CALL TO ORDER (Agenda Item 1): The regular meeting of the Fern Ridge School Board was called to order by Director Mark Boren at 6:30 pm.

In attendance were Directors Mark Boren, Barbara Graham-Adams, Lorrie Daniels, Business Manager Quannah Bennett and Superintendent Gary Carpenter. Chair Larson and Business Manager Quannah Bennett attended virtually.

Directors Turle was absent.

CITIZENSHIP AWARD (Agenda Item 2): The April Citizenship Award winner, Ella Carney, was recognized by Elmira Elementary. Ella is an outstanding student and leader in her 5th grade classroom and school. Her teachers shared that Ella is sweet, kind, and has stood out as a compassionate student. She is a hard worker who enjoys positive relationships with students and teacher. She is a natural leader and a great representation for Elmira Elementary and Fern Ridge School District.

FLAG SALUTE (Agenda Item 3): Ella Carney led in the flag salute.

Oath of Office (Agenda Item 4): Director Boren led appointed Director Lorrie Daniels in the Board Member Oath of Office.

FERN RIDGE MIDDLE SCHOOL PRESENTATION (Agenda Item 5): Principal Olivia Johnson presented the 2021-2022 annual report to the board. She highlighted her staff and thanked them for all of their hard work and energy over this past school year.

Megan Miller and students from the middle school choir gave a concert to wrap up the middle school presentation.

PUBLIC COMMENT (Agenda Item 6): Elmira High School student Clyde Oglesby expressed his concerns about the current health and sexual education curriculum being taught at Elmira High School.

MONTHLY ITEMS (Agenda Item 7):

7.A. Approval of Minutes: The minutes from the April 18, 2022 regular meeting were presented

for approval.

Director Graham-Adams made a motion to approve the April 18, 2022 minutes as written; seconded by Director Daniels. There was no discussion. The motion carried with Directors Larson, Boren, Graham-Adams, and Daniels voting yes. 4-0.

BUSINESS OFFICE (Agenda Item 8):

8.A. Enrollment Report: Business Manager Quanah Bennet presented the May 1 enrollment. The district is down 101 students from budgeted enrollment numbers. Of those 101 students, 16 are from the elementary level, 30 are from the middle school level, level and 55 are from the high school level.

Attendance is down 36 students from this same time last year.

8.B. General Fund Revenue and Expenditure Report as of April 30, 2022: Business Manager Bennett reviewed the general fund revenue and expenditure report as of April 30, 2022.

The district has received 95% of budgeted revenue which is standard for where the district is typically at this time of year.

64% of operating expenditures have been spent. This is about 2% higher than this same time last year due to transportation, fuel costs, and repairs/maintenance.

Business Manger Bennett has completed a five-year review and reported that the 67% expenditure remains 2% lower than where the district normally is at this time of year.

Director Daniels made a motion to approve the April 31, 2022 financial report; seconded by Director Graham-Adams. There was no discussion. The motion carried with Directors Larson, Boren, Graham-Adams, and Daniels voting yes. 4-0.

REPORTS (Agenda Item 9):

9.A. Director of K-12 Programs: Director Marshall gave an update on the Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief Fund expenditures. Dollars have been allocated to a few items that have been approved including; HVAC controls, carpet replacement and upgrades at Fern Ridge Middle School.

Upcoming English Language Arts purchase using some ESSER II dollars. ELA curriculum is very expensive so ESSER II dollars were used to ensure that complete sets of materials could be purchased.

Director Marshall is working on submitting our reports for Data collection for budget, goals, and progress. This information is available to the public on the website and is a living document which is updated regularly.

The state is integrating six different programs and grouping them into one application process. This includes: Student Investment Account, High School Success, Continuous Improvement Plan,

Career Technical Education, Every Day Matters, and Early Indicator Intervention Systems.

Planning and work will begin on a curriculum page on the district website that gives parents and community members a one-stop resource for links to state standards and curriculum information. The goal is to have this resource in place by fall of 2022-2023.

9.B. Superintendent's Report: Superintendent Carpenter gave updates on the following topics:

Budget Document – The budget document has been shared with the budget committee and has been published on the website.

Middle School Athletic Director – Continuing to work with Territorial Sports Program on the potentially Student Investment Account funded middle school athletic director. This would be an extra duty position, not a contracted position with the district, similar to a coach.

ParentSquare – This will be the new district communication tool. Admins are currently being trained. Will start to use this during summer school and will have a full roll-out next fall. This will give parents options to receive information from the district in any way they prefer including communicating with teachers and attendance information.

Parents are able to opt-out of notifications, but this system will be connected with our student information system so there is no need for parents to opt-in.

This tool will also communicate with parents in the language they prefer.

Director Larson asked if there was an override for emergency messaging. Superintendent Carpenter confirmed this feature is available if needed.

Summer School – Begins July 11 and will run for 4 weeks for K-12 students. Registration information is starting to go out to families.

DISCUSSION ITEMS (Agenda Item 10):

10.A. 2021-2022 Calendar Change: The proposed public calendar was presented for a second reading.

It was noted that during the final week of school, the early release day will move from Wednesday to Friday. This helps high school students with their final exam schedule and lets students out early on the final day of school.

Director Larson moved to approve the change to this year's calendar; seconded by Director Graham-Adams. There was no discussion. The motion carried with Directors Larson, Boren, Graham-Adams, and Daniels voting yes. 4-0.

10.B. Second Reading of Proposed Public 2022-2023 Calendar: The proposed public calendar was presented for a second reading.

There was one correction to January 2 from the first reading and the early release day will move from the 14th to the 16th during the final week of school in June 2023.

Director Boren asked if the district had considered moving the early release day to Friday. This is not something the district is considering at this time.

Director Daniels made a motion to accept the 2022-2023 calendar; seconded by Director Graham-Adams. There was no discussion. The motion carried with Directors Larson, Boren, Graham-Adams, and Daniels voting yes. 4-0.

10.C. First Reading of Proposed 2022-2023 School Board Meeting Schedule:

The first reading of the proposed school board meeting schedule was presented.

There was a time of discussion around the August Board Retreat. It was requested that this date be moved from August 11th to August 9th.

There was discussion around having one or two meetings in March. Directors can email Board Secretary Michelle Smith for feedback.

10.D. Resolution 21-22/08: Transfer Students for 2022-2023: The resolution for accepting and releasing students on inter-district transfer numbers was presented. The numbers were set based on building administrator feedback.

Director Daniels made a motion to accept and approve resolution #21-22/08; seconded by Director Daniels. There was no discussion. The motion carried with Directors Larson, Boren, Graham-Adams, and Daniels voting yes. 4-0.

Alternative Education Programs
2022-2023 School Year

In accordance with ORS 336.631(3) and Board Policy IGBHA, the Superintendent must annually approve each alternative education program the district sponsors or allows its students to participate in or contracts with to provide services to Fern Ridge School District (FRSD) students. During the 2019-2020 school year, the FRSD offers for approval the following Alternative School Programs:

Out-of-District Contracted Service Providers:

- **Looking Glass/Riverfront School & Career Center** provides educational assessment, basic skills instruction, GED preparation and completion, completion of a high school diploma, completion of Adult Education Diploma, vocational assessment, career exploration, pre-employment training (paid and non-paid), work experience, hands-on training in electronics, manufacturing, culinary arts, health occupations, natural resources, teen parent program and special education program services. Full day and half day options are available. Target group is 14-21 year old students, particularly those who are not currently in school and would have a difficult time completing their diploma on schedule.
- **Looking Glass/Center Point School** offers academic services in a therapeutic school environment for middle and high school aged youth with emotional, neurological, and/or behavioral issues. Highly trained and professional staff offer expertise in mental health treatment, special education, and counseling. Services provided include comprehensive mental health, psycho-social, and educational assessments, on-site individualized education, transition services, year round programming.
- **Martin Luther King Jr. Education Center (Court School)** serves youth that are involved with the juvenile justice system and not experiencing success in traditional school programs. They seek to help youth achieve academic success and gain social skills so they may return to their resident school or alternative school or move into vocational programs. The target group is 11-19 year old youth that are under supervision of the juvenile system and are not experiencing success in other academic systems. Sometimes students are assigned by the courts to Martin Luther King Jr. Education Center.
- **Bridgeway House** is a special education program for high intensity autism students.
- **Wellsprings Friends School** provides alternative learning approaches, supportive community, and a culture of individual affirmation, in which teenagers are mentored and assisted towards meeting the challenges of adolescence and adulthood.

The above Out-of-District programs will be evaluated on several criteria consistent with applicable Oregon Administrative Rules (OARs) and per a Lane ESD-School District and Alternative Schools Committee understanding as to the protocol for said yearly evaluation. The FRSD will either perform an evaluation based on the attached policies and administrative rules or accept another Lane County School Districts evaluation and in conjunction with specific FRSD required data to determine whether or not the alternative program meets the established expectations.

How students are assigned: Voluntary and Assigned per expulsion hearing, building administration referral to Superintendent or by IEP team decision.
