I am in the process of writing the community schools grant this month and the grant for the Stayton High School choir/London trip. The Community Schools grant is a three year commitment grant and is huge to the future success of the program.

In Kind:

I was successful in getting office furniture donated to the district from Ticor Title in Portland. The amount started out to be just enough to provide for a computer lab and then turned into about a semi truck load, we are so lucky to have such giving people around us! The furniture should be delivered within a week... give or take. Thank you, Ticor Title!

My second intermediate goal is to continue to better communications and build relationships with community members and the North Santiam School District. While I think this goal needs some work in order to become a SMARTER goal, I do feel I can touch on some of the items I have made progress on.

As I continue to work with and provide information to local media outlets, service organizations, community members, district staff and parents, relationships will grow between the district and community members. I will continue to foster positive communications between the district and the three communities it serves. One of the ways we are working through finding out what people want to know about the district is through community forums and survey questions. In working with the Community Engagement Committee, a community survey has been conducted and several community forums have been held. In addition to a community survey, I prepared a staff survey based on the results received from the community survey in an attempt to see how aligned the staff and community are on perceptions about the district. Both surveys were made available during the community forums and work sessions where community theme statements were built. The community survey is posted on the district website.

As stated in my previous reports new brochures are in being created in the district a few examples are available for you to look at tonight. In addition to these, each building will have new up-to-date brochures to hand out to new (or current) parents about what the school (that specific campus) and district has to offer at the beginning of the new school year. Some of the ones you are seeing tonight pertain to departments and are drafts of what are being redesigned or created and "cleaned-up" in an effort to update and unify the districts messaging. A new brochure has been created for our on-line school program and has been distributed to home schooled students in our district.

June/July Board Report:

- **Cash Flow Report:** The cash flow report at the end of the year is fun to compare to budget and to our end of year projections to see how good our estimates were. First, I want to give you the disclaimer that the ending fund balance will change due to MOE reclassifications and due to any audit adjustments requested by our auditor. However, if you remember we projected that the beginning fund balance for our 2011-12 budget would be \$865,000. You can see on the cash flow statement that it is currently \$869,000. Only 4,000 off from the projection at this point in time. Another key factor is to compare the actual tax revenues received to the budgeted revenues. If you combine all of the tax revenues the actual receipts are \$4,987,941. This is \$213,411 over budget. In the 2011-12 budget we have planned for a \$200,000 payback.
- **End of the fiscal year processes:** We are continuing to focus on fiscal year end processes. Another large component of the end of the year process is to claim grant revenues. As we close out the grants and claim the funds, we are building grant files for the auditors which report the expenditures, revenues and staff supported by the grants.

Business Office progress summary:

- **IMMEDIATE GOAL: Have a more user-friendly office & website:** After we have completed the budget process, we have been updating the website with current budgeting information...
- **INTERMEDIATE GOAL #1: Help Food Service Program improve and grow:** I have had the opportunity to meet twice this month with the Food Service Director to review the food service budget and to plan for the 2011-12 year. Toni has been working hard to have some positive changes in place at the high school...
- **INTERMEDIATE GOAL #2: Communicate better with numbers:** The monthly cash flow report will be submitted at the board meeting.
- **INTERMEDIATE GOAL #3: Long Range Financial Projection**
