Measurement of Academic Progress testing has begun at East Elementary. The assessment is given to students in grades kindergarten through third. The results help to establish individual performance levels, monitor student growth, and guide teacher instruction. The assessment is also an approved assessment to meet the requirements of the Nebraska Reading Improvement Act. After each testing session, the results are dissected and analyzed to monitor instructional effectiveness. Not only do we ensure measurable growth and percentage at grade level, but we also collect data to show the percentage of students scoring above the seventy-fifth percentile in each area.

The below is a chart showing each grade level's percentage of students scoring exceedingly high (above 75th%tile).

	Reading	Math
Kindergarten	26%	51%
First Grade	36%	50%
Second Grade	23%	20%
Third Grade	41%	25%

The Nebraska Reading Improvement Act has set a MAP threshold score as a goal for each child to meet in grades kindergarten through third. Eight percent of our student body is working to meet that threshold and therefore has an Individualized Reading Improvement Plan. In other words, ninety-two percent of our student body does not have a specific Reading Improvement Plan.

During December, East and the preschool will be collecting non-perishable food items to donate to the local community resources. It's just one way we teach the importance of helping others in our community.

Mrs. Rowley has prepared and shared a "Socially Distanced 12 Days of Christmas!" Instead of gathering for a Christmas program this year, East Elementary is trying something new that will still allow students to share some fun Christmas songs with families and the community. Once a day during the twelve days before winter break, East will be posting a song or two of students performing. Our wish is that students are able to spread the holiday spirit while showcasing their musical talents.

Interesting fact: Within approximately twelve hours of posting the first musical performance of first graders singing, the students' video reached just over 2,000 people.

Within a day of posting the second musical performance, the students' video reached 2,800 people.

Robert Meehan, educational author, has a popular quote that states, "The most valuable resource that all teachers have is each other. Without collaboration our growth is limited to our own perspectives." At East Elementary and Minden Public Preschool we often reflect on this belief as we organize as formal professional development time and take advantage of informal professional development by working alongside each other each day. In November, a survey was conducted of the East and Preschool staff to gather feedback on their thoughts when we have professional development time at East Elementary. When asked to rate if professional development is a productive use of time as well as organized and helpful, 100% of teachers rated these areas the highest score possible. The following quotes were shared about our East professional development time.

"Our professional development time has a clear plan of what needs to be done and everything is so prepared."-East teacher

"Information is well thought out and given with specific direction. Mrs. Pohl gives straight forward answers."-East teacher

"Mrs. Pohl is always on time, prepared/organized, and uses our time effectively and efficiently."-Preschool teacher

1. 1st Semester Activities/Academics:

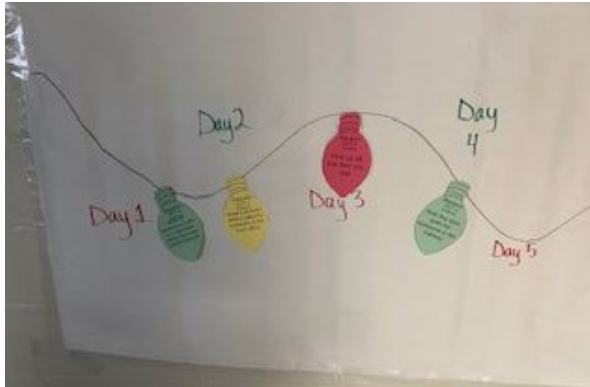
Door Wars-

Elf Jensen is making her appearance at CLJMS.

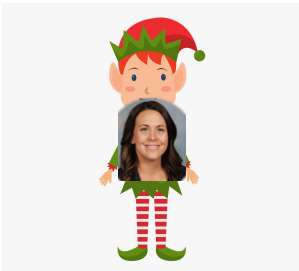
