasurer shall receive, endorse, and process the orders in accordance with Minnesota Statute.

C. Clerk.

1. The clerk shall keep a record of all meetings in the books provided.
2. Within three days after an election, the clerk shall notify all persons elected of their election.
3. On or before August 15 of each year, the clerk shall:
 - a. file with the School Board a report of the revenues, expenditures and balances in each fund for the preceding fiscal year.
 - b. make and transmit to the Commissioner certified reports, showing:

- (1) condition and value of school property;
 - (2) revenues and expenditures in detail, and such other financial information required by law, rule, or as may be called for by the Commissioner;
 - (3) length of school term and enrollment and attendance by grades; and
 - (4) other items of information as called for by the commissioner.
4. The clerk shall enter into the clerk's record book copies of all reports and of the teachers' term reports, and of the proceedings of any meeting, and keep an itemized account of all expenses of the School District.
 5. The clerk shall furnish to the county auditor, on or before October 10, an attested copy of the clerk's record, showing the amount of money voted by the School District or the School Board for school purposes.
 6. The clerk shall draw and sign all orders upon the treasurer for the payment of money for bills allowed by the School Board for salaries of officers and for teachers' wages and all claims, to be countersigned by the chair.
 7. The clerk shall perform such duties as required by the Minnesota Election Law or other applicable laws relating to the conduct of elections.
- D. Vice-Chair.
- The vice-chair shall perform the duties of the chair in the event of the chair's temporary absence.
- E. Superintendent.
1. The Superintendent shall be an ex officio, nonvoting member of the School Board.
 2. The Superintendent shall perform the following:
 - a. visit and supervise the schools in the School District, report and make recommendations about their condition when advisable or on request by the School Board;
 - b. recommend to the School Board employment and dismissal of teachers;

- c. Superintend school grading practices and examinations for promotions;
- d. make reports required by the Commissioner; and
- e. perform other duties prescribed by the School Board.

OPEN SCHOOL BOARD MEETINGS

POLICY: 209

Regular School Board meetings shall be held the second Monday of each month.

A majority of the voting members of the School Board shall constitute a quorum. No contract shall be made or authorized, except at a Regular meeting of the Board or at a Special meeting at which all members are present or of which all members have had notice.

Special meetings may be called by the Chair or Clerk or any three members upon notice mailed to each member at least three days prior thereto. For a special meeting, the School Board shall post written notice of the date, time, place and purpose of the meeting on the principal bulletin board located in the district office. The notice shall be mailed or otherwise delivered to each person who has filed a written request for notice of special meetings. The School Board's actions at a special meeting are limited to those topics included in the notice.

Emergency meetings are special meetings called because of circumstances that, in the judgement of the School Board, require immediate consideration. Posted or published notice of an emergency meeting shall not be required. However, the School Board shall make good faith efforts to provide notice of emergency meetings to each news medium that has filed a written request for notice. Emergency meeting notices shall include the subject of the meeting.

CLOSED SCHOOL BOARD MEETINGS

POLICY: 210

SCHOOL BOARD MEETINGS FOR THE FOLLOWING SPECIFIED PURPOSES MAY OR MUST BE CLOSED TO THE PUBLIC AS DEFINED BY MINNESOTA STATUTE

Strategy for Labor Negotiations

Minnesota law specifies that the School Board may, by a majority vote in a public meeting, decide to hold a closed meeting to consider strategy for labor negotiations with organized bargaining units, including negotiation strategies or developments or discussion and review of labor negotiation proposals, conducted pursuant to Minnesota Statutes. The time of commencement and place of the closed meeting shall be announced at the public meeting. A written roll of members and all other persons present at the closed meeting shall be made available to the public after the closed meeting. The proceedings of a closed meeting to discuss negotiation strategies shall be tape recorded at the expense of the governing body and shall be preserved by it for two years after the contract is signed and shall be made available to the public after all labor contracts are signed by the governing body for the current budget period.

Sessions Closed by Bureau of Mediation Services

All negotiations, mediation sessions, and hearings between the School Board and its employees or their representatives are public meetings except when otherwise provided by the Commissioner of the Bureau of Mediation Services.

Preliminary Consideration of Charges

The School Board shall close one or more meetings for preliminary consideration of allegations or charges against an individual subject to its authority. If the School Board members conclude that discipline of any nature may be warranted as a result of those specific charges or allegations, further meetings or hearings relating to those specific charges or allegations held after that conclusion is reached must be open. A meeting must also be open at the request of the individual who is the subject of the meeting.

Performance Evaluations

The School Board may close a meeting to evaluate the performance of an individual who is subject to its authority. The School Board shall identify the individual to be evaluated prior to closing a meeting. At its next open meeting, the School Board shall summarize its conclusions regarding the evaluation. A meeting must be open at the request of the individual who is the subject of the meeting.

Attorney-Client Meeting

A meeting may be closed if permitted by the attorney-client privilege. Attorney-client privilege applies when litigation is imminent or threatened, or when the School Board needs advice above the level of general legal advice, i.e., regarding specific acts and their legal consequences.

Dismissal Hearing

A hearing on the dismissal of a licensed teacher shall be public or private at the teacher's discretion. A hearing regarding placement of teachers on unrequested leave of absence shall be public.

A hearing on dismissal of a student pursuant to the Pupil Fair Dismissal Act shall be closed unless the pupil, parent or guardian requests an open hearing.

Coaches; Opportunity to Respond

If the School Board has declined to renew the coaching contract of a licensed or nonlicensed head varsity coach, it must notify the coach within 14 days of the decision. If the coach requests the reasons for nonrenewal, the School Board must give the coach the reasons in writing within 10 days of receiving the request. On the request of the coach, the School Board must provide the coach with a reasonable opportunity to respond to the reasons at a School Board meeting. The meeting may be open or closed at the election of the coach, unless the meeting is closed as required by Minnesota Statute to discuss educational or certain other nonpublic data.

Meetings to Discuss Certain "Not Public Data"

Any portion of a meeting must be closed if the following types of data are discussed:

Data that would identify alleged victims or reporters of criminal sexual conduct, domestic abuse, or maltreatment of minors or vulnerable adults;

Active investigative data collected or created by a law enforcement agency; or

Educational data, health data, medical data, welfare data, or mental health data that are not public data.

Purchase and Sale of Property

The School Board may close a meeting to determine the asking price for real or personal property to be sold to the School District; to review confidential or nonpublic appraisal data; and to develop offers or counteroffers for the purchase or sale of real or personal property.

Before closing the meeting, the School Board must identify on the record the particular real or personal property that is the subject of the closed meeting. The closed meeting must be tape recorded at the expense of the School District. The tape must be preserved for eight (8) years after the date of the meeting and be made available to the public after

the meeting has been purchased or sold or the School Board has abandoned the purchase or sale. The real or personal property that is the subject of the closed meeting must be specifically identified in the tape. A list of School Board members and all other persons present at the closed meeting must be made available to the public after the closed meeting.

An agreement reached that is based on an offer considered at a closed meeting is contingent on its approval by the School Board at an open meeting. The actual purchase or sale must be approved at an open meeting and the purchase price or sale price is public data.

Security Matters

The School Board may close a meeting to receive security briefings and reports to discuss issues related to security systems, to discuss emergency response procedures and to discuss security deficiencies in or recommendations regarding public services, infrastructure, and facilities if disclosure of the information discussed would pose a danger to public safety or compromise security procedures or responses.

Financial issues related to security matters must be discussed and all related financial decisions must be made at an open meeting.

Before closing a meeting, the School Board must refer to the facilities, systems, procedures, services, or infrastructures to be considered during the closed meeting. The closed meeting must be tape recorded at the expense of the School district and the recording must be preserved for at least four (4) years.

Other Meetings

Other meetings shall be closed as provided by law.

Procedures for Closing a Meeting

The School Board shall provide notice of a closed meeting just as for an open meeting. A School Board meeting may be closed only after a majority vote at a public meeting. Before closing a meeting, the School Board shall state on the record the specific authority permitting the meeting to be closed and shall describe the subject to be discussed.

**PUBLIC PARTICIPATION IN SCHOOL
BOARD MEETINGS AND WORK
SESSIONS**

POLICY: 212

The School Board recognizes the value of participation by the public in deliberations and decisions on School District matters. At the same time, the School Board recognizes the importance of conducting orderly and efficient proceedings, with opportunity for expression of all participants' respective views.

The purpose of this policy is to assure open and orderly public discussion as well as to protect the due process and privacy rights of individuals under the law.

It is the policy of the School Board to encourage discussion by citizens of subjects related to the management of the School District at School Board meetings and work sessions. The School Board may adopt reasonable time, place, and manner restrictions on public expression in order to facilitate free discussion by all interested parties.

The School Board shall, as a matter of policy, protect the legal rights to privacy and due process of employees and students.

All citizens, including students, of the School District have a right to an opportunity to be heard by the School Board, within the limits of the law and this policy and subject to reasonable time, place, and manner restrictions. Among the rights available to the public is the right to access public data as provided by Minnesota Statutes.

School District employees and School District students have a legal right to privacy related to matters which may come before the School Board as provided by Minnesota Law.

The School Board may decide to hold certain types of public meetings where the public will not be invited to address the School Board. Possible examples are work sessions and Board retreats. The public is entitled to notice of these meetings and will be allowed to attend these meetings, but the public will not be allotted time during the meeting to address the Board.

**PUBLIC PARTICIPATION IN SCHOOL
BOARD MEETINGS**

REGULATIONS: 212-R

The following procedures will be utilized to facilitate public participation in regular School Board meetings. The School Board will provide a specified period of time at the Board's regular monthly meeting where citizens may address the School Board on any topic, subject to the limitations of Policy 211. The School Board reserves the right to allocate a specific period of time for this purpose and limit time for speakers accordingly.

1. Citizens who wish to have a subject discussed at a public School Board meeting are encouraged to notify the Superintendent's office in advance of the School Board meeting. The citizen should provide his or her name, address, the name of group represented (if any), and the subject to be covered or the issue to be addressed.
2. Citizens who wish to address the School Board on a particular subject should identify the subject and identify agenda item(s) to which their comments pertain.
3. The School Board Chair will recognize one speaker at a time, and will rule out of order other speakers who are not recognized. Only those speakers recognized by the Chair are allowed to speak. Comments by others are out of order. Individuals who interfere with or interrupt speakers, the School Board, or the proceedings may be directed to leave.
4. The School Board retains the discretion to limit discussion of any agenda item to a reasonable period of time as determined by the School Board. If a group or organization wishes to address the School Board on a topic, the School Board reserves the right to require designation of one or more representatives or spokespersons to speak on behalf of the group or organization.
5. Matters proposed for placement on the agenda which may involve data privacy concerns, which may involve preliminary allegations, or which may be potentially libelous or slanderous in nature shall not be considered in public, but shall be processed as determined by the School Board in accordance with governing law.
6. The School Board Chair shall promptly rule out of order any discussion by any person, including School Board members, that would violate the provisions of state or federal law, this policy or the statutory rights of privacy of an individual.

7. Personal attacks by anyone addressing the School Board are unacceptable. Persistence in such remarks by an individual shall terminate that person's privilege to address the School Board.

Xcel Energy must relocate its power poles at the Oakwood Elementary/Central Services Facility site, due to the widening of County Highway 101 by Hennepin County. Xcel must acquire an easement from the District for maintenance of the power line. The administration has negotiated a price of \$27,432 as compensation for the reduced value of the District’s property. In addition, Xcel Energy has agreed to pay the appraisal cost of \$5,000, for the total reimbursement to the District of \$32,432.

The agreed-upon price is based on the value per square foot determined by an independent appraiser. The size of the easement has been reduced from 34,675 square feet to 17,145 square feet.

The attached documents grant the easement to Xcel Energy.

OVERHANG ELECTRIC EASEMENT

KNOW ALL BY THESE PRESENTS, That the undersigned, hereinafter called “Grantor”, in consideration of the sum of \$1.00 and other good and valuable consideration in hand paid by **NORTHERN STATES POWER COMPANY**, a Minnesota Corporation, d/b/a Xcel Energy, the receipt and sufficiency whereof is hereby acknowledged, do hereby, grant unto said Company its successors and assigns, hereinafter called “Grantee”, an **overhang** easement with the right, privilege and authority to use overhang easement maintain its facilities located upon adjacent property for the transmission and distribution of electrical energy, said overhang easement located on the following described land situated in the County of Hennepin, State of Minnesota, (hereinafter called “Premises”) to-wit:

The grant of easement herein contained shall also include the right of reasonable access to said easement across the Premises for the purpose of exercising the rights granted herein, together with the right to remove from Easement Area any structure, trees, shrubbery, or other object or obstruction which in Grantee's opinion interferes with said facilities or the removal of which may be reasonably necessary for the construction or maintenance thereof. The grant of easement herein contained shall also include the right of reasonable use of the Premises adjacent to the Easement Area by Grantee for tree trimming purposes and for temporary construction area during construction, repair or replacement of said electric facilities.

Except as otherwise provided herein or in any Underground Distribution Agreement between the Grantor and Grantee covering the above described Premises, Grantee shall, after use of the above, or after the exercise of any rights granted herein, restore the lands subject to this easement to as near their original condition as is reasonably possible and remove therefrom all debris, spoils, and equipment resulting from or used in connection with said installation.

In the event that Grantee performs any construction, maintenance, reconstruction or replacement of facilities for the transmission and distribution of electrical energy located within the easement, Grantee shall:

1. Conduct such activities at a time that reasonably minimizes interference with school activities;
2. Be responsible for making such activities or excavation safe from school students on site; and
3. Restore any landscaping, driveways, sidewalks, conduits, cable or other improvements within the easement area to the condition they were in prior to the Grantee undertaking such activity.
4. Indemnify, defend and hold harmless the School District from any claims, demands, legal actions, damages and costs including attorney's fees resulting from Grantee's negligent use of this easement.


Grantor further agrees that no structure or obstruction will be erected or permitted or any trees planted on or within said Easement Area, that he will not change the ground elevation thereof without the written consent of Grantee, or perform any act which will interfere with or endanger said electrical facilities.

Grantor covenants with Grantee, its successors and assigns, that Grantor is the owner of the above described premises and has the right to sell and convey an easement in the manner and form aforesaid.

The rights herein granted are subject to existing rights of way for highways, roads, railroads, pipelines, canals, laterals, ditches or other electric transmission lines and telegraph and telephone lines heretofore granted across any part of the lands affected by this instrument.

This instrument and the covenants and agreements contained herein are binding upon the Grantor, his personal representatives, heirs, successors and assigns.

The Grantor agrees to execute and deliver to NSP, at NSP's cost, without additional compensation any additional documents needed to correct the legal description of the easement area to conform to the right of way actually occupied by the electric lines.

Whereas, WMEP is authorized to make a contract for the purpose of:

To expand voluntary suburban school choice options for Minneapolis-area urban and suburban families and students, particularly for urban families whose children attend low performing schools and families whose children qualify for free or reduced price lunches. The program will expand on the existing school choice options currently offered. The program will play an important and integral role in carrying out the State's overall policy to encourage voluntary school integration, and will expand and build on the highly successful The Choice is Yours program.

Whereas, WMEP received a grant for the above purposes through the Minnesota Department of Children Families and Learning, its terms and conditions are incorporated by reference. In above grant document, WMEP indicated its intent to provide student and family support services via nine member school districts of: Columbia Heights, Eden Prairie, Edina, Hopkins, Richfield, Robbinsdale, St. Anthony-New Brighton, St. Louis Park, and Wayzata.

Whereas, GRANTEE represents that it is duty qualified, willing, and prepared to undertake and complete the project or work plan which is attached hereto as ATTACHMENT A (hereinafter "PROJECT") of the WMEP grant.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS AGREED by and between the parties as follows:

1. **TERMS OF PERFORMANCE.** The objectives, scope, and methods of the PROJECT are stated in the WMEP GRANT document, ATTACHMENT A, the terms of which are incorporated herein.
2. **CONSIDERATION AND TERMS OF PAYMENT.** In consideration of all services performed and goods or materials supplied by the GRANTEE pursuant to the Agreement, WMEP shall pay for all allowable costs incurred by the GRANTEE under the terms of the Agreement, not to exceed **Thirty-two thousand four hundred fifty Dollars (\$32,450.00).**

WMEP shall make payment as stated in ATTACHMENT B of the WMEP grant document which is incorporated by reference herein.

ATTACHMENT A

The purpose of the Minnesota Voluntary School Choice Project is to expand the existing school choice options currently offered by the Minnesota Department of Education (MDE), the Minneapolis School District (MPS) and the West Metro Education Program (WMEP). These options include a wide network of traditional urban and suburban neighborhood schools, magnet and charter schools, and inter-district schools. The project will play an important and integral role on carrying out the State's overall policy to encourage voluntary school integration, and will expand and build on the highly successful TheChoice Is Yours Program.

The lead agency for the Minnesota Voluntary School Choice Project is the Minnesota Department of Education. The agency's inter-district partners in this project are MPS, WMEP, which is a joint powers agreement with MPS and ten suburban school districts, and the Minneapolis Parent Information Centers, Inc.

The inter-district partners involved in this project recognize that a family's decision on where to send their children to school is made with the heart as well as the head. With that in mind, the overriding goal of the project is to assure that all families are aware of, and have access to, both subjective and objective data on school choice options available to them in choosing the best school for their child, and that families can be confident that whatever their choice, their children will be set up to succeed academically.

There are three specific components to this project: Family outreach, transportation, and academic tutoring and support. This project will meet this goal and make school choice options and information about those options available to 100,000 students and their families in Minneapolis and eight surrounding suburbs.

Partner Responsibility for the West Metro Education Program is to provide individualized services to Minneapolis students and their families attending suburban schools. Since these services will be based on the individual needs of each student, services will be provided by the suburban district of attendance. Services to be provided include:

Tutoring services for students who are behind their peers academically. Tutoring may take place before school, after school, or in the summer.

Provide before and after school child care subsidies for child care programs provided by the district of attendance.

Increase family involvement by holding gatherings in the school that celebrate the school choice that the family has made.

Provide additional transportation services to students and their families when needed.

Such as during parent/teacher conferences.

Provide subsidies for student activity fees.

Provide mentoring programs for students and their families.

Evaluation of the project will measure whether educational opportunities for Minneapolis and suburban students were enhanced; whether participation in the inter-district and intra-district transfer program improves the academic achievement of students; the effectiveness of the school choice information dissemination strategies; whether family involvement expanded; the development and operation of welcoming learning environments; the efficiency and safety of transportation efforts; the effectiveness of partnerships developed through the project; school improvement data; the effectiveness of student and family support services.

ATTACHMENT B

40% of the grant award will be paid upon full execution of the grant agreement.

40% of the grant award will be released upon submission and approval of progress and expenditure reports demonstrating that the first 40% has been appropriately expended or encumbered (legally obligated).

Final 20% of the grant award will be held until submission and approval of final progress and expenditure reports demonstrating that 100% of grant funds have been appropriately expended or encumbered.

All final reports are due no later than September 15, 2008.
