

# The Difference in Coatings

## Acrylic vs. Urethane

When selecting a roof coating it is important to consider the features and benefits of each coating type, as well as its drawbacks.

There are two types of coating that we typically offer for roofing projects, acrylic and urethane. Within these categories there are two options for acrylic and one for urethane. Water-based acrylic coatings are both easy to use and environmentally friendly. Acrylic coatings are best suited on a sloped surface that will drain well and have little or no water ponding. Ponding water can cause acrylic coatings to fail prematurely resulting in additional roof repairs in the future. When acrylic coatings are applied in the proper conditions for your particular roof, they will provide years of protection. Conklin Benchmark, United, Everest Systems, as well as others are the choices we offer in acrylic coatings.

- Conklin Benchmark – This is Conklin’s premier coating. We offer a 12 Year Labor and Material Leak-free non pro-rated Warranty on roof systems using Benchmark coating. Tillotson Enterprises has been using this coating for 20+ years and have found the coating to perform very well for many years past the warranty period.
- Other manufacturer’s acrylic coatings Tillotson uses over polyurethane foam and metal generally offer a 10 Year Labor and Material Leak-free non pro-rated Warranty. We have been applying other manufacturer’s acrylic coatings since 2011 and although our track record with these coatings isn’t as long as it is with Benchmark, we have inspected a variety of older roofs with these coatings and they are performing very well.

The main difference between the two coatings will likely be in the number of years the coating will last before it is necessary to recoat the roof. Tillotson Enterprises has inspected roofs our company coated in the mid-1990’s that are still performing well and have yet to be recoated so we expect the recoat time for a roof coated with Benchmark to be 20-25 years and other coatings Tillotson uses to be in the 15-20 year range. Of course, there are many factors that can affect the lifespan of any coating such as hail, chemical exposure, mechanical damage, etc. so these figures are only estimates and results may vary.

## **URETHANE ROOF COATINGS**

Polyurethane coatings are solvent based coatings that are highly durable and typically have a higher tensile strength when compared to acrylics.

- Neogard's Permthane II urethane coating is a very strong and durable coating that performs well under harsh conditions. It carries a 10 year warranty but 15 year warranties are available.

This coating, while being more expensive per square foot, is necessary when dealing with specific applications:

### **PONDING WATER**

Good roof practice recommends no ponding water, however, small bird baths are typical on most low slope roofs. Since acrylic coatings are more susceptible to damage from ponding water and can peel or come loose from the roof surface when allowed to sit under water for extended periods of time, urethane coatings are necessary when this condition is present.

### **IMPACT DAMAGE**

Urethanes typically have a higher tensile strength than acrylics which make them more resistant to damage from impact such as hail, falling objects, etc. This factor is more important to consider when the coating is going to be applied over a spray foam roof system than over a metal or wood surface.

### **CHEMICAL RESISTANCE**

In areas where chemicals or grease are present, such as restaurants or industrial settings, urethanes are able to withstand the harsh conditions that these elements cause.

Urethane coatings, while being stronger and able to withstand harsher elements, tend to weather faster and will need to be recoated sooner than acrylics.

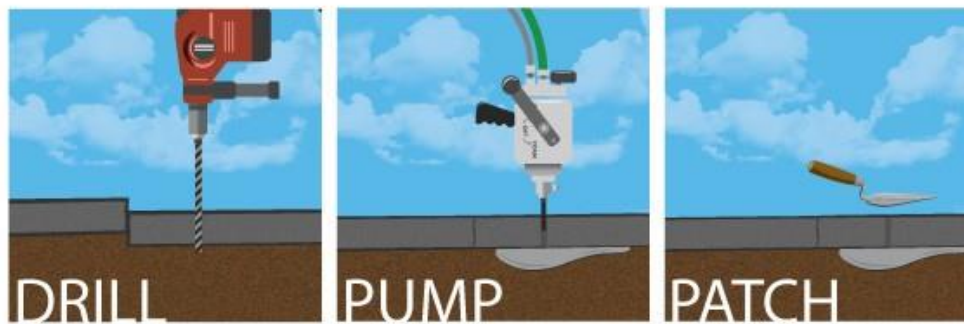

East Butler Public Schools, Brainard, NE is requesting bids for labor and material for applying a spray foam roofing system on a half-round metal Quonset building including applying spray foam and coatings on the exterior of both end walls. Building is located in Brainard, NE on West Adams street west of the main school building.

The project generally includes:

- Surfaces are to be power washed Using minimum of a 3,000 PSI.

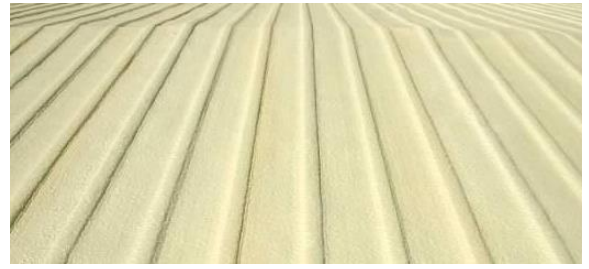

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## Elementary Principal Report May Board Meeting



### I. Mental Health Services

- A. Tammy Sassaman, Behavioral Health Program Coordinator, with Family Service Association in Lincoln provides mental health services to a variety of schools in Saunders County including Ashland-Greenwood, Yutan, Mead, and Wahoo. Amber Pelan with Saunders County Youth Services had given me her name as a contact that may be interested in setting up a similar program at East Butler.
- B. Proposed Services:
  - 1. Therapy sessions for K-12 students (6-7 per day)
  - 2. Classroom presentations and professional learning
  - 3. Diagnose ADHD, PTSD, and depression
- C. They often work with students that are managing trauma, depression, anxiety, and unhealthy homes.
- D. Funding
  - 1. The overall cost for 1 day per week for 43 weeks would be \$15,050 paid in 2 payments. During initial conversations, there was a grant that would cover approximately \$12,000 of this cost with the remainder being paid by the school district. It now appears that this grant will not be available as funds will may be delegated to areas of flooding. We will find out more about the status of this grant in a few weeks.
- E. I spoke to Mr. Quinn, K-12 principal, at Mead Public School as their enrollment is similar to East Butler. They have been part of this program and feel it has been positive for their students. They started by sharing the service with Yutan, but now have one day devoted to their school.

### II. Before/After School Program

- A. Colette Stelling contacted me about the possibility of starting a before/after school program at East Butler. She currently works with Centennial Public School in providing this service by renting gym and stage facilities. Colette had been contacted by a member of the village board.
- B. Extended Care Program:
  - 1. Hours 6:30-8:00 a.m and 3:30-6:00 p.m./Summer hours may be available.
  - 2. Cost approximately \$65.00-\$75.00 per week
  - 3. Students in grades K-6.
  - 4. Activities/Snack (homework area, arts, indoor/outdoor play, board games)
  - 5. Colette's business, The Colt's Corral, would assume all responsibility and liability for this program. This would also include hiring staff and setting guidelines using their handbook.

### III. Reading and Math Program (R.A.M.P)

- A. Letters will be sent to parents of prospective students based on teacher recommendation, NWEA, and DIBELS scores. Special education students and students that qualify for Title I in Reading or Math will be invited to participate in the program.
- B. Sessions will take place from 8:30-11:30 A.M. in Dwight on the following dates:
  - 1. July 9-11
  - 2. July 16-18
  - 3. July 23-25
  - 4. July 30-August

**IV. Social Studies Curriculum**

- A. The quote for social studies curriculum is included. Four textbook series were reviewed and teachers were allowed to vote for their top choice. It was decided that 2019 Pearson myWorld Interactive would best fit the needs of our school.
