# Student Security Initiatives

- ❑ Single Sign On (SSO)
- ❑ Purpose: SSO is utilized heavily within the school district to enhance the security posture regarding user identity. SSO allows the district to centralize logins across multiple systems. It also allows the district to monitor logins from multiple systems into a centralized system.
- ❑ Notes:
  1. ClassLink is used as the main SSO provider, with Google acting as the Identity Provider.
  2. Using QR codes for younger children to authenticate allows the school district to provide strong authentication standards while also providing an easy to use system for young students.

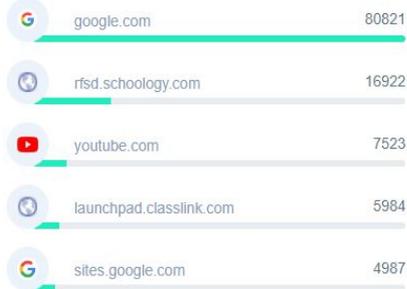

# Staff Security Initiatives

- ❑ Multi-factor authentication on critical applications
  - ❑ Multi-factor authentication is utilized on all critical systems that interface with student and financial data, such as Google, Infinite Campus, Skyward, etc.
- ❑ Coming Spring 2024
  - ❑ Cybersecurity phishing training
    - ❑ Regular cybersecurity training reduces risk to an organization by increasing the awareness and skills of the staff members who use the systems and data. Data shows that more regular testing will result in a lower likelihood of individuals falling for the latest test.
  - ❑ Password Requirements
    - ❑ To continue increasing the security posture for staff, our district is planning on educating staff on the use of pass phrases to lengthen their passwords while also making them easier to memorize. This aligns with guidance from NIST.

# Cybersecurity:

## Analysis, Monitoring, and Incident Response

- ❑ Activity on the School District of River Falls network systems is under constant protection from intrusion and compromise by multiple layers of automated security systems. The School District of River Falls continues to use the combination of Darktrace and SentinelOne to provide network response and endpoint detection and response (EDR), and full network visibility. Reports generated by these tools are reviewed by both CIT and School District of River Falls IT staff.



# Endpoint Detection and Response (EDR)

- ❑ The School District of River Falls utilizes the EDR solution for its endpoint protection solution. This solution has been independently tested by an unbiased and industry trusted vendor (MITRE Engenuity), which has consistently performed in the top 2 solutions over the past few years for both detection and response capabilities. Over the last 90 days, there have been approximately 80 suspicious or malicious items detected on the network. Only three warranted additional investigation and none posed a legitimate threat to the network.



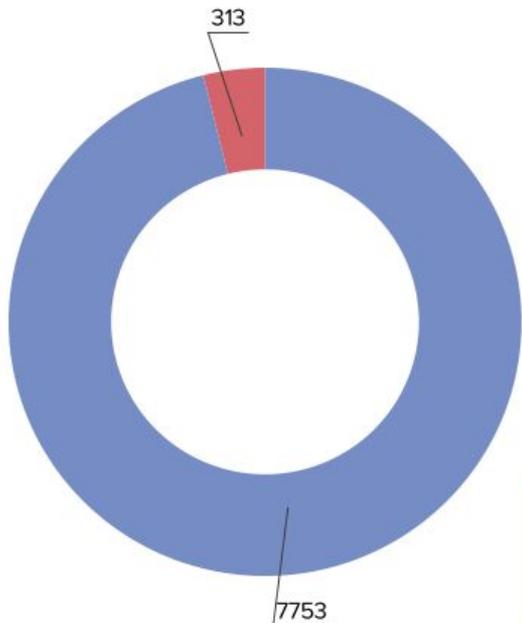
# Darktrace

- ❑ Darktrace is an anomaly detection solution designed to monitor network activity. This tool collects network data, performs a statistical baseline to identify normal activity within the network, and alert on anomalous behavior.
- ❑ Over the past 90 days, there were approximately 8000 anomalous events. The tool performed a full AI-driven analysis of each event within 21 minutes on average. Of the 8000 events, 316 alerts were created.
- ❑ Darktrace responded to anomalous events with an average automated response of 5 seconds.

# Business Continuity and Disaster Recovery

- ❑ Network infrastructure monitoring and config backups
  - ❑ The school district recently implemented software that automatically maps the core network infrastructure and backup critical configurations. In the event of a major incident impacting the network, this allows the district to recreate the network from known good configurations and documentation.
  
- ❑ Focus on additional recovery testing
  - ❑ The school district already has a robust backup solution that backs up data to both an on-site appliance, as well as to an off-site location for secure storage. Backups are protected from major security incidents, such as ransomware.
  - ❑ The district is currently evaluating their business continuity measures by ensuring servers will be restored in a timely manner to make certain education services remain unaffected.

# History of Community Education



- Roots are in Flint, Michigan, 1930's. "Lighted Schoolhouses"
- Based on philosophy that **learning continues throughout life; emphasizes the importance of citizen involvement in the identification of community needs and interests**
- Robust model in Minnesota - legislatively dictated, scope is very broad (Adult Basic Ed, Early Childhood & Family Education, adult & youth programming, often facilities, school-aged care, etc.)



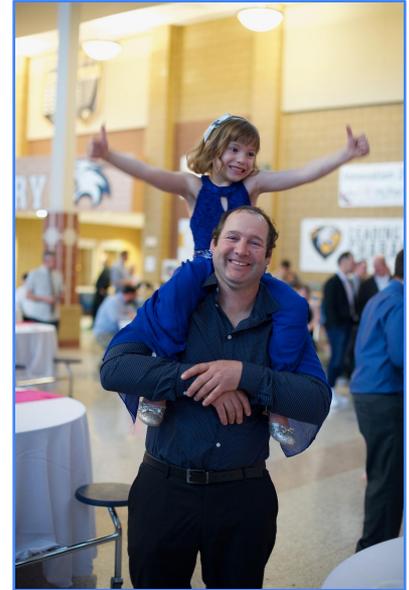

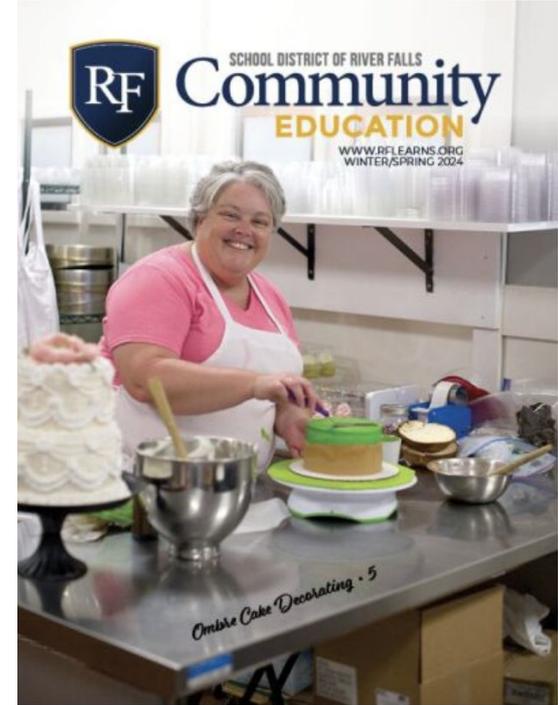

# What is Community Education in Wisconsin?

## DPI Definition

The Community Program and Services (CPS) **Fund 80** is used to account for activities such as **adult education, community recreation programs** (such as evening swimming pool operation and softball leagues), **elderly food service programs, non-special education preschool, day care services** and other programs which are not elementary and secondary educational programs but have the **primary function of serving the community**. Expenditures for these activities, including cost allocations for salaries, benefits, travel, purchased services, etc., are to be included in this fund to the extent feasible.

**Districts may adopt a separate tax levy for this fund.** Building use fees charged for utilities and other operational costs must be recorded in the General Fund if no cost allocation was made for these to the Community Service Fund.

## 1. CITIZEN INVOLVEMENT

- Involving citizens creates a sense of community.
- Solutions are strengthened when a variety of perspectives are brought to an issue.
- Citizens provide input through community advisory councils, volunteering, teaching classes, etc.



# 5 Components

## 2. NEEDS ASSESSMENT AND PLANNING

- A community-driven process: citizens speak for the community and help determine what are the needs & how the needs should be met.
- Creates ownership and adds legitimacy.



# 5 Components

## 3. EXTENDED USE OF PUBLIC EDUCATION FACILITIES

- Underutilized & tax-payer funded.
- Provides extended use of school buildings and equipment.
- Provides an avenue for ALL community members to be in our facilities.
  - Creates a sense of ownership among all citizens.
- Breaks down barriers.
- Helps citizens form a better connection with the school, see first-hand the great things going on, and better understand the needs that exist.



# 5 Components

## 4. INTERAGENCY PARTNERSHIPS

- School is hub of community - partnerships connect the school with the community (business, industry, other governmental agencies, individuals).
- Share resources and services (more efficient, less fragmented, reduce duplication of effort).

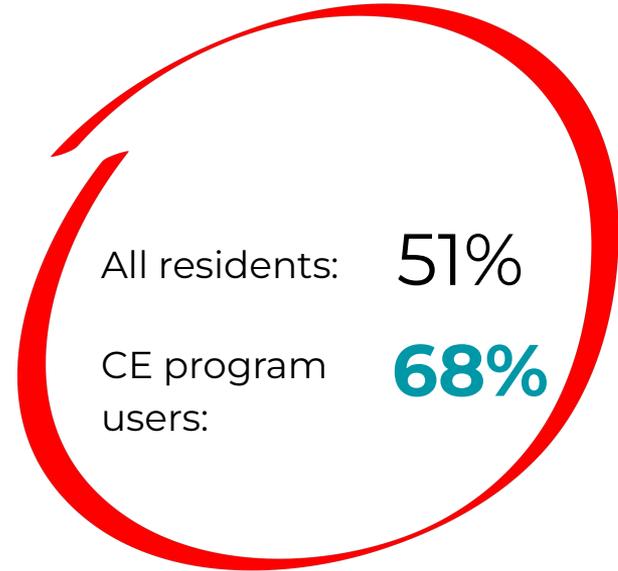

# Models in Wisconsin

## ICEPAC SURVEY

- **70 districts in Wisconsin** have a Community Education program (DPI website).
- **ICEPAC** (Indianhead Community Education Planning Council) - 40+ districts in NW Wisconsin that have a community education program.
- Professional development by ICEPAC is open to all Community Education Departments in state.
- **SURVEY** in fall 2023 - 10 respondents
  - Student population in these districts: 400-5,000



6 out of 10 surveyed in ICEPAC region are full-time and have additional titles/duties beyond community education.

# How to Get Started

### What was done in River Falls?

#### LEADERSHIP

- Combination of district leadership AND grass-roots effort.
- Part of long-term planning – tied into strategic plan.

#### COMMUNITY INPUT

- Leadership connected with established community groups.
- Focus groups were held (part of long-range planning).
- Volunteer coordinators were utilized to help get the right people to the table.
- It was a need; community was ready and wanted community ed.  
(citizens formed a committee advocating for community ed)

**Theme that emerged: Make our schools more accessible to the community.**

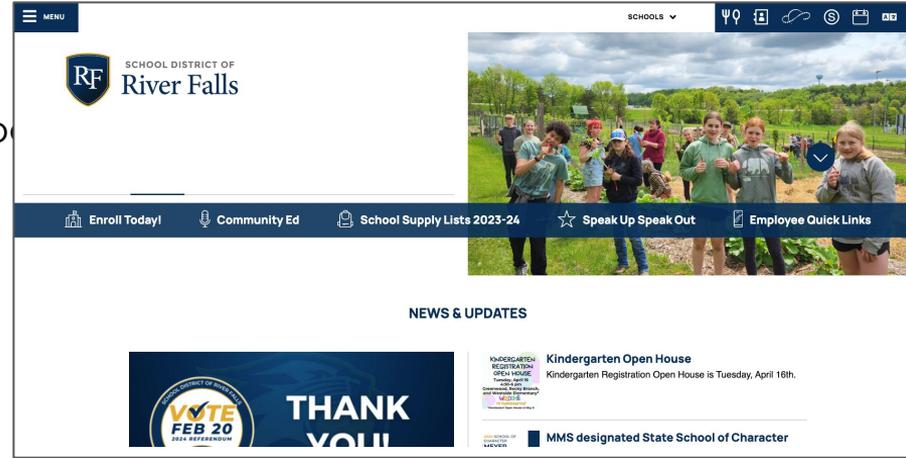

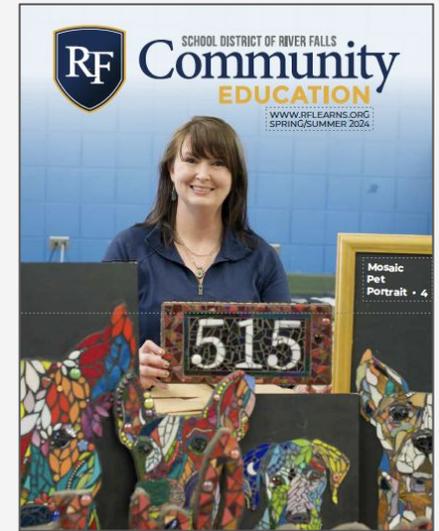
