# Purpose

This annual report includes important and informative demographic, curriculum, financial, and student assessment data. Shelby-Rising City Schools submits this report to the stakeholders of the district to assist you in understanding and evaluating your school system. We hope this report will encourage all stakeholders to become aware of the accomplishments and needs of the district, and to become involved in planning for our continued improvement.

# About the District

The Shelby-Rising City Public Schools is a rural, Class III District, located in east-central Nebraska along Highways 81 and 92. Shelby Public School and Rising City Public School reorganized into the Shelby-Rising City Public Schools in May of 2011. Shelby is a town of 714, located in eastern Polk County. Rising City is a town of 396, located in western Butler County. The schools have a student population of over 400 students in grades PK-12. Beginning with the fall of 2017 all students attend school in Shelby following a \$15 million renovation and expansion project. Shelby-Rising City High School is classified as a C1-C2 school by the Nebraska School Activities Association depending on which activity they are competing in.

The District conducts Strategic Planning sessions with stakeholders to review and update District goals. The initial plan in 2014 led to additional academic programs and the focus on facility improvements. In the spring of 2017 the plan was reviewed with new focus being placed on innovation in the classroom and creating a College and Career Readiness Program/Academy. The plan continues to emphasize the 1:1 Device Initiative that placed laptops in the hands of all 6th through 12th graders in 2014 by expanding it to elementary students. Kindergarten through 2<sup>nd</sup> grade students each have an iPad and 3<sup>rd</sup> through 5<sup>th</sup> grade students each have a Chromebook beginning with the fall of 2017.

# Growth and Progress Continues

Shelby-Rising City Schools continues to defy typical rural trends as enrollment has reached 415 students for PK-12 for the 2018-2019 school year. That is the largest enrollment in school history. The District started the 2019-2020 school year with 406 students.

In the fall of 2018 the District announced it's unique partnership with Central Community College to create the College and Career Pathways Program. The program features dual credit courses taught online and by S-RC teachers that gives students the opportunity to earn college credit, qualify for an Advantage Scholarship, or receive certification in three career ready pathways: Health Sciences, Agriculture Sciences, or Business/Marketing/Information Technology. This unique blend gives students in their Junior and Senior year opportunities beyond those available on campus. S-RC offers several areas of career and technical education courses on campus that will be part of the dual-credit courses.

Shelby-Rising City Schools continues to be a leader in innovative instruction as a pilot school for BlendED learning and one of the few Districts in Nebraska who offers 1-to-1 digital devices to all students in Kindergarten through 12<sup>th</sup> grade. Funding for upgrades to existing technology continues to come through our REAP grant, which minimizes tax dollar usage to acquire updated technology. In the last two years S-RC has focused on providing instructional resources and support to meet our District goals for student learning.

Our District is committed to providing exceptional learning opportunities for students that will prepare them for a variety of choices after graduation.

This fall the District implemented a later start time in order to provide teachers time for quality collaboration through the Professional Learning Community process. As a result of the later start time the District was able to expand opportunities for students before school with our breakfast program, wellness program, mentoring, tutoring, and other whole child supports.

We are proud to boast that 80% of our High School students are participating in at least one school activity and many participate in academic, fine art, and athletic competition for the Huskies. Becoming a well-rounded individual through a variety of academic and extra-curricular offerings is vital in supporting the District Mission for every student!



## *Pathway Program*

S-RC kicked off the partnership with Central Community College to provide students on-campus options for college credit and career certification. Career certification is available in Health Sciences, Precision Agriculture, and Business-Marketing-Technology. All college coursework is dual credit and transferable.

## Educational Service Unit #7

The District is able to receive services including Internet, Distance Learning, Professional Development, Birth to 5 SPED, Transition/Vocational Planning, Psychologist, Behavioral Specialist, Teacher/Principal Coaching, E-Rate Assistance, Production, Advanced Technology Support, and Federal Grant Consortiums that all benefit students and are acquired at a lesser rate through the shared management of the Service Unit.



## Village of Shelby

Our school library also serves as the Public Library for Shelby. The space is shared and the village provides additional staffing above that of the school allowing for a robust offering of materials for both the school and public to utilize. The staffing model allows for expanded hours and the ability to offer specialized programs of interest to all stakeholders. The Volunteer Fire Department continues to provide outreach programs and service at football games unparalleled by other similar size departments.



## Village of Rising City

The District has partnered with the Village of Rising City to facilitate the sale of the former Middle School site to be used as a community center and village offices for Rising City. This partnership allowed the Village to retain the shop building and gymnasium for future use.



## Fitness Center

The District has offered public memberships for the use of the Fitness Center since its inception in 2011. With the completion of the construction project in 2017 the new Fitness Center located near a secure public entrance has more than doubled in size and available equipment. The facility is member only and users may access it 24 hours a day, 7 days a week with an electronic key card. Proceeds from memberships go towards maintaining and updating equipment.



## Local Businesses

Several local businesses in our school communities continue to be key supporters through support of the School financially or through providing resources and student experiences. The SRC Booster Club continues to raise and provide funds for academic, fine art, and athletic programs and their participants. The new Beef Club is also providing local beef for school meals and donations of cash, services, or animals are directly benefiting students, the school, and local business. TEMPORARY EARLY RETIREMENT INCENTIVE POLICY AND PROGRAM  
OF  
SHELBY-RISING CITY PUBLIC SCHOOLS

The purpose of this Temporary Early Retirement Incentive Policy and Program (hereinafter “Program”) is to offer a financial incentive which will assist long-term certificated employees considering retirement. The Program will be offered to certificated employees of the Shelby-Rising City Public School District (hereinafter “District”) for the **2019-2020** school year.

**I. QUALIFICATIONS:**

- A.** The participant must be a fully certificated teacher.
- B.** The participant must have a full-time equivalency of 1.0 FTE for the academic year preceding the year in which the Program is offered.
- C.** For a participant to be eligible for this program, he/she must be fifty-five (55) years of age and have completed a minimum of fifteen (15) consecutive years of creditable service with the District. Credited service shall mean continuous employment with the District as a full-time certificated employee. Board approved military service, sabbatical and maternity leave or any other leave required to be granted according to law shall be included and not disrupt continuous employment for purposes of this paragraph.

**II. PARTICIPATION AND APPLICATION:**

- A.** Participants in the Program must sign an agreement to resign their employment position with the District effective at the close of the **2019-2020** school year, which shall constitute a voluntary termination of employment in consideration of the Program’s benefits provided herein.
- B.** The Superintendent shall deliver to all certificated employees of the District a copy of the Program after review at the January Regular School Board Meeting. The Temporary Early Retirement incentive Policy and Program Application and Agreement is attached hereto as Exhibit “A” and is incorporated herein by reference. Certificated employees participating in this Program cannot return to full-time or part-time employment in the District at a later date. A participant may substitute for the District at the current substitute teacher rate.
- C.** Any employee who attains the minimum eligibility qualifications shall be eligible to participate in the Program. Each qualified employee who wishes to participate must submit a properly executed Application and Agreement form which must be received in the office of the Superintendent no later than **January 15, 2020**. An executed Application and Agreement may be withdrawn by the employee at any time within seven (7) days following the date it is executed by the employee. The Superintendent shall review the employee’s record to determine eligibility. If eligible, the Board of Education shall approve the Application and Agreement, except as may be otherwise provided herein, by/at the **February, 2020** School Board Meeting or at such later time as deemed appropriate. The

Board of Education reserves the right to deny participation and provide no benefit payment and shall accept or reject an Application on or before **February 15, 2020**.

III. BENEFITS:

- A. A qualified participant employee who elects retirement under the Program shall receive a benefit in the form of two equal payments which shall be made by May of the calendar year following the teacher's last year of employment. Such payments shall not be included in the determination of final average compensation pursuant to the School Employees Retirement Act. The payments to the certificated employee shall equal \$1,000.00 (one thousand dollars) for each year of service with the district and shall not exceed \$10,000 (ten thousand dollars) for each certificated employee receiving benefits under this section. Additionally, each teacher will also be paid \$100.00 for each day of unused sick leave as of the last day of employment.
- B. The Board of Education of the District in its sole and absolute discretion reserves the right to accept or reject any or all applications based on financial exigencies, availability of funds, budget, expenses, revenues, and other school finance issues. The District shall pay the entire cost of the Program for any Application and Agreement granted and approved.
- C. A separating employee will have the opportunity to continue health insurance benefits as may be permitted by the provisions of the Comprehensive Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act (COBRA) or other applicable law.
- D. The Superintendent shall assist the employee in completing the Application and Agreement Plan and in arriving at the applicable benefit amount.

IV. ADMINISTRATION:

- A. This Program shall be administered by the Board of Education by and through the Administration of the District. Any benefits granted under this policy shall be binding upon the District. However, the board reserves the right to rescind the program as to application(s) which have not been granted.
- B. The Program benefit may be taxable income. The District will withhold from such payments all appropriate or applicable state, federal, or other withholding, and shall issue any and all appropriate federal forms for such benefit amounts unless the participant releases and holds the District harmless.
- C. An employee who elects to participate in this Program and the District, by and through its Board of Education, shall execute the herein referenced Application and Agreement. The Application and Agreement shall alert the employee that the District's Program is totally voluntary in nature. The Application and Agreement shall include a specific Waiver and Release of All Claims as provided by such Agreement, and shall allow the employee to revoke the Release or Waiver at any time within seven (7) days after signing same, and shall advise the employee to consult with an attorney before signing the Program Application and Agreement.

D. The Board shall, in its sole discretion, determine the number of applications to be approved in any given year which, for this program, shall be four (4). If the Board receives more applications for voluntary separation than it approves, the Board shall approve the applications on the basis of the highest salary schedule placement. If two or more applicants have the same salary schedule placement, the determination shall be based on the seniority of the applicants with the most senior applicant(s) receiving approval in preference to less senior applicants. Seniority shall be defined as the number of full-time years of employment in the district as an employee. If a tie results, the Board will approve the application of the employee which was submitted earlier.

**V. POLICY TERM:**

The District's Program shall be offered only to eligible employees as defined herein, who meet requirements prior to **May 21, 2020**, and who submit a Program Application and Agreement by **January 15, 2020**.

**VI. WAIVER AND RELEASE OF ALL CLAIMS:**

By entering into this Agreement the Teacher-Participant hereby waives the Teacher-Participants rights under the Age Discrimination in Employment Act (ADEA) and the Older Workers Benefit Protection Act (OWBPA), the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), and the Act Prohibiting Unjust Discrimination in Employment on the Basis of Age, and all other local state or federal laws, constitutions, statutes and regulations, or common law or court decisions that relate to the validity of the Program, this Application and Agreement, or any rights or claims arising thereunder or hereunder. The Teacher-Participant further hereby covenants not to sue, and agrees to indemnify and hold the District harmless from any such claims as set forth herein. This Waiver and Release of Claims does not cover rights or claims arising after the date of the execution of this Application and Agreement.

**VII. REVOCATION AND CANCELLATION OF AGREEMENT:**

The Teacher-Participant and the District acknowledge that the Teacher-Participant may revoke this Application and Agreement, and any waiver, release of all claims, covenant not to sue, or indemnification contained herein, and cancel this Application and Agreement, at any time on or before the expiration of seven (7) days after the execution of this Application and Agreement by the Teacher-Participant.
