Mr. Lambert explained the budget form for the General Fund and its layout. He showed the budget expense number for the General Fund for the 2019-2020 school year. He then gave a handout of our actual numbers from September 1, 2019 to December 31, 2019 and explained what percent of the budget we have used for these first four months.

VII. INFORMATION AND PROPOSALS

VII.1. ACTIVITY DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Mr. Lambert read the athletic director's report in the absence of Mr. Hauxwell. He noted members of the fall Academic All-State as well as various activities coming up including the high school wrestling meet, SPVA basketball tournament, District 5 NSAA meeting, honor band participants, and Sing Around Nebraska. It was noted that a wrestling mat was purchased for \$6,980 of which \$3,500 will be paid by the youth wrestling club and a new bid from REI shows the cost of the cameras for the 2 buses will be \$5,780 not \$7,960 as reported at prior meeting.

VII.2. PRINCIPALS' REPORT

Mrs. Odens reported about the various meetings during the teacher in-service on January 6th. She noted that the science fair will take place tomorrow and she and Mr. Lechtenberg will attend career fair at UNK on Thursday January 16th. She also congratulated Mrs. Cupp on the award she received from Farm Bureau - 2020 Nebraska Agriculture in the Classroom Teacher of the Year. She said a special ceremony was done in her honor. She noted that she began second semester teacher observations and that PBIS will have their 2nd annual cake raffle and free throw contest on Friday during the basketball game.

Mr. Lambert read Mr. Lechtenberg's report in his absence. He noted the 5-12 MAPS awards ceremonies that took place the week before Christmas break. He reported that Mrs. Gonzalez and the STEM class won a \$15,000 grant through SONY. He is looking into the possibility of a summer breakfast/lunch program and will report back with more information. He noted that he and Mr. Lambert met with the junior class to discuss improvement of ACT scores through John Baylor ACT prep. He also informed the board of our current student teacher Mikaela Stephenson in the 7-12 English department.

VII.3. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Mr. Lambert sent out article regarding a preschool program and wants to plant the seed to get the board's thoughts on a preschool for 4 year olds. He will be working with Mrs. Odens to apply for grant that can be up to \$130,000 for 3 years. They are thinking we would need 1 teacher and 1-2 paraprofessionals and we have 3 rooms available currently in the building. Gave reports showing area schools that do/don't have pre-k program in their school and some data of what area schools charge and how they run.

Mr. Lambert reported that the front doors are completed. Bids were presented from Cornhusker Glass and Larry's Glass for new doors and windows in gym. It was decided to have a building & grounds committee meeting and present at the next meeting

Dear Parents and Juniors,

One of our goals at Chase County Schools is to prepare students the best we possibly can to take college entrance exams. In order to reach our goal of helping students prepare for the ACT and for students to achieve their goal of doing well, we will be taking members of the Junior class to an **ACT workshop on March 18th at Bridgeport Public Schools from 8:45 AM to 11:45 AM**. The presenter of the workshop will be Chad Cargill from Oklahoma.

Chad is an ACT Consultant that spends most of his time in Oklahoma and Texas presenting workshops to students. Chad is the founder of Cargill Consulting, www.cargillcounseling.com. During high school Chad knew he needed to win scholarships in order to attend Oklahoma State University. Chad's freshman year in high school, he discovered that many scholarships were based on ACT scores and the journey was on. He took the ACT a total of 18 times in high school, raising his score from 19 to 32. This phenomenal increase was simply due to him learning what was on the test and how to take it.

We also do the John Baylor (On To College) ACT Prep Program, the two programs are nothing alike but both are very important. Chad's program involves guidance on how to take the ACT and pointers on exam questions that are often overlooked. At the last school I was at we had Chad come and usually had about 400 students there from other schools including ours, students enjoyed him and felt like it made a big difference in how they scored.

This year Chase County schools will be providing transportation and cover the program cost (including lunch) for all of our juniors. All juniors are required to take the ACT on April 7th as the Nebraska State Assessment which will be held Berean Church in Imperial. Younger students planning to take the ACT this spring may be considered for this workshop if extra slots are available.

The bus will leave the CCS student parking lot at 6:00 AM and return by 3:30 PM on Wednesday, March 18th. We assume all juniors will attend. If a student is not able or willing to attend, parents should contact Mr. Herbert **by February 19th**. He can be reached at therbert@chasecountyschools.org or via phone at 308-882-4304.

Early childhood education can build future

Ninety percent.

That's the giant part of a child's brain formed by age 6.

Ninety percent. That's the two-word answer that pops into Sam Meisels' head when the founding executive director of the Buffett Early Childhood Institute at the University of Nebraska is quizzed by a stranger.

Ninety percent is our starting point today, as we consider a key question: Why does quality early childhood education matter, anyway?

In 2020, most Nebraskans say in surveys that they value it. To parents the need for help is obvious: Roughly 75% of young Nebraska children now grow up in homes where all parents work.

But we may lack an understanding of just how crucial high-quality early childhood education is, and why.

If we understand early childhood's true importance, it's easier to understand why we need to ensure every young Nebraskan can access it. It's easier to understand why we need to pay early childhood teachers more and charge middle-class families less for childcare. It's why we need to end rampant childcare shortages in our state. It's also why we need to pay attention to the Nebraska Early Childhood Workforce Commission, a group of more than 40 political, education and business leaders whose recent report lays a path forward for early childhood in Nebraska. (Learn more at EarlyYearsMatter.org/workforce.)

Not long ago, we viewed young children as blank slates who didn't need to learn much before entering kindergarten. Now we can prove that stimulating brain growth long before kindergarten can have a massive impact on a young child's future education, her future earnings, even her future health.

This shift in thinking began

where we started today: 90 percent of a child's brain is formed by age 6.

We now know that, starting at birth, a million synapses form each second in the brain. This growth of brain connections slows rapidly before puberty. Rewiring existing connections also gets tougher with age. That's why it's easier to learn a new language at age 7 than 77.

"It's more efficient, both biologically and economically, to get things right the first time than to try to fix them later," Meisels says.

So, how do we get things right the first time? By delivering high-quality early childhood education to young children being taught in a home, school or center. A mountain of research shows that doing so can change their lives — especially the lives of kids growing up in poverty.

Consider the Perry Preschool Project, a 1960s study that provided free preschool to a group of Michigan 3- and 4-year-olds from low-income homes. Experts then studied those who got early education, and those who didn't, until those kids were middle aged.

The children who received quality early childhood education were far more likely to become good students who graduated high school. They were also more likely to become successful adults.

Four times as many Perry preschoolers as non-preschoolers ended up making a living wage. Twice as many avoided welfare. Fewer ended up in prison.

Researchers have seen similarly eye-popping results elsewhere. A North Carolina study showed that young children who got quality early childhood education actually grew into healthier adults, with

less heart disease and diabetes for men, and better mental health for women.

Economists have calculated that putting money into early childhood education is a better investment than the stock market. They say that every dollar we spend on early childhood education returns at least \$4 — and as much as \$13 in the case of at-risk children.

Why? Because we spend less down the road on social safety net programs, special education, prison cells. And because a well-educated young child tends to turn into an employed, taxpaying American.

Early childhood education is no magic bullet. But the people working at the cutting edge of brain development tend to view it as the single best way make our future better than our present.

Nebraskans already understand this at a gut level. Polling shows that a strong majority of Nebraskans — Republicans, Democrats, and Independents — support early childhood education. We care about families and kids. We want to help build that better future.

The groundwork is already being laid. Schools, nonprofits and small towns are building up their own early childhood offerings. Businesses are working to solve employee child care shortages. The Workforce Commission is offering a statewide path forward. Now that you know a bit of science behind early childhood's value, you can help.

Ninety percent. That's how much of a child's brain is formed by age 6. Tell your friends, your neighbors, your elected representatives. Tell anyone who asks why early childhood education matters.

Because it most certainly does.

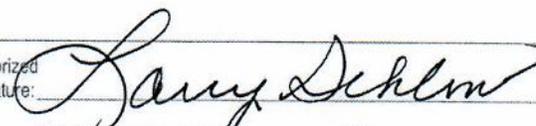
