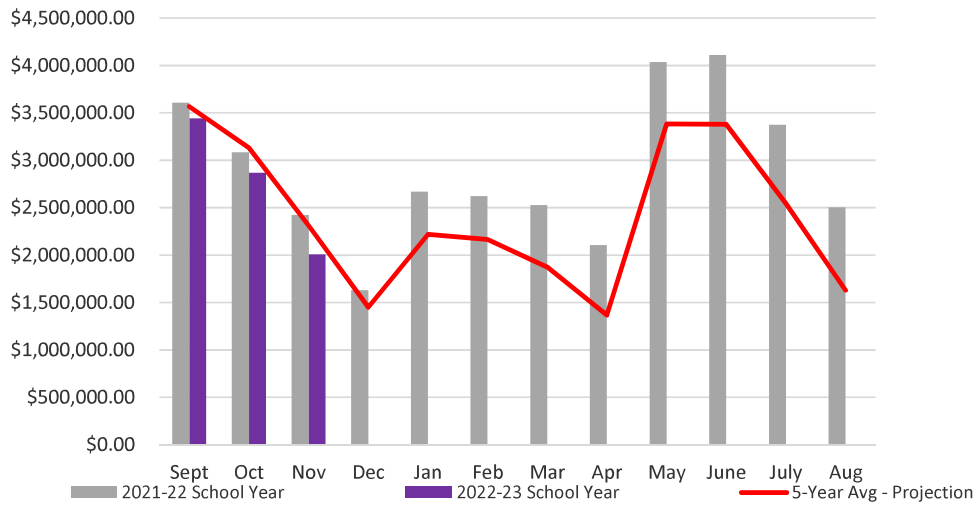

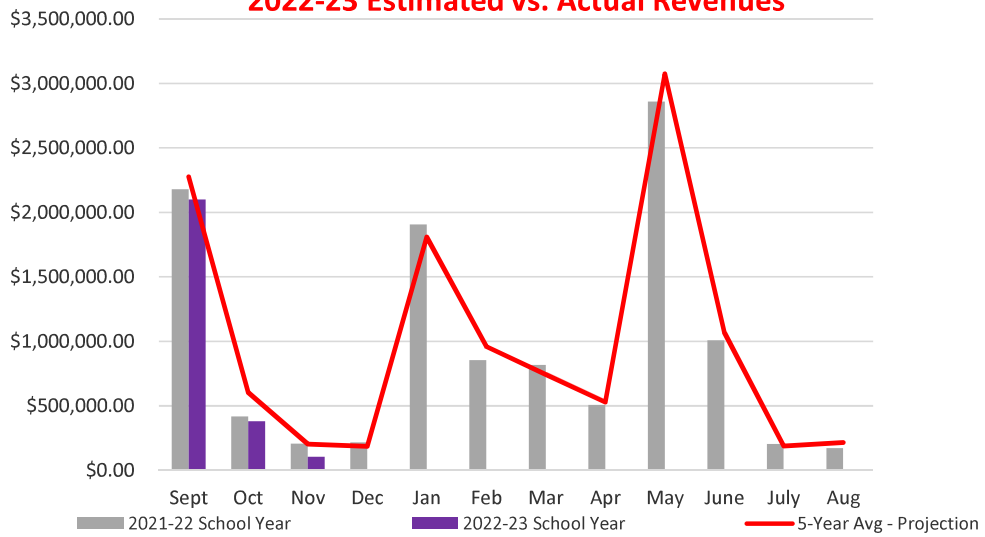

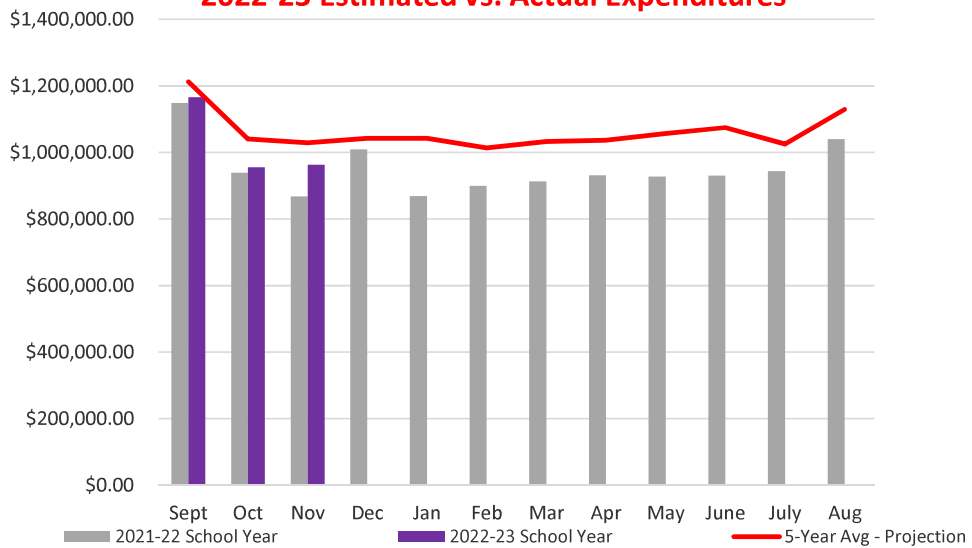
2022-23 Estimated vs. Actual General Fund Balance

The kindergarten and first grade students will have their music program led by Mrs. Rowley on December 19th. Second and third grade students will present a musical in the spring.

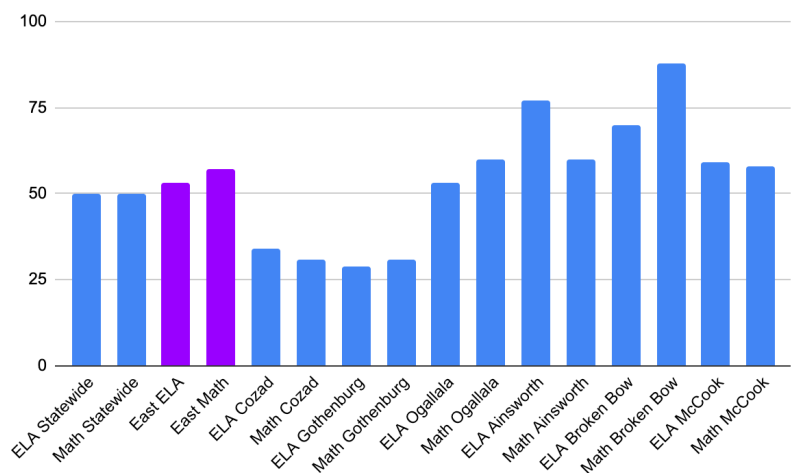
Holiday Tour of Classrooms

mClass Amplify Reading Intervention Information-

Connected to our core reading at each grade level for 4th-6th grade, this program has embedded universal screeners built on the foundation of the Science of Reading research. The data from the screeners allow us to design and implement small group reading interventions. Woods - Rick Chramosta

Approximately sixty students are utilizing the wood shop during this time of the year.

The advanced classes have been in the lab for a good portion of the year. Beginning students have been working in the lab the past few weeks. Many large projects are being built again this year. We have everything from large kitchen storage centers, outdoor furniture, night stands and many others being built. All the students are doing a great job again this year.

Our second year hosting 8 th graders in the shop areas. Phone display holders are being built and the students really enjoy being in the shops and working with our great tool setup.

Computer Aided Drafting (CAD) -Rick Chramosta

Students are developing a set of house plans again this year. The first six weeks or so students studied different types of homes and other attributes of designing a residential house. Since then students have developed a floor plan, foundation plan, door window schedules and now they are working on the elevation plans. Each student will develop a full set of plans for a house of their choice.

One Act Play Production - Jeffrey Horner

Play production 2022 has included 90 students in cast and crew. Of this number, 64 are in the cast and 26 have been part of our crew. This number is nearly one third of the high school population. This is the largest group we have worked with in recent years. Crew includes building the set, running lights, running sound, doing makeup, and helping with director assigned tasks. Stage acting includes our cast members with speaking lines and also those who are part of our ensemble who don't have lines, but invest in the scenes to make them more real. It has been an exciting year bringing to life the story of coal miners of the early 1900s. We have won our festival, our conference meet, and our district meet. Minden is one of the 6 class B schools from across the state to qualify for the state tournament. Play production includes kids from every sport and activity at MHS.

FFA - Animal Science Class

The Animal Science class learned about poultry processing in a hands-on way! Sam Cederburg brought 3 chickens (2 roosters and a guinea) to butcher during class. The students went out to the bus barn with all of the needed supplies to conduct this lab. The students completed all of the steps in processing from the killing, to plucking the feathers, dressing the chickens, and then cleaning the carcass. The students will be preparing

the carcasses to eat during class to compare the taste of different ages and types of poultry. The students had a great time and learned a lot about poultry processing!!

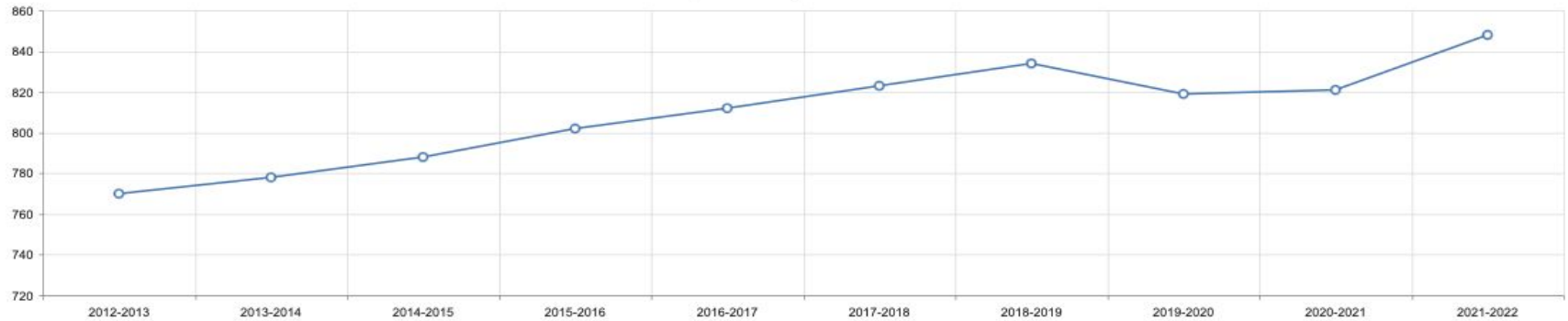

Membership - Prekindergarten - 12th Grade



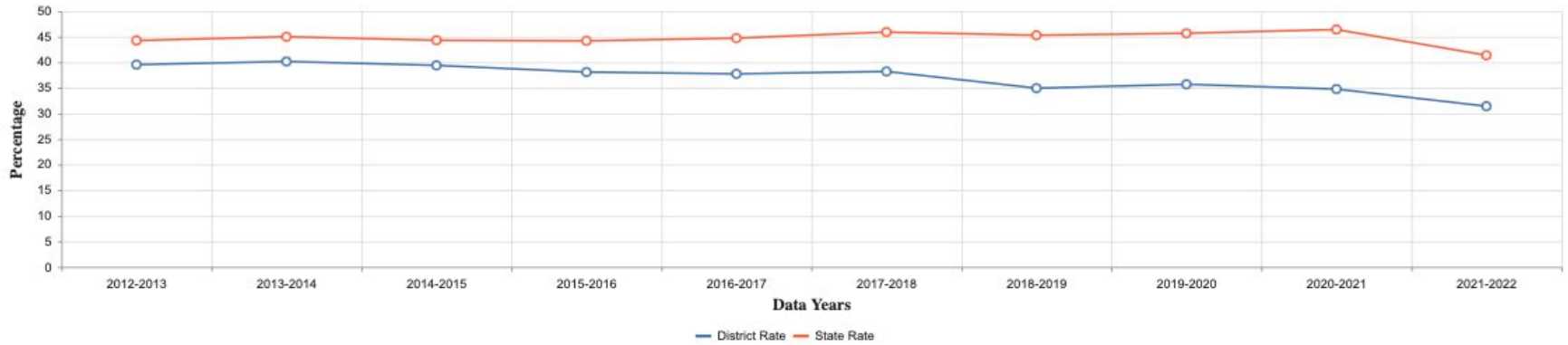

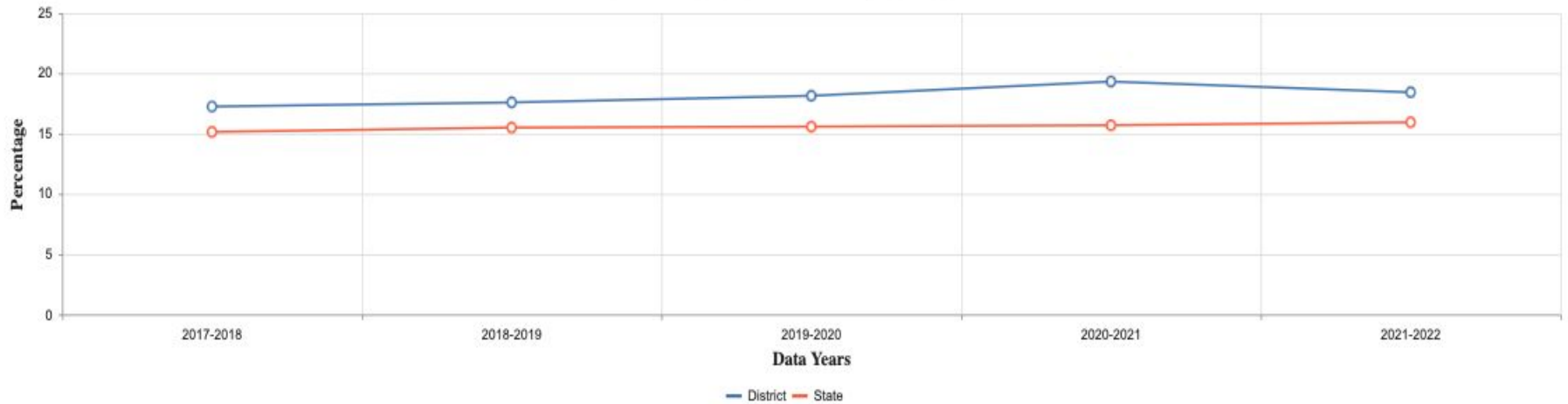

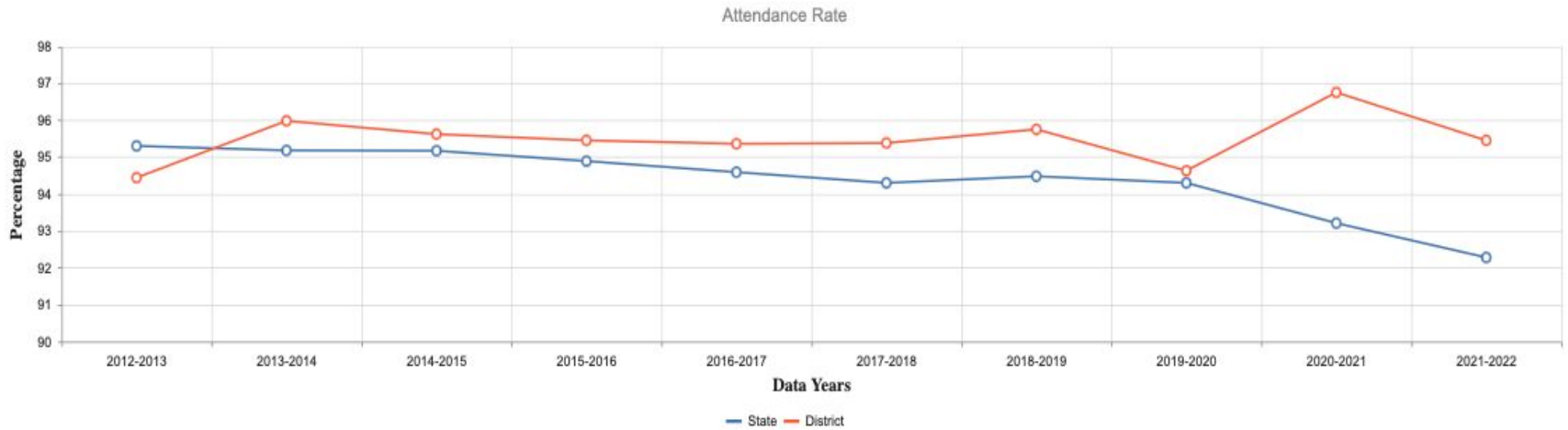

Multicultural Education

Minden Public Schools incorporates multicultural education in all curriculum areas at all grades. Multicultural education includes, but is not limited to, studies relative to the culture, history, and contributions of African Americans, Hispanic Americans, Native Americans, Asian Americans and European Americans with special emphasis on human relations and sensitivity toward all races.

Statement of Philosophy and Mission

The philosophy of the multicultural education program is that students will have improved ability to function as productive members of society when provided with: (a) an understanding of diverse cultures and races, the manner in which the existence of diverse cultures and races have affected the history of our Nation and the world, and of the contributions made by diverse cultures and races and (b) with the ability and skills to be sensitive toward and to study, work and live successively with persons of diverse cultures and races.

The mission of the multicultural education program is to prepare students to: (a) value and respect their own culture and race and cultures and races other than their own and (b) eliminate stereotypes and different treatment of others based on culture and race. The mission shall also include preparing students to eliminate stereotypes and discrimination or harassment of others based on ethnicity, religion, gender, socioeconomic status, age, or disability.

Implementation of Multicultural Education

The philosophy and mission of the multicultural education program is to be implemented as follows:

1. Multicultural education shall be included in goals established for educational programs.
2. Multicultural education shall be included in the district curriculum guides, frameworks, or standards.
3. The process for selecting appropriate instructional materials shall include assuring that the instructional materials at all grade levels include studies relative to the culture, history, and contributions of African Americans, Hispanic Americans, Native Americans, Asian Americans and European Americans with special emphasis on human relations and sensitivity toward all races.
4. Staff development shall be provided on the District's multicultural education policy. The staff development shall include professional development for administrators, teachers, and support staff which is congruent with the District and program goals.
5. Periodic assessment of the multicultural education program shall be conducted by the Superintendent. Teachers and other staff upon request shall have the

responsibility to provide the administration with reports on: (a) the instructional materials used and programs or methods implemented with their students which are supportive of the multicultural education program philosophy and mission, (b) programs or materials to be implemented in the future or which teachers or other staff feel should be implemented to further advance such philosophy and mission, and (c) with their professional assessment on the successes of or deficiencies in achieving the multicultural education program philosophy and mission. The Superintendent shall provide an annual status report on the assessment to the Board of Education.
