Reading Readiness Assessments

- **Wis. Stats. 118.016** requires each pupil enrolled in 4-year-old kindergarten to 2nd grade in a school district or in a charter school to be annually assessed for reading readiness. Each school board and the operator of each charter school shall select the appropriate, valid, and reliable assessment of literacy fundamentals to be used. The school board or operator shall ensure that the assessment evaluates whether a pupil possesses phonemic awareness and letter sound knowledge.

Wisconsin Student Assessment System

The Wisconsin Student Assessment System (WSAS) is a comprehensive statewide program designed to provide information about what students know in core academic areas and whether they can apply what they know. The WSAS includes:

- The **Wisconsin Forward Exam** at grades 3-8 in English Language Arts (ELA) and Mathematics, at grades 4 and 8 in Science, and 4, 8, and 10 in Social Studies
- **Dynamic Learning Maps (DLM)** at grades 3-11 in ELA and Mathematics, at grades 4 and 8 - 11 in Science, and at grades 4, 8, and 10 in Social Studies
- **ACT Aspire** at grades 9 & 10
- **The ACT with Writing** at grade 11 for Reading, English, Mathematics, Science, and Writing.

Wisconsin Student Assessment System

The Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) requires all states to test all students in English language arts (ELA) and mathematics in grades 3-8 and once in high school. ESSA also requires students be assessed in Science once each grade span (3-6, 7-9, and 10-12 grades). Student performance on these assessments is reported in proficiency categories and used for accountability determination at the school, district and state levels. Wisconsin State statute also requires students to take grade 9 and 10 assessments as well as the social studies test. These tests together create the Wisconsin Student Assessment System.

Universal Screener:

In an RTI (Response to Intervention) prevention model, universal screening is the first step in identifying the students who are at risk for learning difficulties. Additionally, it is a way for targeting students who struggle to learn when provided core instruction.

Universal screening is typically conducted three times per school year, in the fall, winter, and spring. Universal screening measures consist of brief assessments focused on target skills (e.g., phonological awareness, reading comprehension, fluency, phonics, vocabulary, computation, numeracy, mathematical fluency) that are highly predictive of future student learning outcomes.

River Falls eSchool FAQ #1

March 2021

Q: Will the River Falls School District have a eSchool this fall?

A: Yes. There will be a full time River Falls Virtual/E-School in the RFSD this fall. The River Falls eSchool began in the fall 2020 for school enrollment opportunities for families in the RFSD. This is a full time online school that families may enroll their children in for the 2021-22 school year and beyond. River Falls teachers will be facilitating instructional programming for students enrolled utilizing online platforms and curriculum. The Virtual/e-School will provide students with instruction in an at-home setting consistently throughout the school year.

Q: How do I enroll my child/children in the River Falls eSchool?

A: Parents and families wishing to enroll their children in the River Falls eSchool will be required to complete an official application form and Family Contract.

Q: Where can I obtain the River Falls eSchool application materials?

A: Applications and family contracts are located on the RFSD website for your convenience. www.rfsd.k12.wi.us.

Q: When are River Falls eSchool applications due?

A: All application materials for the 2021-22 school year are due no later than Friday, April 16, 2021.

Q: Who will be teaching my children in the River Falls eSchool?

A: River Falls School District licensed teachers will be facilitating River Falls eSchool instruction utilizing an online digital curriculum aligned to the appropriate grade level academic standards, virtual meetings and potential face to face conferencing. Any face to face meetings will take place following all DPI, DHS and CDC current guidelines (e.g. social distancing, wearing masks, outdoors when applicable, etc.).

Teachers will facilitate daily meetings with students (e.g. 1-1 meetings, small grade level groups, etc.), manage online curriculum, provide support to students with their learning, maintain attendance to maintain student engagement within virtual learning and communicate regularly with families and students.

We currently anticipate using Wisconsin Virtual School online curriculum with additional opportunities for instructional alignment to programs and resources used in the RFSD to complement the student's eSchool experience.

Q: Will my children's current teacher be providing them with their eSchool lessons?

A: No, all instruction provided will be coordinated and assigned by the River Falls eSchool teachers.

Q: Will my children be able to participate in co-curricular activities?

A: Yes, students will be able to participate in co-curricular activities (e.g. clubs, activities, athletics) sponsored in the River Falls School District either in-person or virtually based on availability.

Q: Will River Falls eSchool students be allowed to participate in field trips?

A: Yes. River Falls eSchool students will be able to participate in field trips offered in conjunction with River Falls eSchool programming. Based on future COVID mitigation protocols, field trips may be offered virtually and/or in-person. We anticipate that this will vary somewhat as we move forward.

Q: Will my children meet their River Falls eSchool teacher and other students?

A: Yes, we are planning both face to face and virtual meetings to facilitate the opportunity for students, families and their teacher to be able to meet. Any face to face contact will require all parties to follow district COVID-19 related procedures. During the school year students will be required to meet virtually everyday with their teacher (e.g. Morning Meeting, TA, Focus)

Q: How often will students be able to connect with their peers?

A: Students will have the opportunity to meet regularly with their teacher(s) and grade level peers. Connections will occur during regularly scheduled meetings (e.g. 1-1 meetings, small grade level meetings, etc.) and will serve as an opportunity for teachers to keep students connected socially as well as academically. As we look forward, we will also be scheduling additional in-person opportunities, field trips, and activities to further support student connections and interactions with their peers.

Q: What equipment would be needed for students to participate in the River Falls Virtual/e-School?

A: Students will need a device (desktop, laptop, or chromebook), access to a webcam if it is not already embedded into their current device, internet connectivity and a printer. The district will provide all participating students with a district-issued chromebook annually. Printers will be primarily used at the primary levels but are beneficial for all students. Hotspots will be available to families in need on a first-come, first-serve basis based on availability.

Q: What if I change my mind during the school year?

A: We are recommending that all students enroll in the River Falls Virtual/E-School for the full academic school year. However, in extenuating circumstances we will consider a transition back to the student's neighborhood/home school. If approved, all student transitions for the 2021-22 school year would be scheduled at the **semester** transition in January.

Q: How many hours each day are students expected to work on their school work/assignments?

A: Students are encouraged to establish a daily routine for optimal success. Teachers will work with families to establish an appropriate daily schedule that allows for students to be successful in their at-home learning. Students should anticipate spending between 3-6 hours for school daily. Times will vary for elementary and secondary students and will be based on the number of courses taken at any given time. All students should schedule regular breaks, lunch and physical activities daily to complement their academic studies.

Q: How will grades be reported for students?

A: Students at the elementary level will be graded based on the current elementary school's Standards Based Report Cards (e.g. Areas of Concern (1), Approaching Expectations (2), Meets Expectations (3), and Exceeds Expectations (4)). Students at the secondary level will receive a letter grade for each of their courses (e.g. A, B, C, D or F). All grades will be tracked and posted in Infinite Campus.

Q: Will the River Falls eSchool be an available opportunity for the 2022-23 school year and beyond.

A: The RFSD intends to formalize our River Falls eSchool Charter School application during the upcoming school year in order to continue to provide this educational option in future years. Upon the completion and approval of our Charter School application, the River Falls School District will then be able to accept eSchool applications through the Open Enrollment process annually.

Q: Will daily attendance be tracked and required?

A: Yes. Daily attendance will be taken by teachers and recorded in Infinite Campus.

Q: Who should parents notify if their child is ill or will be out of town?

A: Parents should directly email their teacher and the River Falls eSchool secretary if their child(ren) will be absent from class. If students are out of town, one convenient feature of the River Falls Virtual/e-School is that they would still be able to participate in their online learning, if applicable.

Q: Who is the River Falls Virtual/e-School Program Coordinator?

A: Jennifer Peterson, Director of Academic Services, will serve as the River Falls eSchool Program Administrator. Erin Cramer, current VES teacher, will serve as the Program Coordinator for the 2021-22 school year. You can contact either of them via email at jennifer.peterson@rfsd.k12.wi.us or erin.cramer@rfsd.k12.wi.us.

Q: What will the class sizes be in the River Falls Virtual/e-School?

A: Staff to student ratios will be monitored regularly. We will follow our District policy guidelines related to class size. (BOE [Policy 343.2](#))

Q: How will Assessments be handled in the River Falls Virtual/e-School?

A1: Classroom assessments will be provided online or via pencil/paper and submitted to their teacher.

A2: State Assessments are required and currently will need to be administered in a face-to-face setting. During the scheduled assessment window, we will schedule times to conduct small group in-person assessments. Our goal is to support families in a family-friendly way so that multi-student families can choose to test at the same time or with their grade level peers.

Q: Will World Languages be an available elective for students?

A: Yes. We will partner with Wisconsin Virtual School to provide World Language opportunities for students in grades 6-8. Mrs. Rachel Young-Subera will provide Spanish instruction for students in grades K-5.

Q: *Will specific curriculum information be provided to families?*

A: Yes. We will provide parents and families with information specific to their child's online course curriculum on a regular basis throughout the school year. Parents and families are a critical component in the at-home learning success for our students.

Q: *Will there be technology support available.*

A: Yes. We will provide families enrolled with information regarding who to contact for technology support needed.
