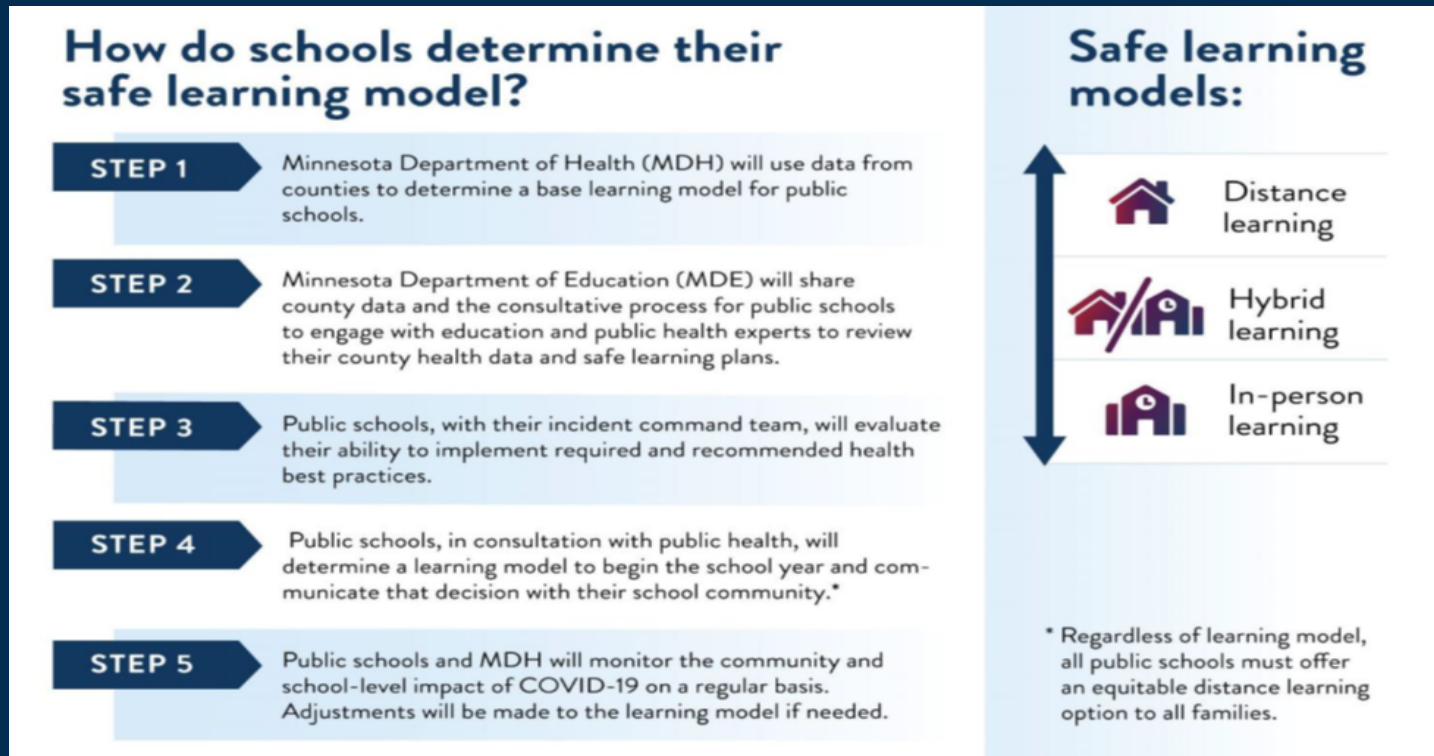

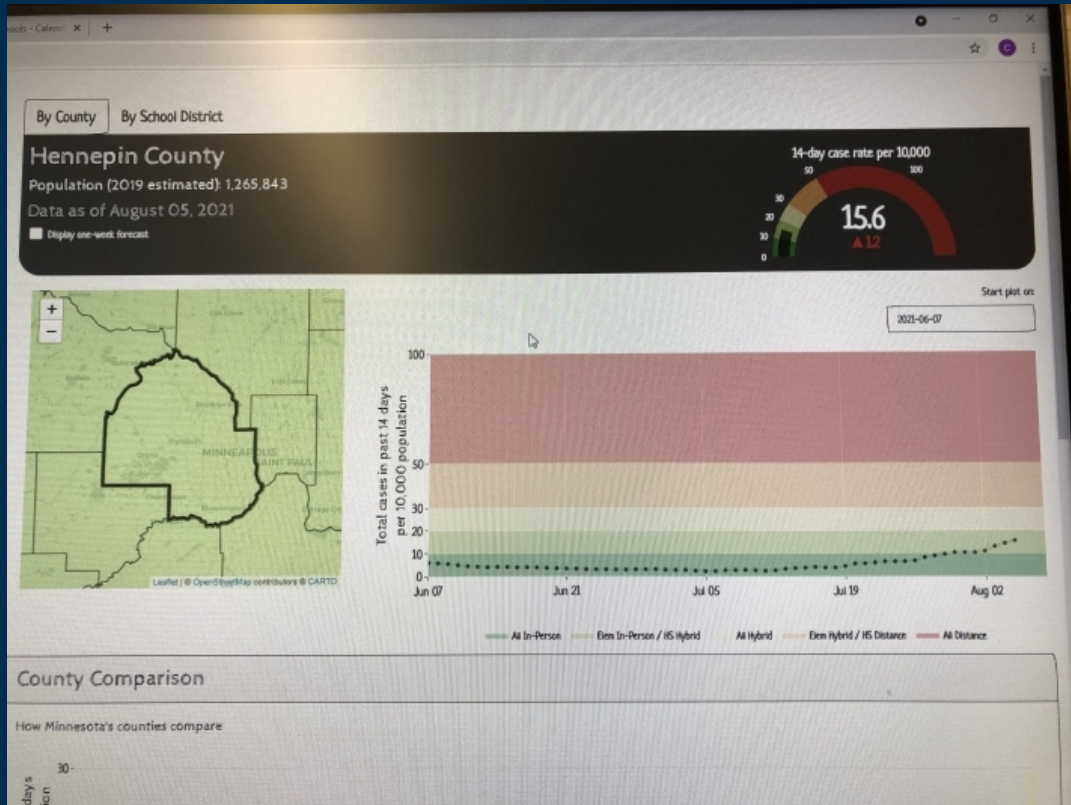

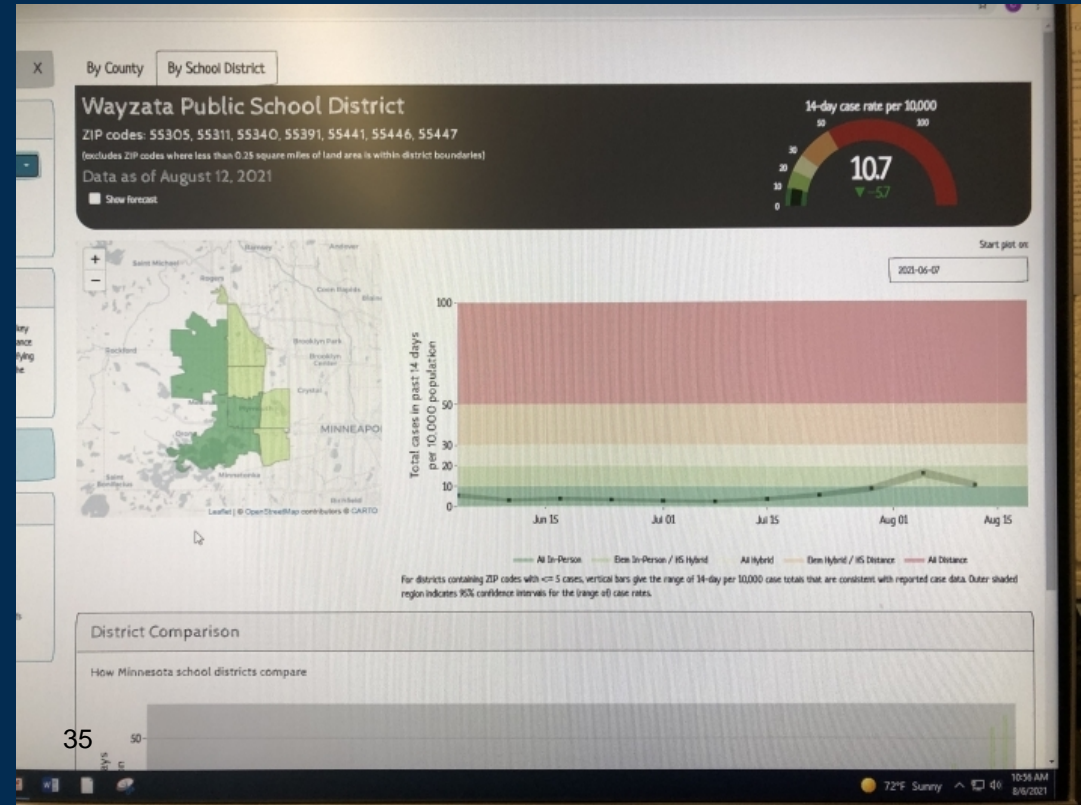


# COVID-19 Hennepin County and WPS-U of MN Wolfson Model 14 Day Running Total of Cases per 10,000 Residents

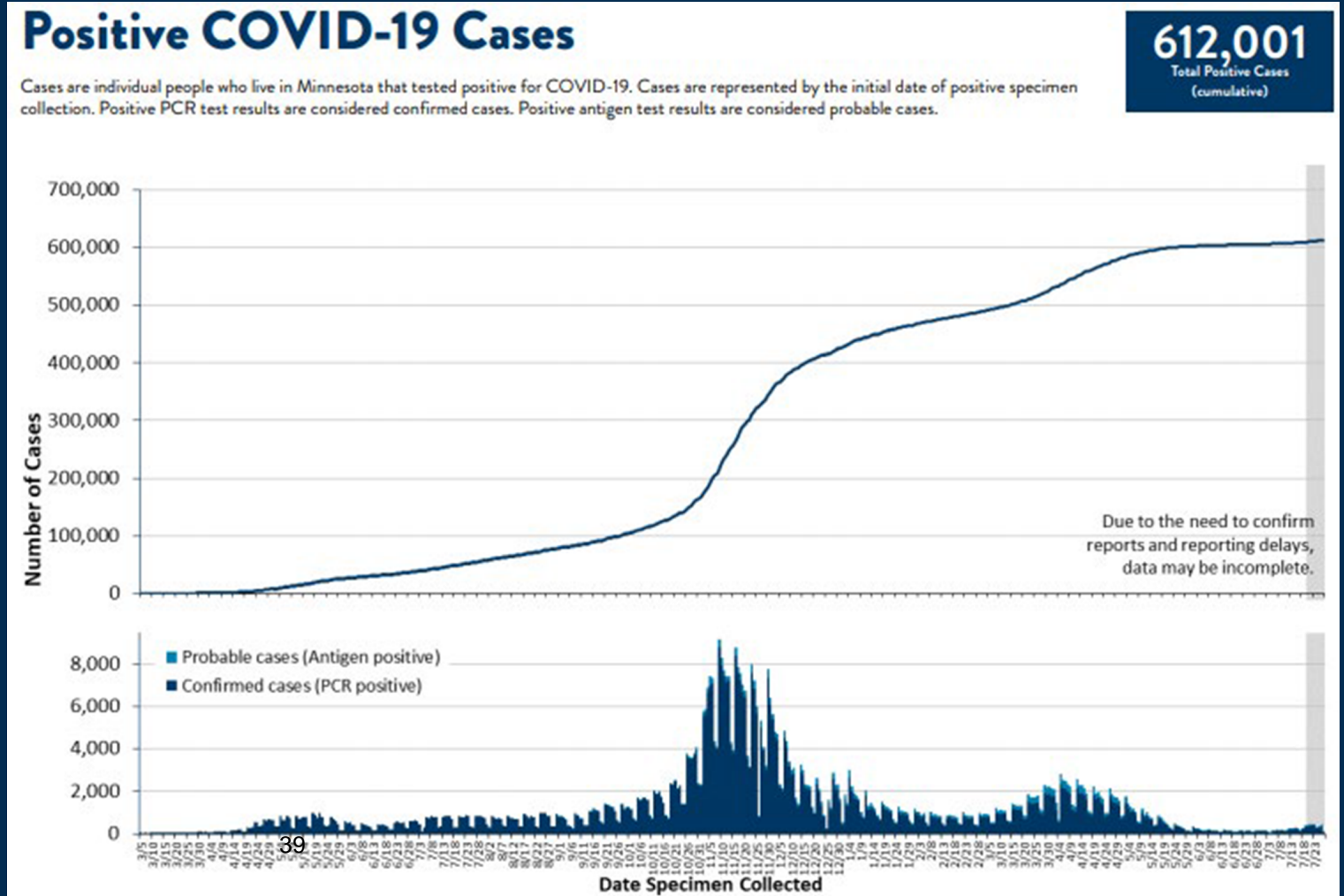

## Delta Variant:

1. Spreads more easily
2. Now the predominant variant
3. “Breakthrough Infections” occur but cases generally mild – vaccines effective in preventing severe illness, hospitalizations, and death
4. Those infected carry higher viral loads
5. Vaccinated people who are infected may be infectious to others

## Delta Variant

- Delta spreads more than twice as easily from one person to another, compared with earlier strains.
- Delta has most recently surged to become the predominant variant—from <1% in May to over 80% of cases in July.
- Delta is causing some “vaccine breakthrough infections,” meaning infections in fully vaccinated people, then other strains have.
  - Most breakthrough infections are mild.
  - Vaccines are working as they should—they are preventing severe illness, hospitalizations, and death.
- New data show that people infected with Delta have higher viral loads—meaning more virus in their body—than with previous variants.
- In contrast to the Alpha (B.1.1.7) strain, new data show that fully vaccinated people who are infected with the Delta variant might be infectious and might potentially spread the virus to others.

## Top 5 Things to Know About Delta

1. Getting vaccinated prevents severe illness, hospitalization, and death; it also helps reduce the spread of the virus in communities.
2. Data show Delta is different than past versions of the virus: it is much more contagious.
3. In areas with substantial and high transmission, CDC recommends that everyone (including fully vaccinated individuals) wear a mask in public indoor settings to help prevent spread of Delta and protect others.
4. CDC recommends that community leaders encourage vaccination and masking to prevent further outbreaks in areas of substantial and high transmission.
5. CDC recommends universal indoor masking for all teachers, staff, students, and visitors to K-12 schools, regardless of vaccination status. Children should return to full-time in-person learning in the fall with layered prevention strategies in place.

- When community rates of COVID are high, especially in areas of lower vaccination rates, there is an increased likelihood of transmission in schools.
- When prevention strategies are layered, transmission within schools and Early Childhood programs can be limited.

- **When community rates of COVID-19 are high, especially with lower vaccination rates for those eligible for vaccination/many who are unable to be vaccinated.** there is an increased likelihood that SARS-CoV-2 will be introduced to, and potentially transmitted within, a school or ECE setting.
- Evidence to date suggests that when **prevention strategies are layered and implemented with fidelity, transmission within schools and ECE programs can be limited.**
- Have an infection rate that is comparable and, in some settings, higher, than adults.
- **Can transmit the virus to others even when they do not have symptoms and/or have mild non-specific symptoms.**
- **Compared to adults are more commonly asymptomatic or have mild, non-specific symptoms** (e.g., headache, sore throat).

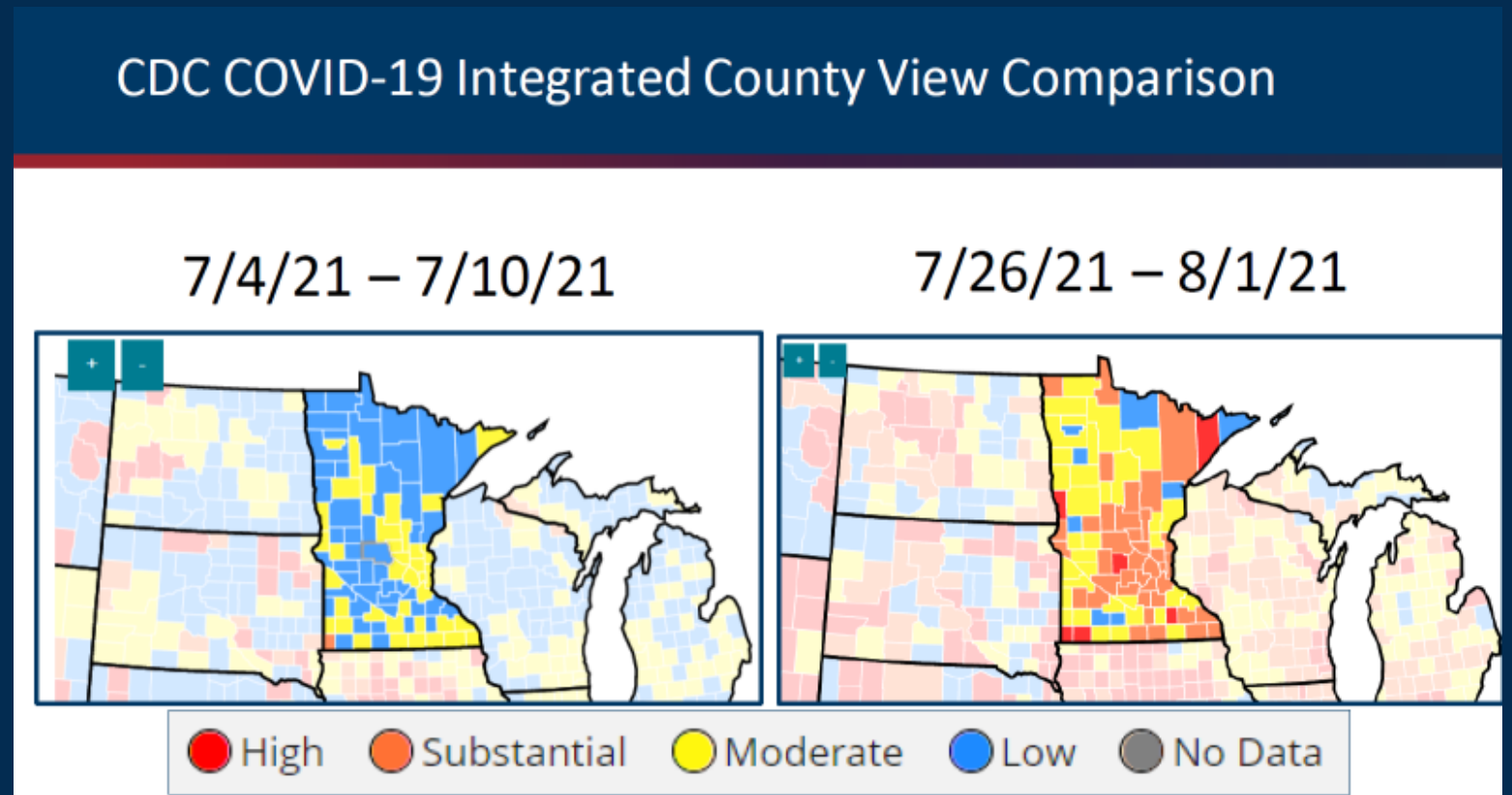

In a three week period in Minnesota, many counties have moved from “Low” or “Moderate” levels of infection to “Substantial” and “High” levels of infection. The same would appear to be true in Minnesota’s surrounding states.

Hennepin County has moved into High Transmission recently.



# MN Department of Health Situation Update 8-4-21

## State/Federal mandates:

- Must wear face coverings on public transportation, includes school buses
- Schools must report cases of COVID to MDH

## Sustained Requirements per Federal Government and Minnesota Rule

- **Face coverings:** All people are required by Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) order to wear face coverings on all public transportation conveyances (airports, public buses, etc.), including school buses.

### CDC: Guidance for COVID-19 Prevention in K-12 Schools Key Takeaways

- In-person instruction in the fall 2021 is a priority.
- Vaccination is currently the leading public health prevention strategy to end the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Masks should be worn indoors by all individuals regardless of vaccination status.
- CDC recommends schools maintain at least 3 feet of physical distance between students within classrooms, combined with indoor mask wearing by people who are not fully vaccinated, to reduce transmission risk.
- Students, teachers, and staff should stay home when they have signs of any infectious illness and be referred to their healthcare provider for testing and care.

# MN Department of Health Situation Update 8-4-21

## Contact Tracing, Isolation and Quarantine

- Continue to isolate positive cases, notify contacts, and quarantine (shortened options available).
- Close contacts generally include those within 6 feet for 15 minutes, but should consider duration, activity risk, and other factors to determine who meets the definition.
- **Exception to quarantine:** in an indoor setting, the close contact definition excludes **students** who were within 3-6 feet **if masked** – does not apply to adults.
- Fully vaccinated people or those with recent infection generally do not need to quarantine – **CDC's new guidance does however recommend they test 3-5 days after exposure even if asymptomatic and mask either for 14 days or until negative test results are received.**



# CDC and MDH Exceptions to Quarantining

Excerpt taken from previous slide....Repeated for Emphasis.

**Exception to quarantine:** in an indoor setting, the close contact definition excludes **students** who were within 3-6 feet **if masked** –does not apply to adults.

Fully vaccinated people or those with recent infection generally do not need to quarantine – **CDC's new guidance does however recommend they test 3-5 days after exposure even if asymptomatic and mask either for 14 days or until negative test results are received.**

# Closing Thoughts

1. We appreciate the feedback from parents. Although opinions vary from A to Z, it is recognized, acknowledged and appreciated that all parents are advocating for their kids and their beliefs.
2. School district staff and our school board make decisions on behalf of all 12,000 + students who come from families with a variety of beliefs and wishes for their kids' experience.
3. It seems we are better positioned this August than we were last August.
4. The primary concern/consideration we are discussing this year is whether or not to wear a mask.
5. Again, when compared to all of the variables we were trying to figure out a year ago, it seems we are in a better place prior to the start of this school year.
6. Although conditions seem improved from a year ago, we aren't out of the woods yet with COVID. Careful consideration will occur in the coming 7-10 days to determine health protocols. Choosing the best of the imperfect options seems the most likely outcome.
7. Delta is different than the original strain.



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# Closing Thoughts

8. A number of corporations are reinstating or extending current masking requirements and other mitigation strategies.
9. As noted early in the presentation, last year could be considered “the year of changing learning models” while the coming school year could be considered “the year of changing mitigation strategies.”
10. Where we start the school year regarding masking and other mitigation efforts may not be where we end the school year. Local viral counts and considering how things are going within our schools and programs will be monitored carefully throughout the school year.
11. Regardless the circumstances, our staff and school board will work tirelessly to design and implement the best possible educational experience for students and modify course along the way as deemed appropriate.
12. **REMINDER: The two main goals are 1) to keep students and staff safe and 2) to keep students at school for in-person learning every day!**
13. It is suggested that the school board determine a date for special board meeting for action (Possibly the week of August 16 or by no later than August 23.)

**RESOLUTION RELATING TO THE ELECTION OF SCHOOL BOARD MEMBERS  
AND CALLING THE SCHOOL DISTRICT GENERAL ELECTION**

BE IT RESOLVED by the School Board of Independent School District No. 284, State of Minnesota as follows:

(a) 1. It is necessary for the school district to hold its general election for the purpose of electing three (3) school board members for terms of four (4) years each.

(b) The clerk shall include on the ballot the names of the individuals who file or have filed affidavits of candidacy during the period established for filing such affidavits, as though they had been included by name in this resolution. The clerk shall not include on the ballot the names of individuals who file timely affidavits of withdrawal in the manner specified by law.

2. The general election is hereby called and directed to be held on Tuesday, the 2nd day of November 2021, between the hours of 7:00 o'clock am. and 8:00 o'clock p.m.

3. Pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, Section 205A.11, the school district combined polling places and the precincts served by those polling places, as previously established and designated by school board resolution for school district elections not held on the day of a statewide election, are hereby designated for said general election.

4. The clerk is hereby authorized and directed to cause written notice of said general election to be provided to the county auditor of each county in which the school district is located, in whole or in part, at least seventy-four (74) days before the date of said election. The notice shall include the date of said general election and the office or offices to be voted on at said general election. Any notice given prior to the date of the adoption of this resolution is ratified and confirmed in all respects.

The clerk is hereby authorized and directed to cause notice of said general election to be posted at the administrative offices of the school district at least ten (10) days before the date of said general election.

The clerk is hereby authorized and directed to cause a sample ballot to be posted at the administrative offices of the school district at least four (4) days before the date of said general election and to cause two sample ballots to be posted in each polling place on Election Day. The sample ballot shall not be printed on the same color paper as the official ballot. The sample ballot for a polling place must reflect the offices, candidates and rotation sequence on the ballots used in that polling place.

The clerk is hereby authorized and directed to cause notice of said general election to be published in the official newspaper of the school district for two (2) consecutive weeks with the last publication being at least one (1) week before the date of said election.

The notice of election so posted and published shall state the offices to be filled set forth in the form of ballot below, and shall include information concerning each established precinct and polling place.

The clerk is authorized and directed to cause the rules and instructions for use of the optical scan voting system to be posted in each polling place on Election Day.

5. The clerk is authorized and directed to acquire and distribute such election materials as may be necessary for the proper conduct of this election, and generally to cooperate with election authorities conducting other elections on that date. The clerk and members of the administration are authorized and directed to take such actions as may be necessary to coordinate this election with those other elections, including entering into agreements or understandings with appropriate election officials regarding preparation and distribution of ballots, election administration and cost sharing.

6. The clerk is further authorized and directed to cause or to cooperate with the proper election officials to cause ballots to be prepared for use at said election in substantially the following form, with such changes in form, color and instructions as may be necessary to accommodate an optical scan voting system.

Optical scan ballots must be printed in black ink on white material, except that marks to be read by the automatic tabulating equipment may be printed in another color ink. The name of the precinct and machine-readable identification must be printed on each ballot. Voting instructions must be printed at the top of the ballot on each side that includes ballot information. The instructions must include an illustration of the proper mark to be used to indicate a vote. Lines for initials of at least two election judges must be printed on one side of the ballot so that the judges' initials are visible when the ballots are enclosed in a secrecy sleeve.

7. The name of each candidate for office at this election shall be rotated with the names of the other candidates for the same office in the manner specified in Minnesota law.

8. If the school district will be contracting to print the ballots for this election, the clerk is hereby authorized and directed to prepare instructions to the printer for layout of the ballot. Before a contract in excess of \$1,000 is awarded for printing ballots, the printer shall, if requested by the election official, furnish, in accordance with Minnesota Statutes, Section 204D.04, a sufficient bond, letter of credit, or certified check acceptable to the clerk in an amount not less than \$1,000 conditioned on printing the ballots in conformity with the Minnesota election law and the instructions delivered. The clerk shall set the amount of the bond, letter of credit, or certified check in an amount equal to the value of the purchase.

9. The clerk is hereby authorized and directed to provide for testing of the optical scan voting system within fourteen (14) days prior to the general election date. The clerk shall cause notice of the time and place of the test to be given at least two (2) days in advance by publishing the Notice of Testing once in the official newspaper and by causing the notice to be posted in the office of the county auditor, the administrative offices of the school district, and the office of any other local election official conducting the test.

10. The clerk is hereby authorized and directed to cause notice of the location of the counting center or the place where the ballots will be counted to be published in the official newspaper at least once during the week preceding the week of the general election and in the newspaper of widest circulation once on the day preceding the general election, or once the week preceding the general election if the newspaper is a weekly.

11. As required by Minnesota Statutes, Section 203B.121, the Board hereby establishes a ballot board to process, accept and reject absentee ballots at school district elections not held in conjunction with the state primary or state general election or that are conducted by a municipality on behalf of the school district and generally to carry out the duties of a ballot board as provided by Minnesota Statutes, Section 203B.121 and other applicable laws. The ballot board must consist of a sufficient number of election judges trained in the handling of absentee ballots. The ballot board may include deputy county auditor or deputy city clerks who have received training in the processing and counting of absentee ballots. The clerk or the clerk's designee is hereby authorized and directed to appoint the members of the ballot board. The clerk or the clerk's designee shall establish, maintain and update a roster of members appointed to and currently serving on the ballot board and shall report to the Board from time to time as to its status. Each member of the ballot board shall be paid reasonable compensation for services rendered during an election at the same rate as other election judges; provided, however, if a staff member is already being compensated for regular duties, additional compensation shall not be paid for ballot board duties performed during that staff member's duty day.

12. Election officials from the City of Minnetonka shall conduct the election for those individuals residing within the City of Minnetonka. Election Officials from Wayzata Public Schools shall conduct the election for all other individuals. The School Board shall appoint those election judges. The election judges shall act as clerks of election, count the ballots cast and submit the results to the school board for canvass

in the manner provided for other school district elections. The general election must be canvassed between the third and tenth day following the general election. The election judges will be appointed later.

13. The School District clerk shall make all Campaign Financial Reports required to be filed with the school district under Minnesota Statutes, Section 211A.02, available on the school district's website. The clerk must post the report on the school district's website as soon as possible, but no later than thirty (30) days after the date of the receipt of the report. The school district must make a report available on the school district's website for four years from the date the report was posted to the website. The clerk must also provide the Campaign Finance and Public Disclosure Board with a link to the section of the website where reports are made available.
