2009 Public Participation at Board Meetings

The board of education shall conduct its meetings in accordance with the Nebraska Open Meetings Act.

The board shall make reasonable efforts to accommodate the public's right to hear the discussions and testimony presented at its meetings. The board shall make available at the meeting, for examination and copying by members of the public, at least one copy of all reproducible written material to be discussed in open session of the meeting.

Except for closed sessions, the board will allow members of the public an opportunity to speak at each meeting. The board may make and enforce reasonable rules and regulations regarding the conduct of persons attending, speaking at, videotaping, photographing, or recording its meetings.

The board shall not require members of the public to identify themselves as a condition for admission to the meeting, nor shall such body require that the name of any member of the public be placed on the agenda prior to such meeting in order to speak about items on the agenda. However, the board shall require members of the public desiring to address the board to identify themselves, including an address and the name of any organization represented by such person unless the address requirement is waived to protect the security of the individual.

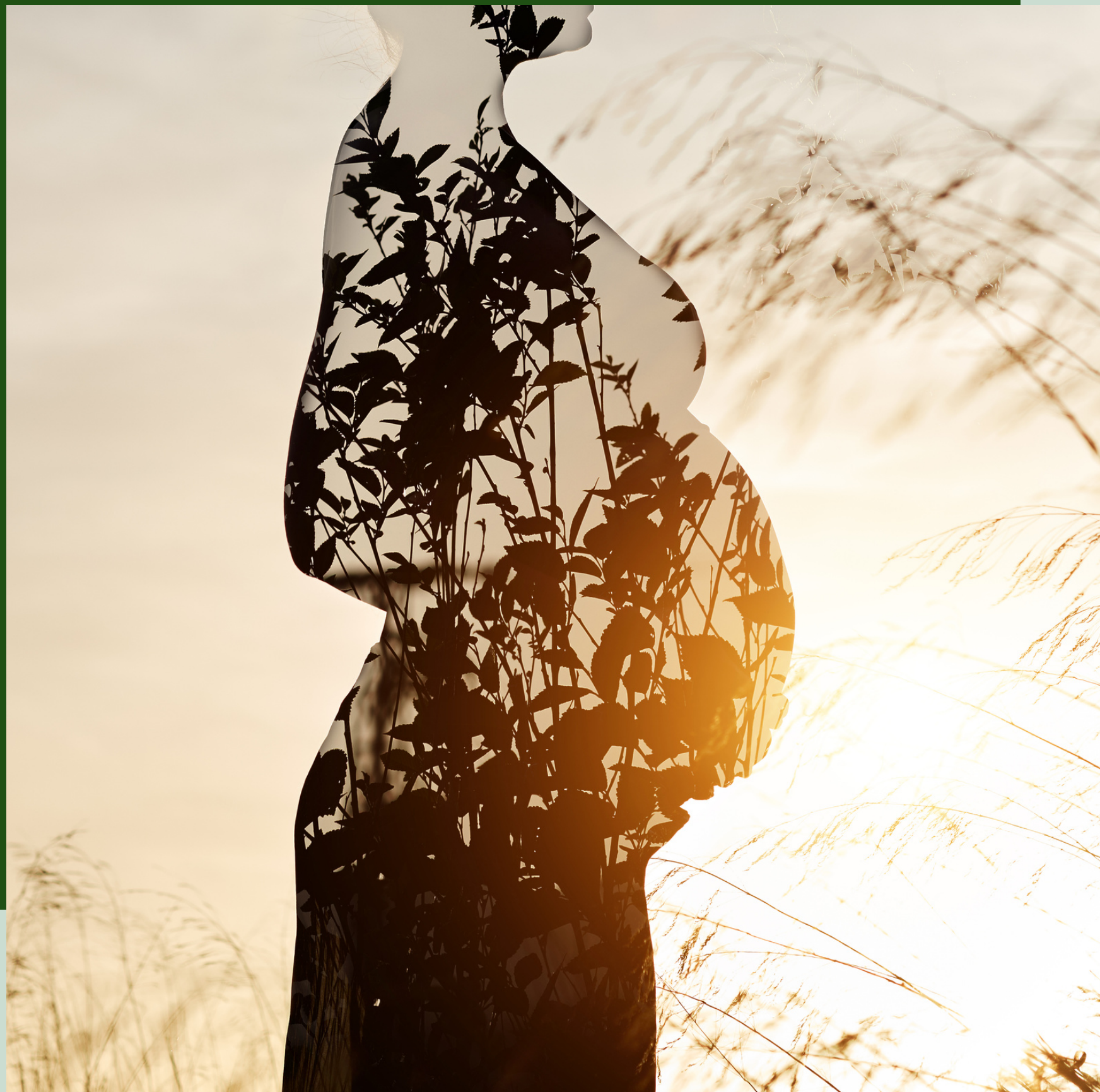

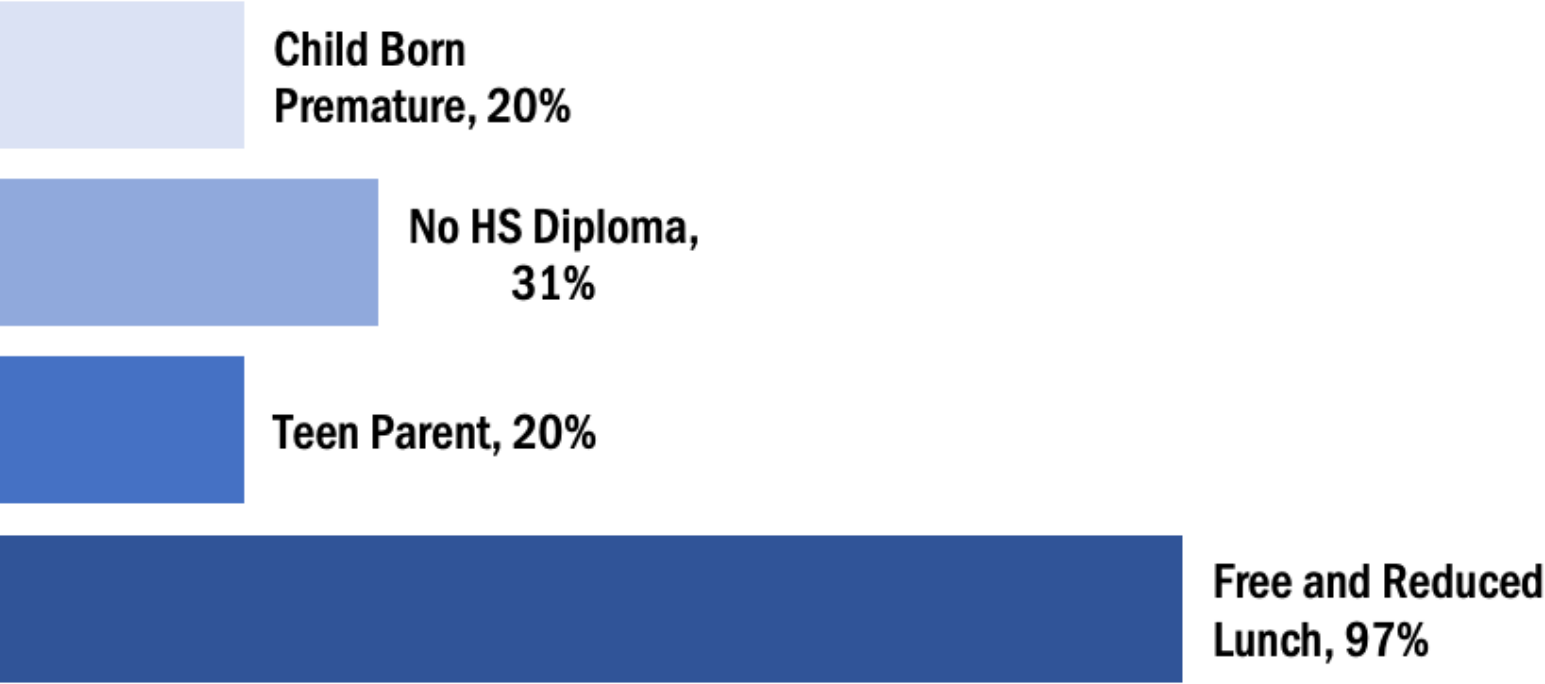

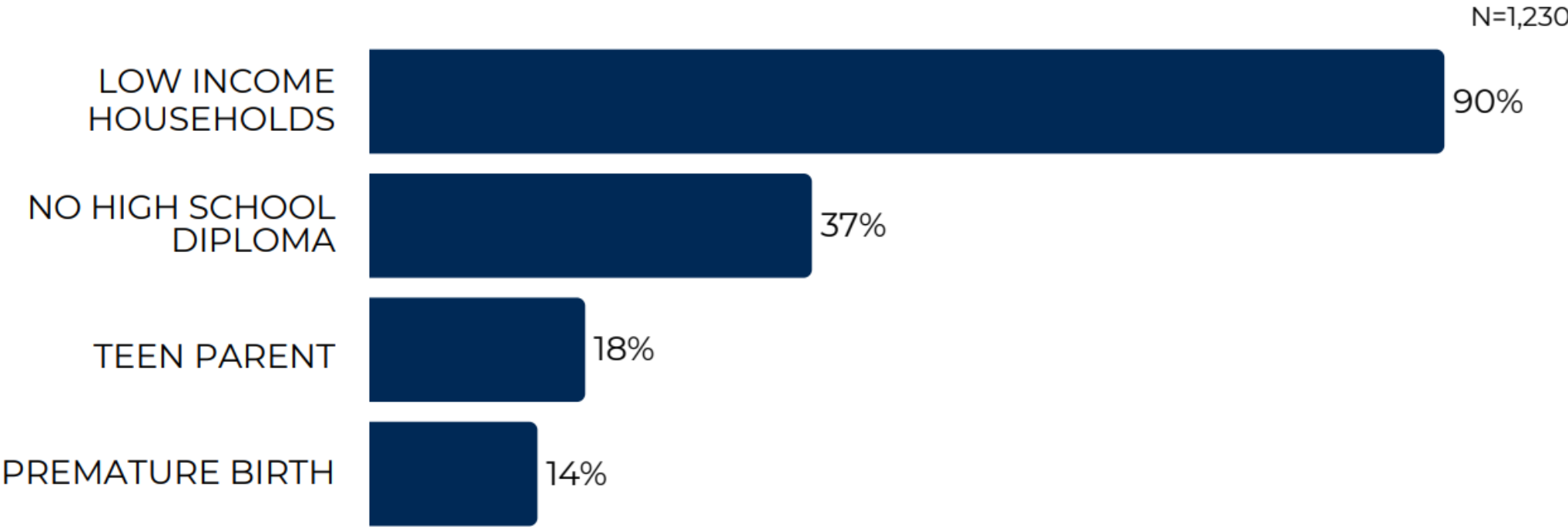
Family stressors

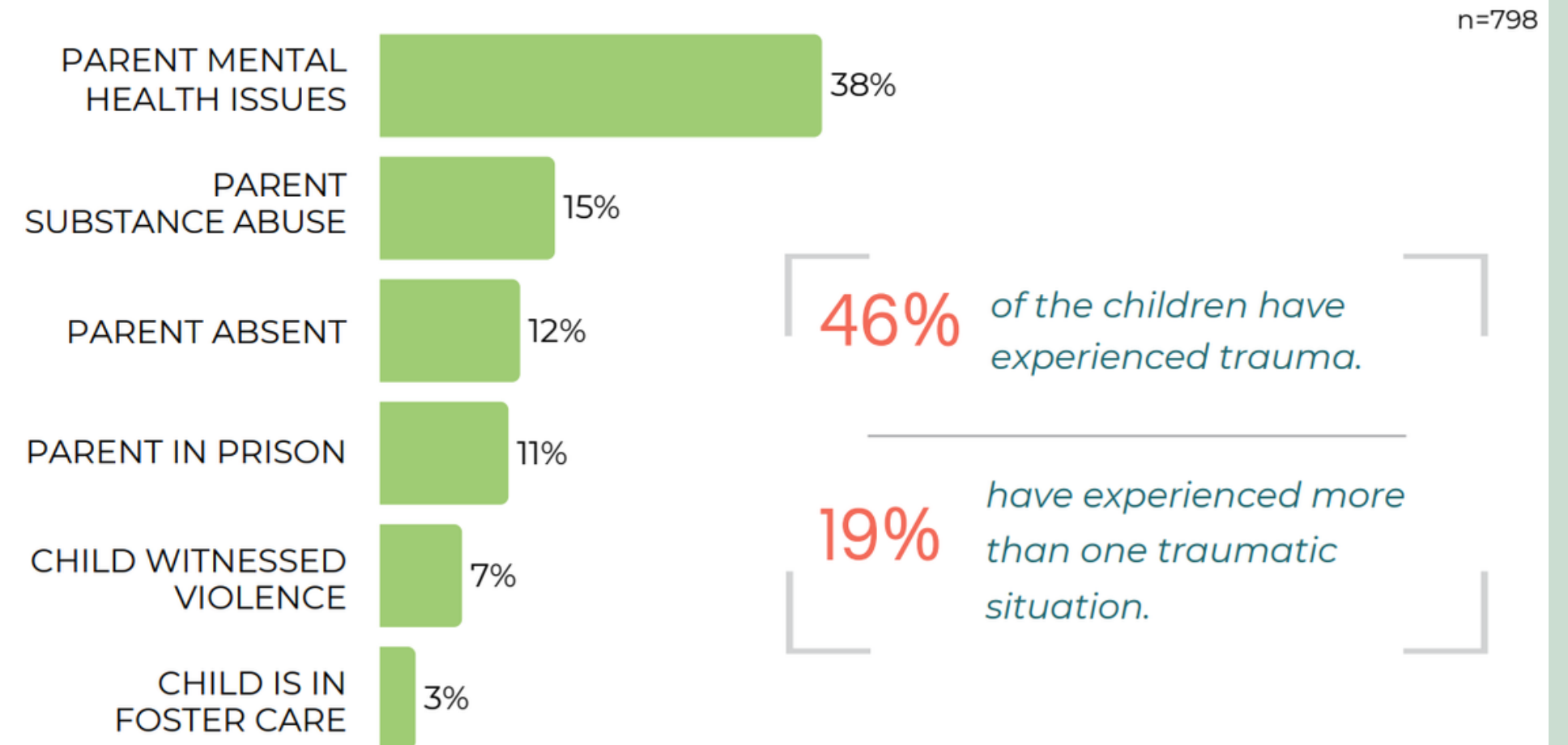

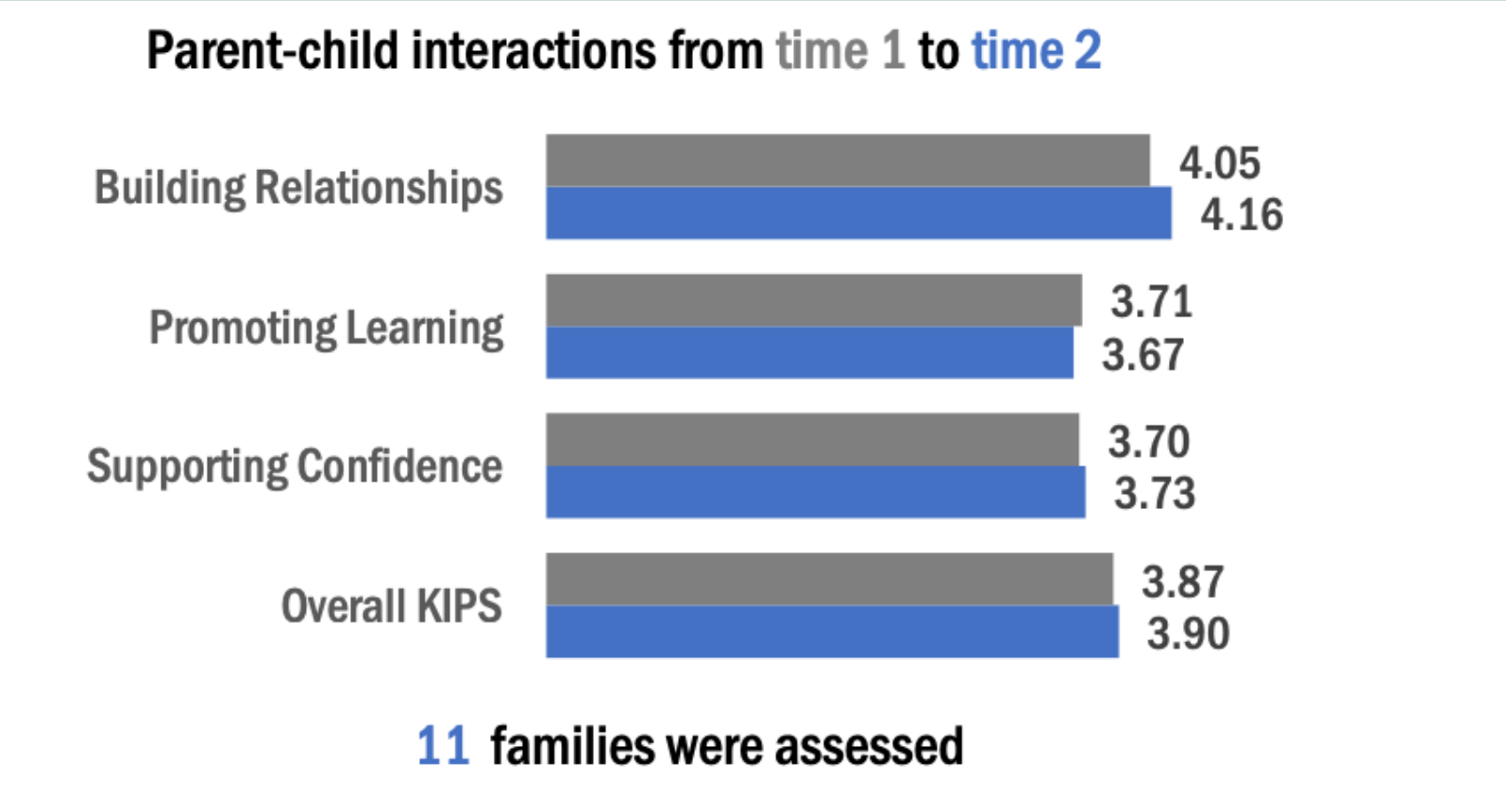

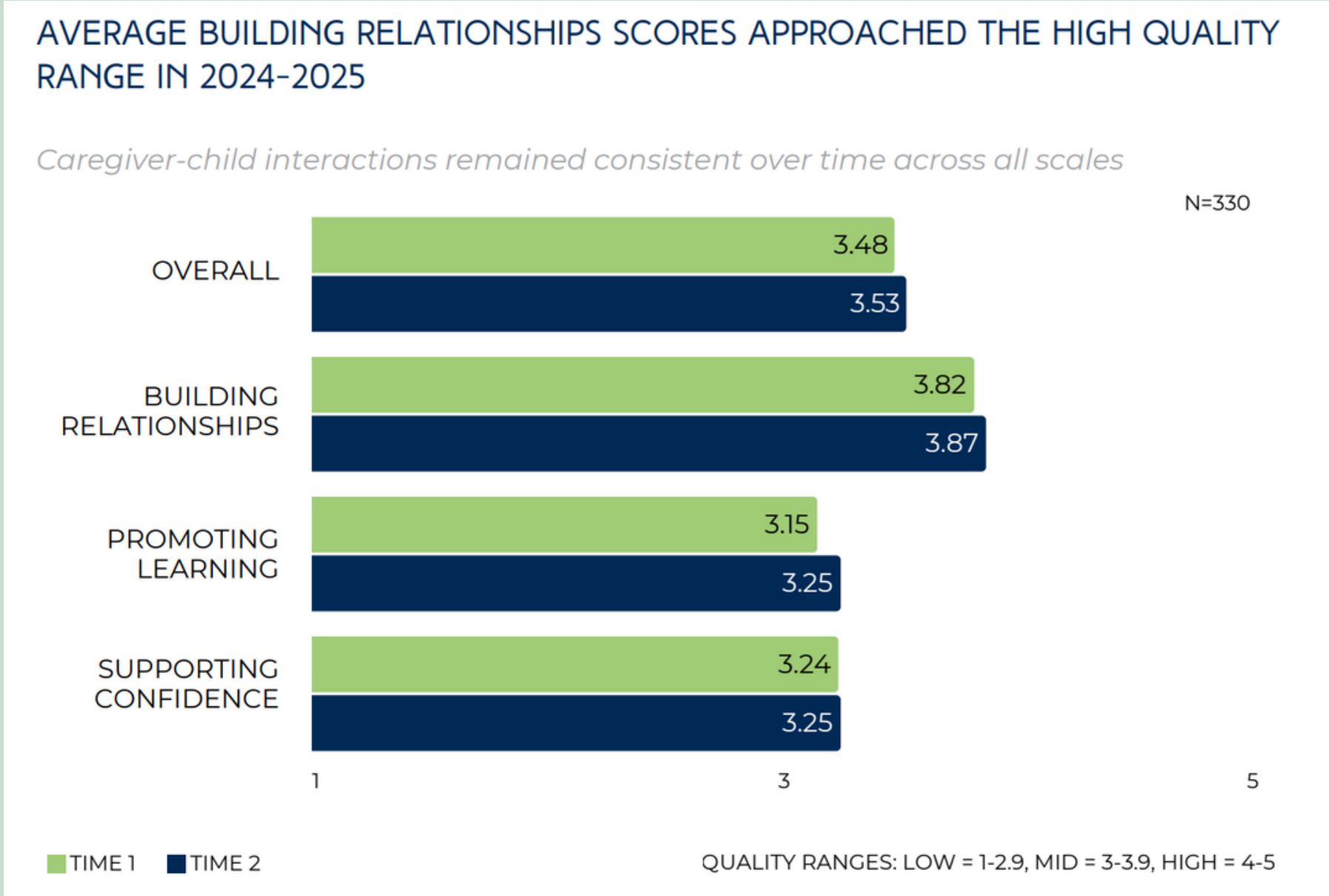

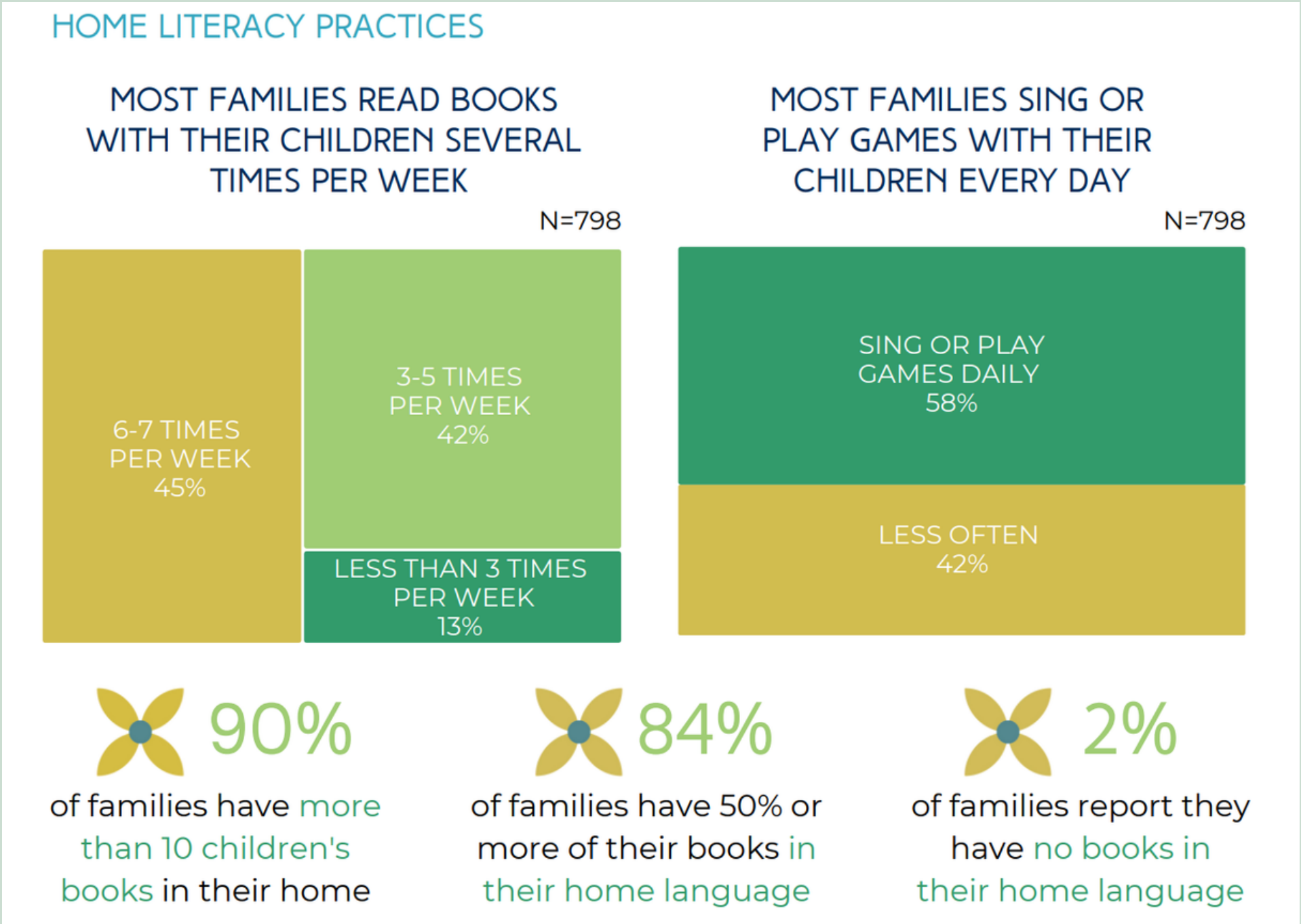

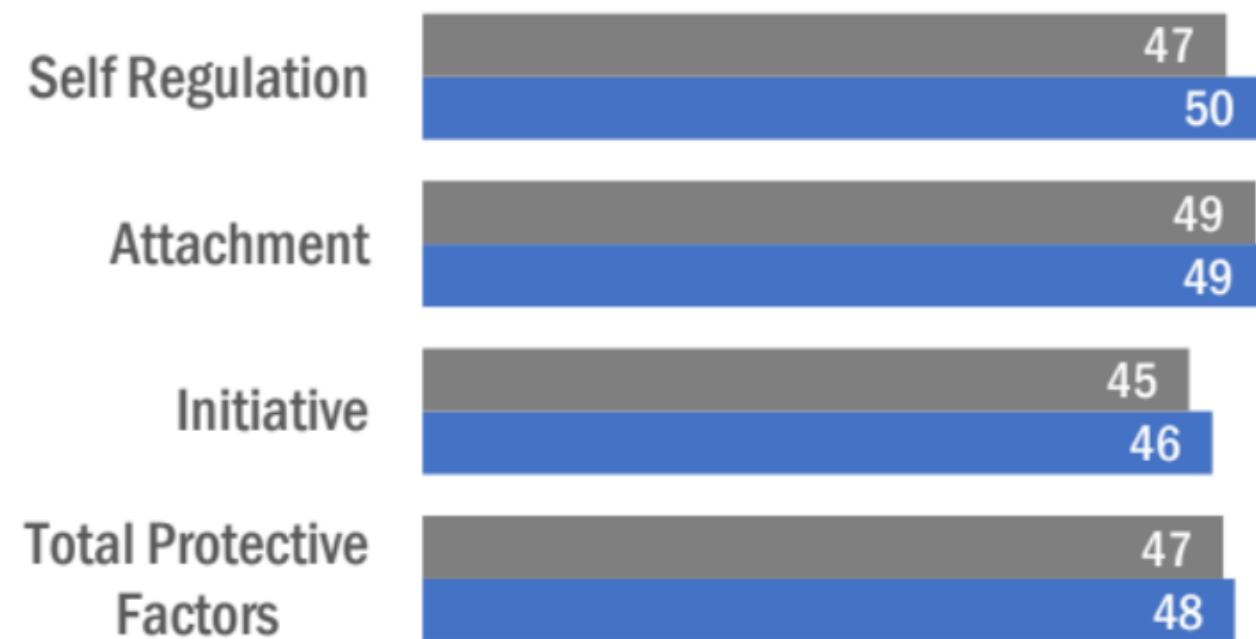

Average social-emotional results from time 1 to time 2.

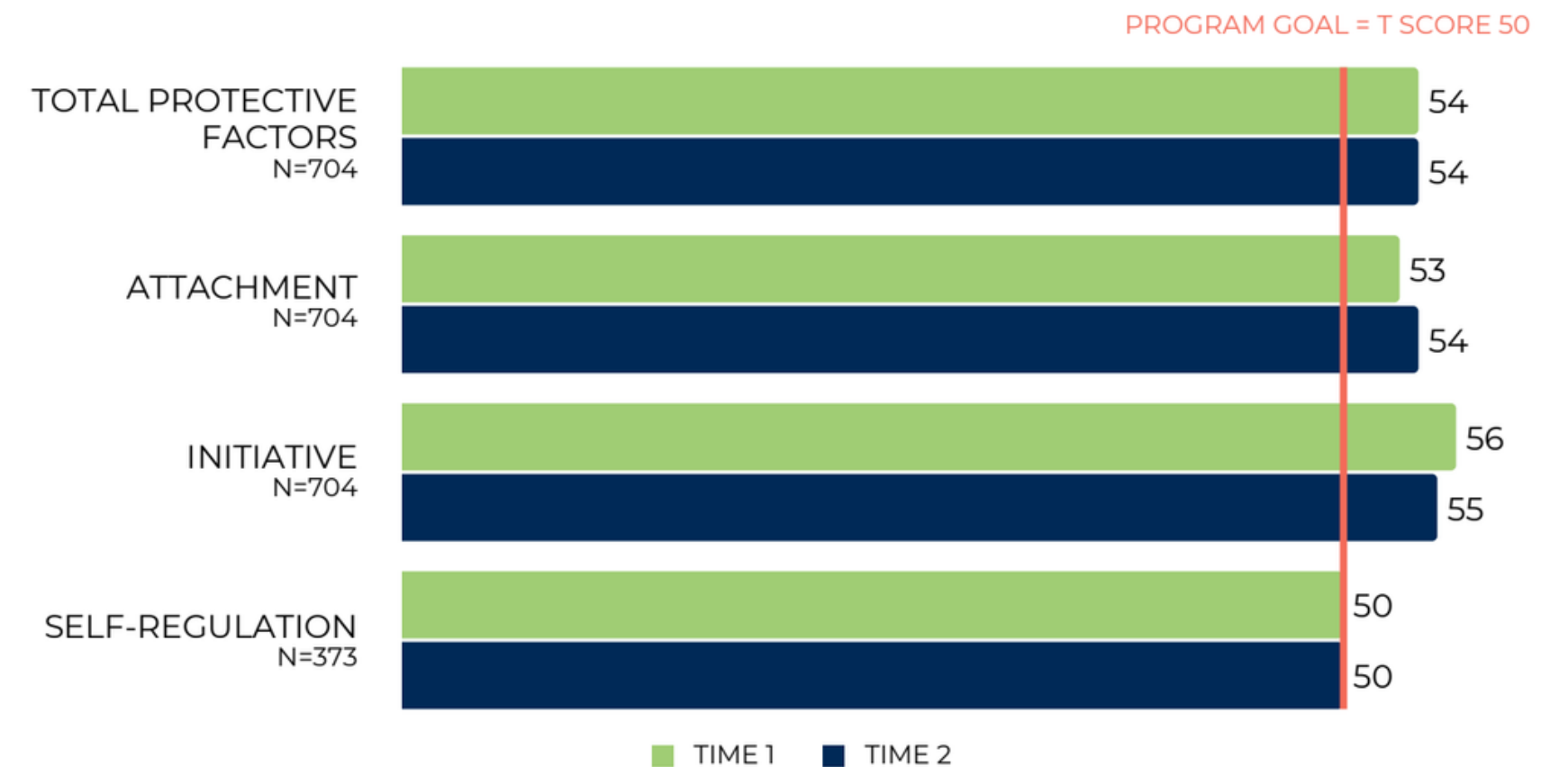

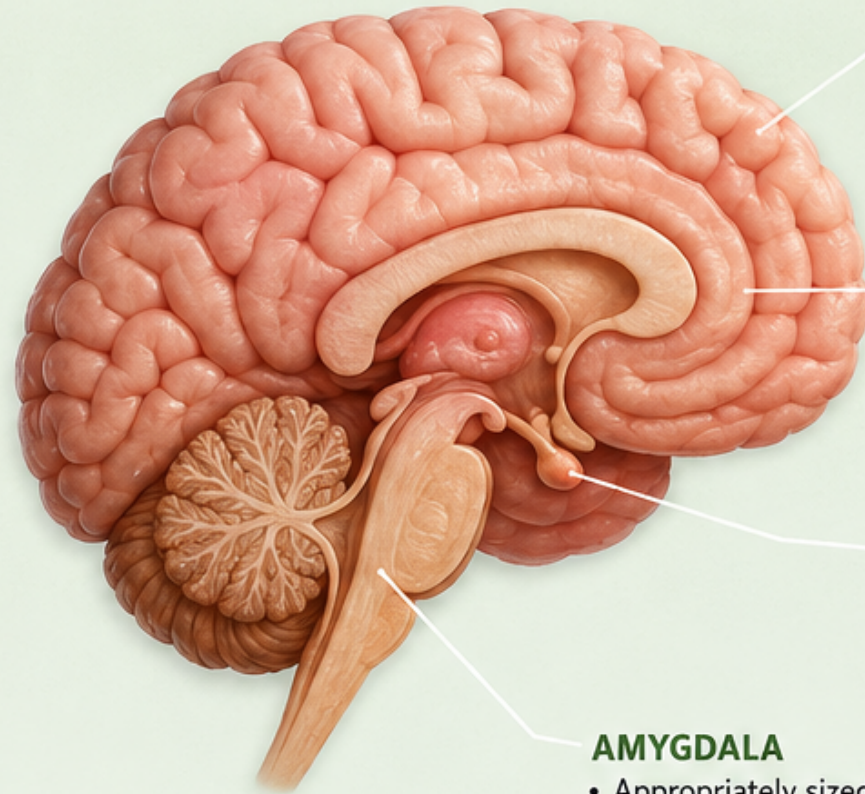

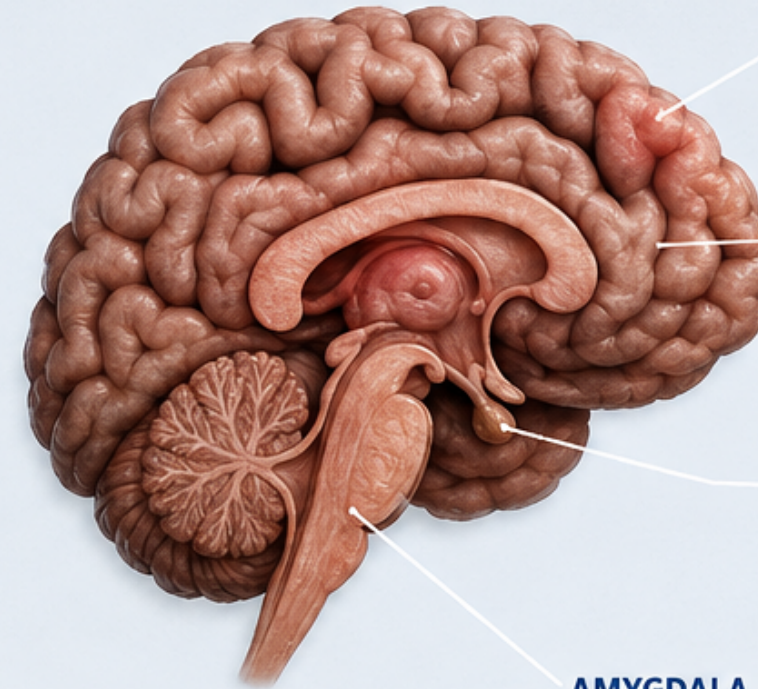

BRAIN WITH SEVERE NEGLECT & TRAUMA

Chronic stress, neglect, and trauma in childhood



PREFRONTAL CORTEX

- Underdeveloped
- Poor impulse control, difficulty planning, trouble focusing

LIMBIC SYSTEM

- Hyperreactive
- Big emotions feel overwhelming
- Difficulty calming down

HIPPOCAMPUS

- Smaller in size
- Poor memory and learning
- Hard time processing past vs. present

AMYGDALA

- Enlarged and overactive
- Constantly on high alert
- Sees danger everywhere (even when safe)

HOW THIS SHOWS UP

- ✗ Struggles to feel safe or trust others
- ✗ Expects rejection or abandonment
- ✗ Lives in fight, flight, or freeze
- ✗ Intense mood swings or numbness
- ✗ Feels shame, worthlessness
- ✗ Higher risk of anxiety, depression, and physical illness
- ✗ Disconnected from self and others

KEY CHARACTERISTICS

- ✗ Sense of danger
- ✗ Emotional dysregulation
- ✗ Poor executive function
- ✗ Impaired learning & memory
- ✗ Relationship difficulties

IMPORTANT TO REMEMBER

The brain is plastic. With safety, connection, and the right support, healing is possible at any age. Trauma changes brain wiring, but it can be rewired.

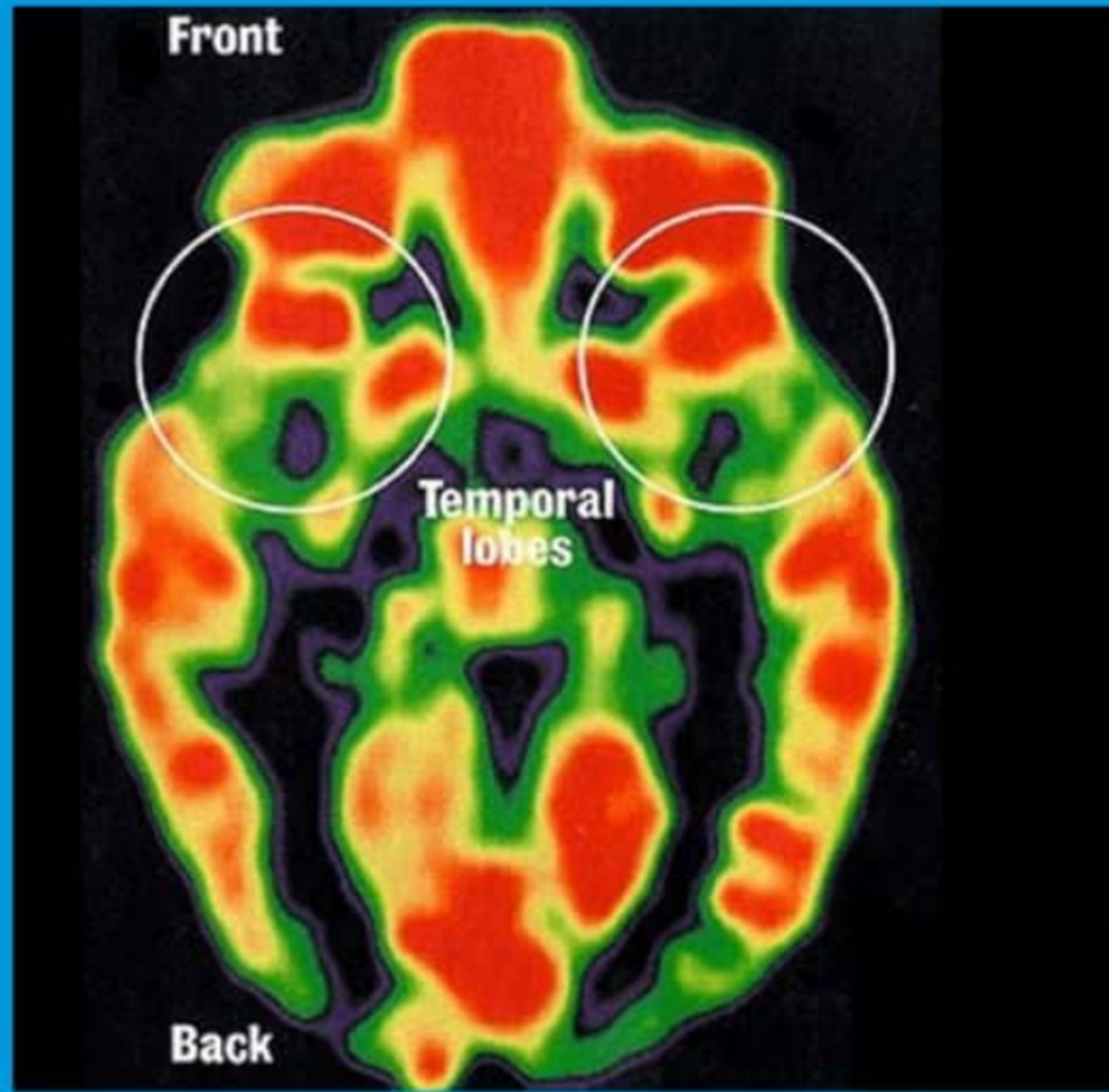

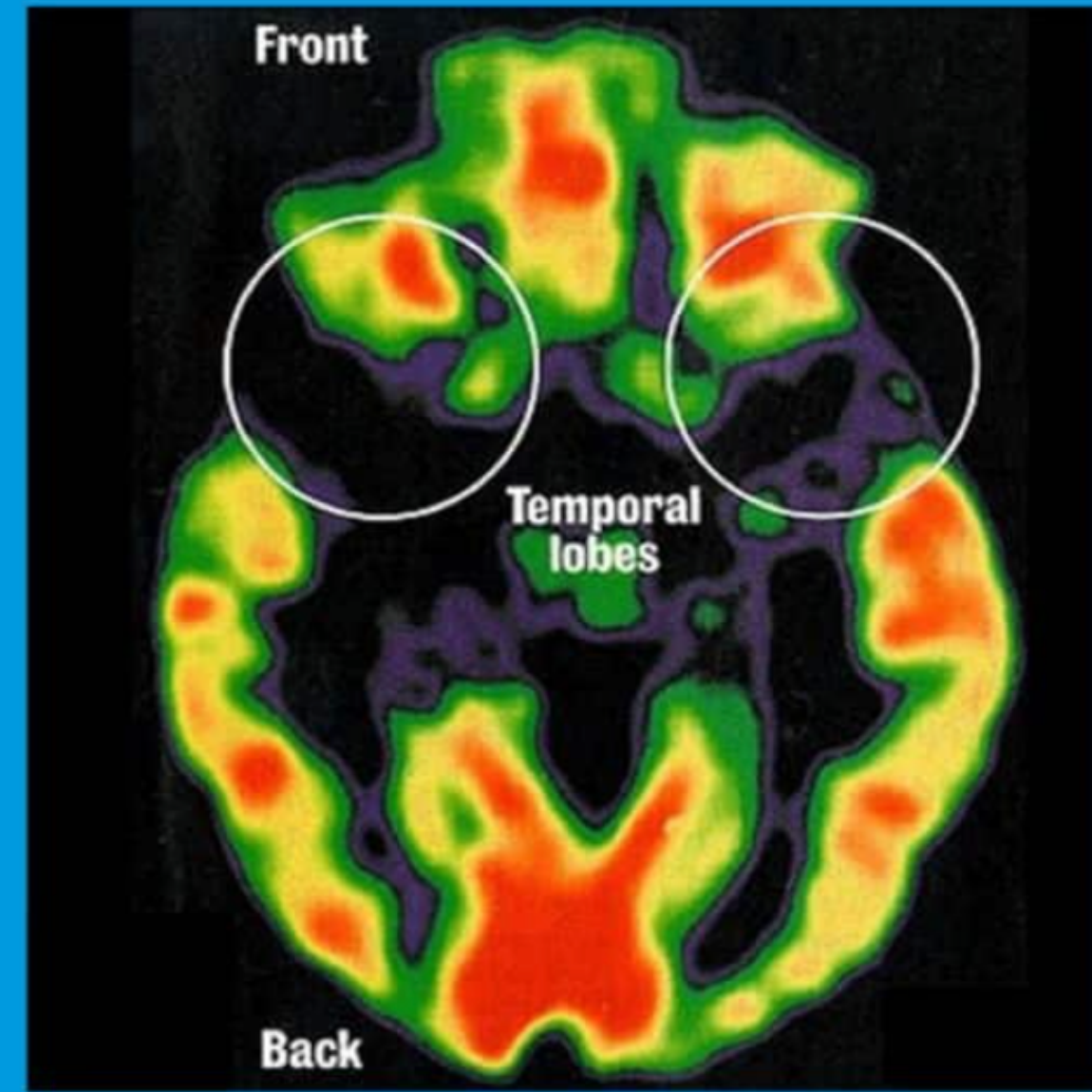

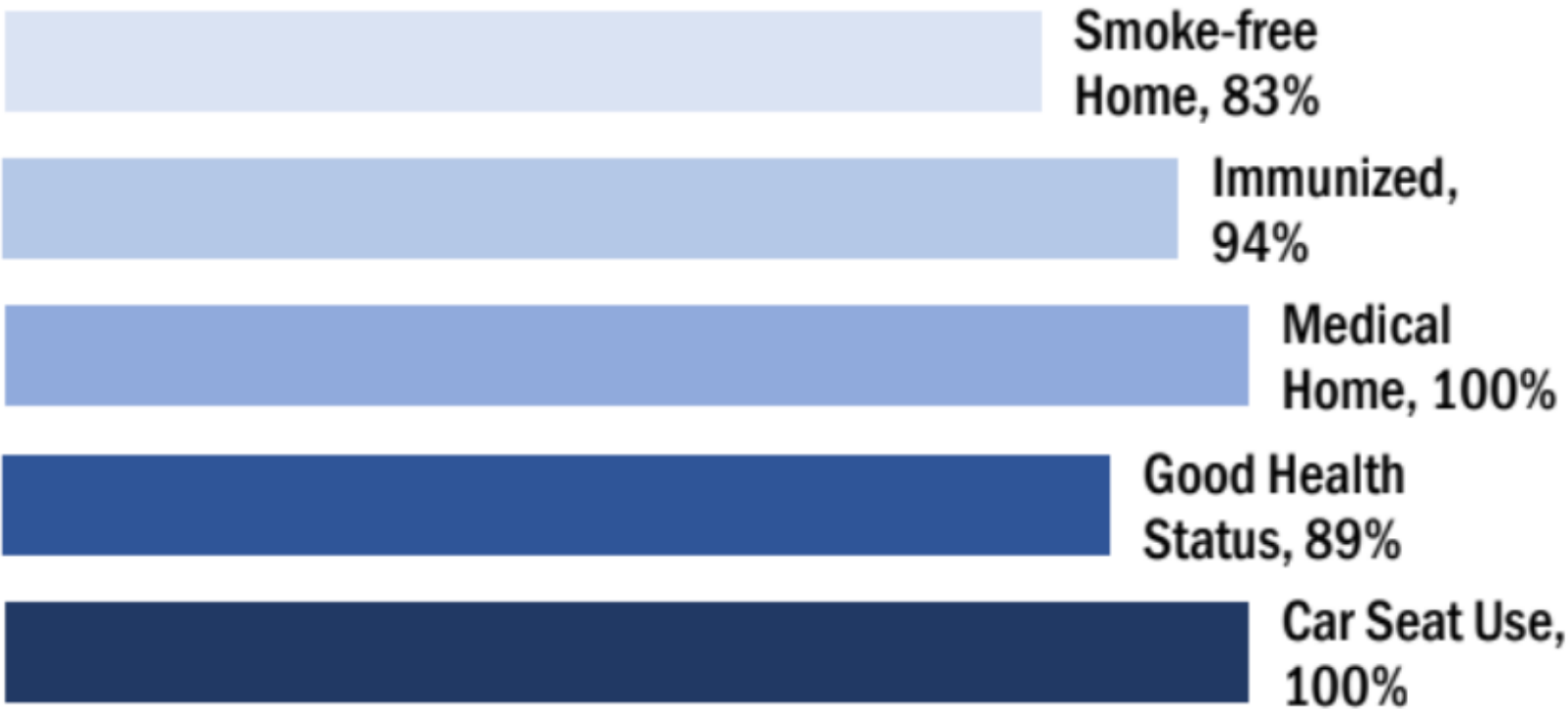
**Brain of Child Exposed to

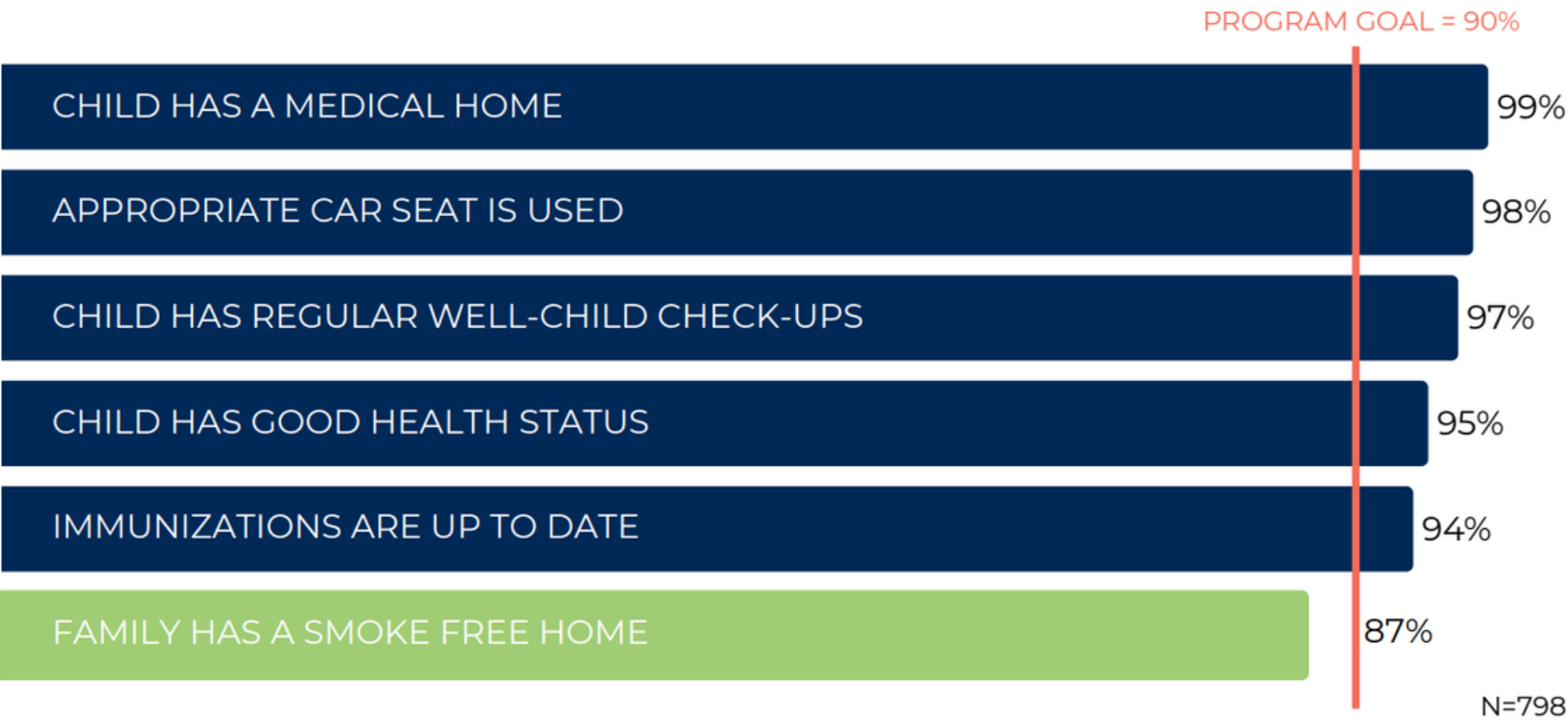
% of children meeting health goals

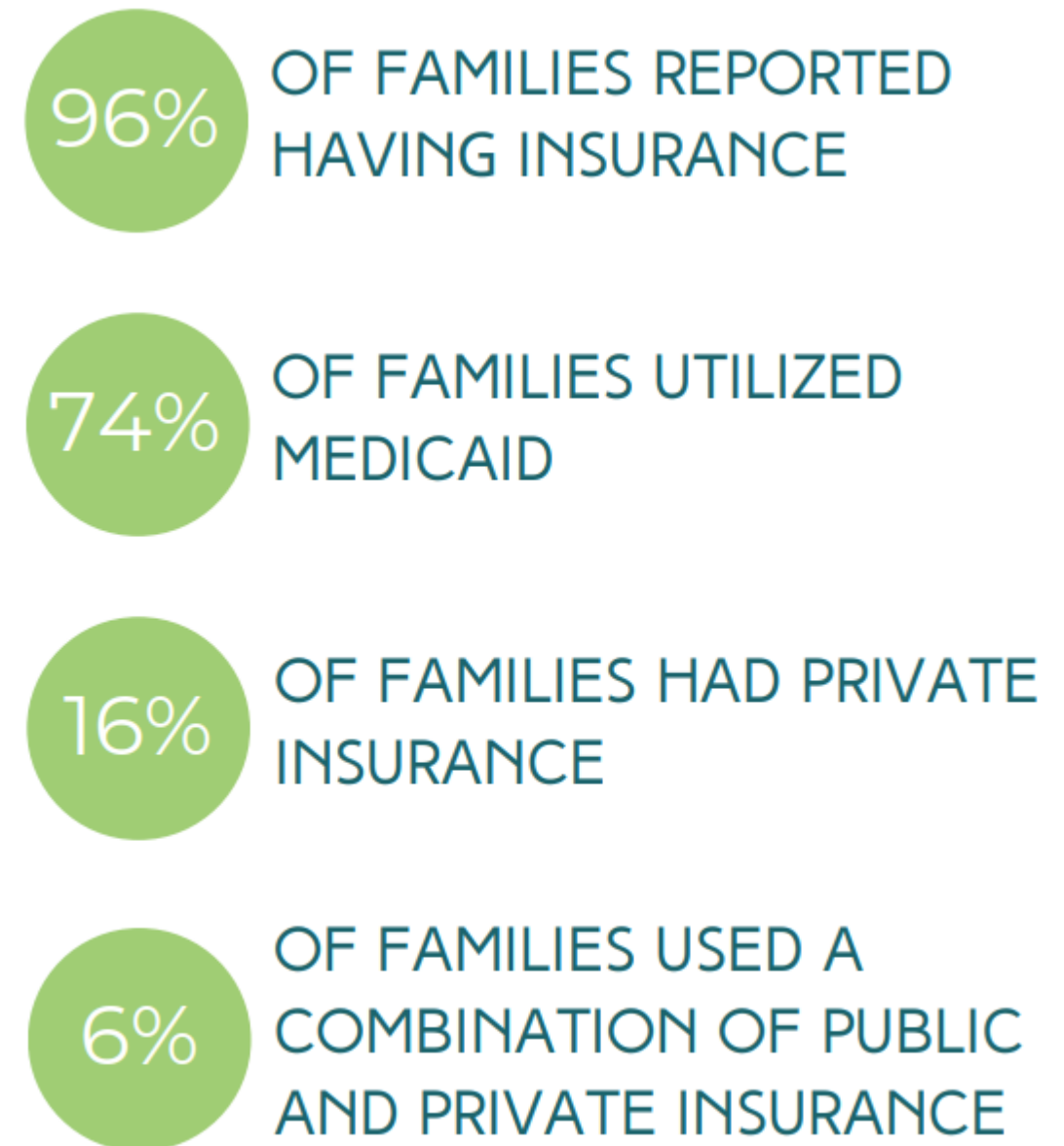

I've been working with Kellie since I was 8 weeks pregnant and 17 years old. The information given was detailed and specific to what I needed. I noticed Kellie is very good at paying attention to detail and making sure her families have what they need and sometimes before they ask. I took a break from Sixpence and Kellie was accommodating and made sure I had information and Kellie was more than happy to take me back. It made me feel very comfortable knowing that I could re-enroll when my life settled back down. Kellie gave me what I needed to be a good mom and gave my child what he needed to just play. Kellie helped with me knowing what's age appropriate and not having unrealistic expectations of growth. If it was not for Sixpence, I probably would have beat my kid because that is all I ever knew growing up. Without Sixpence, I wouldn't have graduated. Kellie gave me confidence in finishing high school when I didn't think I was going to because I had to go another year of schooling. From the beginning of my pregnancy, the team has been supportive, informative, friendly, and honest. They have been exactly what we needed as a new family. As we continued in the program, we got to meet other families, have experiences that we wouldn't normally get to have, we learned so much about how to be the best parents we can be, and we learned a lot about ourselves. Being able to be vulnerable, feeling comfortable enough to ask for help, and just making a connection with a nonjudgemental person during the most trying times is truly remarkable. They were very driven to assure us or support us where we had concerns. We can confidently say that she has been doing so well because she had connected with her coach, and felt safe enough with her to try new things. Overall, I will always recommend this program to families anywhere we go. Post-partum depression hit us hard and they were always there and without them, those dark times would have been much harder. We never wanted to miss a meeting, not just because it was part of the program, but we genuinely were excited and it made our day to see our coach. On our last meeting, we all were sniffing, holding back tears. We all need someone in our corner cheering us on, reminding us that mistakes happen, nobody is perfect, and that tomorrow is a new day. That person can forever change you, and for good. Thank you so much for allowing us to be part of this program. - Sixpence Parent

Being involved with special education and early intervention could feel overwhelming at times, but Sixpence gave our family encouragement, guidance, and hope. Miss Kellie, took the time to listen to our concerns and helped us understand our child's strengths and needs. One of the things I appreciated most was knowing that we were not alone. The support we received helped me become more confident in advocating for my child and celebrating every accomplishment, no matter how small. When I found out I was pregnant with my second child, I did not hesitate to get in contact with Miss Kellie. **RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION TO
INCREASE BASE GROWTH PERCENTAGE TO
DETERMINE ITS PROPERTY TAX REQUEST AUTHORITY**

WHEREAS, the Board of Education ("Board") for **Lincoln County School District 56-0001**, commonly known as **North Platte Public Schools**, is planning the School District's annual budget for the 2026–2027 school year; and

WHEREAS, the funding needed for the School District to meet its obligations to its students will require an increase in the base growth percentage used to determine the School District's property tax request authority under NEB. REV. STAT. § 79-3403; and

WHEREAS, Nebraska law authorizes the Board, upon an affirmative vote of at least seventy percent (70%) of the Board, to increase such base growth percentage by up to five percent (5%).

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED that, pursuant to NEB. REV. STAT. § 79-3405(2), the Board hereby increases the base growth percentage used to determine its property tax request authority for the 2026–2027 budget in an amount of 5%.
