Financial Report Analysis-All Funds

Expenditures- If the District were to spend their dollars evenly each month, expenditures through March should be at 75% of total expenditures. Listed below is a summary of cash expenditures to date as a percentage of total expenditures by fund.

Revenues- the District has received 60.30% of its budgeted revenue compared to 61.08% prior YTD.

Financial Reporting Analysis- Operating Funds

Operating Fund Revenue Summary by Source- 61.33% compared to 62.17% prior YTD-related to student fees

- Local Revenues are at 53.94%;
- State Revenues are on-trend at 73.83% related to an unanticipated increase in the proration of the transportation claim;
- Federal Revenues are on-trend at 78.02% and are in line with federal grant expenditures.

Operating Fund Expenditure Summary by Object- 65.02% compared to 63.13% prior to YTD

- Salaries are at 64.32%- teacher and para salaries started on August 31, as with previous school years, FY2022 wages will accrue in June 2022;
- Benefits are at 61.82%- teacher and para salaries started on August 31, as with previous school years, FY2022 wages will accrue in June 2022;
- Purchase Services are at 72.57%;
- Supplies/Materials are at 61.85%;
- Capital Outlay is at 61.25%;
- Other/Tuition is at 65.44%;
- Non-Capitalized Equipment (any equipment under our \$5000 capitalization threshold) is at 43.02%.

Monthly Notes:

- Investment Income is at 6.00% of the budget. Short-term interest rates have started to increase from 0.010% in February to 0.025% in March.
- The Tort Fund has a deficit balance of (\$247,706) due to payment of the District insurance premiums for worker's compensation and general liability insurance coverage. As in previous years, property tax collections throughout the year will offset this deficit by the end of the fiscal year. The deficit is covered by a loan from the working cash fund.

SUBJECT: Approval of Facility Rental Agreement 22-23 School Year

Background

Every year the District reviews its Facility Rental Agreement to set the fees for the next school year and update verbiage. As we have done in the past, the District has reached out to the surrounding Districts to ensure that our fees align with what the other Districts are charging.

This year we have made some minor language changes to the document.

- Added clarifying language that scholarships are per organization rather than per rental site
- Added only service animals will be allowed inside facilities without prior approval from the District office
- Remove language around “User” having to provide the School District with a list of people trained and certified on the AED and a copy of its AED certification cards. (Please Note: the “User” will still need to provide and have trained staff, but they would not have to provide that documentation to the District)

All changes have been reviewed and approved by the District’s outside counsel.

Recommendation

The administration recommends approving the 22-23 Facility Rental Agreement as presented.



FACILITY RENTAL PROGRAM

Program Guide

2022-2023

It is the intention of the School Board of Community Unit School District 300 to provide the School District facilities to external community groups and organizations, for the benefit of the community and the schools.

FACILITY RENTAL PROCEDURE

All groups wishing to utilize facilities in D300 should visit the District web page for information on the facility rental policy and procedures.

Any questions regarding the rental program should be directed to the appropriate building. To alleviate interruption of regularly scheduled school activities, no dates will be confirmed until final approval has been given by both the building principal or designee and the District Office. Upon final approval, a confirmation email will be sent to the group. The approval process can take up to 10 business days.

RENTAL GROUP CATEGORIES

Rental groups are divided into 5 group categories depending on their affiliation with the school district. Rental group categories will pay an amount based on the affiliation. Below are the categories and the types of fees that could be incurred for those groups.

REQUIREMENTS



1. Facility rental use requests are made by organizations using the online software application (SchoolDude).
2. Certificate of Insurance (must be uploaded with request using SchoolDude).
 - Lessee shall supply the district a “Certificate of Insurance” naming Community Unit School District 300, 2550 Harnish Drive, Algonquin IL 60102, its Board members, employees, and agents as the additional insurance. The certificate must also have the following minimum coverage limits:
 - Commercial General Liability Coverage
 - \$1,000,000 Per Occurrence
 - \$50,000 Damage to Rented Premises (Each Occurrence)
 - \$5,000 Medical Expenses
 - \$1,000,000 Personal and Advertising injury
 - \$2,000,000 General Aggregate
 - \$2,000,000 Products/Completed Ops Aggregate
 - Community Unit School District 300, its Board members, employees, and Agents are named as an additional insured on a primary & non-contributory basis
 - Commercial Automobile Liability Coverage (Only needed if entity will be operating owned vehicles on premises).
 - \$1,000,000 Combined Single Limit
 - Community Unit School District 300, its Board members, employees, and Agents are named as an additional insured on a primary & non-contributory basis
 - Workers Compensation Coverage (Only needed if entity has employees - does not include volunteers)
 - Covering all costs, statutory benefits, and liabilities under State Workers’ Compensation and similar laws for the Contractor’s respective employees and if the Contractor will be on the District’s premises the Workers’ Compensation Insurance must provide an alternative employer endorsement
 - Employers Liability Limits of \$500,000/\$500,000/\$500,000
 - Umbrella Liability Insurance
 - Minimum combined single limit of \$5,000,000 per occurrence and \$5,000,000 general aggregate
 - Community Unit School District 300, its Board members, employees, and Agents are named as an additional insured on a primary & non-contributory basis
 - The insurance shall include sexual abuse and molestation coverage if the Contractor will be on School District premises.
 - Above coverages shall be from a company licensed by the State of Illinois and rated at least an “A VII” rating from A.M. Best Company or comparable rating service.
 - If requested, organization must provide copies of applicable policy endorsements.
 - Certificate of insurance shall contain a provision that LESSOR will be given a minimum of thirty (30) days written notice by registered or certified mail by the insurance company prior to cancellation, termination, or change in such insurance.
 - Insurance shall be effective from the time the LESSEE or LESSEE’s employees, agents or customers begin to arrive on rented site and continue until they vacate the rented site.
 - A copy of the insurance certificate shall be provided and must be on file in the school district prior to the activity beginning. The failure to provide acceptable insurance shall be deemed a breach of this Agreement entitling the School District to terminate this Agreement immediately.



3. LESSEE shall provide proof of product liability if any food or beverage will be dispensed during the rental period.
4. AED certification and equipment.
 - Groups that are using the facilities for physical activities must provide a trained Automated External Defibrillator (AED) user and must provide their own AED at all outdoor events.
5. Facility Rental Fee Estimate Sheet must be uploaded and attached to the request.
6. The Lessee must read, understand, and comply with all “Restrictions” in the Restrictions listing below.

RESTRICTIONS

- Lessee must comply with fire codes, life/safety codes, and all other applicable local, State and Federal laws.
- No alcohol, narcotics, or firearms or look-a-likes allowed on school property.
- No violence or fighting of any sort.
- No smoking or vaping is allowed on School District property.
- No food or drink shall be sold or consumed on district property without prior approval.
- No private parties.
- Meetings shall not be political in nature, subversive to the U.S. Government, or immoral, and shall not violate State or federal non-discrimination laws.
- No group shall attempt to raise funds or solicit contributions without prior approval.
- No tipping of D300 Staff members is allowed.
- Rentals are prohibited on district observed holidays.
- Rentals are automatically canceled when emergency (snow) days are declared.
- Profanity will not be tolerated.
- Building kitchens are prohibited as rental facilities.
- No Gas or Charcoal Grills are allowed to be used on the property.

USE OF SPACE

- The School District will require District staff to open and close the building for Lessee. No keys will be given to Lessee, students or other unauthorized personnel. District staff is assigned to the building for the duration of the rental period. The start time for the Custodians will be decided by the District. At a minimum, the start time will be one-half hour before the scheduled rental and work as necessary after the rental. Custodians will have a work assignment by the District to meet the District needs during the rental event. (This statement does not apply to Dundee Township Park District or Hampshire Park District for the gymnasiums for which we have an Inter-Governmental Agreement.)
- Lessee must have an **adult present**, 18 years of age or older, and in charge of the activity during the entire rental period. This person will be responsible for the proper use of the facilities and the proper conduct of those in attendance.
- At certain times and/or activities the school district may require additional adult supervision, chaperones, or police. All additional expenses are the responsibility of the Lessee.
- Lessee is restricted to the use of specific area(s) and times rented. All Lessee and their participants shall confine themselves to those spaces and times. Charges will apply for extra time and space used.
- Equipment storage must be pre-arranged with the building. Specific arrangements must be made before the rental date. All storage is at the Lessee risk and must be removed immediately after the rental



period. This is conditional upon availability of space.

- Any equipment that an organization uses has to be housed in appropriate containers
 - Container location must be approved in writing by the D300 Operations Department.
 - Containers must be removed following the end of the season or rental contract, whichever comes first.
- No items shall be attached to School District property or any modifications made to the building structure, equipment or grounds.
- Limited movement of furnishings will be allowed with prior approval. Requests for special setup can be made in the Facility Rental program and must be pre-arranged before use. The Building's time involved in setup will be charged to the Lessee. The Lessee is prohibited from bringing in and using any heavy equipment and/or items in the buildings that may damage floors, walls, or any building systems.
- The District reserves the right to restrict and remove some specific areas of the school and grounds from the rental program.
- Food service is available through the District's food service provider (ARAMARK). For pricing and availability please reach out to them directly.
- Parking lots may be rented when available. No parking in restricted areas. All local and state laws will be followed. Long term storage is not permitted in parking lots.
- The lessee cannot sublet rental space.

DAMAGES

- The Lessee is responsible and liable for all damages to school district property. All instances of damage must be reported to district personnel as soon as possible.

BUILDING EQUIPMENT

- Kitchen facilities can only be operated by the District's Food Service Vendor during rental events. All costs for food service workers will be assessed to the Lessee.
- Certain stage, AV equipment, etc. require special handling. Only Building staff are permitted to operate auditorium AV equipment for rentals. All AV costs including AV technology workers' time will be assessed to the Lessee.
- Equipment innate to an area will be part of the rental agreement with applicable charges. The Lessee must be qualified in the use of the equipment before use. No movement or changes of the equipment may occur without prior approval.
- Special arrangements for the use of equipment may be possible with prior approval.
- The district will not lend or rent equipment for use outside of the school.

SNOW PLOWING & SALTING FEES

The Lessee will be charged \$250.00 for snow removal and salting fees if their event is the only event scheduled at the facility.

OUTSIDE FIELD USAGE

- Use of athletic and play fields for recreational activities are allowed when there is no conflict with school activities.
- D300 reserves the right to allocate certain athletic fields and facilities for the exclusive use of the schools.



- The contract does not grant the Lessee permission or authority to modify or upgrade the field in any way.
- The contract only grants time for using the playing field. Lessee must vacate the field when their rented time has expired to minimize the possibility of interrupting the field use of another possible Lessee.
- No motorized vehicles are allowed on school athletic fields other than emergency vehicles.
- School grounds close at dusk.
- The Lessee will assume responsibility for cleanup of the area after each use and will properly dispose of all garbage. Clean up/garbage removal: \$100 per event will be charged back to the organization if the area is not picked up after the event (pictures will be taken and sent along with the invoice).
- Lessee will be provided with a field rental permit and for verification purposes, the permit must be kept readily available while on the field in case a local police officer, or school district employee asks to see it. If the Lessee(s) cannot present the contract/permit, they will be asked to vacate the field. If a league rents a field for multiple dates and times and then divides up the time among several coaches; the league must ensure their individual coaches have a valid contract/permit with the corresponding dates and times rented.
- Proper care must be given to the grounds and district property. Lessee assumes all financial responsibility individually, and on behalf of said organization for any damage caused by participants during the hours the organization is using the property. Any damage or theft must be reported to district personnel as soon as possible.
- Lessees holding field rental events with a term of one or more days and with each day lasting 2 or more hours will be required to provide a rented Portable Toilet and the cost and servicing. The School District will be responsible for determining placement.
- Athletic Permits are available which would reserve the field for the entire season of the sport. Please see section on Outside Athletic Permits.

OUTSIDE ATHLETIC PERMITS

Outside Athletic Permit is the vehicle that allows outside organizations to utilize D300 outdoor athletic fields. While we want to allow outside organizations to use our fields, this fee is used to offset the wear and tear of usage. Additionally, D300 carefully monitors the usage of our facilities to ensure they are maintained to support D300 programs.

- To qualify for an Outside Athletic Permit, the sport team must be comprised of 75% of D300 students. This will be validated by the organization submitting their roster.
- The cost will be \$1,000 for the sport season per school location or the actual cost of the usage whichever is less. No in-kind donations can reduce the \$1,000 fee.
- D300 will reduce the rental fee for an outside athletic permit by \$250 for offering 1 scholarship or \$500 for offering 2 scholarships.
 1. A scholarship is defined as a student athlete not having to pay for registration fees.
 2. Organizations must provide proof of their scholarships by providing the names of the students receiving and the amount of the scholarship.
 3. If the scholarship fee reduction is greater than the rental fee, the total facility rental cost the facility rental cost will be \$0.
 4. Scholarships are per organization, not per the number of buildings utilized.
- The Outside Athletic Permit covers the following:
 1. Field rental - one athletic outdoor sports field
 2. Field maintenance (subject to availability)
 - a. Aerating and overseeding the fields
 - b. Fertilizing, grub control, crabgrass control



- c. Replacing sod with Kentucky Bluegrass
 - d. Weeding
 - e. Cutting
 - f. Spreading field mix and turface
 - g. Repairing the lips and cutting them back
 - h. Maintaining pathways and asphalt
 - i. Watering
- The Outside Athletic Permit **DOES NOT COVER:**
 1. Field striping is not covered.
 - a. The District will charge a flat rate for striping services which includes the paint.
 - Football field
 - a. Layout and stripe 1st time - \$697.00
 - b. Re-striping - \$540.00
 - Lacrosse field
 - a. Layout and stripe 1st time - \$795.00
 - b. Re-striping - \$635.00
 - Soccer field
 - a. Layout and stripe 1st time - \$480.00
 - b. Re-striping - \$367.00
 - For other types of lining please contact the building you are renting from to receive a quote.
 2. Porta Potty expenses. Outside events require a porta potty and are at the organization's expense.

INSIDE FACILITY USAGE

- Use of indoor facilities for recreational activities are allowed when there is no conflict with school activities.
- D300 reserves the right to allocate certain areas of the building for the exclusive use of the schools.
- The contract does not grant the Lessee permission or authority to modify or upgrade the facility in any way.
- The contract only grants time for using the facility during the approved time in the Facility Request software. Lessee must vacate the facility when their rented time has expired to minimize the possibility of interrupting the facility use of another possible Lessee.
- Lessee will be provided with a facility rental permit and for verification purposes, the permit must be kept readily available while at the facility in case a local police officer, or school district employee asks to see it. If the Lessee(s) cannot present the contract/permit, they will be asked to vacate the facility. If a league rents a facility for multiple dates and times and then divides up the time among several coaches; the league must ensure their individual coaches have a valid contract/permit with the corresponding dates and times rented.
- Proper care must be given to the facilities and district property. Lessee assumes all financial responsibility individually, and on behalf of said organization for any damage caused by participants during the hours the organization is using the facility. Any damage or theft must be reported to district personnel as soon as possible.
- Inside Athletic Permits are available for sports teams.
- Only service animals will be allowed inside the facilities without prior approval from District office.



INSIDE ATHLETIC PERMITS

Inside Athletic Permit is the vehicle that allows outside organizations to utilize D300 indoor facilities. While we want to allow outside organizations to use our facilities, this fee is used to offset the wear and tear of usage, utilities, and bathroom supplies. Additionally, D300 carefully monitors the usage of our facilities to ensure they are maintained to support D300 programs. To qualify for an Indoor Athletic Permit, the sport team must be comprised of 75% of D300 students. This will be validated by the organization submitting their roster.

- The cost will be 10% of the total rental fee. However, if a custodian is called in to cover the event, the organization must cover the full cost of the custodial services.
 1. The total rental includes custodial costs, room rentals, and any equipment rental.
 2. No in-kind donations can reduce the fee.
- D300 will reduce the rental fee for an inside athletic permit by \$250 for offering 1 scholarship or \$500 for offering 2 scholarships.
 1. A scholarship is defined as a student athlete not having to pay for registration fees.
 2. Organizations must provide proof of their scholarships by providing the names of the students receiving and the amount of the scholarship.
 3. If the scholarship fee reduction is greater than the rental fee, the total facility rental cost the facility rental cost will be \$0.
 4. Scholarships are per organization, not per the number of buildings utilized.
- The Indoor Athletic Permit covers the following:
 1. Facility rental - limited to gym, field house, and wrestling rooms
- The Indoor Athletic Permit **DOES NOT COVER:**
 - a. Tournaments/Events - Tournaments/Events are billed separately.
 - b. Custodial fees if a custodian is brought in specifically for the rental.

In-kind Donations/Scholarships in Lieu of Rental Fees

With the exception of Athletic Permit Fees, the District may accept in-kind donations or scholarships in lieu of rental fees.

- In-Kind Donations
 1. In-Kind donations represent items provided by the renter on behalf of the District.
 2. If a *school* is receiving the in-kind donation, it must first be reviewed by the school and then by the Chief Operating Officer, or designee, before any formal approval.
 3. If the *District* is receiving the in-kind donation, it must first be reviewed by the Chief Operating Officer, or designee, before any formal approval.
 4. If the total in-kind donation does not cover the total rental request, the in-kind donation will be deducted from the total rental request to determine the new billable amount.
 5. If the in-kind donation is in the form of site related work (e.g., altering the fields, adding to the facilities, or constructing buildings), it must be presented in front of the Construction Facility and Operations Board Committee for approval.
- Scholarships
 1. Scholarships represent waiving student enrollment fees for the program being offered.



2. In order to be eligible, renters must provide the total dollar amount of scholarships being awarded and the number of students eligible to receive the scholarship and provide the process in which the organization uses to award scholarships.
3. Scholarships must be given to D300 students and will be verified by requiring the organization to provide the list of the names of students receiving the scholarships.

PAYMENT

The Facility Rental Program accepts the following forms of payment: Credit cards (No AMEX), debit cards and checks.

CANCELLATIONS

All cancellations must be in writing and received 5 business days prior to the building being used or charges may apply. If charges apply, a detailed invoice will be submitted to the group utilizing facilities.

PRINCIPAL'S ROLE IN BUILDING SUPERVISION

Principals manage all programs, schedules and staff in their schools. Staff management in support areas is in partnership with supervision from district offices. Custodial schedules are developed by the principal, Director of Facilities, and the custodian. The schedules are based on District standards and specific building needs. Schedules include time for cleaning, building operations, educational function operations, and maintenance. The Executive Director of Technology & Operations and the Executive Director of Facilities serve as resources to the principal on all facility and grounds operations.

WITNESSETH:

The School District permits use of school facilities to profit and nonprofit, charitable and non-charitable groups and/or organizations.

Therefore, in consideration of mutual agreements and covenants hereinafter contained and for other good and valuable considerations, the receipt and sufficiency whereof being hereby mutually acknowledged, the parties hereto agree as follows:

I. Use of Facility:

A. Description of Property. The School District is the owner of certain real estate, buildings and facilities (the "Property").

B. Use of Facilities. The School District agrees to allow the User to use the Facilities for the dates and times chosen in SchoolDude. The User's use shall be limited to the areas selected in SchoolDude.

The User shall have no right to use any portion of the Property or other School District property, except as specified herein or as permitted by the School District. The School District shall at all times be the sole owner of the Property and Facilities and the User shall have no right or interest in the Property or Facilities, except for the right to use the Facilities as provided in this Agreement.



C. Fees. The User shall pay to the School District the fees set forth in Exhibit A, which Exhibit is incorporated into this Agreement by this reference.

D. Health and Safety Issues. In the event of emergency, safety issue, or failure to maintain insurance, or any other condition that constitutes a substantial threat to the health or safety of students, employees, or others at the School District, as determined by the School District in its sole discretion, the School District may immediately suspend the User's activities hereunder until such condition has been remedied to the School District's satisfaction. In the event the School District suspends the User's activities pursuant to this Section, the User shall remain responsible for all fees due to the School District.

E. No Drugs or Alcohol. Illegal drugs and alcohol are not permitted on the Property.

F. Compliance with Laws and Policies. The User shall comply with all applicable federal, State, and local laws related to its use of the Facilities and the Property and shall comply with all School District policies and procedures.

G. Maintenance of Property. At the close of each instance of use, the User shall leave Facilities and the Property in substantially the same condition as at the outset of each instance of use, ordinary wear and tear excepted, and shall remove all of the User's personal property. The User shall be responsible for the cost of repair and/or replacement of any damage to the Facilities and Property, including fixtures and furnishings, which occurs as a result of or in connection with the User's or its employees' or agents' use of the Property, normal wear and tear excepted. If the User does not repair damages it caused to the Facilities or Property, the School District may repair the damage at the User's expense. The User shall reimburse the School District for any repair costs the School District incurs within 14 days after the School District send an invoice to the User for such costs.

H. No Improvements. The User shall not modify, alter, or place permanent fixtures or improvements upon the Facilities without the School District's prior written approval.

I. Supervision. The User shall be solely responsible, at its own expense, for providing adequate adult supervision at all times in connection with its use of the Facilities. The User acknowledges and assumes complete responsibility for its employees and agents used to supervise its activities and services.

J. Automated External Defibrillators. The User will provide a trained Automated External Defibrillator (AED) user as defined in 410 ILCS 4/1, et seq., who will be on the leased premises at all times the User is using the Facilities pursuant to this Agreement. The User shall be solely responsible for the failure to provide a trained AED user, or for the conduct, acts or omissions of the trained AED user, and shall defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the School District for same, in accordance with the defense and indemnification provision of this Agreement. The User will provide its own AED at all of their outdoor events.

K. Background Checks. The User shall conduct, at its own cost and expense, criminal background checks in accordance with Section 10-21.9 of the Illinois School Code, 105 ILCS 5/10-21.9, of all of its employees and agents that will work on the Property. The User shall also conduct a search of the Statewide Sex Offender Database and Statewide



Murderer and Violent Offender Against Youth Database for each employee or agent of the User that will work on the Property. The User shall not send to the Property, or allow to interact with students, any employee or agent (1) for whom the User has not received the completed results of the criminal background check; (2) whose criminal background check reveals convictions that would prohibit employment by the School District under Sections 10-21.9 and/or 21B-80 of the Illinois School Code; (3) who appears on the Statewide Sex Offender Database and Statewide Murderer and Violent Offender Against Youth Database ; or (4) who has a history of other criminal conduct or inappropriate behavior which reasonably calls into question such individual's fitness to work near children.

II. Miscellaneous Provisions.

A. Indemnification. To the fullest extent permitted by law, and as partial consideration for the User to use the Facilities, the User shall indemnify, hold harmless, and defend the School District, its Board, Board members, employees, agents, and successors against all claims, losses, liability, costs, and expenses (including attorneys' fees) related to damages to property or person (including death) that may arise out of or in connection with the User's, its employees', agents', or guests' use of the Facilities or the Property. The covenants of this Section shall survive the expiration or termination of this Agreement.

B. Insurance. During the term of this Agreement, the User, at its sole cost and expense, and for the benefit of the School District, shall carry and maintain insurance as provided in the School District's Program Guide for the Facility Rental Program.

C. Waiver of Claims. Except to the extent prohibited by law and for any claim arising out of, relating to or connected with any breach of this Agreement, the School District shall not be liable, and the User waives all claims against the School District for damages to person or property sustained by the User resulting from its use of the Property, or any equipment, furniture, fixtures, or appurtenances thereto becoming out of repair, resulting from any accident in or about the Property or common areas, or resulting directly or indirectly from any act or neglect of any person on the Property or common areas. This Section shall apply especially, but not exclusively, to damage caused by water, snow, frost, steam, excessive heat or cold, sewage, gas, odors, or noise or the bursting or leaking of pipes or plumbing fixtures and shall apply if any such damage results from the act or neglect of other occupants, or an employee or employees of the School District. All personal property belonging to the User on the Property shall be there at the risk of the User. The School District shall not be liable for any damage thereto or the theft or misappropriation thereof. The User shall be limited to its own insurance coverages to pay for damage to its property or fixtures and hereby holds harmless and releases the School District from any damage or claim of damage to the User's property or fixtures.

D. No Waiver of Tort Immunity Defenses. Nothing contained in this Agreement, or in any other provision of this Agreement, is intended to constitute nor shall constitute a waiver of the defenses available to the School District under the Illinois Local Governmental and Governmental Employees Tort Immunity Act, with respect to claims by third parties.

E. Taxes. If, as a result of this Agreement, the School District's Property is threatened with the loss of its tax exempt status, the School District, in its sole discretion, may immediately terminate this Agreement and the User's activities hereunder without the School District incurring any damages or liability to the User. If any portion of the Property becomes subject to taxation as result of this Agreement or the User's use of the Property, the User shall be responsible for the payment of any taxes assessed and such taxes shall be payable at the time said taxes are due. The School District shall have the right to challenge, at the User's expense, any loss of tax-exempt status of the Property. In the event that the User fails to pay the taxes when due, the School District may, at its sole option, pay the taxes and the



User shall be liable, in addition to any other remedies available to the School District, to the School District for all costs and expenses, including, but not limited to, reasonable legal fees, incurred by the School District in paying the delinquent taxes. The covenants of this Section shall survive the expiration or termination of this Agreement.

F. No Assignment. The User may not assign any rights or duties under this Agreement without the prior express written consent of the School District.

G. Entire Agreement. This Agreement shall constitute the entire agreement of the Parties hereto with respect to the Facilities, the Property, and activities hereunder and supersedes any and all prior agreements and understandings, whether written or oral, formal or informal. This Agreement may not be amended except by means of a written document signed by authorized representatives of the Parties.

H. Termination. Either party may terminate this Agreement for any reason after providing seven days written notice to the other party of its intention to terminate the Agreement. If the School District terminates the Agreement based on this provision, it shall return the security deposit, except for any portion needed to pay for repairs, and shall return a pro-rata portion of the use fee based on the remaining time period remaining in the Agreement.

I. Notice. All notices required or permitted by this Agreement must be in writing and delivered personally or sent by certified mail, return receipt requested to the respective party's mailing address. Either party may specify a different address to receive notices by providing a written directive given in accordance with this Section.

J. Effective Date. This Agreement shall be deemed dated and become effective on the date the last of the Parties signs as set forth below the signature of their duly authorized representatives.

SUBJECT: Student Fees 2022-23

Background

Per Board Policy 4:140 and as authorized by 105 Illinois School Code 5/10-22.25, the administration will recommend the student fees charged for using textbooks, consumable materials, extracurricular activities, and other school fees tangential to the educational program.

Historically, the District completes a student fee survey of surrounding school districts and recommends that the District maintain a fee structure comparable to the average student fees for surrounding Kane County school districts. Before the pandemic onset, the Board approved the 2020-21 fee schedule, which provided no increase from the previous year. For the 2021-2022 school year, a one-time waiver for all PK-12 fees was approved to relieve families, many of whom struggled financially during the pandemic.

Based on the 2021-22 fee schedule, the following is the anticipated revenue of the District for the Fiscal Year 2022-2023 budget for the following Instructional Registration Fees:

Instructional Registration Fee (includes technology fee)	\$2,185,308
Summer Instructional Registration Fee (reduced due to ESSER funds)	\$ 40,000
Total Instructional Registration Fees	\$2,225,308

Recommendation

The administration recommends extending the fee waiver for all PK-12 instructional fees for the 2022-23 school year and maintaining the 2021-22 fee rate schedule for all optional fees such as Driver's Ed, athletic fees, and parking fees; those types of fees will still be assigned. The District will utilize an unexpected distribution adjustment due to a coding error in the initial implementation of the Evidenced-Based Funding formula granted by the Illinois State Board of Education. The District will be receiving approximately \$2.6 million from this error. The Proposed 2022-23 Student Fee Schedule is attached for your review.

SUBJECT: Hampshire High School Welding Lab HVAC Renovations Bid

Background

The welding certification program at Hampshire High School has been highly successful. The original design and setup for the welding lab no longer can accommodate the students in that area, and HVAC upgrades and modifications are needed at the facility.

The scope of work is as follows -

1. Remove the three (3) west Niederman extraction arms from the existing dust collection system and cap ductwork. Reuse the three (3) extraction arms for items 2 or 3 below.
2. Add four (4) new exhaust drops with extraction arms to the new arc welding stations from NHH-EF-50. Extend main ductwork as required
3. Add one (1) new drop with extraction arm to grinding station on the west end from NHHEF-50. Extend main ductwork as required
4. Remove the plasma cutting table from exhaust fan NHH-EF-50, including its associated extraction arm. Provide a new roof-mounted, dedicated exhaust fan and associated ductwork designed for horizontal capture of the plasma table discharge (fan capacity and selection to be determined). The new exhaust fan will be locally controlled for on / off with a possible timer to reduce runtime longer than required.
5. Remove the capture hood from the existing dust collection system and cap the main. Provide a new, dedicated exhaust fan on the roof to serve the hood (fan capacity and selection to be determined). The new exhaust fan will be locally controlled for on / off with a possible timer to reduce runtime longer than required.
6. Provide new extraction arms (hood and hose) for all welding locations where the existing hoods were removed. The new hoods and hose will match the current and be provided with a damper to allow for complete shut-off when not in use (quantity to be determined in the field).



The following are further action items that Elara will perform and advise the School District as to the outcome of each:

7. Confirm with a dust collector manufacturer what the interval of filter replacement should be based on usage or by static pressure.
8. Confirm through JCI that RTU-3 remains 100% outside air during occupied hours.

Administrative Recommendation

The administration recommends developing bidding documents for approval to upgrade the HVAC / Ventilation of the Hampshire High School Welding Lab to meet the current needs.

This will be paid for out of the Operations and Maintenance Fund (20) or the Capital Projects Fund (60).

1. GENERAL

- a. Bids shall be signed and submitted in an envelope properly marked with the title of the bid, and date and time of opening. Unsigned bids will be rejected.

- d. The District is not subject to Federal Excise Tax or Illinois Sales or Retailers Occupational Tax. Bids should not include sales or excise tax.
- e. Prices quoted shall include all charges for packing, transportation and delivery to the locations designated on the bid specification and installation if called for in the bid specifications.
- f. Correspondence shall be addressed to the Director of Purchasing.
- g. Bids are available for inspection in the purchasing office by appointment for 10 days after the date of the award of an order.
- h. Oral, telephonic, telegraphic, facsimile or electronically transmitted bids will not be accepted.
- i. The district will be using the CPI-U (Consumer Price Index - Urban) to determine the rate of increase/decrease over the contract period if warranted. 2. ERRORS AND OMISSIONS

A total bid dollar amount, regardless of whether or not the bidder is bidding all items, must be entered in the appropriate section of the bid form before signing and submitting the bid.

21. HOLD HARMLESS AND INDEMNIFICATION

The contractor shall assume all liability for, and shall protect, defend, indemnify and hold harmless, the Board of Education, its members individually, officers, employees, servants and agents, from and against all claims, actions suits, judgments, costs, losses, expenses and liabilities of whatsoever kind or nature including reasonable legal fees incurred by owner arising out of:

22. DAMAGE TO PROPERTY

If the bidder does not repair such damage within 14 days after receiving written notice from the District, or such lesser time if the District determines the damage creates an emergency situation,

the District may repair the damage and the bidder shall reimburse the District for the costs the District incurs within 14 days after the District provides a written invoice to the bidder.

23. LATE BIDS

Bids received after the time specified in the Invitation to Bid will not be opened or considered. The method of transmittal of the bid is at the bidder's risk of untimely receipt by the Board of Education. The use of Board of Education equipment for transmission of bids is prohibited.

24. RECYCLED PRODUCTS

The District supports national and local efforts for recycling. Bidders are encouraged to offer recycled supplies and materials as bid alternatives. Notations are to be included as to the percentage of recycled products in each item.

This document combined with amendments, the bidder's bid, the required submittals, and the purchase order, if any, shall comprise the binding contract.

Note: If you are a U.S. person and a requester gives you a form other than Form W-9 to request your TIN, you must use the requester's form if it is substantially similar to this Form W-9.

Definition of a U.S. person. For federal tax purposes, you are considered a U.S. person if you are:

- An individual who is a U.S. citizen or U.S. resident alien;
- A partnership, corporation, company, or association created or organized in the United States or under the laws of the United States;
- An estate (other than a foreign estate); or
- A domestic trust (as defined in Regulations section 301.7701-7).

Special rules for partnerships. Partnerships that conduct a trade or business in the United States are generally required to pay a withholding tax under section 1446 on any foreign partners' share of effectively connected taxable income from such business. Further, in certain cases where a Form W-9 has not been received, the rules under section 1446 require a partnership to presume that a partner is a foreign person, and pay the section 1446 withholding tax. Therefore, if you are a U.S. person that is a partner in a partnership conducting a trade or business in the United States, provide Form W-9 to the partnership to establish your U.S. status and avoid section 1446 withholding on your share of partnership income.

In the cases below, the following person must give Form W-9 to the partnership for purposes of establishing its U.S. status and avoiding withholding on its allocable share of net income from the partnership conducting a trade or business in the United States.

- In the case of a disregarded entity with a U.S. owner, the U.S. owner of the disregarded entity and not the entity;
- In the case of a grantor trust with a U.S. grantor or other U.S. owner, generally, the U.S. grantor or other U.S. owner of the grantor trust and not the trust; and
- In the case of a U.S. trust (other than a grantor trust), the U.S. trust (other than a grantor trust) and not the beneficiaries of the trust.

Foreign person. If you are a foreign person or the U.S. branch of a foreign bank that has elected to be treated as a U.S. person, do not use Form W-9. Instead, use the appropriate Form W-8 or Form 8233 (see Pub. 515, *Withholding of Tax on Nonresident Aliens and Foreign Entities*).

Nonresident alien who becomes a resident alien. Generally, only a nonresident alien individual may use the terms of a tax treaty to reduce or eliminate U.S. tax on certain types of income. However, most tax treaties contain a provision known as a "saving clause." Exceptions specified in the saving clause may permit an exemption from tax to continue for certain types of income even after the payee has otherwise become a U.S. resident alien for tax purposes.

If you are a U.S. resident alien who is relying on an exception contained in the saving clause of a tax treaty to claim an exemption from U.S. tax on certain types of income, you must attach a statement to Form W-9 that specifies the following five items.

1. The treaty country. Generally, this must be the same treaty under which you claimed exemption from tax as a nonresident alien.
2. The treaty article addressing the income.
3. The article number (or location) in the tax treaty that contains the saving clause and its exceptions.
4. The type and amount of income that qualifies for the exemption from tax.
5. Sufficient facts to justify the exemption from tax under the terms of the treaty article.

Example. Article 20 of the U.S.-China income tax treaty allows an exemption from tax for scholarship income received by a Chinese student temporarily present in the United States. Under U.S. law, this student will become a resident alien for tax purposes if his or her stay in the United States exceeds 5 calendar years. However, paragraph 2 of the first Protocol to the U.S.-China treaty (dated April 30, 1984) allows the provisions of Article 20 to continue to apply even after the Chinese student becomes a resident alien of the United States. A Chinese student who qualifies for this exception (under paragraph 2 of the first protocol) and is relying on this exception to claim an exemption from tax on his or her scholarship or fellowship income would attach to Form W-9 a statement that includes the information described above to support that exemption.

If you are a nonresident alien or a foreign entity, give the requester the appropriate completed Form W-8 or Form 8233.

Backup Withholding

What is backup withholding? Persons making certain payments to you must under certain conditions withhold and pay to the IRS 24% of such payments. This is called "backup withholding." Payments that may be subject to backup withholding include interest, tax-exempt interest, dividends, broker and barter exchange transactions, rents, royalties, nonemployee pay, payments made in settlement of payment card and third party network transactions, and certain payments from fishing boat operators. Real estate transactions are not subject to backup withholding.

You will not be subject to backup withholding on payments you receive if you give the requester your correct TIN, make the proper certifications, and report all your taxable interest and dividends on your tax return.

Payments you receive will be subject to backup withholding if:

1. You do not furnish your TIN to the requester,
2. You do not certify your TIN when required (see the instructions for Part II for details),
3. The IRS tells the requester that you furnished an incorrect TIN,
4. The IRS tells you that you are subject to backup withholding because you did not report all your interest and dividends on your tax return (for reportable interest and dividends only), or
5. You do not certify to the requester that you are not subject to backup withholding under 4 above (for reportable interest and dividend accounts opened after 1983 only).

Certain payees and payments are exempt from backup withholding. See *Exempt payee code*, later, and the separate Instructions for the Requester of Form W-9 for more information.

Also see *Special rules for partnerships*, earlier.

What is FATCA Reporting?

The Foreign Account Tax Compliance Act (FATCA) requires a participating foreign financial institution to report all United States account holders that are specified United States persons. Certain payees are exempt from FATCA reporting. See *Exemption from FATCA reporting code*, later, and the Instructions for the Requester of Form W-9 for more information.

Updating Your Information

You must provide updated information to any person to whom you claimed to be an exempt payee if you are no longer an exempt payee and anticipate receiving reportable payments in the future from this person. For example, you may need to provide updated information if you are a C corporation that elects to be an S corporation, or if you no longer are tax exempt. In addition, you must furnish a new Form W-9 if the name or TIN changes for the account; for example, if the grantor of a grantor trust dies.

Penalties

Failure to furnish TIN. If you fail to furnish your correct TIN to a requester, you are subject to a penalty of \$50 for each such failure unless your failure is due to reasonable cause and not to willful neglect.

Civil penalty for false information with respect to withholding. If you make a false statement with no reasonable basis that results in no backup withholding, you are subject to a \$500 penalty.

Criminal penalty for falsifying information. Willfully falsifying certifications or affirmations may subject you to criminal penalties including fines and/or imprisonment.

Misuse of TINs. If the requester discloses or uses TINs in violation of federal law, the requester may be subject to civil and criminal penalties.

Specific Instructions

Line 1

You must enter one of the following on this line; **do not** leave this line blank. The name should match the name on your tax return.

If this Form W-9 is for a joint account (other than an account maintained by a foreign financial institution (FFI)), list first, and then circle, the name of the person or entity whose number you entered in Part 1 of Form W-9. If you are providing Form W-9 to an FFI to document a joint account, each holder of the account that is a U.S. person must provide a Form W-9.

a. **Individual.** Generally, enter the name shown on your tax return. If you have changed your last name without informing the Social Security Administration (SSA) of the name change, enter your first name, the last name as shown on your social security card, and your new last name.

Note: ITIN applicant: Enter your individual name as it was entered on your Form W-7 application, line 1a. This should also be the same as the name you entered on the Form 1040/1040A/1040EZ you filed with your application.

b. **Sole proprietor or single-member LLC.** Enter your individual name as shown on your 1040/1040A/1040EZ on line 1. You may enter your business, trade, or "doing business as" (DBA) name on line 2.

c. **Partnership, LLC that is not a single-member LLC, C corporation, or S corporation.** Enter the entity's name as shown on the entity's tax return on line 1 and any business, trade, or DBA name on line 2.

d. **Other entities.** Enter your name as shown on required U.S. federal tax documents on line 1. This name should match the name shown on the charter or other legal document creating the entity. You may enter any business, trade, or DBA name on line 2.

e. **Disregarded entity.** For U.S. federal tax purposes, an entity that is disregarded as an entity separate from its owner is treated as a "disregarded entity." See Regulations section 301.7701-2(c)(2)(iii). Enter the owner's name on line 1. The name of the entity entered on line 1 should never be a disregarded entity. The name on line 1 should be the name shown on the income tax return on which the income should be reported. For example, if a foreign LLC that is treated as a disregarded entity for U.S. federal tax purposes has a single owner that is a U.S. person, the U.S. owner's name is required to be provided on line 1. If the direct owner of the entity is also a disregarded entity, enter the first owner that is not disregarded for federal tax purposes. Enter the disregarded entity's name on line 2, "Business name/disregarded entity name." If the owner of the disregarded entity is a foreign person, the owner must complete an appropriate Form W-8 instead of a Form W-9. This is the case even if the foreign person has a U.S. TIN.

Line 4, Exemptions

If you are exempt from backup withholding and/or FATCA reporting, enter in the appropriate space on line 4 any code(s) that may apply to you.

Exempt payee code.

- Generally, individuals (including sole proprietors) are not exempt from backup withholding.
- Except as provided below, corporations are exempt from backup withholding for certain payments, including interest and dividends.
- Corporations are not exempt from backup withholding for payments made in settlement of payment card or third party network transactions.

For interest and dividend payments, and certain payments made with respect to readily tradable instruments, generally you will have 60 days to get a TIN and give it to the requester before you are subject to backup withholding on payments. The 60-day rule does not apply to other types of payments. You will be subject to backup withholding on all such payments until you provide your TIN to the requester.

Note: Entering "Applied For" means that you have already applied for a TIN or that you intend to apply for one soon.

Protect yourself from suspicious emails or phishing schemes.

Phishing is the creation and use of email and websites designed to mimic legitimate business emails and websites. The most common act is sending an email to a user falsely claiming to be an established legitimate enterprise in an attempt to scam the user into surrendering private information that will be used for identity theft.

The IRS does not initiate contacts with taxpayers via emails. Also, the IRS does not request personal detailed information through email or ask taxpayers for the PIN numbers, passwords, or similar secret access information for their credit card, bank, or other financial accounts.

If you receive an unsolicited email claiming to be from the IRS, forward this message to phishing@irs.gov. You may also report misuse of the IRS name, logo, or other IRS property to the Treasury Inspector General for Tax Administration (TIGTA) at 1-800-366-4484. You can forward suspicious emails to the Federal Trade Commission at spam@uce.gov or report them at www.ftc.gov/complaint. You can contact the FTC at www.ftc.gov/idtheft or 877-IDTHEFT (877-438-4338). If you have been the victim of identity theft, see www.IdentityTheft.gov and Pub. 5027.

Visit www.irs.gov/IdentityTheft to learn more about identity theft and how to reduce your risk.

Privacy Act Notice

Section 6109 of the Internal Revenue Code requires you to provide your correct TIN to persons (including federal agencies) who are required to file information returns with the IRS to report interest, dividends, or certain other income paid to you; mortgage interest you paid; the acquisition or abandonment of secured property; the cancellation of debt; or contributions you made to an IRA, Archer MSA, or HSA. - e. Prices quoted shall include all charges for packing, transportation and delivery to the locations designated on the proposal specification and installation, if called for, in the proposal specifications.
- f. Correspondence shall be addressed to the Director of Purchasing.
- g. Proposals are available for inspection in the purchasing office by appointment for 10 days after the date of the award of an order.
- h. Oral, telephonic, telegraphic, or facsimile bids will not be accepted.

2. **ERRORS AND OMISSIONS**

All proposals shall be submitted with each space properly completed. The special attention of bidders is directed to the policy that no claim for relief because of errors or omissions in the bidding will be considered, and bidders will be held strictly to the proposals as submitted. Should a bidder find any claimed discrepancies in, or omissions from, any of the documents, or be in doubt as to their meanings, bidder shall advise the purchasing official first orally, followed by written (FAX or letter) with specification of the claimed problems which must be received during regular working hours at least 10 days before the date set for proposal opening so that a written notification can be prepared by any purchasing official, who will issue the necessary clarifications to all prospective bidders by means of addenda.

3. **FIRM PROPOSAL**

All proposals will be considered to be firm for a period of 90 days from the date established for the opening of proposals.

4. WITHDRAWAL OF PROPOSALS

Proposals may be withdrawn by letter, or telegram, or fax received by the district or in person prior to the time and date established for the opening of proposals.

5. INVESTIGATION OF BIDDERS

- a. The purchasing official will make such investigation as is necessary to determine the ability of the bidder to fulfill proposal requirements. The bidder shall furnish such information as may be requested and shall be prepared to show completed installations of equipment, types of service or supplies similar to those included in the proposal.

7. COMPLIANCE WITH THE ILLINOIS PREVAILING WAGE ACT

12. EVALUATIONS

The District reserves the right to reject any and all proposals, to waive any technicalities in the bidding and to award each item to a different bidder or all items to a single bidder unless otherwise noted on proposal request, and to determine whether in the opinion of the District: (1) an early delivery date is entitled to more consideration than price, (2) an earlier delivery date is to be disregarded because of the reputation of the bidder for not meeting delivery dates, (3) a bidder is not a responsible bidder and should be disregarded. The bidder shall warrant the work services, and/or products to be free of defects in material and workmanship for a period as defined by Board of Education award documents. See the Warranty tab in Response Form B. This warranty shall obligate the contractor to repair or replace the products at no additional charge to the District.

17. INSURANCE (REQUIRED)

The contractor shall provide and maintain insurance in the amounts outlined below with companies acceptable to the District:

Each Bidder shall provide at the time of bid submission a certificate of insurance evidencing ability to obtain insurance on the terms and conditions stated herein. Insurance shall be with companies licensed to do business in Illinois and satisfactory to the District. In light of the agreements that the District and the Contractor (i) may enter into governing the Contractor's exclusive use of the District's terminal facilities, (ii) may enter into for the sale and transfer of the District's fleet and (iii) may enter into for the leasing of the District fleet, the District agrees to cooperate, to the extent necessary, with the Contractor to secure any related insurance:

All insurers shall be licensed by the State of Illinois and rated A-VII or better by A.M. Best or comparable rating service. The comprehensive general liability, property damage, auto liability, and umbrella liability insurance policy shall name the District, its Board, Board members, employees, volunteers, sponsors, endorsed organizations, and agents as an additional insured on a primary noncontributory basis with a waiver of subrogation in favor of the District (if the Contractor will be on the District's premises the waiver of subrogation shall also apply to the workers' compensation insurance the waiver of subrogation shall also apply to the workers' compensation insurance). 19. HOLD HARMLESS AND INDEMNIFICATION

The contractor shall assume all liability for, and shall protect, defend, indemnify and hold harmless, the Board of Education, its members individually, officers, employees, servants and agents, from and against all claims, actions suits, judgments, costs, losses, expenses and liabilities of whatsoever kind or nature including reasonable legal fees incurred by owner arising out of:

21. LATE PROPOSALS

If any person employed on the work site were, in the opinion of the District project manager, intemperate, disorderly, incompetent, willfully negligent or dishonest on the performance of his/her duties, he or she shall be directed by the contractor to cease work and vacate the job site immediately.

26. SEXUAL HARASSMENT

a. The name of any owner or co-owner, equity of each co-owner or corporate offices of the entity submitting the proposal, and the name, address, and business telephone number of each such person.

b. The last financial statement and balance sheet of the bidder, including a specification in detail of all loans outstanding, or a copy of the last certified annual audit.

29. COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS.

Successful bidder shall at all times observe and comply with all laws, ordinances, regulations and codes of the federal, state, county and other local government agencies, which may in any manner affect the performance of the contract and in particular any such laws pertaining to safety.

30. GOVERNING LAW

The terms of this quote shall be governed and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Illinois. If any provision hereof shall be held to contravene any applicable law, such provision shall be deemed reformed to the extent of conforming to said law, and in all other respects the terms hereof shall remain in full force and effect.

31. PROPOSAL

The signing of the submittal form shall be construed as acceptance of all provisions contained herein. All proposals shall be submitted with each space properly completed. 5. Sufficient facts to justify the exemption from tax under the terms of the treaty article.

Example. Article 20 of the U.S.-China income tax treaty allows an exemption from tax for scholarship income received by a Chinese student temporarily present in the United States. Under U.S. law, this student will become a resident alien for tax purposes if his or her stay in the United States exceeds 5 calendar years. However, paragraph 2 of the first Protocol to the U.S.-China treaty (dated April 30, 1984) allows the provisions of Article 20 to continue to apply even after the Chinese student becomes a resident alien of the United States. A Chinese student who qualifies for this exception (under paragraph 2 of the first protocol) and is relying on this exception to claim an exemption from tax on his or her scholarship or fellowship income would attach to Form W-9 a statement that includes the information described above to support that exemption.

If you are a nonresident alien or a foreign entity, give the requester the appropriate completed Form W-8 or Form 8233.

Backup Withholding

What is backup withholding? Persons making certain payments to you must under certain conditions withhold and pay to the IRS 24% of such payments. This is called "backup withholding." Payments that may be subject to backup withholding include interest, tax-exempt interest, dividends, broker and barter exchange transactions, rents, royalties, nonemployee pay, payments made in settlement of payment card and third party network transactions, and certain payments from fishing boat operators. Real estate transactions are not subject to backup withholding.

Payments you receive will be subject to backup withholding if:

1. You do not furnish your TIN to the requester,
2. You do not certify your TIN when required (see the instructions for Part II for details),

GENERAL CONDITIONS-SCOPE OF SERVICES

A. INTRODUCTION

Community Unit School District 300 (as herein defined) and the Contractor (as herein defined) shall enter into a Contract (as herein defined) to provide the services at the price and on the terms and conditions specified in these General Conditions and other Bid Documents (as herein defined) and such other reasonable terms consistent therewith and necessary for the performance of the Contract. Such Contract shall be for a term commencing on July 1, 2019 and ending on June 30, 2020 and may, at the District's sole discretion, be extended for two (2) additional one-year periods, as provided for herein.

B. GENERAL SCOPE OF WORK

This Contract is for a three-year student taxi transportation services agreement. The District provides transportation services to students, covering 78,500 miles in Radius I routes and 49,000 miles in Radius II routes. This includes special needs students that attend one of the District's 27 schools, 27 special educational facilities, some of which are, and some of which are not located within the District. A list of the District schools (Attachment B) and out-of-district special education facilities (Attachment C) are included at the end of this document.

C. DEFINITIONS

1. "Route" shall mean the pattern or plan of travel including pick-up and departure points for taxi's transporting students and others entitled to school taxi transportation.

D. BIDDER AND CONTRACTOR FISCAL ABILITY AND PAST EXPERIENCE

The Contractor may be required to furnish evidence of fiscal stability at the option of the District.

Each Contractor shall furnish the District with a statement listing all of its school student transportation experience since the 2017-2018 school year through and including the 2014-2015 school year, including the names of all past and current Illinois schools, school districts and educational cooperatives served by the Contractor and the names, addresses and telephone numbers of all such school, school district and cooperative staff responsible for student transportation.

For the first year of the Contract only, final Certificates of Insurance shall be filed by the Contractor with the District within ten (10) days of Contract award, and for each remaining year of the Contract, the Certificates of Insurance shall be filed by the Contractor with the District by July 1. The Certificates of Insurance shall show that the District, the Board and all relevant individuals have been duly named as additional insured under each policy and showing that the insurance is not cancelable without first giving sixty (60) days advance written notice to the District. The Contractor shall incur a one hundred dollar (\$100) per diem penalty for each day it fails to file said Certificates of Insurance after the applicable due date. In the

event of cancellation, the Contractor shall furnish evidence of new insurance at the earliest possible date, but not later than ten (10) days prior to the cancellation date of the original policy. Failure of the Contractor to obtain new insurance shall be cause for the District to terminate the Contract.

E. INVOICING – Monthly - required detailed student pick-up address, drop off location, name and address of student, trip charge and mileage of trip Invoicing shall be done by the Contractor directly to the District, in a format acceptable to the District. In addition, the Contractor shall provide copies of all calculations deriving per-student charges from per-route and per-trip charges billed in accordance with these General Conditions. Contractor shall submit invoices to the District on or before the tenth (10th) day of each month. The District shall make payment to the Contractor monthly in arrears based upon actual routes at the appropriate unit prices per route, as specified in the Bid Form. Payments shall be made monthly after approval of the bills submitted by the District Finance Committee and the Board of Education based upon the Board of Education Board meeting schedule.

Payments for all other services under the Contract (i.e., early or late routes, etc.) shall be made monthly in arrears, upon submission by the Contractor of individual invoices covering the services provided.

District 300 will provide payments via check, ACH, wire or MasterCard Credit Card. Discounts for payment within 10 or 20 days of receipt of detailed invoice can be negotiated with District 300. Invoices will be paid at 95% within 10 days of receipt, the 5% balance paid within the 30-day term once attendance is confirmed.

Final invoicing for the year will be provided to the District in time prior to July 10 to include all cost in the Transportation Claim.

F. CONTRACT TERM AND EXTENSION AND CONTRACT PRICE

1. The Contractor will be awarded the Contract for a one (1) year term, beginning on July 1, 2022 and ending on June 30, 2023. The District, at its sole discretion, may elect to extend the Contract for two (2) additional one-year periods (the 2023-2024 and 2024-2025 school years). However, if for any reason the District determines that continuation of this Contract is not in the best interests of the District, it may withdraw from and terminate the Contract at the end of any fiscal year (a fiscal year ends on June 30) covered by this Contract, provided that the District gives the Contractor written notice of its intention to so terminate the Contract by April 1 of said fiscal year. If the District elects to recommend the extension the of Contract for an additional one-year period it shall so notify the Contractor in writing by March 1 of the year in which the Contract would otherwise expire.

2. In the event the District elects to extend the contract for the second and third years, the negotiated, tentative Contract will be brought for approval before the District Board.

3. The Contract base prices may be increased or decreased by no more than the lesser of five percent (5%) or the percentage increase or decrease reflected by the Chicago Metropolitan area Consumer Price Index for Urban Consumers, from March 1 of the previous calendar year to February 28 (or 29, as the case may be) of the current calendar year, as published by the United States Department of Labor, Bureau of Statistics. The base prices listed for any Contract year shall be the bases for adjusting the Contract price for the next year.

G. EMERGENCY REQUIREMENTS

Plans and programs for maintaining the following safety precautions and programs shall be established by the Contractor prior to the start date of the Contract:

1. At least one (1) assigned office worker familiar with the District Contract shall be available in the Contractor's office 5:30 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., or until the last student is delivered, to field calls or transmissions from District staff each day students are transported. After hours answering service must be provided to District staff.
2. An answering service shall be provided by the Contractor to be used between the hours of 6:00 p.m. to 5:30 a.m. each day when students are transported to advise callers that the office is closed and in the event of an emergency to contact one or more individuals designated by the Contractor.
3. The Contractor shall have means to make contact with drivers at all times.
4. The Contractor shall provide the District, in an Excel document, the names of all assigned drivers, copy of Driver's License for all drivers at the start of the contract and upon request.
5. The Contractor shall provide the District Transportation Director with immediate notification of all accidents and incidents.
6. Accident reports are to be submitted to the Director of Transportation within 24 hours of the time of the accident.

H. EQUIPMENT AND VEHICLE MAINTENANCE

The Contractor shall be responsible for each of the items listed below relative to any vehicle that the Contractor uses or proposes to use to transport District students, regardless of whether the Contractor is the actual titleholder of the vehicle, and the Contractor shall certify, in writing, by August 1 of each year that this Contract is in effect, to the District that it has met each of these responsibilities:

1. Ensuring that all equipment on vehicles conforms to all local, State and Federal statutes pertaining to school bus transportation, vehicle specifications and safety, and to all relevant State and Federal regulations.
2. Obtaining in a timely fashion any and all required inspections and providing a copy of the inspection report for any vehicle upon request of the District.
3. Ensuring that each vehicle possesses the following safety equipment in good and working order: a first-aid kit, individual seat belts where required by Illinois law, and padded seats,
4. Ensuring that each vehicle is maintained in a clean, sanitary, good mechanical condition and that vehicles are smoke-free.
5. Maintaining a safety program that, at a minimum, includes the following:
 - a. Regularly scheduled in-service meetings for drivers to include, but not limited to, defensive driver training, blood-borne pathogens training, and student behavior management.
 - b. Daily vehicle inspections.

- c. Safety Supervisor(s) to enforce good driving practices with respect to safety, mechanical operation, adherence to time schedules and conformity with applicable laws and regulations.
- d. To ensure that drivers and dispatcher understand appropriate emergency procedures.
- e. Drivers are prohibited from driving a taxi while smoking or being under the influence of alcohol or drugs.
- f. Requirement that all drivers and passengers wear their seat belt at all times when they are operating their vehicle.
- g. Drivers are prohibited from using a cellular telephone while driving a taxi with passengers on board, except in the event of a taxi emergency.

I. DRIVER RESPONSIBILITY AND QUALIFICATIONS

All drivers shall be subject to State and Federal laws pertaining to the operation of school buses and the transportation of students, the Illinois School Code and the rules and regulations pertaining to same, and the policies and regulations of the District, and no driver shall be permitted to operate any vehicle under this Contract unless he or she is in full compliance with all such laws, rules, regulations and policies. All personnel operating vehicles used in the transportation of students must be of the highest moral character, completely competent professionals, properly licensed and physically capable.

The Contractor shall provide to the District a detailed description of its procedures for screening and employing all employees. In addition, the Contractor shall supply to the District:

1. Each employee's name
2. Each driver's commercial driver's license number and school bus driver's permit number.
3. The date on which each employee, as applicable, successfully passed drug and alcohol screening.
4. The date on which each employee, as applicable, was cleared by a criminal background check and checks of the Statewide Sex Offenders database.

All employees who are required to, but have not submitted to the background check and drug/alcohol testing or those who have not been cleared by a background check and drug/alcohol test may not be employed under this Contract. In addition, detailed information on each driver and employee, as applicable, including certification, criminal background check, and driving record shall be maintained at the Contractor's office and provided to the District upon request.

The District reserves the right to request the removal of a driver for specific routes or from driving for District 300. The District is not liable for any unemployment claims resulting from any requested termination.

Any problems relative to transportation services between drivers and school staff should not be discussed in front of students. The driver should bring the problem to the attention of his or her supervisor who can then resolve the issue with the District's Superintendent or his designee. Drivers are required to report behavior

problems in a timely, accurate and appropriate manner. The Contractor will keep a record of any and all accidents, commendations, complaints and concerns regarding each driver. These records shall be provided to the District on a monthly basis to the District's designated administrator. Accident records will be provided to the District no later than 24 hours after the event.

J. STUDENT DISCIPLINE

DRIVERS WILL REPORT DISCIPLINE ISSUES TO THEIR DISPATCHER, WHO WILL CONTACT DISTRICT 300 TRANSPORTATION DIRECTOR.

- The District Superintendent or his designee may from time to time issue instructions governing the behavior of students. The Contractor's drivers shall, to the best of their abilities, follow such instructions at all times. Such instructions shall include procedures for reporting misconduct.
- The Contractor will report each incident of student misconduct immediately by phone or in person to the Director of Transportation and follow up with a written report upon request.
- The Contractor will not permit smoking or consumption of alcoholic beverages, or consumption of other non-prescription drugs, by students in a taxi.
- The Contractor's drivers shall not, under any circumstances, administer physical punishment to any student on the bus. Restraint may be used by the drivers only when necessary to protect the safety of other students on in a taxi.
- Will not stop at any location for students other than the designated pickup or drop off.

K. ELIGIBLE STUDENTS; NUMBER OF DAYS OF TRANSPORTATION

1. No Unauthorized Persons: No unauthorized persons shall be allowed in any vehicle while it is engaged in transporting students; however, the District reserves the right to have an authorized District employee ride on any vehicle on any route, without prior notice to the Contractor. Rides by parents for personal reasons are expressly forbidden.

2. School Calendars: All transportation will be in accordance with the District calendar including provisions for holidays, institute days, early dismissal for in-service training, beginning time for the school day and ending time for the school day. The District shall, by July 1 of each year of the Contract, furnish the Contractor with a school calendar, including the Summer Program schedule and subsequent changes to the school calendar will be furnished to the Contractor in a timely fashion. The calendar for the 2022-2023 school year is included as part of these Bid Documents.

L. ROUTES AND SCHEDULES

1. The starting time for incoming routes shall be set to allow the taxi to arrive at the school not more than fifteen (10) minutes or less than five (5) minutes before the designated start time on the route form contained in these Bid Documents. Outgoing routes shall be scheduled in accordance with District 300 guidelines.

2. Seating capacity shall not exceed capacity as described by manufacturer of vehicle. Students are not allowed to ride in the front seat of any taxi.

M. DISTRICT'S RIGHTS IN CONTRACT AWARD

The District reserves the right to award the transportation Contract as it sees fit, selecting the Bidder(s) which it considers to be in the best interest of the District, or to reject any and all proposals. The District reserves the right to award any portion of the bid or portion thereof, including base bids and alternate bids as noted in the Scope of Services to one or more Bidders.

N. ASSIGNMENT OF CONTRACT

The Contractor agrees not to assign this Contract, or any part of this Contract.

O. NON-COMPLIANCE PENALTIES

Should the District find the Contractor in noncompliance with the provisions of the Contract on a taxi route or series of routes, the District will be entitled to impose the following penalties, provided that the Superintendent, or his designee, has provided the Contractor two (2) days oral notice of the noncompliance and the Contractor has not cured the noncompliance within said two days. For purposes of this Section of these General Conditions, "noncompliance" means, but is not limited to, the failure to transport students on a taxi route or routes as contracted or as requested in strict accordance with the terms, conditions and provisions of this Contract, or the failure to make changes to routes as specified and directed by the Superintendent in accordance with the terms of this Contract, or the failure to comply with an explicit provision or requirement set forth in this Contract. Further, for purposes of this Section of these General Conditions, the Contractor shall be deemed to have cured any noncompliance if the action, event or occurrence that caused the noncompliance is not repeated in any of the ten (10) business days following oral notification of the noncompliance by the Superintendent or his designee.

The District will pay one (1) no load fee per day per taxi. If a student does not ride in the morning, the driver must report that to dispatch. District 300 will not pay for the afternoon no load.

The District shall notify the Contractor in writing whenever it has elected to assess a penalty, whether assessed pursuant to this Paragraph or another paragraph of these General Conditions, stating the amount of and the reason for the penalty. The noncompliance penalties for late pick-up and drop-off shall not apply during weather involving hazardous driving conditions or delays due to a vehicle accident (non-bus). **A penalty, whether assessed pursuant to this Paragraph or another paragraph of these General Conditions, shall be deducted, at the District's sole discretion, from the first or second invoice following the noncompliance. The failure of the District to assess or collect any penalty under these General Conditions shall not be considered a waiver of the District's right to assess or collect that penalty in the future or a waiver with respect to any future violation committed by the Contractor.**

P. SERVICE INTERRUPTION

1. In the event that service is interrupted for more than twenty-four (24) hours by reason of work stoppage or any other event which prevents the Contractor from furnishing service, the District shall have the right to secure and substitute other transportation services. If the cost of the substitute transportation services are higher than the Contractor's cost (agreed upon in the Contract), then the Contractor

shall pay the difference between its charges and the charges of the substitute taxi company.

2. In the event of severe weather conditions, or conditions beyond the Contractor's reasonable control, the Contractor shall notify the Superintendent, or his/her designee and request permission to interrupt service. Such decisions by the Superintendent shall be final.

3. If schools serviced by the taxis are closed on any day or days because of weather conditions or other emergency, notice will be given by the District of cancellation of service to the Contractor by telephone or otherwise, before 5:45 a.m. for such day(s).

Q. TERMINATION OF CONTRACT BY REASON OF DEFAULT

1. If the Contractor or its drivers or employees at any time fail to comply with the terms of this Contract, or do not fully perform and strictly adhere to any of the terms hereof required to be performed, the District may, at its discretion, terminate this Contract, as provided herein.

2. In the event that the District determines that the Contractor has failed to comply fully, perform, or strictly adhere to this Contract, then the District may, at its discretion, through its Superintendent, send written notice to the Contractor indicating the intention of the District to declare the Contractor in default. In such notice, the District shall state in what respect the Contractor has failed to comply with the terms of the Contract, and shall further state a date upon which the Contract will terminate, unless the Contractor, prior to such date, cures the defect to the satisfaction of the District. The Contractor shall provide the District a written correction plan to provide a cure for the non-compliance concerns within 48 hours of the receipt of the District's notification. If prior to the date of termination stated in said notice, the District notifies the Contractor that the defect has been cured, the Contract will not terminate on the date stated in the notice but will be deemed to have remained in effect as of the date such notice was given. In the event the District does not so notify the Contractor that the defect has been cured, this Contract shall be terminated without further action by the District on the date of termination stated in notice.

3. The date of termination stated in the notice of intent to declare the Contractor in default, as provided in "2" above, may not be sooner than thirty (30) calendar days following the date of such notice unless there is a failure by the Contractor to provide the services required by this Contract which affect twenty-five per cent (25%) or more of the routes assigned to the Contractor, in which event the date of termination may be five (5) calendar days following the date of such notice.

4. The right of the District to terminate the Contract as provided in this Section is cumulative with all other rights of the District contained herein.

R. MISCELLANEOUS

Any notice or communication permitted or required under the Contract shall be in writing and shall become effective on the day of mailing thereof by email.

S. TAXI TRANSPORTATION SERVICES

The Contractor shall conduct all of its activities subject to all current and future federal and state laws and ordinances, and the decisions, rules, guidelines, policies and procedures of the District (hereinafter, collectively, "District Policies") and pursuant thereto, the Contractor shall carry out the following functions and responsibilities of this Contract to include the following:

- The Contractor shall provide the District with on-time delivery. There is an expectation that taxis should arrive no more than fifteen (15) minutes and no less than five (5) minutes before the start of school. If the Contractor fails to meet this requirement a penalty of 20% of the cost of that route for that day will be assessed against the Contractor's billing for the month.
- The Contractor shall have an expected wait time at pick-up of no less than five (5) minutes. Repeated wait times in excess of 5 minutes should be reported to the District 300 Director of Transportation at 847-551-8492 or email deborah.mason@d300.org
- Contractor is not allowed to combine routes without permission from the Director of Transportation.
- The Contractor must have staff available between the hours of 5:30 a.m. until the last scheduled student has been delivered at the end of the day.
- The Contractor shall provide emergency response contacts that are available beyond the required hours of staffing to provide adequate support for after-hours trips and extracurricular runs and in the event of emergencies.
- Recommend to the District short-term and long-term plans, processes and procedures that will improve student transportation services and upon the District's approval and adoption of such policies and procedures, implement same.
- Recruit and maintain driver pool to accommodate District 300 needs.
- Evaluate the performance of each taxi driver annually.
- Accommodate District 300 request for service changes within 24 hours of the request.
- Provide a complaint tracking system.
- All communications are routed through District 300 Director of Transportation or designee.
- As requested, assist the Director of Transportation and other District 300 departments with transportation issues.
- The Contractor shall provide the District with the following reports and submittals:
 - Billing by the 10th of the month for the previous month of service in an electronic format (Excel preferred), to include date of service, student name, pick-up/drop-off address and mileage of route
 - Assist with other required data requests as needed

- The Contractor's General Manager will meet as requested with the Director of Transportation to report on achievements, areas of concern, and information of interest. The Contractor shall make reports, studies, and surveys regarding student transportation as are reasonably necessary to or requested by the District.
- The Contractor will report all accidents/incidents regardless of severity or insignificance immediately to the Director of Transportation including the name of the driver and student(s), location of accident, and accident report.
- Taxi drivers will meet with District 300 prior to start of school to discuss District expectations at no cost to the District.

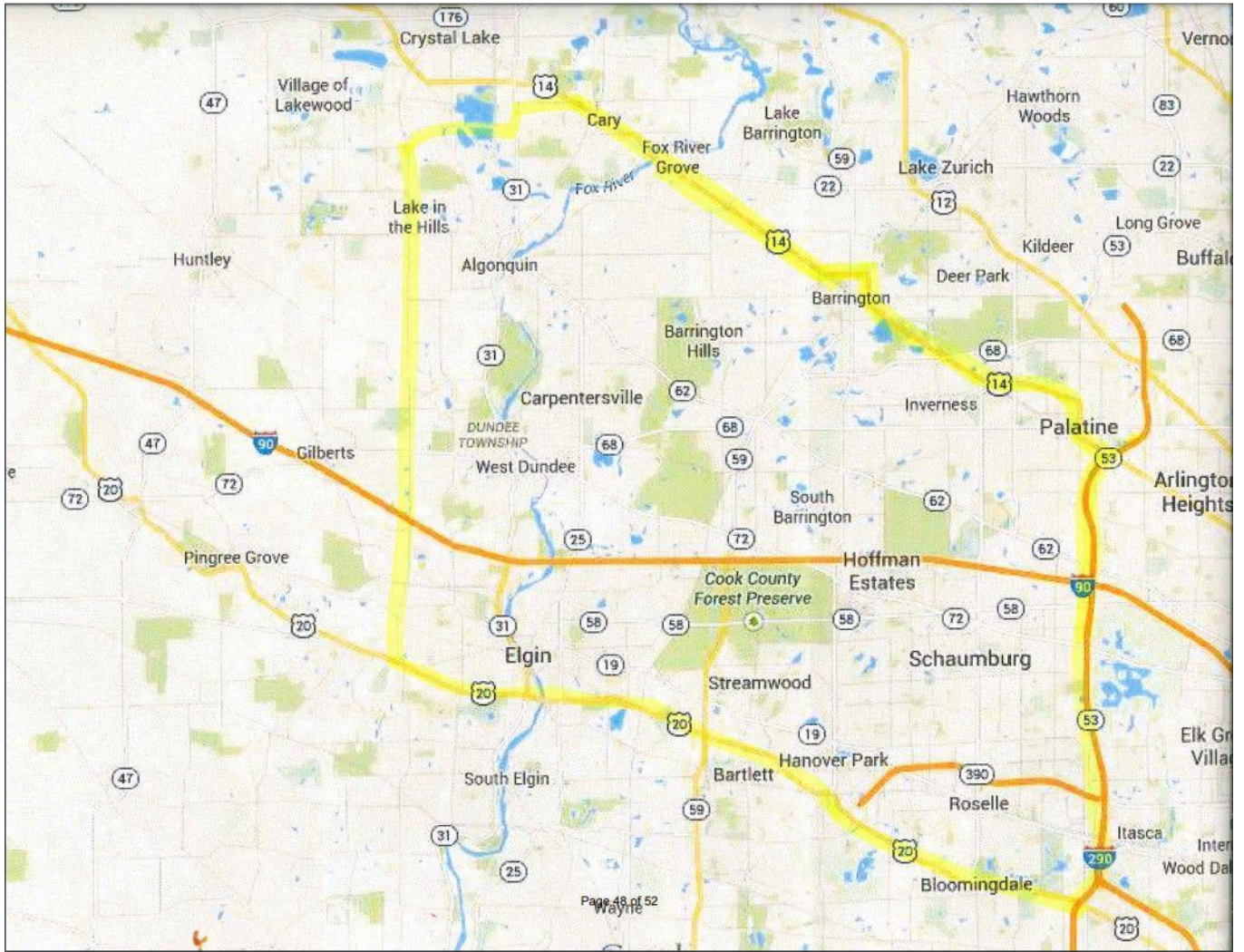

- f. Correspondence shall be addressed to the Director of Purchasing.
- g. Proposals are available for inspection in the purchasing office by appointment for 10 days after the date of the award of an order.
- h. Oral, telephonic, telegraphic, or facsimile bids will not be accepted.

2. **ERRORS AND OMISSIONS**

All proposals shall be submitted with each space properly completed. The special attention of bidders is directed to the policy that no claim for relief because of errors or omissions in the bidding will be considered, and bidders will be held strictly to the proposals as submitted. Should a bidder find any claimed discrepancies in, or omissions from, any of the documents, or be in doubt as to their meanings, bidder shall advise the purchasing official first orally, followed by written (FAX or letter) with specification of the claimed problems which must be received during regular working hours at least 10 days before the date set for proposal opening so that a written notification can be prepared by any purchasing official, who will issue the necessary clarifications to all prospective bidders by means of addenda.

3. **FIRM PROPOSAL**

All proposals will be considered to be firm for a period of 90 days from the date established for the opening of proposals.

4. WITHDRAWAL OF PROPOSALS

5. INVESTIGATION OF BIDDERS

7. COMPLIANCE WITH THE ILLINOIS PREVAILING WAGE ACT

The District reserves the right to reject any and all proposals, to waive any technicalities in the bidding and to award each item to a different bidder or all items to a single bidder unless otherwise noted on proposal request, and to determine whether in the opinion of the District: (1) an early delivery date is entitled to more consideration than price, (2) an earlier delivery date is to be disregarded because of the reputation of the bidder for not meeting delivery dates, (3) a bidder is not a responsible bidder and should be disregarded. The bidder shall warrant the work services, and/or products to be free of defects in material and workmanship for a period as defined by Board of Education award documents. See the Warranty tab in Response Form B. This warranty shall obligate the contractor to repair or replace the products at no additional charge to the District.

17. INSURANCE (REQUIRED)

The insurance shall include sexual abuse, molestation and misconduct coverage if the Contractor will be on District premises or transporting students or staff. All insurers shall be licensed by the State of Illinois and rated A-VII or better by A.M. Best or comparable rating service. Nonresident alien who becomes a resident alien. Generally, only a nonresident alien individual may use the terms of a tax treaty to reduce or eliminate U.S. tax on certain types of income. However, most tax treaties contain a provision known as a "saving clause." Exceptions specified in the saving clause may permit an exemption from tax to continue for certain types of income even after the payee has otherwise become a U.S. resident alien for tax purposes.

If you are a U.S. resident alien who is relying on an exception contained in the saving clause of a tax treaty to claim an exemption from U.S. tax on certain types of income, you must attach a statement to Form W-9 that specifies the following five items.

1. The treaty country. Generally, this must be the same treaty under which you claimed exemption from tax as a nonresident alien.
2. The treaty article addressing the income.
3. The article number (or location) in the tax treaty that contains the saving clause and its exceptions.
4. The type and amount of income that qualifies for the exemption from tax.
5. Sufficient facts to justify the exemption from tax under the terms of the treaty article.

Example. Article 20 of the U.S.-China income tax treaty allows an exemption from tax for scholarship income received by a Chinese student temporarily present in the United States. Under U.S. law, this student will become a resident alien for tax purposes if his or her stay in the United States exceeds 5 calendar years. However, paragraph 2 of the first Protocol to the U.S.-China treaty (dated April 30, 1984) allows the provisions of Article 20 to continue to apply even after the Chinese student becomes a resident alien of the United States. A Chinese student who qualifies for this exception (under paragraph 2 of the first protocol) and is relying on this exception to claim an exemption from tax on his or her scholarship or fellowship income would attach to Form W-9 a statement that includes the information described above to support that exemption.

If you are a nonresident alien or a foreign entity, give the requester the appropriate completed Form W-8 or Form 8233.

Backup Withholding

What is backup withholding? Persons making certain payments to you must under certain conditions withhold and pay to the IRS 24% of such payments. This is called "backup withholding." Payments that may be subject to backup withholding include interest, tax-exempt interest, dividends, broker and barter exchange transactions, rents, royalties, nonemployee pay, payments made in settlement of payment card and third party network transactions, and certain payments from fishing boat operators. Real estate transactions are not subject to backup withholding.

You will not be subject to backup withholding on payments you receive if you give the requester your correct TIN, make the proper certifications, and report all your taxable interest and dividends on your tax return.

Payments you receive will be subject to backup withholding if:

1. You do not furnish your TIN to the requester,
2. You do not certify your TIN when required (see the instructions for Part II for details),
3. The IRS tells the requester that you furnished an incorrect TIN,
4. The IRS tells you that you are subject to backup withholding because you did not report all your interest and dividends on your tax return (for reportable interest and dividends only), or
5. You do not certify to the requester that you are not subject to backup withholding under 4 above (for reportable interest and dividend accounts opened after 1983 only).

Certain payees and payments are exempt from backup withholding. See *Exempt payee code*, later, and the separate Instructions for the Requester of Form W-9 for more information.

What is FATCA Reporting?

The Foreign Account Tax Compliance Act (FATCA) requires a participating foreign financial institution to report all United States account holders that are specified United States persons. Certain payees are exempt from FATCA reporting. See *Exemption from FATCA reporting code*, later, and the Instructions for the Requester of Form W-9 for more information.

Updating Your Information

You must provide updated information to any person to whom you claimed to be an exempt payee if you are no longer an exempt payee and anticipate receiving reportable payments in the future from this person. For example, you may need to provide updated information if you are a C corporation that elects to be an S corporation, or if you no longer are tax exempt. In addition, you must furnish a new Form W-9 if the name or TIN changes for the account; for example, if the grantor of a grantor trust dies.

Penalties

Failure to furnish TIN. If you fail to furnish your correct TIN to a requester, you are subject to a penalty of \$50 for each such failure unless your failure is due to reasonable cause and not to willful neglect.

Civil penalty for false information with respect to withholding. If you make a false statement with no reasonable basis that results in no backup withholding, you are subject to a \$500 penalty.

Criminal penalty for falsifying information. Willfully falsifying certifications or affirmations may subject you to criminal penalties including fines and/or imprisonment.

GENERAL CONDITIONS-SCOPE OF SERVICES

A. INTRODUCTION

Community Unit School District 300 (as herein defined) and the Contractor (as herein defined) shall enter into a Contract (as herein defined) to provide the services at the price and on the terms and conditions specified in these General Conditions and other Bid Documents (as herein defined) and such other reasonable terms consistent therewith and necessary for the performance of the Contract. Such Contract shall be for a term commencing on July 1, 2019 and ending on June 30, 2020 and may, at the District's sole discretion, be extended for two (2) additional one-year periods, as provided for herein.

B. GENERAL SCOPE OF WORK

This Contract is for a three-year student taxi transportation services agreement. The District provides transportation services to students, covering 78,500 miles in Radius I routes and 49,000 miles in Radius II routes. This includes special needs students that attend one of the District's 27 schools, 27 special educational facilities, some of which are, and some of which are not located within the District. A list of the District schools (Attachment B) and out-of-district special education facilities (Attachment C) are included at the end of this document.

C. DEFINITIONS

1. "Route" shall mean the pattern or plan of travel including pick-up and departure points for taxi's transporting students and others entitled to school taxi transportation.

D. BIDDER AND CONTRACTOR FISCAL ABILITY AND PAST EXPERIENCE

The Contractor may be required to furnish evidence of fiscal stability at the option of the District.

Each Contractor shall furnish the District with a statement listing all of its school student transportation experience since the 2017-2018 school year through and including the 2014-2015 school year, including the names of all past and current Illinois schools, school districts and educational cooperatives served by the Contractor and the names, addresses and telephone numbers of all such school, school district and cooperative staff responsible for student transportation.

For the first year of the Contract only, final Certificates of Insurance shall be filed by the Contractor with the District within ten (10) days of Contract award, and for each remaining year of the Contract, the Certificates of Insurance shall be filed by the Contractor with the District by July 1. The Certificates of Insurance shall show that the District, the Board and all relevant individuals have been duly named as additional insured under each policy and showing that the insurance is not cancelable without first giving sixty (60) days advance written notice to the District. The Contractor shall incur a one hundred dollar (\$100) per diem penalty for each day it fails to file said Certificates of Insurance after the applicable due date. In the

event of cancellation, the Contractor shall furnish evidence of new insurance at the earliest possible date, but not later than ten (10) days prior to the cancellation date of the original policy. Failure of the Contractor to obtain new insurance shall be cause for the District to terminate the Contract.

E. INVOICING – Monthly - required detailed student pick-up address, drop off location, name and address of student, trip charge and mileage of trip Invoicing shall be done by the Contractor directly to the District, in a format acceptable to the District. In addition, the Contractor shall provide copies of all calculations deriving per-student charges from per-route and per-trip charges billed in accordance with these General Conditions. Contractor shall submit invoices to the District on or before the tenth (10th) day of each month. The District shall make payment to the Contractor monthly in arrears based upon actual routes at the appropriate unit prices per route, as specified in the Bid Form. Payments shall be made monthly after approval of the bills submitted by the District Finance Committee and the Board of Education based upon the Board of Education Board meeting schedule.

Payments for all other services under the Contract (i.e., early or late routes, etc.) shall be made monthly in arrears, upon submission by the Contractor of individual invoices covering the services provided.

District 300 will provide payments via check, ACH, wire or MasterCard Credit Card. Discounts for payment within 10 or 20 days of receipt of detailed invoice can be negotiated with District 300. Invoices will be paid at 95% within 10 days of receipt, the 5% balance paid within the 30-day term once attendance is confirmed.

Final invoicing for the year will be provided to the District in time prior to July 10 to include all cost in the Transportation Claim.

F. CONTRACT TERM AND EXTENSION AND CONTRACT PRICE

1. The Contractor will be awarded the Contract for a one (1) year term, beginning on July 1, 2022 and ending on June 30, 2023. The District, at its sole discretion, may elect to extend the Contract for two (2) additional one-year periods (the 2023-2024 and 2024-2025 school years). However, if for any reason the District determines that continuation of this Contract is not in the best interests of the District, it may withdraw from and terminate the Contract at the end of any fiscal year (a fiscal year ends on June 30) covered by this Contract, provided that the District gives the Contractor written notice of its intention to so terminate the Contract by April 1 of said fiscal year. If the District elects to recommend the extension the of Contract for an additional one-year period it shall so notify the Contractor in writing by March 1 of the year in which the Contract would otherwise expire.

2. In the event the District elects to extend the contract for the second and third years, the negotiated, tentative Contract will be brought for approval before the District Board.

3. The Contract base prices may be increased or decreased by no more than the lesser of five percent (5%) or the percentage increase or decrease reflected by the Chicago Metropolitan area Consumer Price Index for Urban Consumers, from March 1 of the previous calendar year to February 28 (or 29, as the case may be) of the current calendar year, as published by the United States Department of Labor, Bureau of Statistics. The base prices listed for any Contract year shall be the bases for adjusting the Contract price for the next year.

G. EMERGENCY REQUIREMENTS

Plans and programs for maintaining the following safety precautions and programs shall be established by the Contractor prior to the start date of the Contract:

1. At least one (1) assigned office worker familiar with the District Contract shall be available in the Contractor's office 5:30 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., or until the last student is delivered, to field calls or transmissions from District staff each day students are transported. After hours answering service must be provided to District staff.
2. An answering service shall be provided by the Contractor to be used between the hours of 6:00 p.m. to 5:30 a.m. each day when students are transported to advise callers that the office is closed and in the event of an emergency to contact one or more individuals designated by the Contractor.
3. The Contractor shall have means to make contact with drivers at all times.
4. The Contractor shall provide the District, in an Excel document, the names of all assigned drivers, copy of Driver's License for all drivers at the start of the contract and upon request.
5. The Contractor shall provide the District Transportation Director with immediate notification of all accidents and incidents.
6. Accident reports are to be submitted to the Director of Transportation within 24 hours of the time of the accident.

H. EQUIPMENT AND VEHICLE MAINTENANCE

The Contractor shall be responsible for each of the items listed below relative to any vehicle that the Contractor uses or proposes to use to transport District students, regardless of whether the Contractor is the actual titleholder of the vehicle, and the Contractor shall certify, in writing, by August 1 of each year that this Contract is in effect, to the District that it has met each of these responsibilities:

1. Ensuring that all equipment on vehicles conforms to all local, State and Federal statutes pertaining to school bus transportation, vehicle specifications and safety, and to all relevant State and Federal regulations.
2. Obtaining in a timely fashion any and all required inspections and providing a copy of the inspection report for any vehicle upon request of the District.
3. Ensuring that each vehicle possesses the following safety equipment in good and working order: a first-aid kit, individual seat belts where required by Illinois law, and padded seats,
4. Ensuring that each vehicle is maintained in a clean, sanitary, good mechanical condition and that vehicles are smoke-free.
5. Maintaining a safety program that, at a minimum, includes the following:
 - a. Regularly scheduled in-service meetings for drivers to include, but not limited to, defensive driver training, blood-borne pathogens training, and student behavior management.
 - b. Daily vehicle inspections.

- c. Safety Supervisor(s) to enforce good driving practices with respect to safety, mechanical operation, adherence to time schedules and conformity with applicable laws and regulations.
- d. To ensure that drivers and dispatcher understand appropriate emergency procedures.
- e. Drivers are prohibited from driving a taxi while smoking or being under the influence of alcohol or drugs.
- f. Requirement that all drivers and passengers wear their seat belt at all times when they are operating their vehicle.
- g. Drivers are prohibited from using a cellular telephone while driving a taxi with passengers on board, except in the event of a taxi emergency.

I. DRIVER RESPONSIBILITY AND QUALIFICATIONS

All drivers shall be subject to State and Federal laws pertaining to the operation of school buses and the transportation of students, the Illinois School Code and the rules and regulations pertaining to same, and the policies and regulations of the District, and no driver shall be permitted to operate any vehicle under this Contract unless he or she is in full compliance with all such laws, rules, regulations and policies. All personnel operating vehicles used in the transportation of students must be of the highest moral character, completely competent professionals, properly licensed and physically capable.

The Contractor shall provide to the District a detailed description of its procedures for screening and employing all employees. In addition, the Contractor shall supply to the District:

1. Each employee's name
2. Each driver's commercial driver's license number and school bus driver's permit number.
3. The date on which each employee, as applicable, successfully passed drug and alcohol screening.
4. The date on which each employee, as applicable, was cleared by a criminal background check and checks of the Statewide Sex Offenders database.

All employees who are required to, but have not submitted to the background check and drug/alcohol testing or those who have not been cleared by a background check and drug/alcohol test may not be employed under this Contract. In addition, detailed information on each driver and employee, as applicable, including certification, criminal background check, and driving record shall be maintained at the Contractor's office and provided to the District upon request.

The District reserves the right to request the removal of a driver for specific routes or from driving for District 300. The District is not liable for any unemployment claims resulting from any requested termination.

Any problems relative to transportation services between drivers and school staff should not be discussed in front of students. The driver should bring the problem to the attention of his or her supervisor who can then resolve the issue with the District's Superintendent or his designee. Drivers are required to report behavior

problems in a timely, accurate and appropriate manner. The Contractor will keep a record of any and all accidents, commendations, complaints and concerns regarding each driver. These records shall be provided to the District on a monthly basis to the District's designated administrator. Accident records will be provided to the District no later than 24 hours after the event.

J. STUDENT DISCIPLINE

DRIVERS WILL REPORT DISCIPLINE ISSUES TO THEIR DISPATCHER, WHO WILL CONTACT DISTRICT 300 TRANSPORTATION DIRECTOR.

- The District Superintendent or his designee may from time to time issue instructions governing the behavior of students. The Contractor's drivers shall, to the best of their abilities, follow such instructions at all times. Such instructions shall include procedures for reporting misconduct.
- The Contractor will report each incident of student misconduct immediately by phone or in person to the Director of Transportation and follow up with a written report upon request.
- The Contractor will not permit smoking or consumption of alcoholic beverages, or consumption of other non-prescription drugs, by students in a taxi.
- The Contractor's drivers shall not, under any circumstances, administer physical punishment to any student on the bus. Restraint may be used by the drivers only when necessary to protect the safety of other students on in a taxi.
- Will not stop at any location for students other than the designated pickup or drop off.

K. ELIGIBLE STUDENTS; NUMBER OF DAYS OF TRANSPORTATION

1. No Unauthorized Persons: No unauthorized persons shall be allowed in any vehicle while it is engaged in transporting students; however, the District reserves the right to have an authorized District employee ride on any vehicle on any route, without prior notice to the Contractor. Rides by parents for personal reasons are expressly forbidden.

2. School Calendars: All transportation will be in accordance with the District calendar including provisions for holidays, institute days, early dismissal for in-service training, beginning time for the school day and ending time for the school day. The District shall, by July 1 of each year of the Contract, furnish the Contractor with a school calendar, including the Summer Program schedule and subsequent changes to the school calendar will be furnished to the Contractor in a timely fashion. The calendar for the 2022-2023 school year is included as part of these Bid Documents.

L. ROUTES AND SCHEDULES

1. The starting time for incoming routes shall be set to allow the taxi to arrive at the school not more than fifteen (10) minutes or less than five (5) minutes before the designated start time on the route form contained in these Bid Documents. Outgoing routes shall be scheduled in accordance with District 300 guidelines.

2. Seating capacity shall not exceed capacity as described by manufacturer of vehicle. Students are not allowed to ride in the front seat of any taxi.

M. DISTRICT'S RIGHTS IN CONTRACT AWARD

The District reserves the right to award the transportation Contract as it sees fit, selecting the Bidder(s) which it considers to be in the best interest of the District, or to reject any and all proposals. The District reserves the right to award any portion of the bid or portion thereof, including base bids and alternate bids as noted in the Scope of Services to one or more Bidders.

N. ASSIGNMENT OF CONTRACT

The Contractor agrees not to assign this Contract, or any part of this Contract.

O. NON-COMPLIANCE PENALTIES

Should the District find the Contractor in noncompliance with the provisions of the Contract on a taxi route or series of routes, the District will be entitled to impose the following penalties, provided that the Superintendent, or his designee, has provided the Contractor two (2) days oral notice of the noncompliance and the Contractor has not cured the noncompliance within said two days. For purposes of this Section of these General Conditions, "noncompliance" means, but is not limited to, the failure to transport students on a taxi route or routes as contracted or as requested in strict accordance with the terms, conditions and provisions of this Contract, or the failure to make changes to routes as specified and directed by the Superintendent in accordance with the terms of this Contract, or the failure to comply with an explicit provision or requirement set forth in this Contract. Further, for purposes of this Section of these General Conditions, the Contractor shall be deemed to have cured any noncompliance if the action, event or occurrence that caused the noncompliance is not repeated in any of the ten (10) business days following oral notification of the noncompliance by the Superintendent or his designee.

The District will pay one (1) no load fee per day per taxi. If a student does not ride in the morning, the driver must report that to dispatch. District 300 will not pay for the afternoon no load.

The District shall notify the Contractor in writing whenever it has elected to assess a penalty, whether assessed pursuant to this Paragraph or another paragraph of these General Conditions, stating the amount of and the reason for the penalty. The noncompliance penalties for late pick-up and drop-off shall not apply during weather involving hazardous driving conditions or delays due to a vehicle accident (non-bus). **A penalty, whether assessed pursuant to this Paragraph or another paragraph of these General Conditions, shall be deducted, at the District's sole discretion, from the first or second invoice following the noncompliance. The failure of the District to assess or collect any penalty under these General Conditions shall not be considered a waiver of the District's right to assess or collect that penalty in the future or a waiver with respect to any future violation committed by the Contractor.**

P. SERVICE INTERRUPTION

1. In the event that service is interrupted for more than twenty-four (24) hours by reason of work stoppage or any other event which prevents the Contractor from furnishing service, the District shall have the right to secure and substitute other transportation services. If the cost of the substitute transportation services are higher than the Contractor's cost (agreed upon in the Contract), then the Contractor

shall pay the difference between its charges and the charges of the substitute taxi company.

2. In the event of severe weather conditions, or conditions beyond the Contractor's reasonable control, the Contractor shall notify the Superintendent, or his/her designee and request permission to interrupt service. Such decisions by the Superintendent shall be final.

3. If schools serviced by the taxis are closed on any day or days because of weather conditions or other emergency, notice will be given by the District of cancellation of service to the Contractor by telephone or otherwise, before 5:45 a.m. for such day(s).

Q. TERMINATION OF CONTRACT BY REASON OF DEFAULT

1. If the Contractor or its drivers or employees at any time fail to comply with the terms of this Contract, or do not fully perform and strictly adhere to any of the terms hereof required to be performed, the District may, at its discretion, terminate this Contract, as provided herein.

2. In the event that the District determines that the Contractor has failed to comply fully, perform, or strictly adhere to this Contract, then the District may, at its discretion, through its Superintendent, send written notice to the Contractor indicating the intention of the District to declare the Contractor in default. In such notice, the District shall state in what respect the Contractor has failed to comply with the terms of the Contract, and shall further state a date upon which the Contract will terminate, unless the Contractor, prior to such date, cures the defect to the satisfaction of the District. The Contractor shall provide the District a written correction plan to provide a cure for the non-compliance concerns within 48 hours of the receipt of the District's notification. If prior to the date of termination stated in said notice, the District notifies the Contractor that the defect has been cured, the Contract will not terminate on the date stated in the notice but will be deemed to have remained in effect as of the date such notice was given. In the event the District does not so notify the Contractor that the defect has been cured, this Contract shall be terminated without further action by the District on the date of termination stated in notice.

3. The date of termination stated in the notice of intent to declare the Contractor in default, as provided in "2" above, may not be sooner than thirty (30) calendar days following the date of such notice unless there is a failure by the Contractor to provide the services required by this Contract which affect twenty-five per cent (25%) or more of the routes assigned to the Contractor, in which event the date of termination may be five (5) calendar days following the date of such notice.

4. The right of the District to terminate the Contract as provided in this Section is cumulative with all other rights of the District contained herein.

R. MISCELLANEOUS

Any notice or communication permitted or required under the Contract shall be in writing and shall become effective on the day of mailing thereof by email.

S. TAXI TRANSPORTATION SERVICES

The Contractor shall conduct all of its activities subject to all current and future federal and state laws and ordinances, and the decisions, rules, guidelines, policies and procedures of the District (hereinafter, collectively, "District Policies") and pursuant thereto, the Contractor shall carry out the following functions and responsibilities of this Contract to include the following:

- The Contractor shall provide the District with on-time delivery. There is an expectation that taxis should arrive no more than fifteen (15) minutes and no less than five (5) minutes before the start of school. If the Contractor fails to meet this requirement a penalty of 20% of the cost of that route for that day will be assessed against the Contractor's billing for the month.
- The Contractor shall have an expected wait time at pick-up of no less than five (5) minutes. Repeated wait times in excess of 5 minutes should be reported to the District 300 Director of Transportation at 847-551-8492 or email deborah.mason@d300.org
- Contractor is not allowed to combine routes without permission from the Director of Transportation.
- The Contractor must have staff available between the hours of 5:30 a.m. until the last scheduled student has been delivered at the end of the day.
- The Contractor shall provide emergency response contacts that are available beyond the required hours of staffing to provide adequate support for after-hours trips and extracurricular runs and in the event of emergencies.
- Recommend to the District short-term and long-term plans, processes and procedures that will improve student transportation services and upon the District's approval and adoption of such policies and procedures, implement same.
- Recruit and maintain driver pool to accommodate District 300 needs.
- Evaluate the performance of each taxi driver annually.
- Accommodate District 300 request for service changes within 24 hours of the request.
- Provide a complaint tracking system.
- All communications are routed through District 300 Director of Transportation or designee.
- As requested, assist the Director of Transportation and other District 300 departments with transportation issues.
- The Contractor shall provide the District with the following reports and submittals:
 - Billing by the 10th of the month for the previous month of service in an electronic format (Excel preferred), to include date of service, student name, pick-up/drop-off address and mileage of route
 - Assist with other required data requests as needed

- The Contractor's General Manager will meet as requested with the Director of Transportation to report on achievements, areas of concern, and information of interest. The Contractor shall make reports, studies, and surveys regarding student transportation as are reasonably necessary to or requested by the District.
- The Contractor will report all accidents/incidents regardless of severity or insignificance immediately to the Director of Transportation including the name of the driver and student(s), location of accident, and accident report.
- Taxi drivers will meet with District 300 prior to start of school to discuss District expectations at no cost to the District.

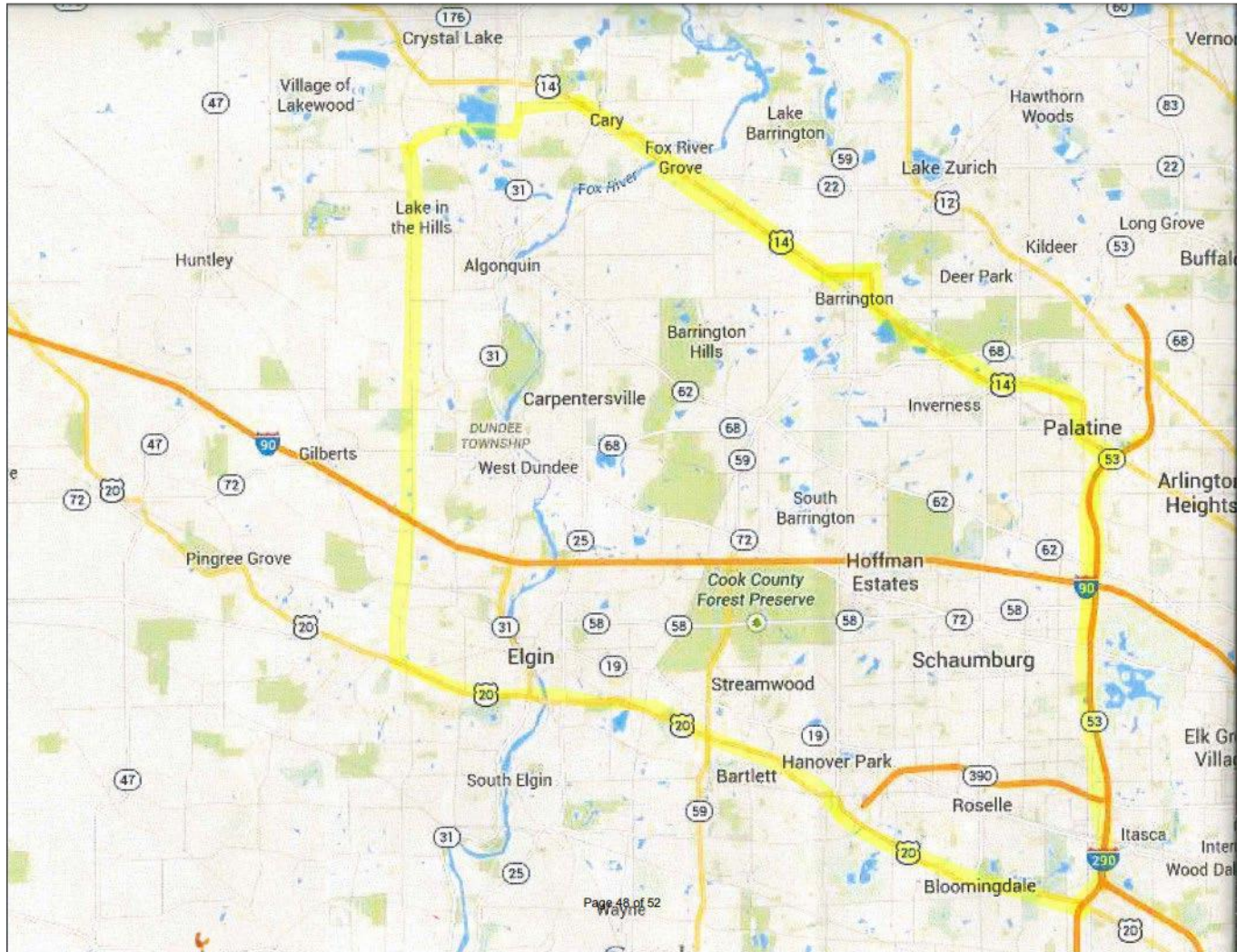

Background

SUBJECT: Dundee Middle School Mechanical Systems Project

Background

The District's Master Facility Plan includes an update to the mechanical systems at Dundee Middle School. Several options were presented and vetted through the joint committee, and the Hybrid Geothermal model was selected. This project will be completed in phases over several years.

Dewberry Architects has provided the statement of work to develop the specifications for the Dundee Middle School Mechanical Replacement Project. Dewberry's fees are based upon the Master Service Agreement with Indefinite Duration and Indefinite Project Task Order dated August 28, 2018. Per this agreement, the architectural and engineering fees are based upon the estimated statement of work, which includes the aggregate price of construction contracts, additive alternates, any design allowances, and the construction manager's general conditions provided by Lamp. Per the Master Agreement, the fees will be adjusted once bids have been received.

The estimated construction cost provided by Lamp Inc. is \$13,190,788. Using this amount with the interpolated fee percentage of 6.98% equals a basic service fee amount of \$920,700. Dewberry has obtained fixed sum proposals for this work as follows:

Background

District 300 previously contracted with INVO Healthcare Associates (IHC) to staff the D.R.E.A.M. program in order to provide the requisite level of educationally based therapy, behavioral intervention services and comprehensive wrap-around support services for students and their families who are dealing with adverse childhood experiences. The contract with INVO expires June 2022 and will not be renewed.

Recommendation

To ensure continued levels of services and support, we recommend that District 300 hire to replace those positions. To allow for consistency for this vulnerable population, we recommend obtaining some of the individuals that have already been working successfully with these students and their families.

However, the contract language states that District 300 is prohibited from hiring any individual that IHC introduces to District 300 for a period of twelve (12) months following termination or expiration of the contract (the "Non-Solicitation"). Therefore, we have requested a one-time waiver of the Non-Solicitation and Buy Out. IHC desires to permit a one-time waiver of the Non-Solicitation and Buy Out Agreement solely for the purpose of permitting District 300 to hire those individuals.

The administration recommends that District 300 enter into the Buyout Agreement and pay a one-time fee that will be paid from the Education Service budget.

BUY OUT AGREEMENT

This **BUY OUT AGREEMENT** (this "**Agreement**") is entered into as of the effective date set forth in Section 10 below (the "**Effective Date**"), by and between **Community Unit School District 300**, 2550 Harnish Drive, Algonquin, IL 60102 (the "**AGENCY**") and **INVO HEALTHCARE ASSOCIATES**, 2003 S. Easton Road, Suite 308, Doylestown, PA 18901 ("**IHC**"). Each of **AGENCY** and **IHC** are referred to herein as a "**Party**" and collectively as the "**Parties**."

RECITALS:

WHEREAS, the Parties entered into that certain Agency Agreement effective as of Date (the "**Agency Agreement**") pursuant to which **IHC** provides Service Providers to service children under **AGENCY**'s direction;

WHEREAS, in accordance with Section 11 of the Agency Agreement, **AGENCY** is prohibited from hiring any individual that **IHC** introduces to or arranges for an interview with **AGENCY** (each, a "**Service Provider**") for a period of twelve (12) months following termination or expiration of the Agency Agreement (the "**Non-Solicitation**"); and

WHEREAS, **AGENCY** has requested a one-time waiver of the Non-Solicitation and Buy Out and **IHC** desires to permit a one-time waiver of the Non-Solicitation and Buy Out solely for the purpose of permitting **AGENCY** to hire the following therapists (the "**Service Provider**") subject to the terms and conditions of this Agreement list:

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and the mutual promises contained herein, and for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the Parties hereto agree as follows:

1. Waiver of Non-Solicitation and Buy Out. **IHC** hereby waives its right to assert a claim against **AGENCY** for violation of the Non-Solicitation and Buy Out provision of the Agency Agreement for the sole purpose of allowing **AGENCY** to hire Service Provider ("**Waiver**"), whom the Parties agree that **IHC** introduced to the **AGENCY**. **AGENCY** understands and agrees that this Waiver only permits **AGENCY** to hire Service Provider and the Non-Solicitation and Buy Out shall remain in full force and effect for all other current and future Service Providers.

2. Buy Out Provisions. As consideration for the Waiver set forth above, **AGENCY** hereby agrees to pay **IHC** the amount of sixty-nine thousand dollars (\$69,000.00) which shall be paid to **IHC** for consulting services rendered. **IHC** will invoice sixty-nine thousand (\$69,000.00) dollars (the "**Payment**") to **Agency** and payment will be due in 30 days following receipt of the invoice and each Service Provider's first day of work as an **AGENCY** employee. **AGENCY** shall have no obligation to make any portion of the **Payment** attributable to a Service Provider listed above that is not employed by **Agency** prior to July 1, 2023. Additionally, **Agency** will provide an opportunity for **IHC** to replace Service Provider with another Service Provider under the same terms and conditions of the existing Agency Agreement.

3. Counterparts. This Agreement may be executed in several counterparts, each of which shall be deemed to be an original and all of which together shall constitute one and the same instrument.

4. Authority. Each Party represents and warrants that it has the necessary power and authority to enter into and perform its obligations under this Agreement and upon execution, this Agreement will be a legal, valid and binding obligation of such Party, enforceable against such party in accordance with its terms.

5. Severability. Any provision of this Agreement that is prohibited or unenforceable in any jurisdiction shall, as to such jurisdiction, be ineffective to the extent of such prohibition or unenforceability without invalidating the remaining provisions of this Agreement, and any such prohibition or unenforceability in any jurisdiction shall not invalidate or render unenforceable such provision in any other jurisdiction.

6. Recitals. The recitals set forth above are incorporated into and made part of this Agreement.

7. Miscellaneous. Each Party acknowledges that this Agreement constitute the entire agreement of the Parties with respect to the subject matter of this Agreement. This Agreement may not be amended, waived, or terminated without the prior written consent of both Parties. This Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the Parties hereto and their respective heirs, successors and permitted assigns. If the Service Provider does not decide to work for the AGENCY, this agreement will cease to be enforceable regarding that individual Service Provider.

8. Governing Law. This Agreement shall be governed by, construed, and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of Illinois without regard to conflict of law principles. Jurisdiction and venue for all disputes shall be the Circuit Court located in Kane County, Illinois, or the federal district court for the Northern District of Illinois.

9. Effective Date. This Agreement shall be deemed dated and become effective on the date the last of the parties' signs as set forth below the signature of their duly authorized representatives.

MASTER SERVICES AGREEMENT
TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1. Software and Services

1.1. Software. Subject to the terms and conditions set forth in this Agreement (including any Order Forms, Order Form Terms and Conditions and/or Statement of Work), Frontline hereby grants Customer a non-exclusive, non-transferable license to use the software identified on any Order Form (the "Software") and the technical manuals, instructions, user information, training materials, and other documentation that accompany the Software and contain its technical specifications, as may be amended from time to time ("Documentation") solely for internal use by its then-current employees, contractors, agents, representatives and other end users authorized to use the Software on Customer's behalf (collectively, "Authorized Users" or "End Users") in the ordinary course of Customer's business. Frontline shall provide any professional or other services set forth in an Order Form (the "Services"). All rights, title and interest to the Software and any work product, deliverables or other materials provided by Frontline ("Work Product") are expressly reserved and retained by Frontline or its licensors, including any program or other application that is designed to integrate and be used with the Software, whether or not developed independently by Frontline, and all improvements, modifications and intellectual property rights therein. Customer shall not, and Customer shall require any Authorized Users to not (a) transfer, assign, export, or sublicense the Software or Work Product except as specifically set forth herein, or its license rights thereto, to any other person, organization or entity, including through rental, timesharing, service bureau, subscription, hosting, or outsourcing the Software (whether or not such sublicense, hosting or outsourcing is by Customer or for Customer); (b) attempt to create any derivative version thereof; (c) remove or modify any marking or notice on or displayed through the Software, Work Product or Documentation, including those related to Frontline's or its licensors' proprietary rights in and to the Software, Work Product or Documentation, as applicable; or (d) de-compile, decrypt, reverse engineer, disassemble, or otherwise reduce same to human-readable form. Without limiting the foregoing, Customer may not sublicense, outsource or otherwise grant access to the Software to any third party vendor without Frontline's prior written consent, including any third party host of the Software for Customer. Frontline shall have the right (but not the obligation) to monitor Customer's and its Authorized Users' use of the Software to confirm Customer's and its Authorized Users' compliance with the terms of this Agreement.

1.2. Authorized Users. The total number of Authorized Users will be limited to the numerical or category limitations set forth in an Order Form, if any. Customer acknowledges and agrees that, depending on the specific Software provided by Frontline to Customer and/or the category of Authorized User, Authorized Users may have different access and usage rights to the Software. Customer shall ensure that Authorized Users comply with the terms and conditions of this Agreement with respect to access and use of the Software and any acts or omissions of such Authorized Users with respect to the same will be deemed acts or omissions of Customer for which Customer will be responsible on a joint and several basis. Customer is solely responsible for approving and provisioning any and all usernames and passwords assigned to or adopted by Customer's Authorized Users in connection with use of the Software. Customer is responsible for all activities that occur as a result of the use of such usernames and passwords. Customer will notify Frontline promptly of any unauthorized use of such usernames and passwords or any other breach of security known to Customer.

1.3. Order Forms. Customer may place orders for the Software and Services by entering into a mutually agreed Order Form, which shall become a part of this Agreement and be attached hereto as Exhibit A. No other document shall be required to affect a legally binding purchase under this Agreement. Any preprinted or other terms contained on Customer's purchase order or otherwise shall be inapplicable to this Agreement. Unless an Order Form states otherwise, each Order Form is independent of each other Order Form (but each Order Form is a part of and integral to this Agreement).

1.4. Software Administrator; Maintenance Windows. At all times, Customer must have an employee who has obtained the Software administrator certification training from Frontline and who is certified by Frontline as a Software administrator ("Software Administrator"). If Software Administrator ceases to serve as such, Customer shall promptly provide written notice to Frontline and have another employee obtain Frontline Software administrator certification and be designated as a Software Administrator, at Customer's expense. Frontline shall provide Customer with assistance regarding the use of the Software during Frontline's normal business hours (EST), Monday through Friday. Such assistance shall be provided only to Customer's Software Administrator. Frontline may perform system maintenance and/or software updates periodically upon advanced notice to Customer. However, due to extenuating circumstances, Frontline may, at times, need to perform maintenance without the ability to provide advance notice.

1.5. Customer Content. The Software and Services may enable Customer and its Authorized Users to provide, upload, link

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to, transmit, display, store, process and otherwise use text, files, images, graphics, illustrations, information, data (including Personal Data as that term is defined in applicable laws), audio, video, photographs and other content and material in any format (collectively, the "Customer Content") in connection with the Software and Services. Customer hereby grants to Frontline a non-exclusive, royalty-free license to reproduce, display, distribute, modify, prepare derivative works of and otherwise use the Customer Content for the purpose of providing the Software and otherwise performing its obligations and exercising its rights under this Agreement. Customer shall have the sole responsibility for the accuracy, quality, integrity, legality, reliability, appropriateness and ownership of all of the Customer Content. Frontline will act as a data processor, and will act on Customer's instruction concerning the treatment of Personal Data provided in connection with the Software and Services, as specified in the Order Form. Customer shall provide any notices and obtain any consents (including consent of any parent or guardian for any minor) related to Customer's use of the Software and receipt of the Services and Frontline's provision of the Software and Services, including those related to the collection, use, processing, transfer and disclosure of Personal Data. Customer acknowledges and agrees that it must properly enter data, information and other Customer Content and configure settings within the Software in order for the Software to operate properly. Customer shall verify the accuracy of any of the Customer Content, forms, workflow and configuration settings entered on the Software. Frontline shall not have any liability arising from the inaccuracy of scoring, completeness, use of or reliance on the information contained in the extract of data from any Software or Services under this Agreement. Customer assumes the sole responsibility for the selection of the Software and Services to achieve Customer's intended results, the use of the Software and Services, and the results attained from such selection and use. Customer represents and warrants that it is the owner of the Customer Content, or has obtained permission for such use from the owner of the Customer Content, including evaluation frameworks and/or rubrics uploaded into the Software. As to any content or data made available to Frontline, Customer represents that it has notified and obtained consent from all necessary persons (including parents, students, teachers, interns, aides, principals, other administrative personnel, and classroom visitors), and has taken all other actions that may be necessary to ensure that use of the products, services, or related materials provided or produced hereunder complies with all applicable laws and regulations as well as school or district policies.

1.6. Integration. Customer may, at Customer's direction and with or without Frontline's assistance, integrate or otherwise use the Software in connection with third party courseware, training, and other information and materials of third parties ("Third Party Materials") and Frontline may make certain Third Party Materials available in connection with the Software and Services. Customer acknowledges and agrees that (a) Frontline is authorized to provide the Customer Content to a specified third party or permit such third party to have access to the Customer Content in connection with Third Party Materials; and (b) Frontline does not control and is not responsible for, does not warrant, support, or make any representations regarding (i) Third Party Materials; (ii) the Customer Content provided in connection with such Third Party Materials, including a third party's storage, use or misuse of the Customer Content; or (iii) Customer's uninterrupted access to Third Party Materials. Customer understands that the use of the Software may involve the transmission of the Customer Content over the Internet and over various networks, only part of which may be owned or operated by Frontline, and that Frontline takes no responsibility for data that is lost, altered, intercepted, or stored without Customer's authorization during the transmission of any data whatsoever across networks whether or not owned or operated by Frontline. If Customer engages Frontline to assist in Customer's integration or use of the Software with Third Party Materials, you authorize Frontline to access and use such Third Party Materials in connection with such assistance and you represent and warrant that you have the rights necessary to grant such authorization. Customer agrees to be bound by the terms, conditions and restrictions of the applicable third party license agreement with respect to such Third Party Materials.

1.7. Hosting. The Software will be hosted by an authorized subcontractor (the "Hosting Service Provider") that has been engaged by Frontline and shall only be accessed by Customer on websites, using Customer's computers. As part of the Services, the Hosting Service Provider shall be responsible for maintaining a backup of the Customer Content. The Hosting Service Provider is an independent third party not controlled by the Frontline. Accordingly, IN NO EVENT WILL FRONTLINE BE LIABLE FOR ANY DIRECT, GENERAL, SPECIAL, INCIDENTAL, INDIRECT OR CONSEQUENTIAL DAMAGES WHATSOEVER (INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO LOSS OR DAMAGE TO DATA, DAMAGES FOR LOSS OF BUSINESS PROFITS, BUSINESS INTERRUPTION, LOSS OF INFORMATION OR ANY OTHER PECUNIARY LOSS) ARISING OUT OF THE USE OF OR INABILITY TO USE THE SOFTWARE, DUE TO PROBLEMS (INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO ERRORS, MALFUNCTIONS) ASSOCIATED WITH THE FUNCTIONS OF SERVERS MAINTAINED BY THE HOSTING SERVICE PROVIDER, EVEN IF FRONTLINE HAS BEEN ADVISED OF THE POSSIBILITY OF SUCH DAMAGES.

1.8. Customer Responsibilities. Customer understands and agrees that (a) Customer shall have sole responsibility for

All fees and charges will be set forth in the applicable Order Form(s). The Startup Cost set forth on the first page of an Order Form will be invoiced to Customer by Frontline upon execution of the applicable Order Form. Startup Costs are priced with the assumption that implementation will be completed within 120 days after signing. Frontline reserves the right to charge Customers additional service fees for added project costs due to Customer-caused delays occurring after the 120 day implementation period. The Annual Subscription will be invoiced to Customer by Frontline based on the Subscription Start Date (as set forth in the Order Form) unless otherwise stated on the front of an Order Form. The Subscription Start Date shall be defined as thirty (30) days after Customer's signature of an applicable Order Form. Except as otherwise provided, Frontline shall invoice Customer in US Dollars and Customer shall pay all fees, charges, and expenses within thirty (30) days of the date of an invoice via check or ACH. Without prejudice to its other rights and remedies, if Frontline does not receive any payment by its due date, Frontline may assess a late payment charge on the unpaid amount at the rate of 1.5% per month or, if less, the highest rate allowed under applicable law. Frontline reserves the right to increase any of the fees once annually during any Renewal Term by providing at least thirty (30) days advance notice to Customer. All charges under this Agreement are exclusive of, and Customer is solely responsible for, any applicable taxes, duties, fees, and other assessments of whatever nature imposed by governmental authorities. Without limiting the foregoing, Customer shall promptly pay to Frontline any amounts actually paid or required to be collected or paid by Frontline pursuant to any statute, ordinance, rule or regulation of any legally constituted taxing authority. If the Customer claims tax-exempt status or the right to remit taxes directly, the tax-exempt number must be entered on the first page of any applicable Order Form and the Customer shall indemnify and hold Frontline harmless for any loss occasioned by its failure to pay any tax when due. If for any reason Frontline's personnel travel to Customer's facility or otherwise in connection with the Software or Services under this Agreement, Customer shall be responsible for the reasonable costs of transportation, lodging, meals and the like for Frontline's personnel.

3. Warranties and Disclosures

3.1. Mutual. Customer represents and warrants on behalf of itself and any of its Authorized Users that it has the full legal right to provide the Customer Content and that the Customer Content will not (a) infringe any intellectual property rights of any person or entity or any rights of publicity, personality, or privacy of any person or entity, including as a result of failure to obtain consent to provide Personal Data or otherwise private information about a person; (b) violate any law, statute, ordinance, regulation, or agreement, including school or district policies; or (c) constitute disclosure of any confidential information owned by any third party.

3.2. Software Warranties. The foregoing warranty will not apply (i) if Customer is in default or breach of any of its obligations under this Agreement, or (ii) to any non-conformance of the Software, Work Product or Services due to (A) Customer's failure to permit the installation/implementation of any update, upgrade or release provided by Frontline, (B) Customer's negligence, abuse, misapplication or misuse of the Software (including Customer's failure to operate the Software in accordance with Documentation), or (C) Customer's use or operation of the Software in or with any technology (including any software, hardware, firmware, system or network) not approved in writing by Frontline. In the event of a non-conformance of the Software, Work Product or Services reported to and verified by Frontline, Frontline will make commercially reasonable efforts to correct such non-conformance. Customer's sole remedy is limited to the replacement, repair, or refund, at Frontline's option, of defective Software or Work Product or re-performance of the Services. Notwithstanding the foregoing, any Third-

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Party Materials shall be subject only to such third-party terms and any warranties therein.

3.3. Disclaimers. EXCEPT AS EXPRESSLY PROVIDED HEREIN, FRONTLINE AND ITS LICENSORS EXPRESSLY DISCLAIM ALL WARRANTIES, WHETHER EXPRESS, IMPLIED, OR STATUTORY, AS TO ANY ASPECT OF THE SOFTWARE, WORK PRODUCT, SERVICES, OR OTHER PRODUCTS INCLUDING WARRANTIES OF MERCHANTABILITY AND FITNESS FOR A PARTICULAR PURPOSE. FRONTLINE AND ITS LICENSORS DO NOT WARRANT THAT THE SOFTWARE, WORK PRODUCT, SERVICES, OR OTHER PRODUCTS WILL BE UNINTERRUPTED, OR ERROR-FREE; NOR DO THEY MAKE ANY WARRANTY AS TO THE RESULTS THAT MAY BE OBTAINED FROM USE OF THE SOFTWARE, WORK PRODUCT, SERVICES, OR OTHER PRODUCTS.

4. Confidential Information Privacy

4.1. Confidential Information. During the term of this Agreement and for two (2) years thereafter, each Party will use the same degree of care to protect the other Party's Confidential Information as it uses to protect its own confidential information of like nature, but in no circumstances less than reasonable care. "Confidential Information" means any information that is marked or otherwise indicated as confidential or proprietary, in the case of written materials, or, in the case of information that is disclosed orally or written materials that are not marked, by notifying the other Party of the proprietary and confidential nature of the information, such notification to be done orally, by email or written correspondence, or via other means of communication as might be appropriate. Notwithstanding the foregoing, (a) Confidential Information of Frontline shall include the Software and the terms of this Agreement and (b) Confidential Information of Customer shall include Personal Data regarding Customer's users provided in connection with the Software and Services. Confidential Information does not include information which (a) was known to the receiving Party or in the public domain before disclosure; (b) becomes part of the public domain after disclosure by a publication or other means except by a breach of this Agreement by the receiving Party; (c) was received from a third party under no duty or obligation of confidentiality to the disclosing Party; or (d) was independently developed by the receiving Party without reference to Confidential Information. Aggregated data that does not contain personally identifiable information regarding Customer's users provided in connection with the Software and Services will be Confidential Information and property of Frontline. The receiving Party will not be liable for disclosures of Confidential Information that are required to be disclosed by law or legal process, so long as the recipient notifies the disclosing Party, provides it with an opportunity to object and uses reasonable efforts (at the expense of the disclosing Party) to cooperate with the disclosing Party in limiting disclosure.

4.2. Privacy. Part 99) ("FERPA") by the Customer to Frontline. Frontline agrees that it will not use or re-disclose Student PII except in compliance with and all applicable state and federal laws, including FERPA. Customer acknowledges that Frontline is a "school official" with a legitimate educational interest in receiving Student PII under FERPA and Frontline agrees that it will comply with the requirements of 34 C.F.R. § 99.33 regarding its use and re-disclosure of Student PII.

4.3. Data Security. Frontline will utilize commercially reasonable administrative, technical, and physical measures designed to maintain the confidentiality and security of Confidential Information and Student PII submitted by Customer. Customer understands and agrees that no security measures can be 100% effective or error-free and understands that Frontline expressly disclaims (a) any warranty that these security measures will be 100% effective or error-free or (b) any liability related to the confidentiality and security measures utilized by third parties.

5. Indemnification.

Customer shall indemnify Frontline and its officers, directors, employees, and agents and hold them harmless from all third-party claims, liabilities, expenses, and losses (including attorneys' fees and expenses) arising from or related to any breach by Customer of this Agreement, including failure to obtain consent to provide Personal Data or otherwise private information about a person.

6. Limitations of Liability.

OTHER THAN THE FEES, CHARGES AND EXPENSES PAYABLE PURSUANT HERETO, IN NO EVENT SHALL EITHER PARTY (OR IN THE CASE OF FRONTLINE, ITS LICENSORS) BE LIABLE TO THE OTHER PARTY OR ANY THIRD PARTY FOR INDIRECT, INCIDENTAL, SPECIAL, CONSEQUENTIAL, OR PUNITIVE DAMAGES, WHETHER FORESEEABLE OR UNFORESEEABLE, OF ANY KIND WHATSOEVER (INCLUDING LOST PROFITS) ARISING FROM OR RELATING TO THIS AGREEMENT OR THE USE OR NON-USE OF THE SOFTWARE, WORK PRODUCT OR SERVICES. NOTWITHSTANDING ANYTHING CONTAINED IN THIS AGREEMENT TO THE CONTRARY, IN NO EVENT SHALL FRONTLINE'S (OR ITS LICENSORS') TOTAL LIABILITY ARISING FROM OR RELATING TO THIS AGREEMENT, WHETHER BASED ON WARRANTY, CONTRACT, TORT (INCLUDING NEGLIGENCE), PRODUCT LIABILITY OR OTHERWISE, EXCEED THE TOTAL AMOUNTS PAID TO FRONTLINE HEREUNDER DURING THE TWELVE MONTHS IMMEDIATELY

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PRECEDING THE EVENTS GIVING RISE TO SUCH CLAIMS. Each Party acknowledges and agrees that the warranty disclaimers and liability and remedy limitations in this Agreement are material, bargained for provisions of this Agreement and that fees and consideration payable hereunder reflects these disclaimers and limitations.

7. Term and Termination.

The term of this Agreement will commence on the Effective Date and continue until such time that there are no valid Order Forms. The initial term of each Order Form under this Agreement shall (a) begin on the Subscription Start Date (as defined in Section 2 above) and (b) continue for one year or such longer period as provided in an Order Form (the "Order Form Initial Term") and will renew for successive one-year terms thereafter (each, a "Renewal Term") unless one Party notifies the other Party of non-renewal in writing at least sixty (60) days prior to the end of the current term of such Order Form. Customer may not terminate any Order Form at any time in the middle of a term. Either Party may terminate this Agreement in the event that the other Party materially breaches this Agreement the other Party does not cure such breach within thirty (30) days after written notice of such Expiration or termination of any Order Form or Statement of Work shall constitute the expiration or the termination of such Order Form or Statement of Work only and shall not affect this Agreement or any other Order Form or Statements of Work outstanding under this Agreement. Notwithstanding the foregoing, unless otherwise mutually agreed by the parties in writing, any Order Form or Statement of Work outstanding as of the date of termination or expiration of this Agreement shall remain in effect and continue to be governed by the terms of this Agreement and its own terms until such time as such Order Form or Statement of Work is completed, expires or is otherwise terminated. Upon the termination or expiration of this Agreement, the licenses granted to Customer under Section 1.1 will terminate automatically and Customer (i) shall immediately cease using the Software and Documentation and (ii) for a period of thirty (30) days, may request a copy of the Customer Content that is in Frontline's possession in the format retained by Frontline. The following provisions of this Agreement will survive expiration or termination of this Agreement Sections 3.3, 4, 5, 6, 7 and 9. Frontline may (without limitation of any other rights or remedies) suspend use of the Software in the event that (A) Customer is delinquent in payment of any amount due to Frontline under this Agreement (and has not cured such delinquency within five (5) days following written notice thereof to Customer), (B) Customer has breached any of the provisions of Section 1 of this Agreement, or (C) in Frontline's reasonable good faith determination, suspension of use of the Software is necessary to avoid or mitigate harm to the security of Frontline's or its customers' systems or data. Any such suspension will not constitute a termination of this Agreement.

8. District Ordering.

Any other school district in the same state as Customer ("School District") may also purchase from Frontline a license to the Software and provision of the Services for the School District's own account on the same terms and conditions as are applicable to Customer under these Terms and Conditions (excluding any pricing terms and conditions). Each School District will be separately liable for payment for such Software and Services and its compliance with these Terms and Conditions, and neither Customer nor any School District will be liable for the acts, omissions or obligations of any other School District under these Terms and Conditions. Frontline will have no obligations to provide any Software or Services to a School District until such time as Frontline and such School District enter into an Order Form which references and is subject to these Terms and Conditions. By so doing, the School District agrees to be bound by these Terms and Conditions and for purposes of its order is considered "Customer" as that term is used in these Terms and Conditions. In the event that Customer and Frontline amend these Terms and Conditions (each an "Amendment"), any and all such Amendments will be enforceable against each School District that has executed an Order Form which references and is subject to these Terms and Conditions upon notice of such Amendment from Frontline unless Frontline has agreed in writing with School District that the Amendment, or specific provisions within the Amendment, do not apply to such School District.

9. General.

Frontline and Customer are each independent contractor and neither Party shall be, nor represent itself to be, the franchiser, partner, broker, employee, servant, agent, or legal representative of the other Party for any purpose whatsoever. Customer may not sublicense, assign, or transfer this Agreement, or any rights and obligations under this Agreement, in whole or in part, without Frontline's prior written consent. Any attempted assignment in violation of this Section shall be void. This Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of, the permitted successors and assigns of each Party. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in this Agreement, except for Customer's obligations to pay amounts due under this Agreement, neither Party will be deemed to be in default of any provision of this Agreement for any delay, error, failure, or interruption of performance due to any act of God, terrorism, war, strike, or other labor or civil disturbance, interruption of power service, interruption of communications services, problems with the Internet, act of any other person not under the control of such Party, or other similar cause. If the Customer requests to be added as an additional insured on any Frontline

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insurance policy, the limits of such policies shall be subject to the Limitations of Liability stated in Section 6 herein. This Agreement may be amended only by written agreement of the Parties, and any attempted amendment, including any handwritten changes on this Agreement, in violation of this Section shall be void. The waiver or failure of either Party to exercise in any respect any right provided under this Agreement shall not be deemed a waiver of such right in the future or a waiver of any other rights established under this Agreement. This Agreement does not confer any rights or remedies upon any person other than the Parties, except Frontline's licensors. When used herein, the words "includes" and "including" and their syntactical variations shall be deemed followed by the words "without limitation." This Agreement may be executed in counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, but all of which together shall be deemed to be the same agreement.

PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT

This Agreement is dated as of the Effective Date as set forth in Section 4.T below, and is by and between the Board of Education of Community Unit School District No. 300, Kane, McHenry, Cook, and DeKalb Counties, Illinois (the “School District”), and International Institute for Restorative Practices (the “Consultant”).

IN CONSIDERATION OF the recitals and the mutual covenants and agreements set forth in this Agreement, the parties agree as follows:

SECTION 1. CONSULTANT.

A. **Engagement of Consultant.** The School District desires to engage the Consultant to perform and to provide all necessary professional consulting services (the “Services”) as set forth in the Scope of Work (the “Scope”) attached as Exhibit A to this Agreement. The Consultant shall provide the Services pursuant to the terms and conditions of this Agreement. The term of this Agreement shall be from the Effective Date of May 3, 2022 through July 30, 2022 and may be renewed at any time with agreement of both parties.

B. **Representations of Consultant.** The Consultant represents that it is sufficiently experienced and competent to perform the Services in a manner consistent with the standards of professional practice by recognized consultants providing services of a similar nature.

C. **Agreement Amount.** As compensation for administering the program, the School District will pay the Consultant the amounts set forth in the Scope to be paid in accordance with the Illinois Local Government Prompt Payment Act, 50 ILCS 505/1 *et seq.* The proposed expenses are set forth in Exhibit A to this Agreement. Any expenses that exceed \$500 shall be first approved in writing by the School District’s Superintendent.

D. **Claim in Addition to Agreement Amount.** If the Consultant desires to make a claim for additional compensation because of action taken by the School District, the Consultant shall provide written notice to the School District of such claim within 15 days after occurrence of such action as provided by Section 4.G, Notice, of this Agreement, and no claim for additional compensation shall be valid unless made in accordance with this Section. Any changes in the Agreement amount shall be valid only upon written amendment pursuant to Section 4.E, Amendment, of this Agreement. Regardless of the decision of the School District relative to a claim submitted by the Consultant, the Consultant shall proceed with all the work required to complete the Services under this Agreement as determined by the School District without interruption.

E. **Taxes, Benefits, and Royalties.** Each payment by the School District to the Consultant includes all applicable federal, state, and municipal taxes of every kind and nature applicable to the Services as well as all taxes, contributions, and premiums for unemployment insurance, old age or retirement benefits, pensions, annuities, or similar benefits and all costs,

royalties, and fees arising from the use of patented or copyrighted equipment, materials, supplies, tools, appliances, devices, processes, or inventions. All claim or right to claim additional compensation because of the payment of any such tax, contribution, premium, costs, royalties, or fees is hereby waived and released by the Consultant.

F. **Time of Performance.** The Consultant shall diligently and continuously prosecute the Services until the completion of the Services or upon the termination of this Agreement by the School District, as provided in Section 4.D.

G. **Reporting.** The Consultant shall regularly report to the School District's Superintendent, or the Superintendent's designee, regarding the progress of the Services during the term of this Agreement.

H. **Criminal Background Check.** The Consultant shall not send to any school building or school property any employee or agent who would be prohibited from being employed by the School District due to a conviction of a crime listed in 105 ILCS 5/10-21.9 or who is listed in the Illinois Sex Offender Registry or the Illinois Murderer and Violent Offender Against Youth Registry. The Consultant shall make every employee who will be sent to any school building or school property available to the School District for submitting to a fingerprint-based criminal history records check pursuant to 105 ILCS 5/10-21.9. The check shall occur before any employee or agent is sent to any school building or school property. The Consultant will reimburse the School District for the costs of the checks. The School District must provide a copy of the report to the individual employee, but is not authorized to release it to the Consultant.

I. **Replacement of Providers.** Upon the request of the School District, the Consultant shall replace any individual provider providing services to the School District with another qualified provider acceptable to the School District.

J. **Damage to Property.** In the event the School District's property is damaged by the Consultant, the Consultant shall, at the Consultant's sole cost, restore the property or any surrounding area. The restoration shall be to a condition at least equivalent to the condition of the affected area immediately before the destruction or damage. If the Consultant does not repair the damage within 14 days after receiving written notice from the School District, or a lesser time if the School District determines the damage creates an emergency, the School District may repair the damage and the Consultant shall reimburse the School District for the costs the School District incurs within 14 days after the School District provides a written invoice to the Consultant.

K. **School Closure.** If the School District's schools are or will be closed for ten consecutive student attendance days or more due to a cause beyond the School District's reasonable control, including acts of war, acts of God, acts of terrorism, earthquake, flood, embargo, riot, sabotage, labor shortage or dispute, pandemic, governmental act, or failure of the Internet, the School District may terminate the Agreement after providing five days written notice to the Consultant or the parties may amend the Agreement to account for appropriate payment related to the Services actually provided by the Consultant during the school closure.

SECTION 2. CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION-TRADEMARKS.

A. **Confidential Information.** The term “*Confidential Information*” shall mean information in the possession or under the control of the School District relating to the educational, employee, student record, technical, business, or corporate affairs of the School District; School District students, School District property; user information, including, without limitation, any information pertaining to usage of the School District's computer system, including and without limitation, any information obtained from server logs or other records of electronic or machine readable form; and the existence of, and terms and conditions of, this Agreement.

B. **No Disclosure of Confidential Information by the Consultant.** The Consultant acknowledges that it shall, in performing the Services for the School District under this Agreement, have access to or be directly or indirectly exposed to Confidential Information. The Consultant shall hold confidential all Confidential Information and shall not disclose or use such Confidential Information without the express prior written consent of the School District. The Consultant may disclose Confidential Information if consented to in writing by the School District, or if required pursuant to any judicial or administrative proceeding, but only after providing written notice to the School District of such potential release.

In addition, the Consultant shall comply with the relevant requirements of the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) (20 U.S.C. 1232g) and the Illinois School Student Records Act (ISSRA) (105 ILCS 10/1 *et seq.*), regarding the confidentiality of student “education records” as defined in FERPA and “school student records” as defined in ISSRA. Any use of information contained in student education records to be released must be approved by the School District. To protect the confidentiality of student education records, the School District will limit access to student education records to those employees who reasonably need access to them to perform their responsibilities under this Agreement.

C. **Return of Confidential Information and School District Property.** Upon the termination of this Agreement, the Consultant shall return all Confidential Information and other property, documentation, or records belonging to the School District to the Superintendent.

D. **FOIA.** As an independent contractor of the School District, records in the possession of the Consultant related to this Agreement may be subject to the Illinois Freedom of Information Act (“FOIA”), 5 ILCS 140/5-1 *et seq.*; 5 ILCS 140/7(2). The Consultant, at the Consultant’s cost, shall immediately provide the School District with any such records requested by the School District to timely respond to any FOIA request received by the School District. The School District will review all such records to determine whether FOIA exemptions apply before disclosing the records, such that information properly exempt as proprietary or prohibited from release by other laws or exempt for other reasons will not be released. If the Consultant

refuses to provide a record that is the subject of a FOIA request to the School District and the Attorney General or a court of competent jurisdiction subsequently requires the release of the record or penalizes the School District in any way, the Consultant shall reimburse the School District for all costs, including attorneys' fees, incurred by the School District related to the FOIA request and records at issue.

SECTION 3. INDEMNIFICATION AND INSURANCE.

A. **Indemnification.** To the fullest extent allowed by law, Consultant agrees to reimburse defense costs, indemnify, and hold harmless the School District, its architect, general contractor, and owner's representative as well as their respective employees and agents, directors, partners and members and trustees (collectively "Indemnified Parties") from and against any and all claims, demands, actions, causes of action, liabilities, damages, losses, fines, penalties and expenses, including, without limitation, reasonable attorneys fees and expenses, resulting from or arising out of any injury to or death of any person, damage to any property, or other loss, cost or damage or expense arising out of or related to the following: (i) any acts, errors or omissions of Consultant, any employees of Consultant or any other person or entity for whom Consultant is responsible in connection with the performance of the services under this Agreement, whether or not lawful or within the scope of their employment; (ii) the failure of Consultant to comply with any law, statute, ordinance, code, rule, regulation or requirement of a public authority; (iii) an inquiry or investigation of Consultant by any public authority; or (iv) any breach by Consultant of any obligation of Consultant under this Agreement. The obligations of Consultant under this Section shall not be construed to negate, abridge, or reduce other rights of any of the Indemnified Parties or Consultant's obligations of indemnification. The indemnification obligations set forth in this Section shall survive the termination of this Agreement.

B. **Infringement.** The Consultant warrants that no third party has any claim to any trademark, patent, or proprietary interest in any services Consultant provides to the School District. The Consultant will defend, hold harmless, and indemnify the School District against any claims brought by a third party against the School District to the extent based on an allegation that that any of the Consultant's products infringe any U.S. patent, copyright, trademark, trade secret, or other proprietary right of a third party.

C. **Insurance.** During the term of this Agreement, the Consultant, at its sole cost and expense, and for the benefit of the School District, shall carry and maintain the following insurance:

1. Comprehensive general liability and property damage insurance, insuring against all liability of Contractor related to this Agreement, with a minimum combined single limit of One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) per occurrence and Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000) general aggregate;
2. Professional Liability Insurance with limits in the per claim amount of not less than Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000) and the annual aggregate of not less than Three Million Dollars (\$3,000,000);

3. Automobile liability Insurance with a combined single limit of One Million dollars (\$1,000,000);
4. Workers' Compensation Insurance covering all costs, statutory benefits, and liabilities under State Workers' Compensation and similar laws for Contractor's respective employees; and
5. Sexual abuse and molestation insurance with a combined single limit of One Million dollars (\$1,000,000).
6. Umbrella liability insurance with a minimum combined single limit of One Million dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence and One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) general aggregate.

All insurers shall be licensed by the State of Illinois and rated A+-VII or better by A.M. Best or comparable rating service. The comprehensive general liability, sexual abuse and molestation, and property damage insurance policy shall name the School District, its Board, Board members, employees, agents, successors, its architect, general contractor, and owner's representative as an additional insured on a primary noncontributory basis with a waiver of subrogation in favor of the School District. The Consultant shall provide the School District with certificates of insurance and/or copies of policies reasonably acceptable to the School District evidencing the existence of the coverage described above, including form and deductibles, during the duration of this Agreement. The failure to provide acceptable insurance shall be deemed a breach of this Agreement entitling the School District to terminate this Agreement immediately. All policies of insurance shall provide by endorsement that no coverage may be canceled, terminated, or reduced by the insuring company without the insuring company having first given at least 30 days prior written notice to the School District by certified mail, return receipt requested.

D. **No Personal Liability.** No elected or appointed official or employee of the School District shall be personally liable, in law or in contract, to the Consultant as the result of the execution of this Agreement.

SECTION 4. GENERAL PROVISIONS.

A. **Relationship of the Parties.** The Consultant shall act as an independent contractor in providing and performing the Services. Nothing in, nor done pursuant to, this Agreement shall be construed to create the relationship of principal and agent, employer and employee, partners, or joint venturers between the School District and the Consultant.

B. **Conflict of Interest.** The Consultant represents and certifies that, to the best of its knowledge, (1) no School District employee or agent is interested in the business of the Consultant or this Agreement; (2) as of the date of this Agreement, the Consultant does not have any interest that would conflict in any manner or degree with the performance of the obligations under this Agreement; and (3) neither the Consultant nor any person employed by or associated

with the Consultant shall at any time during the term of this Agreement obtain or acquire any interest that would conflict in any manner or degree with the performance of the obligations under this Agreement.

C. **License and Assignment of Rights.** To the extent that the Consultant has intellectual property rights of any kind in any pre-existing works that are subsequently incorporated in any work or work product produced in rendering the Services, the Consultant hereby grants the School District a royalty-free, irrevocable, world-wide, perpetual, non-exclusive license (with the right to sublicense) to make, have made, copy, modify, make derivative works of, use, sell, license, disclose, publish, or otherwise disseminate or transfer such subject matter. The Consultant further agrees that it will promptly make full written disclosure to the School District, will hold in trust for the sole right and benefit of the School District, and hereby assigns to the School District, or its designee, all right, title, and interest throughout the world in and to any and all inventions, original works of authorship, developments, concepts, know-how, improvements or trade secrets, whether or not patentable or registrable under copyright or similar laws, which they may solely or jointly conceive or develop or reduce to practice, or cause to be conceived or developed or reduced to practice, developed for the School District in the course of providing the Services during the Term. The Consultant further acknowledges that the inventions, original works of authorship, developments, concepts, know-how, improvements, or trade secrets which are made by the Consultant (solely or jointly with others) within the scope of and during the period in which the Consultant is retained by the School District are “works made for hire” (to the greatest extent permitted by applicable law) for which compensation is being paid to the Consultant pursuant to this Agreement.

D. **Termination.** Notwithstanding any other provision hereof, the School District may terminate this Agreement at any time upon 30 days prior written notice to the Consultant. If this Agreement is so terminated, the Consultant shall be paid for Services performed and reimbursable expenses incurred, if any, prior to termination, not exceeding the value of the Services completed.

E. **Amendment.** No amendment or modification to this Agreement shall be effective unless and until the amendment or modification is in writing, properly approved in accordance with applicable procedures, and executed.

F. **Assignment.** This Agreement may not be assigned by the School District or by the Consultant without the prior written consent of the other party.

G. **Notice.** All notices required or permitted to be given under this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be delivered (1) personally, (2) by a reputable overnight courier, or (3) by certified mail, return receipt requested, and deposited in the U.S. Mail, postage prepaid. Unless otherwise expressly provided in this Agreement, notices shall be deemed received upon the earlier of (a) actual receipt; (b) one business day after deposit with an overnight courier as evidenced by a receipt of deposit; or (c) three business days following deposit in the U.S. mail,

as evidenced by a return receipt.

H. **Third Party Beneficiary.** No claim as a third-party beneficiary under this Agreement by any person, firm, or corporation shall be made or be valid against the School District.

I. **Provisions Severable.** If any term, covenant, condition, or provision of this Agreement is held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, void, or unenforceable, the remainder of the provisions shall remain in full force and effect and shall in no way be affected, impaired, or invalidated.

J. **Time.** Time is of the essence in the performance of this Agreement.

K. **Calendar Days and Time.** Unless otherwise provided in this Agreement, any reference in this Agreement to "day" or "days" shall mean calendar days and not business days. If the date for giving of any notice required to be given, or the performance of any obligation, under this Agreement falls on a Saturday, Sunday, federal, State, or School District holiday, then the notice or obligation may be given or performed on the next business day after that Saturday, Sunday, or federal, State, or School District holiday.

L. **Governing Laws.** This Agreement shall be governed by, construed, and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of Illinois. Jurisdiction and venue for all disputes hereunder shall be the Circuit Court located in Kane County, Illinois, or the federal district court for the Northern District of Illinois.

M. **No Waiver.** The failure of either party to insist upon the performance of any of its

terms and conditions, or the waiver of any breach of any of the terms and conditions of this Agreement, shall not be construed as thereafter waiving any such terms and conditions, but they shall continue and remain in full force and effect as if no waiver had occurred.

N. **Entire Agreement.** This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties to this Agreement and supersedes all prior agreements and negotiations between the parties, whether written or oral relating to the subject matter of this Agreement.

O. **Authority to Execute.** Each individual signing this Agreement on behalf of the entity that constitutes the School District and the Consultant, represents and warrants that the individual is duly authorized to execute and deliver this Agreement on behalf of the entity, and that this Agreement is binding on the School District and the Consultant, as the case may be, in accordance with its terms.

P. **Survival of Terms.** Sections 2, 3, and any provisions of this Agreement which by their very nature are intended to survive the termination or expiration of this Agreement will survive the termination or expiration of this Agreement and will inure to the benefit of and be binding upon the parties to this Agreement.

Q. **Exhibit.** Exhibit A is incorporated into and made part of this Agreement.

R. **Captions.** The captions at the beginning of the several paragraphs, respectively, are for convenience in locating the contents, but are not part of the context.

S. **Counterparts.** This Master Agreement may be executed in any number of counterparts, each of which shall constitute an original, but altogether shall constitute one and the same Master Agreement.

T. **Effective Date.** This Agreement shall be deemed dated and become effective on the date the last of the parties executes the Agreement as set forth below.

SUBJECT: RFP - Athletic Training Services

Background

District 300 published a call for RFP for Athletic Training Services for Dundee Crown, Jacobs, and Hampshire High School on March 9, 2022. The contract term is three years, with the possibility of two one-year extensions.

Proposals were opened on April 5, 2022, at 3:00 pm. Eleven firms were contacted; three responded, one declined, and two submitted complete proposals.

- ATI
- Northwestern Medicine

Both firms were selected to be interviewed by the committee. Interviews were conducted on Wednesday, April 13, 2022. The committee consisted of the district Administration and Athletic Directors for each high school.

Recommendation:

The administration recommends additional time to evaluate completed proposals and conduct thorough reference checks. Northwestern's proposal fees were significantly lower than ATI's. However, concerns were brought up regarding:

- Equity of access to Northwestern facilities for all our High Schools
- Ability to staff schools with Athletic Trainers
- Loss of continuity of current services

The administration will bring forth a recommendation to the May 24th Board Meeting for approval.
