**Richard W. Riley College of Education and Human Sciences
Letter of Agreement for Licensure Programs**

This agreement is entered into for the Richard W. Riley College of Education and Human Science’s Licensure Programs at Walden University, LLC hereinafter referred to as the “UNIVERSITY” and Wayzata Public Schools _____, hereinafter referred to as the “SCHOOL.”

The purpose of this agreement is to guide and direct a working relationship between the UNIVERSITY and the SCHOOL in providing clinical practice experiences (“field experience”) as required by the Minnesota Professional Educator Licensing and Standards Board, Minnesota Board of School Administrators, or the Ohio Department of Higher Education and Ohio State Board of Education, and in accordance with UNIVERSITY’s state-approved licensure programs.

As outlined in each program handbook, the UNIVERSITY requires students enrolled in a licensure-leading program, hereinafter referred to as “Candidates” to complete student teaching or field experiences. These experiences are described in each program handbook and are bound by the terms of this letter of agreement.

ACTIVITIES AND SERVICES

The UNIVERSITY requests qualified mentors to provide activities and services for the Candidates, to act as “Cooperating Teachers” or “Host Teachers” for Candidates in the Teacher Preparation and Endorsement programs, or “Principal Mentors” for Candidates in the Educational Leadership and Administration programs. The qualifications for “Cooperating Teachers” are listed in APPENDIX A, the qualifications for “host teachers” are listed in APPENDIX B, and the qualifications for “principal mentors” are listed in APPENDIX C.

ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

The Candidate shall be responsible for the following:

1. Honoring the time schedule established between the SCHOOL, UNIVERSITY, and Candidate.
2. Following the existing SCHOOL curriculum and policies, and all SCHOOL and classroom rules and procedures, including FERPA guidelines for confidentiality of student information.
3. Fulfilling the expectations and policy of both the SCHOOL personnel and the UNIVERSITY, as described in each program handbook (including completing a Teacher Performance Assessment for Teacher Preparation program candidates).
4. Conducting themselves in a professional manner.
5. Accepting constructive feedback and engaging in regular self-appraisal.
6. Adhering to the Code of Ethics for Minnesota Teachers (rule 8710.2100, subpart 2), for candidates in the Teacher Preparation and Endorsement programs. The Code of Ethics for Minnesota Teachers is listed in APPENDIX D.
7. Adhering to the Minnesota Code of Ethics for School Administrators (rule 3512.5200, subpart 2), for candidates in the Minnesota-approved Educational Leadership and Administration programs. The Minnesota Code of Ethics for School Administrators is listed in APPENDIX E.

8. Adhering to the Licensure Code of Professional Conduct for Ohio Educators, for candidates in the Ohio-approved Educational Leadership and Administration programs. The Licensure Code of Professional Conduct for Ohio Educators is listed in APPENDIX F.
9. Providing all required documentation to SCHOOL including criminal background checks, drug testing clearances, immunization reports or other health information, if applicable.

SCHOOL personnel shall be responsible for the following:

1. Reading the appropriate program handbook.
2. Identifying and selecting qualified clinical educators (Cooperating Teachers, Host Teachers, or Principal Mentors) who model effective instruction, including the use of state academic standards, or if available, national discipline-specific standards, and who model culturally responsive teaching. Selected clinical educators must demonstrate a positive impact on candidates' development and P-12 student learning and development, and be mutually agreeable to the UNIVERSITY.
3. Providing opportunities for the Candidate to complete experiences with students with a range of exceptionalities, including students on an individualized education plan.
4. Participating in four (4) observations of the Candidate during demonstration teaching in the Teacher Preparation programs, and providing actionable feedback to the Candidate during triad meetings with the UNIVERSITY supervisor.
5. Allowing Teacher Preparation program candidates to complete the Teacher Performance Assessment (edTPA) during Demonstration Teaching, including videotaping the candidate's instruction.
6. Completing and submitting a survey to verify; 1) the number of hours or weeks the Candidate spent in the field, and 2) the diversity of the classroom and school.
7. Completing and submitting an evaluation on the Candidate's performance and dispositions, pertaining to the Candidate(s) assigned to them.
7. Allowing the UNIVERSITY supervisor into the classroom for a minimum of four (4) observations of a Candidate during demonstration teaching in the Teacher Preparation programs.
8. Conferring with the UNIVERSITY supervisor regularly throughout the Candidate's field experience and communicating any concerns regarding the Candidate to the UNIVERSITY.
9. Requesting that all required documentation be provided to SCHOOL, including criminal background checks, drug testing clearances, immunization reports or other health information from candidate, if applicable.
10. Sharing responsibility for continuous improvement of Candidate preparation and share accountability for Candidate outcomes with UNIVERSITY.
11. Immediately notifying the UNIVERSITY if the SCHOOL wishes to remove, reassign, or discontinue a placement for a candidate dispositional concern, or if it is determined the field experience is jeopardizing the educational advancement of the class.

UNIVERSITY personnel shall be responsible for the following:

1. Providing oversight and direction to the field experience.
2. Confirming the Candidate's placement with the SCHOOL two (2) weeks before the placement begins.
3. Orienting SCHOOL personnel and Candidate to expectations and responsibilities according to University policy.
4. Ensuring the field experience is conducted in such a manner as to enhance the education of the students in the SCHOOL.
5. Partnering with SCHOOL to co-select, prepare, evaluate, support, and retain high-quality educators who demonstrate a positive impact on Candidate and P-12 student development.

6. If the UNIVERSITY or SCHOOL decides to remove, reassign or discontinue a placement for a candidate dispositional concern, or if it is determined the field experience is jeopardizing the educational advancement of the class, the UNIVERSITY is responsible for informing the Candidate.

HONORARIA OR STIPENDS

SCHOOL warrants that payments or other things of value provided by UNIVERSITY under this Agreement will be used for the benefit of SCHOOL employees who are providing services under the Agreement, and not for the personal benefit of any individual who might influence the awarding of field experience positions for UNIVERSITY students. A Cooperating Teacher who mentors a Candidate for a 12-week Demonstration Teaching experience in a Teacher Preparation Program will receive a \$200 stipend after being setup as a vendor with the university and completing a midterm evaluation, and another \$200 stipend after completing a final evaluation on the Candidate. A Principal Mentor who mentors a Candidate for a 40-hour placement in the Educational Leadership and Administration Programs will receive a \$200 stipend after being setup as a vendor with the university and completing an evaluation and survey, and a professional dispositions assessment on the Candidate. A Principal Mentor who mentors a Candidate for a 160-hour placement in the Educational Leadership and Administration Programs will receive a \$400 stipend after being setup as a vendor with the university and completing an evaluation and survey, and a professional dispositions assessment on the Candidate. A Principal Mentor who mentors a Candidate for a 240-hour placement in the Educational Leadership and Administration Programs will receive a \$600 stipend after being setup as a vendor with the university and completing an evaluation and survey, and a professional dispositions assessment on the Candidate. UNIVERSITY holds the right to pro-rate stipends for the SCHOOL employee if the employee does not mentor the Candidate for the required number of hours, and/or the required number of hours do not extend through the agreed upon calendar dates. UNIVERSITY also holds the right to withhold the stipend if the SCHOOL employee does not submit the required documents or complete the required assessments and evaluations within the agreed upon calendar dates.

MUTUAL AGREEMENT

The following is understood and agreed:

1. The terms of this agreement shall be in force until either party terminates this agreement upon thirty (30) days' prior written notice to the other.
2. This agreement may be modified by mutual consent, provided any and all modifications will be in writing and signed by an official of the UNIVERSITY and of the SCHOOL.
3. The parties shall maintain liability insurance with limits sufficient to cover the activities contemplated in this agreement. Such insurance limits shall not be less than \$1million per occurrence and \$3 million aggregate. The parties shall provide evidence of coverage upon request.
4. The parties agree to indemnify and hold harmless the other from all loss or liability resulting from the negligent acts or omissions of the respective party and/or its employees or agents arising out of the performance or the terms and conditions of this Agreement.
5. In accordance with the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (FERPA), the parties acknowledge and agree that the SCHOOL is an educational institution with a legitimate educational interest in the educational records of the Candidate participating in the field experience program and to the extent that access to Candidate's records are required by the SCHOOL in order to carry out the field experience program.
6. The parties agree that Candidate will have equal access to their respective programs and facilities without regard for race, color, sex, age, religion or creed, marital status, disability, national or ethnic origin,

socioeconomic status, sexual orientation or other legally protected status. The SCHOOL shall comply with the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, as amended by the ADA Amendments Act of 2008 (“ADA”), which became effective as of January 1, 2009, Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (“Section 504”), and Title IX, including the Department of Education’s Final Rule and/or guidance, and shall cooperate to ensure that applicable Student(s) receive reasonable accommodations.

7. SCHOOL represents that it has policies in place that are consistent with applicable laws to prevent and report instances of sexual harassment, sexual discrimination, and sexual misconduct and it will comply with these policies during its participation in the field experience program. In the event that SCHOOL does not have such policies in place, it shall abide by UNIVERSITY’S Code of Conduct located at <https://catalog.waldenu.edu/content.php?catoid=182&navoid=66741> with regard to Candidates.
8. Governing Law; Venue. This agreement and any claim or controversy hereunder shall be governed by and construed and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of Illinois, without regard to the conflict of laws provisions thereof. All actions and proceedings arising out of or related to this agreement shall be brought in a court located in Cook County in the State of Illinois.

APPENDIX A

The Cooperating Teacher (Teacher Preparation Programs)

The Cooperating Teacher serves as a mentor teacher during demonstration teaching in the Teacher Preparation programs. The Cooperating Teacher collaborates with the university supervisor to establish mutually agreeable expectations for candidate preparation and exit, and shares responsibility with the university for the continuous improvement of the candidate. In addition, the Cooperating Teacher evaluates, supports, and demonstrates a positive impact on candidate development and P-12 student learning and development.

Cooperating Teacher qualifications:

- A valid MN teaching license, or the equivalent, in the field of specialization
- At least three (3) years of teaching experience in the field of specialization
- At least one (1) year of teaching experience at the current grade/age level
- At least one (1) year of teaching experience in the school or center
- Models effective instruction, including the use of state academic standards, or if available, national discipline-specific standards
- Models culturally responsive teaching
- Recommendation by the site principal or director

School and University will co-select qualified clinical educators.

APPENDIX B

The Host Teacher (Early Field Experiences and Endorsement Programs)

The host teacher is a licensed teacher who is responsible for supervising the Candidate during clinical experiences. The host teacher provides opportunities for the candidate to observe his/her classroom and fulfill the clinical experience course assignments, and also provides on the job development that is essential in maintaining coherence across the clinical and academic components of preparation.

Host Teacher qualifications:

- A valid MN teaching license, or the equivalent
- At least two years of teaching experience
- Models effective instruction, including the use of state academic standards, or if available, national discipline-specific standards
- Models culturally responsive teaching
- Recommendation by the site principal or director

School and University will co-select qualified clinical educators.

APPENDIX C

The Principal Mentor (Educational Leadership and Administration Principal Preparation Programs)

The principal mentor is a licensed principal-practitioner who serves as a role model, counselor, and teacher, providing guidance and opportunities for professional development, growth, and support. In collaboration with the university supervisor, the principal mentor establishes mutually agreeable expectations for candidate performance, and ensures theory and practice are linked. The relationship between the principal mentor and the candidate is key to the candidate's successful development as an effective leader. Candidates will have three principal mentors—one in each field experience setting.

Principal Mentor qualifications:

- A master's degree is required, advanced degree in educational administration is preferred.
- Licensure or eligibility for licensure as a school administrator.
- At least three (3) years of principal experience, of which at least one year is at the age/grade level of the assignment.
- Recommendation of the school system.

School and University will co-select qualified clinical educators.

APPENDIX D

Code of Ethics for Minnesota Teachers

All Walden University Candidates are expected to abide by the following Code of Ethics for Minnesota Teachers ([8710.2100, subpart 2](#)) while at their placement sites. The standards of professional conduct include the following:

- A. A teacher shall provide professional education services in a nondiscriminatory manner.
- B. A teacher shall make reasonable effort to protect the student from conditions harmful to health and safety.
- C. In accordance with state and federal laws, a teacher shall disclose confidential information about individuals only when a compelling professional purpose is served or when required by law.
- D. A teacher shall take reasonable disciplinary action in exercising the authority to provide an atmosphere conducive to learning.
- E. A teacher shall not use professional relationships with students, parents, and colleagues to private advantage.
- F. A teacher shall delegate authority for teaching responsibilities only to licensed personnel.
- G. A teacher shall not deliberately suppress or distort subject matter.
- H. A teacher shall not knowingly falsify or misrepresent records or facts relating to that teacher's own qualifications or to other teachers' qualifications.
- I. A teacher shall not knowingly make false or malicious statements about students or colleagues.
- J. A teacher shall accept a contract for a teaching position that requires licensing only if properly or provisionally licensed for that position.

APPENDIX E

Minnesota Code of Ethics for School Administrators

All Walden University Principal Candidates enrolled in the Minnesota-approved principal preparation program are expected to abide by the following Minnesota Code of Ethics for School Administrators ([rule 3512.5200, subpart 2](#)) while at their placement sites. The standards of professional conduct include the following:

- A. A school administrator must provide professional educational services in a nondiscriminatory manner.
- B. A school administrator must take reasonable action to protect students and staff from conditions harmful to health and safety.
- C. A school administrator must take reasonable action to provide an atmosphere conducive to learning.
- D. A school administrator must not use professional relationships with students, parents and caregivers, staff, or colleagues to private advantage.
- E. A school administrator must disclose confidential information about individuals only when a compelling professional purpose is served in accordance with state and federal laws, and school district policies.
- F. A school administrator must not knowingly falsify or misrepresent records or facts relating to the administrator's qualifications, or to the qualifications of other staff or personnel.
- G. A school administrator must not knowingly make false or malicious statements about students, students' families, staff, or colleagues.
- H. A school administrator must not accept gratuities, gifts, or favors that impair professional judgment, nor offer any favor, service, or item of value to obtain special advantage.
- I. A school administrator must only accept a contract for a position when licensed for the position or when a school district is issued a variance by the board.
- J. A school administrator, in filling positions requiring licensure, must employ, recommend for employment, and assign only appropriately licensed personnel, or persons for whom the school district has been issued a variance by the appropriate state board or agency, unless, after making reasonable efforts to obtain a variance, an appropriately licensed person cannot be assigned and the position must be filled to meet a legitimate emergency educational need.
- K. A school administrator must not engage in conduct involving dishonesty, fraud, or misrepresentation in the performance of professional duties.

APPENDIX F

Licensure Code of Professional Conduct for Ohio Educators

All Walden University Principal Candidates enrolled in the Ohio-approved principal preparation programs are expected to abide by the following [Licensure Code of Professional Conduct for Ohio Educators](#) while at their placement sites. The principles of professional conduct include the following:

1. Educators behave in a professional manner, realizing that one's actions reflect directly on the status and substance of the profession.
2. Educators maintain a professional relationship with all students at all times, both in and outside the classroom.
3. Educators accurately report information required by the local board of education or governing board, state education agency, federal agency or state or federal law.
4. Educators adhere to federal, state, and local laws and statutes regarding criminal activity.
5. Educators comply with state and federal laws related to maintaining confidential information.
6. Educators serve as positive role models and do not use, possess, or unlawfully distribute illegal or unauthorized drugs.
7. Educators ensure school property, public funds, or fees paid by students or the community are used in the best interest of students and not for personal gain.
8. Educators fulfill all the terms and obligations in their employment contracts.
9. Educators use technology in a responsible manner and safeguard the electronic devices and data entrusted to them.

**AFFILIATION AGREEMENT
BETWEEN
IOWA STATE UNIVERSITY
AND
Wayzata Public Schools**

THIS AGREEMENT (the “**Agreement**”) is entered into this 9th day of October, **2023** by and between Wayzata Public SCHOOL DISTRICT (“**the Placement Site**”) and IOWA STATE UNIVERSITY OF SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY (“**the University**”).

WHEREAS, the University desires to utilize various Placement Site sites (Exhibit A) that may be available for the purpose of providing practical learning and clinical experiences (see Exhibit C for program-specific requirements) in connection with students of the University.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is understood and agreed upon by the parties hereto as follows:

A. UNIVERSITY RESPONSIBILITIES:

1. Provision of foundational curriculum to internship students. The University shall have the total responsibility for planning and determining the adequacy of the educational experience of internship students in theoretical background, basic skill, professional ethics, attitude and behavior, and will assign to the Placement Site only those students who have satisfactorily completed the prerequisite didactic portion of the University’s curriculum.

2. Designation of liaison to Placement Site; communications relating to clinical placements. The University designates a faculty internship coordinator to coordinate and act as its liaison to the Placement Site. The assignments to be undertaken by the students participating in the educational program will be mutually arranged and a regular exchange of information will be maintained by on-site visits when practical, and by letter or telephone in other instances.

The University shall notify the Placement Site in writing of any change or proposed change of the person(s) responsible for coordinating clinical placements with the Placement Site.

3. Evidence of student certifications, vaccinations, etc. Where applicable, the University shall provide evidence that the student has met all requirements of CPR certification, hepatitis B vaccination, and OSHA compliance for prevention of transmission of blood borne pathogens and TB.

4. Criminal background check compliance. Where applicable, a criminal background check, as specified in Exhibit C, and as required by and acceptable to the Placement Site, are required of each placed student prior to participation in the clinical rotation. It is the University’s responsibility to ensure that the background check has been completed and that students with unacceptable results will not participate at sites where students with such results are forbidden by policy.

5. **University notices to students.** The University shall notify each student prior to his/her arrival at the Placement Site that he/she is required to:

- (a) Follow the administrative policies, standards, and practices of the Placement Site.
- (b) Obtain medical care at his/her own expense for any injuries or illnesses sustained as a direct or indirect result of his/her affiliation with the Placement Site.
- (c) Provide his/her own transportation and living arrangements.
- (d) Report to the Placement Site on time and follow all established regulations during the regularly scheduled operating hours of the Placement Site.
- (e) Conform to the standards and practices established by the University while functioning at the Placement Site.
- (f) Obtain prior written approval of the Placement Site and the University before publishing any material relating to the clinical learning experience.
- (g) Meet the personal, ethical and professional standards required of employees of the Placement Site and consistent with the applicable professional Code of Ethics and the applicable standards of relevant accrediting or regulatory bodies.

B. PLACEMENT SITE RESPONSIBILITIES:

1. **Provision of facilities for supervised clinical experiences.** Subject to the provisions of Section C.2 of this Agreement, the Placement Site agrees to make the appropriate facilities available to the University in order to provide supervised clinical experiences to students. Such facilities shall include an environment conducive to the learning process of the students as intended by the terms of this Agreement and conforming to customary Placement Site procedures.

2. **Placement Site rules applicable to students during clinical assignments.** Students are to remain subject to the authority, policies, and regulations imposed by the University and, during periods of clinical assignment, students will be subject to all rules and regulations of the Placement Site and imposed by the Placement Site on its employees and agents with regard to following the administrative policies, standards, and practices of the Placement Site.

3. **Student care.** While at the Placement Site, students are not to replace the Placement Site staff, and are not to render service except as identified for educational value and delineated in the jointly planned educational experiences. Any such direct contact between an internship student and a district student shall be under the proximate supervision of a member of the staff of the Placement Site. The Placement Site shall at all times remain responsible for district student care.

4. **Designation of liaison to University; communications relating to clinical placements.** The Placement Site shall designate a liaison responsible for coordinating the clinical placements. That person shall maintain contact with the University's designated liaison person to assure mutual participation in and surveillance of the clinical program. The Placement Site shall notify the University in writing of any change or proposed change of the person(s) responsible for coordinating the clinical placements.

5. **Identity and credentials of Placement Site supervising personnel.** The Placement Site shall designate and submit in writing to the University, the name and professional and academic credentials of the individual(s) overseeing student(s) experiences.

6. **University tour of Placement Site.** The Placement Site shall, on reasonable request and subject to legal restrictions regarding district student confidential information, permit a tour of its facilities and services available and other items pertaining to clinical learning experiences, by representatives of the University and agencies charged with responsibility for approval of the facilities or accreditation of the curriculum.

7. **Provision of relevant Placement Site policies.** The Placement Site shall provide the student(s) and the University the Placement Site's administrative policies, standards and practices relevant to the clinical placement.

8. **FERPA compliance.** The Placement Site shall comply with the applicable provisions of the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974, 20 USC 1232 (g), otherwise known as FERPA or the Buckley Amendment, and shall take all measures necessary to ensure the confidentiality of any and all information in its possession regarding the University's students who train at the Placement Site pursuant to this agreement.

9. **Placement Site Insurance.** Placement Site shall maintain general and professional liability insurance with minimum coverage levels of \$1,000,000 per occurrence and \$3,000,000 annual aggregate and provide evidence of such insurance upon request.

C. OTHER RESPONSIBILITIES:

1. **Compliance with district student privacy laws.** The University agrees to abide by and require that its faculty and internship students abide by all applicable state and federal laws, rules and regulations regarding district student privacy, including but not limited to, the Standards for Privacy of Individually Identifiable Health Information as required under the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA) and any subsequent amendments thereto. Students shall be required to comply with the Placement Site's policies and procedures regarding the confidentiality of district student information and the use of all such information. The parties will notify one another if there are known breaches of this confidentiality.

2. **Determination of instructional period.** The course of instruction will cover a period of time as arranged between the University and the Placement Site. The beginning dates and length of experience shall be mutually agreed upon by the University and the Placement Site.

3. Determination of number of participating students. The number of students eligible to participate in the clinical placement will be determined and may be changed by mutual agreement of the parties. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the Placement Site and the University agree and understand that the availability of clinical placements at Placement Site during the term of this Agreement may periodically be affected by a variety of factors. In such event, Placement Site may reduce the number of students eligible to participate in the clinical education program with prior notice to the University and adequate time for the University to reassign the student(s) to another clinical site. The Placement Site agrees further to accommodate students of the University who are similarly displaced from other clinical affiliates of the University to the extent that clinical space is available at the Placement Site.

4. Evaluation of students' clinical experiences. Evaluation of the clinical learning experiences of the students will be accomplished jointly by the University and the Placement Site. Appropriate University and the Placement Site staff will communicate on a regular basis for the purpose of reviewing and evaluating current clinical experiences offered to students.

5. Removal of students.

(a) The University has the right to remove a student from a clinical education program. The University shall notify the Placement Site of such removal in writing.

(b) The Placement Site may immediately remove any student participating in a clinical education program from the Placement Site's premises for behavior that the Placement Site deems to be an immediate threat to the health or welfare of its students, staff members, visitors, or operations. In such event, the Placement Site shall notify the University in writing of its actions and the reasons for its actions as soon as practicable. If the Placement Site desires to remove a student for any other reason, it shall notify the University in writing of the reasons for the removal and shall consult with the University before removing the student.

D. TERM OF AGREEMENT:

The term of this Agreement shall be for five (5) years, to commence on October 9th , 2023 and terminate on October 9th , 2028 . Either party may terminate this Agreement at any time, with or without cause, upon ninety (90) days prior written notice to the other party. In the event that this Agreement is not renewed for a subsequent term, students who are participating in the clinical learning experiences at the time of termination shall be allowed to complete such assignment under the terms and conditions herein set forth.

E. ADDITIONAL TERMS:

1. Stipulations as to liability. Subject to applicable state law, neither party to this Agreement shall be legally liable for the consequences, whether bodily injury or property damage, occasioned by an act, omission, or neglect chargeable to the other party. Where

Worker's Compensation or other obligation for payment of benefits may arise, this Agreement shall neither enlarge nor diminish such obligation.

2. **Additional insurance coverage.** Any additional applicable insurance coverage requirements shall be set out by the parties in Exhibit C to this agreement.

3. **Qualifications of University faculty.** The University represents and warrants that relevant faculty members are appropriately certified and/or licensed. The University will provide the Placement Site with copies of evidence of certifications or licensures.

4. **Assignment of Agreement.** This Agreement may not be assigned without the prior written consent of the other party, which will not be unreasonably withheld.

5. **Entire Agreement.** This Agreement supersedes any and all other agreements, either oral or written, between the parties hereto with respect to the subject matter hereof. No changes or modifications of this Agreement shall be valid unless the same are in writing and signed by the parties. No waiver of any provisions of this Agreement shall be valid unless in writing and signed by the parties.

6. **Severability.** If any provision of this Agreement or the application thereof to any person or situation shall, to any extent, be held invalid or unenforceable, the remainder of this Agreement, and the application of such provision to persons or situations other than those to which it shall have been held invalid or unenforceable, shall not be affected thereby, but shall continue valid and enforceable to the fullest extent permitted by law.

7. **Non-Discrimination.** The parties hereto shall abide by the requirements of Executive Order 11246, 42 U.S.C. Section 2000d and the regulations thereto, as may be amended from time to time, the Illinois Human Rights Act, and the Rules and Regulations of the Illinois Department of Human Rights. There shall be no unlawful discrimination or treatment because of race, color, religion, sex, national origin, ancestry, military status, sexual orientation or handicap in the employment, training, or promotion of students or personnel engaged in the performance of this Agreement.

8. **Employment status.** No assigned student or University faculty member under this Agreement shall in any way be considered an employee or agent of the Placement Site nor shall any such student or faculty member be entitled to any fringe benefits, Worker's Compensation, disability benefits or other rights normally afforded to employees of the Placement Site.

9. **Notice to Parties.** Any notice, demand or request required or permitted to be given under the provisions of this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be deemed to have been duly given under the earlier of (a) the date actually received by the party in question, by whatever means and however addressed, or (b) the date sent by facsimile (receipt confirmed), or on the date of personal delivery, if delivered by hand, or on the date signed for if sent by an overnight delivery service, to the following addresses, or to such other address as either party may request, in the case of the University, by notifying the Placement Site, and in the case of the Placement Site, by notifying the University:

10. **Counterparts.** This Agreement may be executed in one or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed to be an original, but all of which together shall constitute one and the same instrument.

11. **No Third-Party Beneficiaries.** This Agreement shall inure exclusively to the benefit of and be binding upon the parties hereto and their respective successors, assigns, executors and legal representatives. Nothing in this Agreement, expressed or implied, is intended to confer on any person other than the parties hereto or their respective successors and assigns any rights, remedies, obligations or liabilities under or by reason of this Agreement.

12. **Agreement binding on parties' successors and assigns.** This Agreement shall be binding upon the University and the Placement Site, their successors, employees, agents and assigns, during the initial term of this Agreement and any extensions thereof.

13. **Captions for reference only.** The captions contained in this Agreement are for convenience of reference only and do not define, describe, or limit the scope or intent of this Agreement or any of its provisions.

14. The parties agree that the performance of work under this Agreement it will comply with all applicable federal, state, provincial, and local laws and ordinances and all lawful orders, rules and regulations there under.



In 2021, the Wayzata Public Schools (WPS) commissioned the Teaching & Learning Department to conduct an internal review of the district’s middle school program. A Middle School Program Review Design Team was formed to consider all aspects of the current middle school program, identifying strengths as well as ways the middle school experience might be modified and improved for the district’s nearly 2,900 middle school students. The Design Team's report and recommendations will be presented to the School Board for feedback and consideration before proceeding with implementation of these improvements.

- **Phase 1:** The Design Team reviewed research and analyzed current WPS middle school program practices, curriculum and instruction, and facilities to establish priorities.
- **Phase 2:** Project Teams, made up of staff members, were formed to envision what a world-class middle school model at WPS looks like for each of the following nine priorities. Teacher and parent surveys were conducted by the district. Project teams conducted interviews with students to gain their perspectives.





- Increases instructional time for middle school and high school students.
- Allows for more flexible scheduling for the three middle schools and the high school to accommodate any potential modifications to scheduling models/patterns.
- Elementary start and end times are not impacted and will not change.

These start and end times have been reviewed by our transportation team professionals and we have been assured that this plan can be implemented in a cost-neutral manner.

Statement of Revenues Analysis

This analysis reflects revenue received by the month end noted above. These numbers are only representative of the first two fiscal months of the FY 2023-24. State Aid revenues are close in line with prior years. Deviations in revenue from prior years include Federal Aids and Miscellaneous Local Revenue which can vary year to year and are also impacted by FY23 accrued revenues. The significant decrease over the prior year in Federal are due to when these funds are drawn as pointed out in prior reports. As a reminder, the district still has CARES Act dollars that are allowed to carry over to the current fiscal years. The deviation in Community Education Revenue has to do with the timing of revenues being recorded for fees for summer school. The expectation is that the district will continue to see more pre-COVID numbers back as it relates to fees the district collects for sports along with Community Education and Food Service.

Statement of Expenditures Analysis

This analysis reflects actual expenditures and does not include outstanding encumbrances along with only representing the two month of the FY 2023-24. Overall expenditures are relatively similar to prior years. Salaries and benefits are slightly below prior years percentages but expected to come in line in the next few pay periods. As is usually always the case , variations compared to prior years are primarily driven by the timing of payments, timing of projects, timing of purchases of supplies, materials, and capital expenditures along with the timing of payments for purchased services.

2023-24 School Year Statement of Revenues





According to Minnesota Statute 124D.03, Subdivision 2, a Board may, by resolution, limit the enrollment for nonresident pupils in its schools or program according to this section to a number not less than the lessor of:

- 1) One percent of the total enrollment at each grade level in the district; or
- 2) The number of district’s residents at that grade level enrolled in a non-resident district according to this section.

Recommended Action: Recommended Action:

- 1. Approve the resolution to maintain the minimum 1% at all grades; closing open enrollment for 2024-25 in grades 1-3 and 5-12 and to admit 1% of open enrollment students for K and 4th grade with priority given to siblings of currently open enrolled families and children of staff members.
- 2. In addition, the District will accept some siblings of currently open enrolled families and children of staff members in excess of the 1% minimum, if requested. Besides the siblings of currently enrolled students and children of District staff who have already been accepted, the District will accept up to five additional siblings of currently enrolled students beyond this limit at each grade level and five additional children of the District’s staff beyond this limit at each grade level.
- 3. Approve up to 100 open enrollment applications for 9th and 10th grade at Wayzata High School. If there are over 50 applications per grade a lottery will be run on applications received by the statutory deadline of January 15, 2024. If less than 50 applications are received in 9th or 10th, additional applications can be approved at the other grade until the limit of 100 applications is met.

- In accordance with state law, offer and accept enrollment to kindergarten students with a currently enrolled sibling. The 2024-2025 kindergarten students will be placed at an elementary school that has anticipated capacity.
- In accordance with state law, offer and accept enrollment to kindergarten students with a parent who is currently employed by the district. The 2024-2025 kindergarten students will be placed at an elementary school that has anticipated capacity.
- If the required minimum number of open enrolled students is not met with siblings and/or children of employees, then a lottery will be executed to reach the minimum number to satisfy the one percent of open enrolled students per grade requirement.
- Approved up to 100 applications for 9th and 10th grades at Wayzata High School.
 - If there are over 50 applications per grade a lottery will be run on applications received by the statutory deadline of January 15, 2024. In accordance with state law, current open enrolled families and students of staff members will have priority.
 - If less than 50 applications are received in 9th or 10th, additional applications can be approved at the other grade until the limit of 100 applications is met.

The district administration has identified a property consisting of a 31,780 square foot building located at 13305 12th Avenue North, Plymouth, MN 55441 that would become the district’s new administrative offices.

The District Administration Building has been repurposed for the Wayzata Transition Program starting with the 2023-2024 school year. The district’s long-term goal has been to find a facility where our district leadership team members and administrative staff can be co-located for maximum efficiency and effectiveness, freeing up the space for student instruction. Currently, WPS administrative team members are housed in multiple locations throughout the district in spaces that could be used for student instructional spaces.

The Board determined that the Purchase Agreement and acquisition of the Property contemplated would serve the District’s facility needs and would be economically advantageous to the taxpayers of the District.

In consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements contained herein, including the costs and expenses incurred by Purchaser to perform due diligence related to the acquisition of the Property (as defined below), and for other good and valuable consideration, Purchaser and Seller do hereby make and enter into this Agreement upon the following terms and conditions:

ARTICLE 1 - PURCHASE AND SALE

1.1 Agreement of Purchase and Sale. Seller agrees to sell to Purchaser, and Purchaser agrees to buy from Seller, the real property consisting of an approximately 31,780 square foot building ("Building") and approximately 2.67 acres of land, with a street address of 13305 12th Avenue North, City of Plymouth, County of Hennepin, State of Minnesota, as legally described and depicted in Exhibit A attached hereto and made a part hereof, together with all structures, building systems (i.e. mechanical, HVAC and utility), fixtures and leasehold improvements thereon, and easements, leases and rights benefiting or appurtenant to the property (collectively the "Property").

Personal Property located at the Property shall be treated as set forth in Section 4.2(e).

1.2 Purchase Price and Manner of Payment. The purchase price for the Property shall be the sum of Seven Million Seven Hundred Fifty Thousand and no/100 Dollars (\$7,750,000.00) ("Purchase Price"). The Purchase Price, subject to prorations and adjustments set forth in this Agreement, shall be payable in full at Closing in cash, by wire transfer of immediately available funds or by a Title Company check to Seller.

1.3 Earnest Money. Within three (3) business days after the Effective Date, Purchaser shall deposit with the Title Company (as defined below) the sum of One Hundred Thousand and no/100 dollars (\$100,000.00) ("Earnest Money") in good funds, either by check or by wire transfer. If upon expiration of the Due Diligence Period this Agreement is still in effect, Buyer shall deposit with the Title Company an additional One Hundred Thousand and no/100 dollars (\$100,000.00) in good funds, either by check or by wire transfer, which shall become a part of the Earnest Money. The Title Company shall hold the Earnest Money in accordance with the terms and conditions of this Agreement and any escrow agreement entered into by Seller, Purchaser and Title Company. Interest, if any, accruing on such amount shall become a part of the Earnest Money and shall be distributed as Earnest Money in accordance with the terms of this Agreement. The Earnest Money shall be refundable as set forth in this Agreement. The Earnest Money shall be applied towards payment of the Purchase Price.

1.4 Charitable Donation. Purchaser acknowledges that, while the agreed-upon Purchase Price is \$7,750,000.00, Seller has received a subsequent offer from an unaffiliated third party to purchase the Property for \$8,000,000.00. In acknowledgment of the disparity in the Purchase Price that Purchaser has agreed to pay and the status of the Purchaser as a Minnesota independent school district, Purchaser agrees to accept a charitable donation from Seller or its individual owners in the amount that the appraised market value of the Property exceeds the Purchase Price, if at all (the "Delta"). In order to determine the Delta, Seller shall engage a licensed third party professional commercial property appraiser experienced in the suburban Twin Cities office market to perform an appraisal of the Property (the "Appraisal") prior to the date of Closing. Provided that Purchaser does not terminate this Agreement pursuant to any of Purchaser's contingencies, Seller intends to make the charitable donation in the amount of the Delta as determined by the Appraisal on the date of Closing. Seller acknowledges that this Section is being agreed to by Purchaser as an accommodation to Seller, consequently, Seller and its individual owners hereby forever release and

forever discharge Purchaser and Purchaser's successors and assigns (collectively the "Purchaser Related Entities"), from all tax consequences, losses, damages, attorneys' fees, claims, demands, liabilities, obligations, actions and causes of action whatsoever, that Seller or its owners incur due to this charitable donation. Purchaser has no immediate plans to convey the Property after Closing, but Seller acknowledges that nothing in this provision shall restrict the Purchaser's ability to so convey the Property after Closing, regardless of what effect such a conveyance will have on the charitable donation.

ARTICLE 2 – TITLE AND SURVEY AND OTHER DELIVERABLES

2.1 Title Examination. Purchaser shall, at Seller's cost, cause to be issued and delivered to Purchaser a current ALTA title insurance commitment ("Title Commitment") from First American Title Insurance Company, Minneapolis Office ("Title Company") covering the entire Property. Purchaser shall order the Title Commitment within three (3) days after the Effective Date. The Title Commitment shall show all matters affecting title to the Property and bind the Title Company to issue at Closing an ALTA 2006 extended owner's title insurance policy to Purchaser in the full amount of the Purchase Price ("Title Policy"). The Title Commitment shall be accompanied by copies of all recorded documents affecting the Property with proper searches for bankruptcies, judgments, liens and assessments. Purchaser shall pay the cost of the premium for the Title Policy and any endorsements required by Purchaser.

2.2 Survey. Purchaser may, at its option and cost, employ a surveyor, licensed or registered by the state where the Property is located, to prepare an ALTA survey of the Property ("Survey"). Purchaser agrees to have any Survey that Purchaser obtains with respect to the Property certified to both Seller and Purchaser, provided the additional certification is at no cost to Purchaser, and to provide any such Survey to Seller as soon as Purchaser receives the same.

2.3 Title Objections; Cure of Title Objections. Purchaser shall have until the expiration of the Due Diligence Period (as defined below) to notify Seller in writing of such objections as Purchaser may have to anything contained in the Title Commitment or Survey ("Objections"). Seller shall have the right, but not the obligation, to cure any Objections. Seller shall notify Purchaser within seven (7) days after receipt of a written notice from Purchaser describing any such Objections as to whether Seller is willing to attempt to cure such Objections. If Seller is not willing to attempt to cure any such Objections or if Purchaser is not satisfied with Seller's proposed cure, Purchaser's sole rights shall be to either (i) waive the Objections and proceed to purchase the Property without any reduction in the Purchase Price, or (ii) terminate this Agreement and recover the Earnest Money. If Seller indicates that it intends to cure an Objection, then Seller shall have thirty (30) days to complete the cure. If the cure is not completed within such thirty (30) day period, then Seller shall notify Purchaser and Purchaser may do either (i) or (ii) above. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in this Agreement, Seller shall satisfy, release or cure at Closing any liens of an ascertainable amount encumbering the Property that are created, assumed or otherwise caused by Seller, its affiliates or related parties, or any occupants of the Property, such as mortgages, deeds of trust, mechanic's liens, judgment liens, utility liens and past due tax liens, and in the event that Seller does not, Purchaser may proceed to Closing and pay directly or withhold from the Purchase Price and place into escrow, an amount sufficient to satisfy the lien, or for the Title Company to insure over the lien, as applicable.

2.4 Additional Title Objections. Purchaser may also, at its option, object to any additional title or survey item that materially and adversely affects the Property and was not previously set forth in the Title Commitment or Survey provided such objection is made within five (5) days of Purchaser becoming aware of the objectionable item. Purchaser shall have a period of five (5) days after written notice and receipt of the additional title or survey item to provide Seller with written notice of an Objection. If Purchaser does

not provide written notice of such Objection within the five (5) day time period, then Purchaser shall no longer have any right to object to the additional title or survey item. Any proper Objection under this Section shall otherwise be subject to the process set forth in Section 2.3.

2.5 Due Diligence Materials and Other Documents Provided by Seller. Seller shall deliver to Purchaser, within five (5) days after the Effective Date, copies of all of the following due diligence materials relating to or affecting the Property which are in Seller's possession or control: (1) abstracts and/or title work; (2) survey(s); (3) environmental reports or tests and soil reports or tests; (4) all available records concerning repair and maintenance of the Property; (5) a copy of any plans for the improvements on the Property, including a full set of "As-Built" drawings; (6) any correspondence or notices from governmental authorities regarding the Property; and (7) any other property information reasonably requested by Buyer ("Due Diligence Materials").

Seller shall also deliver to Purchaser, within five (5) days after the Effective Date, correct and complete copies of all existing agreements or contracts related to or affecting the Property, including, but not limited to: leases, licenses, occupancy agreements, copies of any unrecorded easements, covenants and restrictions known to Seller that restrict the use of the Property or the construction of improvements at the Property; and any maintenance, management and service contracts, whether or not being assumed by Purchaser.

The obligation of Seller to provide the above referenced items is ongoing through Closing in the event that Seller gains access to, or possession or control of, any additional or updated above referenced items after the Effective Date. Seller shall cooperate in all reasonable respects with Purchaser's due diligence efforts. Seller shall not be entitled to any compensation in connection with such cooperation.

ARTICLE 3 - INSPECTION AND CONTINGENCIES

3.1 Right of Inspection and Contacting Tenants. As of the Effective Date, Purchaser and its agents shall have the right to access the Property to make physical and visual inspections, investigations, surveys and testing as the Purchaser deems necessary. Purchaser agrees that its on-site activities at the Property shall be conducted at reasonable times and shall not unreasonably interfere with the use of the Property by Seller. Seller agrees to meet with the parties conducting any inspections, investigations, surveys and testing and to cooperate in answering questions concerning the Property as requested. Purchaser shall pay all costs and expenses of such inspections, investigations, surveys and testing conducted by Purchaser. Purchaser shall promptly repair and restore any damage to the Property caused by Purchaser's activities at the Property to substantially the same condition as existed prior to such entry. Purchaser shall pay all costs and expenses of such investigation and testing and shall defend, indemnify and hold Seller harmless from and against any and all liabilities, actions, losses, costs, damages, liens and expenses (including reasonable attorney fees incurred by Seller in enforcing such right to defense, indemnification and reimbursement) arising from or relating to such investigation and testing or the conduct of Purchaser's inspection activities at the Property. These obligations of Purchaser shall not be construed to require Purchaser to perform any removal or remediation of any hazardous substances or incur any other expenses related to discovery of hazardous substances revealed by Purchaser's actions. Purchaser also agrees to have any environmental assessments, soil tests, physical condition reports and other inspections that Purchaser obtains with respect to the Property certified to both Seller and Purchaser, provided the additional certification is at no cost to Purchaser, and to provide any such assessments, test, reports and inspections to Seller as soon as Purchaser receives the same as long as Seller is not in default of this Agreement. The indemnification obligations of Purchaser set forth in this Section shall survive the termination of this Agreement by either party for a period of twelve (12) months. These obligations shall survive Closing or any termination of this Agreement for a period of twelve (12) months.

3.2 Due Diligence Period and Due Diligence Materials. The “Due Diligence Period” shall be from the Effective Date through the date that is sixty (60) days from the Effective Date.

3.3 Purchaser’s Contingencies. The obligations of Purchaser under this Agreement are contingent upon each of the following:

- (a) Performance of Seller’s Obligations. Seller shall have performed all of the obligations required to be performed by Seller under this Agreement on or before the Closing.
- (b) Proceedings. That there is no action, litigation, investigation, condemnation or eminent domain proceeding of any kind pending or threatened against the Property on or before the Closing.
- (c) Title and Survey. Title and Survey shall have been found acceptable by Purchaser as provided in Article 2.
- (d) Testing and Inspection. Purchaser shall have determined, in its sole discretion, on or before the expiration of Due Diligence Period, that it is satisfied with the condition of the Property and the results of all inspections and testing of the Property, including, but not limited to, all soil tests, well tests, engineering inspections, property condition reports, hazardous waste and environmental reviews of the Property.
- (e) Contracts. Purchaser shall have determined, in its sole discretion, on or before the expiration of the Due Diligence Period, that it is satisfied with all existing contracts affecting the Property.
- (f) Leases. Seller shall have terminated any leases, licenses or occupancy agreements affecting the Property.
- (g) Due Diligence Materials and Other Documents Provided by Seller. Purchaser shall have determined, in its sole discretion, on or before the expiration of the Due Diligence Period, that it is satisfied with the Due Diligence Materials and other documents and information concerning the Property provided by Seller under this Agreement.
- (h) Government Approvals. Purchaser shall have determined, in its sole discretion, on or before the expiration of Due Diligence Period, that it is satisfied that all governmental approvals, permits or authorizations necessary or desired by Purchaser for the Property have or will be obtained. Purchaser shall have determined, in its sole discretion, on or before the expiration of the Due Diligence Period, that all applicable zoning ordinances, building and use restrictions and codes, required building permits, and any requirements with respect to licenses, permits and agreements necessary for the lawful use and operation of the Property as Purchaser elects, have been or will be issued or complied with.
- (i) Tax Exempt Status. Purchaser shall have received information satisfactory to Purchaser, in its sole discretion, that the Property will qualify for tax exempt status on or before Closing.
- (j) Board Approval. Purchaser’s Board shall have ratified this Agreement at their next meeting after the Effective Date, which is October 9. Purchaser already obtained the Board’s approval to negotiate and execute this Agreement, but Purchaser is required by

law to make the terms of this Purchase Agreement public and have the Board ratify the Agreement after executing the Agreement.

3.4 Right of Termination. Seller agrees that in the event Purchaser determines in its sole discretion that the Property is not suitable for its purposes, for any reason or no reason at all, on or before the expiration of Due Diligence Period, or that a contingency contained in Section 3.3 has not been satisfied on or before the date specifically set forth for the contingency, Purchaser shall have the right to terminate this Agreement by written notice to Seller on or before the date that is five (5) days after the expiration of the Due Diligence Period, or five (5) days after the date specifically set forth for the contingency, as applicable. Upon such termination, the Earnest Money shall be returned to Purchaser. If Purchaser acknowledges the satisfaction or waiver of a contingency by written notice to Seller, or if Purchaser does not provide a written notice of termination by the date required, Purchaser shall no longer have a right to terminate this Agreement under this Section because of such contingency and the Earnest Money shall not be refundable to Purchaser thereafter, except as set forth in Sections 8.1 (Casualty), Section 8.2 (Condemnation) and Section 9.1 (Remedies). All the contingencies set forth in Section 3.3 are specifically for the benefit of the Purchaser.

ARTICLE 4 - REPRESENTATIONS AND COVENANTS

4.1 Representations and Warranties of Seller. Seller represents and warrants to Purchaser as follows:

- (a) Organization and Authority. Seller is a limited liability company duly organized and validly existing in good standing under the laws of Minnesota. Seller has the requisite power and authority to enter into and perform this Agreement and to transfer all of the Property in accordance with this Agreement and without further consent or approval. The person signing this Agreement and Seller's closing documents on behalf of the Seller is authorized to do so.
- (b) Proceedings. To Seller's knowledge, there is no action, litigation, investigation, condemnation, eminent domain or proceeding of any kind pending or threatened against the Property. Seller has not received any notice from any governmental authority or third party of any violation or potential violation of any law, ordinance or regulation related to the Property or its condition, or of any breach of any covenants or easements affecting the Property.
- (c) Notice of Violations. Seller has received no written notice that the use and operation of the Property violates any applicable building codes, environmental, zoning and land use laws, or other applicable local, state and federal laws and regulations, and Seller has not received prior to the Effective Date any written notification from any governmental or public authority (1) that the Property is in violation of any applicable fire, health, building, use, occupancy or zoning laws where such violation remains outstanding, or (2) that any work is required to be done upon or in connection with the Property, where such work remains outstanding.
- (d) Assessments. Seller has received no written notice of threatened or pending special assessments or reassessments of the Property.
- (e) Possession and Title. No persons are in possession of any portion of the Property other than Seller. There will be no leases or possessory rights in favor of any person, service or maintenance contracts, equipment leases or other contracts affecting the Property as of the

Closing. Seller is not a party to any non-governmental covenants, restrictions or easements contained in any document, whether recorded or unrecorded, that affect the use of the Property or the construction of improvements at the Property. Seller has no knowledge of any encroachments or boundary line questions affecting the Property.

- (f) Condition of the Property. Seller has no knowledge of any structural, roofing or other material defects in the improvements located with the Property and has no knowledge of any material repairs currently contemplated.
- (g) Hazardous Substances. To Seller's knowledge and except as disclosed in any Environmental Reports that Seller will provide to Purchaser as part of the Due Diligence Materials, no hazardous substances are located on the Property. Seller has received no notice from any governmental entity or private party that any hazardous substances are currently located on the Property in violation of any environmental law. Except as disclosed in any Environmental Reports that Seller will provide to Purchaser as part of the Due Diligence Materials, Seller has no knowledge of the use, storage or release of any hazardous substances on the Property. Seller has not released any hazardous substance on the Property.
- (h) Wells, Individual Sewage Treatment Systems and Storage Tanks. To Seller's knowledge, there are no wells or individual sewage treatment systems, whether in use or abandoned, at the Property. To the Seller's knowledge, there are no underground or above ground storage tanks of any size or type at the Property.
- (i) Methamphetamine Disclosure. To Seller's knowledge, methamphetamine production has not occurred at the Property.

As used herein, the phrase "to Seller's knowledge" means to the actual knowledge of Barry Nordstrand.

Seller shall indemnify, defend and hold Purchaser harmless from, any expenses or damages, including reasonable attorneys' fees that Purchaser incurs by reason of, or arising out of, any breach of any of the above representations and warranties. The representations and warranties of Seller in this Agreement shall be true as of the Closing and shall survive Closing for a period of twelve (12) months only and Purchaser shall have no right thereafter to make any claim against Seller or any other party based upon an alleged breach of any such representations or warranties. The consummation of this Agreement by Purchaser with knowledge of any breach by Seller of any of Seller's representations or warranties herein shall constitute a waiver and release by Purchaser of any claims based, in whole or in part on such breach, unless the breach is caused by the intentional or negligent acts of Seller or if known by Seller to be false as of the Effective Date.

It is specifically understood that Purchaser shall have a full and complete opportunity prior to Closing to determine for itself the condition of the Property. Except as expressly provided in this Agreement or any of the documents delivered by Seller at Closing, the sale of the Property is made on an "AS IS" basis, and Purchaser expressly acknowledges that, except as otherwise specified herein or any of the documents delivered by Seller at Closing, SELLER MAKES NO WARRANTY OR REPRESENTATION, EXPRESS OR IMPLIED, OR ARISING BY OPERATION OF LAW, WITH RESPECT TO THE PROPERTY INCLUDING, BUT IN NO WAY LIMITED TO, ANY WARRANTY OF QUANTITY, QUALITY, CONDITION, HABITABILITY, MERCHANTABILITY, SUITABILITY OR FITNESS FOR A PARTICULAR PURPOSE, OR WITH RESPECT TO ANY IMPROVEMENTS, PERSONAL PROPERTY

OR THE ENVIRONMENTAL OR SOIL CONDITIONS OF THE PROPERTY. By executing this Agreement, Purchaser acknowledges the following: (1) the Property may contain defects unknown to Seller; (2) Purchaser bears the sole responsibility to inspect the Property and review all information disclosed by Seller or its agents with respect to the Property; and (3) Purchaser is assuming all risks concerning the Property upon Closing.

4.2 Covenants of Seller. Seller covenants and agrees as follows from the Effective Date until the Closing or earlier termination of this Agreement:

- (a) Exclusive Right to Purchase. Seller and its agents shall cease marketing the Property and shall not conduct any discussions or negotiations or respond in writing to any solicitations by third parties relating to the purchase of the Property during the term of this Agreement. Seller will not enter into any other contracts for the sale of the Property, nor will Seller grant any rights of first refusal or options to purchase the Property or any other rights to others that might prevent the consummation of this Agreement. Seller has not entered into or granted any contracts, rights or options relating to a sale of the Property to any third party that remain in effect on the Effective Date.
- (b) Contracts Affecting the Property. Seller shall not amend any existing or enter into any new agreements or contracts related to or affecting the Property without the consent of Purchaser which will be in force and effect after the Closing, including, but not limited to: any maintenance, management and service contracts; any leases, licenses or occupancy agreements; and any recorded or unrecorded easements, agreements, restrictions, governmental agreements. Seller shall not convey all or any part of the Property.
- (c) Operation of the Property. Seller shall continue to operate, maintain, repair and insure the Property in a manner consistent with the operation, maintenance, repair and insurance of the Property existing as of the Effective Date. Seller shall not perform or authorize any activities that change the physical characteristics of the Property from its existing state as of the date of the Effective Date. Seller shall not perform or authorize any removal or alteration of any buildings, structures, improvements, trees or vegetation at the Property and shall not perform or authorize any excavation or earth moving after the Effective Date.
- (d) Liens and Encumbrances. Upon Closing, the Property will be free and clear of all liens of an ascertainable amount that are created, assumed or otherwise caused by Seller, its affiliates or related parties, or any occupants of the Property, such as mortgages, deeds of trust, mechanic's liens, judgment liens, utility liens and past due tax liens. All labor or material which has been or will be furnished to the Property have been fully paid for or will be fully paid for by the Closing so that no lien for labor or material rendered can be asserted against the Property. Seller agrees to satisfy the requirements of the Title Company necessary to cause the Title Company to insure Purchaser's title to the Property without an exception for mechanic's lien claims arising out of labor or materials provided to the Property by or at the direction of Seller or any occupants of the Property prior to Closing.
- (e) Personal Property. Any personal property located at the Property as of the Effective Date will remain at the Property, except for the following items which shall be removed by Seller prior to the date of Closing: (i) financial documents and records of Seller and previous occupant; (ii) all serving pieces in cabinets and drawers in the lobby and conference rooms;

and (iii) all decorative vases and ceramic pieces located in the lobby and conference rooms (except for items (i)-(iii) above, the “Personal Property”). The office furniture and related furnishings, including desks, chairs, and a/v equipment located at the Property on November 28, 2022 will also remain at the Property and will be included in the sale to Purchaser (the “Office Furniture”). The Office Furniture is not defined as Personal Property, but rather included in the definition of the Property for purposes of this Agreement. In no event does Personal Property include structures, building systems (i.e. mechanical, HVAC and utility), fixtures and leasehold improvements.

Seller shall indemnify, defend and hold Purchaser harmless from all claims, liabilities, damages and costs, including reasonable attorneys’ fees, arising out of or resulting from any failure of Seller to move-out and surrender the Property as required under this Agreement.

- (f) Surrender of Property. Unless the parties otherwise agree in writing to the contrary, as of the Closing:
- (1) Seller shall participate with Purchaser or its agents in a walk-thru inspection of the Property as reasonably requested by Purchaser to verify the condition of the Property.
 - (2) Seller shall surrender possession of the Property to Purchaser, and no persons shall be in possession of any portion of the Property or have any right to occupy the Property at any time thereafter other than the Purchaser.
 - (3) Seller shall surrender the Property in a condition similar to the condition as of the date of this Agreement, less reasonable wear and tear.
 - (4) All keys to all buildings and rooms at the Property shall be provided to Purchaser.
 - (5) All leases and contracts related to the operation, management, maintenance and repair of the Property shall be terminated or assigned as agreed upon by the parties.
 - (6) All Personal Property remaining at the Property shall be deemed abandoned and may be used, removed, stored or disposed of by Purchaser. Purchaser shall not be responsible for the preservation or safekeeping of any Personal Property remaining at the Property.
 - (7) All leases affecting the Property shall be terminated prior to Closing.
- (g) Seller’s Cooperation. Seller shall cooperate in all reasonable respects and in good faith with Purchaser in obtaining governmental and third party approvals, consents and agreements, and shall execute such applications, permits, agreements and other documents as may be reasonably required by Purchaser, provided that such items may be effective as of the Closing. Seller shall not be entitled to any compensation or reimbursement of costs in connection with such cooperation.

4.3 Representations and Warranties of Purchaser. Purchaser represents and warrants to Seller as follows:

(a) Purchaser is an independent school district under the laws of the State of Minnesota, and Purchaser has and will have on the date of Closing all necessary power and authority to: (A) own and operate the Property; and (B) enter into and perform Buyer's obligations under this Agreement, subject only to Purchaser's obligation under Section 3.3(j).

(b) Except as provided in 3.3(j), which Purchaser cannot do until this Agreement is executed, Purchaser has taken all actions required to be taken under the laws of the State of Minnesota and under Purchaser's governing documents to approve or authorize the execution and delivery of this Agreement and consummation of the transactions contemplated in this Agreement. Except as provided in 3.3(j), no consent, waiver, approval or authorization is required from any person or entity (that has not already been obtained) in connection with the execution and delivery of this Agreement by Purchaser and/or the consummation by Purchaser of the transactions contemplated in this Agreement.

ARTICLE 5 - CLOSING

5.1 Time and Place. Except as extended pursuant to this Agreement, the closing of the purchase and sale transaction contemplated by this Agreement ("Closing") shall occur on a date that is thirty (30) days after the expiration of Due Diligence Period or upon such earlier date agreed upon by the parties, at the offices of Title Company or through deposit of funds and documents in escrow with the Title Company.

5.2 Seller's Obligations at Closing. At the Closing, Seller shall deliver to Purchaser a duly executed Limited Warranty Deed in recordable form, conveying to Purchaser fee simple marketable title to the Property and all rights appurtenant, together with a seller's affidavit, FIRPTA affidavit, evidence as to the authority of the persons executing documents on behalf of Seller, well certificate and all other documents reasonably necessary to consummate the transaction contemplated by this Agreement. The seller's affidavit executed by Seller shall be reasonably acceptable to the Title Company and certify as of the date of Closing that there are no outstanding unsatisfied judgments, tax liens or bankruptcies against or involving Seller or the Property; that there has been no skill, labor or material furnished to the Property at the request of Seller or any other occupant of the Property for which payment has not been made; and that there are no unrecorded interests in the Property known to Seller. Seller shall also deliver possession of the Property to Purchaser at the Closing. At the Closing, Seller shall also deliver to Purchaser the following:

- (a) Service Contracts and Warranties. Deliver to Purchaser a termination of all maintenance, management and service contracts affecting the Property or an assignment of contracts for any such contract that Purchaser, in its discretion, agrees to assume, together with any originals of the contracts being assumed. Deliver to Purchaser any originals of all warranties for any equipment or improvements at the Property together with an assignment of such warranties consented to by the warrantor.
- (b) Personal Property and Bill of Sale. Deliver to Purchaser a bill of sale listing all equipment and personal property being sold as part of the Property, including the Office Furniture. The bill of sale shall convey good and marketable title to the equipment and personal property free and clear of all liens and encumbrances. All equipment, personal property and debris not included in the sale shall be removed by Seller, at its cost, on or before the Closing. Any equipment, personal property or debris remaining on the Property after the

Closing shall be deemed abandoned and may be removed, stored or disposed of by Purchaser, at Seller's cost.

5.3 Purchaser's Obligations at Closing. At the Closing, Purchaser shall pay to Seller the full amount of the Purchase Price, as increased or decreased by prorations or adjustments set forth in this Agreement, and shall deliver to Seller all other documents reasonably necessary to consummate the transaction contemplated by this Agreement. Purchaser and Seller agree that the Earnest Money shall be delivered to Seller at the Closing and applied towards payment of the Purchase Price.

5.4 Closing Costs. Seller and Purchaser agree to the payment of costs in connection with the Closing as follows: (a) Seller and Purchaser each will pay one-half of any reasonable and customary closing fees or charges imposed by the Title Company for the Closing; (b) Seller shall pay all state deed tax for the recording of the deed; (c) Seller shall pay the cost of recording all documents necessary to place record title in the condition warranted by Seller in this Agreement and Purchaser will pay the cost of recording the deed conveying the Property to Purchaser; and (d) any other costs required to be paid by Purchaser or Seller by Closing pursuant to this Agreement.

5.5 Prorations. Seller and Purchaser agree to the following prorations as if Purchaser was vested with title to the Property on the date of Closing:

- (a) Utility Services. Seller shall pay or cause to be paid all charges for utility services, garbage charges and similar charges incurred at the Property prior to the date of Closing. Seller shall cause all utility meters for utility services at the Property to be read as of the date of Closing.
- (b) Other Costs. Any other costs pertaining to the Property not prorated in this Agreement shall be paid and prorated as follows. Seller agrees to cause to be paid in full all expenses and charges incurred in connection with the Property for the period prior to the date of Closing. Purchaser agrees to cause to be paid in full all expenses and charges incurred in connection with the Property for the period from the date of Closing and thereafter. Seller or Purchaser, as the case may be, shall indemnify, defend and shall hold the other harmless from any costs, expenses or damages, including reasonable attorneys' fees, which may result from any failure by Seller or Purchaser to so pay such items. The provisions of this Section shall survive Closing and delivery of the deed.

ARTICLE 6 - REAL ESTATE TAXES AND SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS

6.1 Real Estate Taxes and Special Assessments. On or before the Closing, Seller shall pay all general real estate taxes for the Property due and payable in years prior to the year of Closing. General real estate taxes for the Property due and payable in the year of Closing shall be apportioned between Purchaser and Seller based on a 365-day calendar year as if Purchaser were vested with title to the Property on the date of Closing. Seller shall also pay, on or before the Closing, all deferred taxes for the Property (including green acre taxes, if applicable) and all special assessments levied, pending or certified against the Property as of the Closing, including, without limitation, any installments of special assessments (or estimates thereof) and interest thereon payable after the Closing. The obligations of Purchaser and Seller contained in this Section shall survive Closing and delivery of the deed.

ARTICLE 7 - COMMISSIONS

7.1 Brokerage Commissions. Seller and Purchaser each respectively represent and warrant that the only real estate brokers or agents involved with this transaction are Laura Moore and Nick Leviton with Colliers on behalf of Seller and Jason Sell with Cushman & Wakefield on behalf of Purchaser. Seller shall be responsible for the real estate commissions and costs payable to both of the foregoing brokers at Closing pursuant to a separate agreement. Purchaser and Seller agree to indemnify, defend and hold harmless the other party from any loss, liability, cost, damage or expense resulting from, or relating to, the breach of its representation under this Section. These obligations of Purchaser and Seller shall survive Closing or any termination of this Agreement.

ARTICLE 8 – CASUALTY AND EMINENT DOMAIN

8.1 Casualty. Prior to Closing, Seller shall have responsibility and liability for all damage or injury of any kind to the Property, the improvements thereon, any and all persons, whether employees or otherwise, and all property connected to the Property, except for damage or injury caused by the acts of Purchaser, its agents or assigns. Seller agrees to maintain Seller's current insurance coverage, if any, on the Property until Closing. If, prior to the Closing Date, all or any part of the Property is substantially damaged by fire, casualty, the elements or any other cause, Seller shall immediately give Purchaser written notice of such fact and, in such case, either Seller or Purchaser shall have the right (to be exercised by either party within ten (10) days after receipt of Seller's notice) to terminate this Agreement by delivering written notice of such termination to the other party. If this Agreement is so terminated, neither party will have any further obligations under this Agreement and the Earnest Money shall be refunded to Purchaser. If this Agreement is not terminated despite such damage, or if the Property is damaged but not substantially, Seller shall promptly commence to repair such damage or destruction and return the Property to substantially its condition prior to such damage. If such damage shall be completely repaired prior to the Closing Date, then there shall be no reduction in the Purchase Price and Seller shall retain the proceeds of all insurance related to such damage. If such damage shall not be completely repaired prior to the Closing Date but Seller is diligently proceeding to repair, then, at Purchaser's option, Purchaser may (a) post-pone closing until the work is complete; or (b) opt to have Seller complete the repair after the Closing Date and require Seller to (1) escrow at least 120% of the estimated amount to complete the work, or more if required by the Title Company to issue mechanics lien coverage to Purchaser, and (2) deliver all other documentation required by Title to issue said mechanics lien coverage. In either case, Seller shall be entitled to receive the proceeds of all insurance related to such damage after repair is completed and providing all documentation necessary for mechanics lien coverage or fulfillment of the obligations of the escrow agreement. If the work is not completed by Closing and Seller is not diligently proceeding to repair, then Seller is in default under this Agreement and Purchaser has the remedies available under Section 9.1. For purposes of this Section, the words "substantially damaged" mean damage that would cost \$25,000.00 or more to repair.

8.2 Eminent Domain. If prior to the Closing Date, eminent domain proceedings are commenced against all or any part of the Property, Seller shall immediately give Purchaser written notice of such fact and, in such case, either Seller or Purchaser shall have the right (to be exercised by Purchaser or Seller within ten (10) days after receipt of Seller's notice) to terminate this Agreement by delivering written notice of such termination to the other party. If this Agreement is so terminated, neither party will have further obligations under this Agreement and the Earnest Money and all accrued interest thereon shall be refunded to Purchaser. If neither party terminates this Agreement, the Purchase Price shall be reduced by any condemnation awards paid to Seller prior to Closing and Seller shall, at Closing, assign to Purchaser all of Seller's right, title and interest in and to any award made or to be made in the condemnation proceedings. Prior to the Closing Date, Seller shall not designate counsel, appear in, or otherwise act with respect to the condemnation proceedings without Purchaser's prior written consent.

ARTICLE 9 - REMEDIES

9.1 Remedies. If any representation or warranty of Purchaser in this Agreement proves untrue, if Purchaser breaches any covenant of Purchaser under this Agreement, or if Purchaser fails to consummate the transactions contemplated in this Agreement for any reason other than Seller's default or the failure of any conditions precedent to Purchaser's obligations to be satisfied, Seller shall have the right to terminate this Agreement by giving Purchaser thirty (30) days' prior written notice of such termination in accordance with Minnesota Statutes 559.21. If Purchaser fails to cure all items of default specified in the notice within thirty (30) days after receiving such notice, then this Agreement shall be deemed terminated and upon such termination Seller shall retain the Earnest Money as liquidated damages and as Seller's sole remedy. If any representation or warranty of Seller in this Agreement proves untrue, if Seller breaches any covenant of Seller under this Agreement, or if Seller fails to consummate the transactions contemplated in this Agreement for any reason other than Purchaser's default or the failure of any conditions precedent to Seller's obligations to be satisfied, then Seller shall be in default of this Agreement and Purchaser's sole rights shall be to either (i) terminate this Agreement by giving written notice of such termination to Seller, whereupon the Earnest Money shall be returned to Purchaser and Purchaser may bring an action for Purchaser's actual third-party out-of-pocket costs incurred by Purchaser in connection with its negotiation of this Agreement and due diligence, or (ii) seek specific performance of this Agreement, but only if a lawsuit seeking specific performance is commenced within six (6) months after the scheduled Closing Date or within twelve (12) months of the Closing Date with respect to the indemnification obligations of Seller under Article 4; and (iii) all other remedies available at law or in equity.

ARTICLE 10 - MISCELLANEOUS

10.1 Successors or Assigns. This Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties, and their respective successors and assigns.

10.2 Severability. In the event any provision of this Agreement shall be held to be invalid, unenforceable or in conflict with the law of the jurisdiction, the remaining provisions of this Agreement shall continue to be valid, enforceable and not be affected by such holding.

10.3 Waiver. No term or condition of this Agreement will be deemed waived or amended unless expressed in writing. The waiver of any condition or the breach of any term will not be a waiver of any subsequent breach of the same or any other term or condition.

10.4 Assignment. Either party may assign its rights under this Agreement before or after the Closing with the consent of the other party, such consent not to be unreasonably withheld. It shall not be deemed to be unreasonable for Seller to withhold consent to a proposed assignment by Purchaser to an assignee who is not a cash purchaser. Any such assignment will not relieve such assigning party of its obligations under this Agreement.

10.5 Notices. Any notice required or permitted to be given hereunder will be properly given in accordance with this Agreement, if in writing and (i) delivered by hand, (ii) sent by recognized overnight courier (such as Federal Express), (iii) sent via electronic mail, or (iv) mailed by United States first class mail, postage prepaid, return receipt requested to the addresses provided below. Notice shall be effective, and the time for response to any notice by the other party shall commence to run, one (1) business day after any such deposit if by overnight carrier, or three (3) days if by U.S. mail, or the day of receipt if delivered by hand, or the day when sent by email if sent during normal business hours and on the next business day if sent after normal business hours, in each case with confirmation of transmission by the transmitting

equipment, to the addresses and email addresses and marked to the attention of the individual (by name or title) set forth below or to such other address email address or individual as such party may designate by a notice given in accordance with this Section 10.5:

or to such other respective addresses and/or addressees as may be designated by notice given in accordance with the provisions of this Section 10.5. Attorneys for each party shall be authorized to give and receive notices for each such party.

10.6 Further Assurances. Each party agrees that it will execute and deliver such other documents and take such other action, whether prior or subsequent to Closing, as may reasonably be requested by the other party, to further consummate the transaction contemplated by this Agreement, without further consideration.

10.7 Termination. If this Agreement is terminated by either Purchaser or Seller pursuant to a right of termination expressly set forth in this Agreement, neither party shall have any further rights or obligations under this Agreement, except for the obligations concerning the Earnest Money as set forth in this Agreement, and to the extent any rights or obligations expressly survive such termination.

10.8 Time of Essence. Time is of the essence of this Agreement.

10.9 Calculation of Time Periods. Except as specifically set forth in this Agreement, in computing any period of time described in this Agreement, the day of the act or event after which the designated period of time begins to run is not to be included and the last day of the period so computed is to be included, unless such last day is on a Saturday, Sunday or legal holiday, in which event the period shall run until the end of the next business day following such Saturday, Sunday or legal holiday. As used herein, the term “legal holiday” means any state or federal holiday for which financial institutions or post offices are generally closed in the state where the Property is located.

10.10 Governing Law. This Agreement shall in all respects be interpreted, construed and enforced according to the laws of the state where the Property is located.

10.11 Counterparts. This Agreement may be executed separately and independently in any number of counterparts and each and all of which together shall be deemed to have been executed simultaneously and regarded as one agreement dated the Effective Date. The transmission of a signature page by email or facsimile shall be valid and binding once attached to the Agreement for all purposes of this Agreement

10.12 Captions. The captions and headings contained in this Agreement are for convenient reference only and shall not affect the interpretation of this Agreement.

10.13 Attorneys’ Fees and Costs. Purchaser and Seller will pay their own attorneys’ fees for the transaction contemplated by this Agreement, except as follows. In the event of litigation arising out of breach or claimed breach of this Agreement, the prevailing party shall be entitled to recover from the other party all costs and expenses incurred as a result, including attorneys’ fees and costs.

10.14 Survival. All of the terms of this Agreement, including, without limitation, the representations and warranties contained herein, shall survive and be enforceable after the Closing and delivery of the deed.

10.15 Entire Agreement/Amendment. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties with respect to the subject matter herein and fully supersedes all prior written or oral agreements between the parties with respect to such matters. No other agreement, statement or promise made by any party and no amendment, modification or other change of any provision of this Agreement shall be effective unless in writing signed by the parties.

10.16 Effective Date. The date that the last party executed this Agreement as evidenced by the dates in the signature block of this Agreement. If either party fails to date this Agreement by its signature, the date by the signature of the other party shall constitute the Effective Date. Upon execution, a party shall promptly forward a signed original to the other party.

10.17 Confidentiality. Purchaser and Seller agree not to disclose this Agreement, nor discussions regarding it, to any person without the consent of the other party, provided, however, that the foregoing restrictions shall not apply to: (a) information that is already in the public domain without violation of this Section; (b) information that is required to be disclosed by law; (c) disclosures deemed reasonably necessary by either party in order to accomplish this transaction; and (d) disclosures to members, managers, officers, brokers, attorneys, accountants, board members, and financial consultants of the parties. This confidentiality provision shall remain in effect until the Purchaser’s public school board meeting to obtain approval for this transaction.

10.18 Tax Deferred Exchange. Seller and Purchaser shall cooperate with each other in order to permit either party to effectuate the conveyance or acquisition of the Property as part of a tax-deferred Section 1031 exchange; provided that the party requested to so cooperate does not incur any expense or any liability in connection therewith and it does not delay Closing.

10.19 Electronic Signing and Delivery. The parties may execute this Agreement with a “wet ink” or manual signature or an Electronic Signature, the parties hereby consenting to the execution of this Agreement or any amendment to it with an Electronic Signature. An Electronic Signature has the same legal validity and enforceability as a manually executed signature to the fullest extent permitted by applicable law. A party may deliver electronically its signature to this Agreement or any amendment relating to it, regardless of the means by which it is executed, and when fully delivered, this Agreement or document relating to it will constitute effective delivery of that document. As used herein, “Electronic Signature” means an electronic symbol or process, including but not limited to, pdfs, facsimiles or a signature generated through a signature service such as “DocuSign” or Adobe “Sign”, attached to or logically associated with a contract or other record and executed or adopted by a person with the intent to sign the record.

10.20 Relocation Benefits.

(a) Applicability. Purchaser is an “acquiring authority” within the meaning of Minn. Stat. §§ 117.50 through 117.56. When Purchaser acquires real property, Minn. Stat. § 117.52 obligates Purchaser, as an “acquiring authority” to provide the relocation assistance, services, payments and benefits required by the Uniform Relocation Assistance and Real Property Acquisition Policies Act of 1970, as amended by the Surface Transportation and Uniform Relocation Assistance Act of 1987 and the regulations adopted pursuant thereto which are found at 49 CFR Part 24. 49 CFR § 24.101(a) indicates that the requirements of the regulations do not apply to voluntary transactions which meet the following conditions:

- i. No specific site or property needs to be acquired;
- ii. The property to be acquired is not part of an intended, planned or designated project area where all or substantially all of the property within the area is to be acquired within specific time limits;
- iii. The acquiring agency will not acquire the property in the event negotiations fail to result in an amicable agreement, and the owner is so informed in writing; and
- iv. The acquiring agency informs the owner in writing what it believes to be the fair market value of the property.

Purchaser asserts that this transaction satisfies the requirements set forth above. Purchaser does not need to acquire any specific site; the Property is not part of an intended, planned or designated project area of Purchaser’s in which Purchaser is to acquire all or substantially all of the property within the area within specific time limits; Purchaser will not acquire the Property in the event negotiations fail to result in an amicable agreement between Seller and Purchaser; and Purchaser believes that the Purchase Price is the fair market value of the Property.

(b) Representations and Warranties of Seller. Seller represents and warrants to Purchaser that Seller is the sole owner-occupant of the Property; that Seller had expressed an intent to sell the Property on the public market prior to any inquiry or action by the Purchaser; that there were no tenants or other non-

owner occupants in possession of all or any portion of the Property as of the date Purchaser delivered the initial draft of this Agreement to Seller; and Seller will not allow any parties other than Seller to occupy or possess the Property prior to the Closing. Seller further represents to Purchaser that the Property is used solely for the operation of a business and has not been used as a single-family or multi-family residence, a multi-purpose property which included a single or multi-family residence, a unit in a condominium or cooperative housing project or any other place of permanent or customary usual residence of a person.

(c) Indemnification. Seller acknowledges that Purchaser is executing this Agreement in reliance on the representations set forth in Section 10.20, and Seller hereby agrees to indemnify Purchaser against any claims, causes of action or liability, including, but not limited to, claims for relocation assistance, services, payments or benefits, which Purchaser suffers or incurs as a result of the inaccuracy of any of the warranties set forth in Section 10.20 or Seller's breach of any of the warranties set forth in Section 10.20, provided that any action for damages based on a breach of any warranty shall have been commenced by Purchaser against Seller within twelve (12) months of the Closing.

(d) Waiver. Seller agrees that if, notwithstanding the provisions of Sections 10.20(a) and 10.20(b) above, Purchaser is obligated to provide Seller with relocation benefits pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 117.52, it is Seller's intent to waive the relocation benefits pursuant to the provisions of Minn. Stat. § 117.521. The attached **Exhibit B** specifically describes the types and amounts of relocation assistance, services, payments and benefits which Seller may be eligible for if the provisions of Sections 10.20(a) and 10.20(b) do not apply; and the types and amounts of relocation assistance, services, payments and benefits which Seller is waiving pursuant to this Section 10.20(d). Seller acknowledges that Purchaser has explained the contents of this waiver to Seller, that Seller is waiving these benefits voluntarily, that Purchaser has not made any express or implied threats to acquire the Property by eminent domain or any other threats intended to induce Seller to waive relocation assistance benefits and that representatives of Seller have explained the contents of this waiver to Seller in a manner which is understandable to the Seller and the Seller understands the terms and conditions of the waiver.





Waiver of Relocation Benefits

1. RELOCATION ASSISTANCE, SERVICES, PAYMENTS AND BENEFITS FOR WHICH SELLER MAY BE ELIGIBLE.

If, notwithstanding the factors recited in Section 10.20 of the Purchase Agreement, the requirements of 49 CFR, Part 24 apply to Purchaser's acquisition of the Property from Seller, Seller may be entitled to receive the following relocation assistance, services, payments and benefits:

A. Seller has the right to require Purchaser to comply with the basic acquisition policies described in 49 CFR, Section 24.102;

B. Seller has the right to require Purchaser to acquire all buildings, structures or other improvements located upon the Property pursuant to the provisions of 49 CFR, Section 24.105;

C. Seller has the right to require Purchaser to pay expenses incidental to transfer of title to the Purchaser pursuant to the requirements of 49 CFR, Section 24.106;

D. Seller has the right to receive the relocation notices described in 49 CFR, Section 24.203;

E. Seller has the right to receive relocation planning, advisory services and coordination as described in 49 CFR, Section 24.205; and

F. Seller has the right to receive payment for actual reasonable moving and related expenses pursuant to 49 CFR, Sections 24.301 and 24.303 and payment for re-establishment expenses pursuant to 49 CFR, Section 24.304. Re-establishment expenses may not exceed \$10,000.00. As a substitute for the payments for actual reasonable moving and related expenses and re-establishment expenses, Seller may be eligible to choose a fixed payment equal to the average of 2 years annual gross revenues of the nonprofit organization less administrative expenses, as computed in accordance with 49 CFR, Section 24.305(d), but such amount shall not be less than \$1,000.00 nor more than \$20,000.00. Any payment in excess of \$1,000 must be supported with financial statements for the two 12-month periods prior to the acquisition.

2. RELOCATION ASSISTANCE, SERVICES, PAYMENTS AND BENEFITS WHICH SELLER IS ELIGIBLE FOR AND WHICH SELLER IS VOLUNTARILY WAIVING PURSUANT TO MINN. STAT. § 117.521, SUBD. 1.

Seller voluntarily waives the relocation assistance and each of the relocation services, payments and benefits described in Section 1 above. Seller states that this waiver is made voluntarily and is not made under any threat of acquisition of the Property by eminent domain by Purchaser. Seller further states that Purchaser and Seller's attorney have explained the contents of this waiver to Seller and that Seller fully understands the nature of the relocation assistance, services, payments and benefits for which Seller is eligible and that Seller knowingly and voluntarily waives such assistance, services, payments and benefits.
