### School Board Report February 2025

- The Alternative Learning Program (ALP) has adjusted its hours to better accommodate student needs. The new schedule is:
  - Monday: 7:30-3:30
  - Tuesday: 8:00-6:00
  - Wednesday: 8:00-8:00
  - Thursday: 8:00-6:00
  - Friday: Closed

Currently, 27 students in grades 9-12 are enrolled in the ALP, along with 6 students participating in credit recovery.

- The Mentor Program, developed and implemented by the ALL IN Team, has officially launched. So far, 9 students have been paired with high school mentors. These partnerships, supported by Mrs. Wilke, meet weekly, with many sessions taking place during RISE.
- We are actively working to expand Work-Based Learning (WBL) opportunities for students. Four staff members will be attending the National WBL Conference in Seattle from April 2-4, with grant funding provided by the South Central Service Cooperative. We continue to collaborate with the cooperative to enhance job-related skill development, creating more opportunities for students to engage in internships and work placements that support local businesses while still in high school.
- The Polar Plunge for LSH Unified have been incredibly successful, providing meaningful opportunities for our students to engage with the community and support inclusivity. I want to recognize Erika Anderson for her dedication to fostering an inclusive environment and ensuring student success. Her creativity and compassion have had a direct impact on our students, helping to build a positive, supportive culture where all learners feel valued and empowered.
- Parent-Teacher Conferences will be held on February 13 from 3:30-7:30 PM in the MS/HS commons. To maintain confidentiality, special education teachers will hold their conferences in their individual classrooms.

- The 6th grade DARE program kicked off on Monday, January 27. Deputy Jim Staupe will be working with students during Social Studies classes (3rd, 4th, and 6th hour) every Monday for the next 8-9 weeks. This program provides valuable lessons on decision-making, responsibility, and making safe and healthy choices.
- The Middle School Career Fair is set to take place on Friday, Feb 7. A special thanks goes out to Mel Hollnagel and the Avid Committee for making this a success each year.

## Community Education Update

**Date: January 28, 2025**

### *New Building Update*

We have now been in the new LSH Elementary for a couple of months and are continuing to settle in. We are still figuring out the best use of spaces and how the building operates. For example, groups using the building are interested in utilizing the built-in speakers in the gym and cafeteria. As of January, we have started to navigate these features, and groups like the PTO were able to successfully incorporate music into their event.

### *Early Childhood*

- **Winter Wonderland:** Our Winter Wonderland event took place on January 23rd, featuring our well-loved hot dog meal, arts and crafts, and games for the kids. We had over 50 attendees.
- **Preschool Open House:** On Thursday, March 13, families interested in enrolling in Little Giants Preschool are invited to our open house from 5:00–7:00 p.m. This is a great opportunity to showcase our new building, preschool classrooms, and early childhood wing. We are once again coordinating with Kindergarten Round-Up to offer both events simultaneously.
- **Dueling Pianos Fundraiser:** On Saturday, March 22, we are hosting a fundraiser to support preschool tuition assistance. Tickets are \$50 and include dinner, entertainment, and a silent auction. Doors open at 6:00 p.m., with the performance running from 7:00–9:00 p.m.

### *Adult Education*

For the first time, students will be able to take their GED test within our own consortium, as we have become an official GED testing center. Previously, students had to travel to Mankato for testing. Our first GED test is scheduled for Friday, February 14th.

### *Kids Club*

Last summer, we transitioned to Arux software for childcare billing. While we are pleased with the switch, we are still working through some challenges, particularly when there are schedule changes such as early releases or weather-related delays. These situations have led to some billing discrepancies that we are actively addressing.

### *General Community Education*

We have several upcoming events:

- **Daddy-Daughter Dance (February 7):** As of January 27th, we have 72 participants registered. The evening includes a catered meal by Sue Milam, a DJ, a photographer, and games for those who prefer not to dance.
- **Mother-Son Bowling (February 15):** Moms and their sons will enjoy bowling and pizza. This event is nearly sold out.
- **Senior Dinner:** In partnership with the United Fund of Le Sueur, the Knights of Columbus, and Le Sueur Transit, we will be hosting our annual senior dinner.
- **LSH Elementary Open Gym & Walking Track:** Attendance at our first two open gyms has been low (fewer than five attendees). I will be seeking feedback from the advisory council on whether to continue this offering. The walking track has seen slightly higher usage.
- **Winter Classes:** We've had strong participation in our winter class offerings. Our sourdough bread class, 55 Alive course, and after-school youth classes all reached full capacity.

## BUSINESS MANAGER CONTRACT

### ARTICLE I PURPOSE

This Contract is entered into between Independent School District No. 2397, Le Sueur-Henderson, Minnesota, hereinafter referred to as the School District, and Ky Battern, hereinafter referred to as the Business Manager, who agrees to perform the duties of the Business Manager of the School District.

### ARTICLE II DURATION, EXPIRATION, TERMINATION DURING THE TERM, MUTUAL CONSENT, AND CONTINGENCY

Section 1. Duration and Proration: This Contract is for the term commencing on February 3, 2025 and ending on June 30, 2025. It shall remain in full force and effect unless modified by mutual consent of the School Board and the Business Manager or unless terminated as provided in this Contract.

Excluding holidays, all terms outlined in this contract are based on an annual schedule and will be prorated accordingly.

Section 2. Expiration: This Contract shall expire at the end of the term specified in Section 1. above. At the conclusion of its term, neither party shall have any further claim against the other, and the School District's employment of the Business Manager shall cease, unless a subsequent Contract is entered into by the parties. In the event the parties fail to enter into a subsequent contract, the Business Manager's employment shall continue on a month-to-month basis until the School Board either enters into a subsequent Contract with the Business Manager or until the School Board provides sixty (60) calendar days of written notice of the termination of the Business Manager's employment.

Section 3. Termination During the Term: The Business Manager's employment may be terminated during the term of this Contract only for cause as defined in M.S. 122A.40, Subd. 9. and Subd. 13., but, except for purposes of describing grounds for discharge, the provisions of M.S. 122A.40 shall not be applicable. If the School Board proposes to terminate the Business Manager during the term of this Contract for cause as described in M.S. 122A.40, Subd. 9. or Subd. 13., it shall notify the Business Manager, in writing, of the proposed grounds for termination. The Business Manager shall be entitled to a hearing before an arbitrator provided the Business Manager makes such a request, in writing, to the School Board Chair within fifteen (15) calendar days after receipt of the written notice of the proposed termination. In such event, the parties shall jointly petition the Bureau of Mediation Services (BMS) for a list of five (5) arbitrators. The arbitrator shall be selected by the parties through the normal striking process as provided by BMS rules. The arbitrator shall conduct a hearing under normal arbitration procedure rules and issue a written decision. The decision of the arbitrator shall be final and binding upon the parties, subject to normal judicial review of arbitration decisions as provided by law. The Business Manager may be suspended with pay pending final determination by the arbitrator. If the Business Manager fails to request a hearing as provided in this section within the fifteen (15)-day calendar period, he/she shall be deemed to have acquiesced to the School Board's proposed action, and the proposed action shall become final on such date as determined by the School Board, and the Business Manager shall have no further claim or recourse.

Section 4. Mutual Consent: This Contract may be terminated at any time by mutual consent of the School Board and the Business Manager.

Section 5. Contingency: If this Contract is a subsequent Contract entered into prior to the completion of an existing Contract, this subsequent Contract is contingent upon the Business Manager completing the terms of the existing Contract.

### ARTICLE III DUTIES

The Business Manager shall serve as the Chief Business and Financial Officer of the School District and shall serve under the direction of the Superintendent. The Business Manager shall perform all duties incident to the position of Business Manager and such other duties as may be prescribed by the Superintendent and School Board from time to time. The Business Manager shall abide by the policies, regulations, rules, and procedures established by the School Board and the Commissioner of the Department of Education and shall abide by all Minnesota laws relating to the operation of the School District. The Business Manager shall attend School Board and other meetings as directed by the Superintendent and shall provide recommendations to the Superintendent regarding the financial and business affairs of the School District.

### ARTICLE IV DUTY YEAR AND LEAVES OF ABSENCE

Section 1. Basic Work Year: The Business Manager's duty year shall be for the entire twelve (12) month Contract year, and the Business Manager shall perform duties on those legal holidays on which the School Board is authorized to conduct school if the School Board so determines. The Business Manager shall be on duty during any emergency, natural or unnatural, unless otherwise excused in accordance with School Board administrative policy. The Business Manager may work remotely up to two (2) days per week, provided their physical presence is not required as per the determination of the Superintendent.

Section 2. Vacation: The Business Manager shall earn twenty (20) working days of annual paid vacation each Contract year, or 13.34 hours per month. The Business Manager may carry up to 10 unused vacation days into next year, with superintendent approval. Accrued vacation over ten (10) days, shall be paid out at the Business Manager's hourly rate at the end of the school year. Upon voluntary termination of employment, the Business Manager shall be entitled to payment for any unused vacation days earned and accrued pursuant to the provisions of this section; however, if the Business Manager is involuntarily terminated, he/she shall not be entitled to unused earned and accrued vacation days.

Section 3. Holidays: The Business Manager shall be entitled to eleven (11) paid holidays: Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, Friday after Thanksgiving, Christmas Eve day, Christmas Day, New Year's Eve day, New Year's Day, Good Friday, Memorial Day and Juneteenth.

Section 4. Sick Leave: The Business Manager shall earn paid sick leave at the rate of 1.25 days per working month and earned sick leave may accumulate to a maximum of one hundred and twenty (120) days. Upon voluntary or involuntary termination of employment, the Business Manager shall not be entitled to payment of any unused earned and accrued sick leave days. Upon reemployment, the Business Manager's previously earned sick leave balance from their prior employment with the District will be fully restored.

Section 5. Workers' Compensation: Pursuant to M.S. Chapter 176, the Business Manager injured on the job in the service of the School District and collecting workers' compensation insurance may draw sick leave and receive full salary from the School District, the salary to be reduced by an amount equal to the insurance payments, and only that fraction of the days not covered by insurance will be deducted from accrued sick leave.

Section 6. Emergency and Funeral Leave: The Business Manager shall be granted bereavement leave for a death within the Business Manager's immediate family. The time utilized shall be in an amount to be determined after conferring with the Superintendent. Days utilized will not be deducted from the Business Manager's sick leave. "Immediate family" is defined as the Business Manager's spouse, child, parent, brother, sister, grandparent, brother-in-law, sister-in-law, mother-in-law, father-in-law, or grandchildren. This particular type of personal leave shall be extended from one to five days as determined and granted by the superintendent or his designated representative for any particular event.

Funeral leave of up to one (1) day per school year shall be granted for funerals of friends and other persons not mentioned in the previous paragraph. Such leave shall be non-accumulative.

Section 8. Jury Service: The Business Manager who serves on jury duty shall be granted the day or days necessary as stipulated by the court to discharge this responsibility without any salary deduction or loss of basic leave allowance. The compensation received for jury duty service shall be remitted to the School District.

Section 9. Military Leave: Military leave shall be granted pursuant to applicable law.

Section 10. Insurance Application: A Business Manager on unpaid leave is eligible to continue to participate in group insurance programs if permitted under the insurance policy provisions. The Business Manager shall pay the entire premium for such insurance commencing with the beginning of the leave and shall pay to the School District the monthly premium in advance. In the event the Business Manager is on paid leave from the School District under Section 4. above or supplemented by sick leave pursuant to Section 5. above, the School District will continue insurance contributions as provided in this Contract until sick leave is exhausted. Thereafter, the Business Manager must pay the entire premium for any insurance retained.

## ARTICLE V INSURANCE

Section 1. Health and Hospitalization Insurance: The School District shall provide the Business Manager and the Business Manager's dependents with health and hospitalization insurance coverage under the School District's group health and hospitalization insurance plan. The School District shall contribute the sum of \$6,700 annually (\$558.33 per month) for single coverage and \$10,800 annually (\$900 per month) for family coverage toward the premium for such insurance. The balance of the premium shall be paid by the Business Manager through payroll deduction.

*NOTE 2: In the event this Contract will cause or does cause penalties, fees, or fines to be assessed against the School District, the parties agree to reopen negotiations that result in a revised Contract between the parties that eliminates or reduces penalties, fees, or fines to be assessed against the School District. The amount of any reduction in the School District's contribution toward the Business Manager's healthcare benefits as a result of addressing the "highly compensated employee" component of the ACA will be placed into another School District provided benefit(s) (i.e., a retirement HRA, salary, etc.) as agreed upon between the parties.*

Section 2. Life Insurance: The School District shall provide, at its own expense, term life insurance for the Business Manager under the School District's group term life insurance plan in the amount of \$50,000, payable to the Business Manager's named beneficiary(ies).

*NOTE 3: According to the Internal Revenue Service rules, the amount of School District premium contribution that pays for life insurance coverage in excess of \$50,000 is considered taxable income, so the School District should be certain that it is reporting that contribution as such, and the Business Manager needs to know why that amount is being reported.*

Section 3. Long-Term Disability Insurance: The School District shall provide, at its own expense, long-term disability insurance for the Business Manager under the School District's group long-term disability insurance under which full-time employees may be included and which will compensate those persons covered thereby two-thirds (2/3) of the covered person's annual salary, effective after thirty (30) days' disability and payable to age seventy (70) subject to requirements of the insurance carrier.

Section 4. Eligibility: The eligibility of the Business Manager and the Business Manager's dependent(s) and beneficiary(ies) for insurance benefits shall be governed by the terms of the insurance policies purchased by the School District pursuant to this article.

Section 5. Claims Against the School District: The School District's only obligation is to purchase the insurance policies described in this article, and no claim shall be made against the School District as a result of denial of insurance benefits by an insurer if the School District has purchased the policies and paid the premiums described in this article.

## ARTICLE VI OTHER BENEFITS

Section 1. Tax-Sheltered Annuities: The Business Manager is eligible to participate in a tax-sheltered annuity plan through payroll deduction established pursuant to Section 403(b) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, M.S. 123B.02, Subd. 15., School District policy, and as otherwise provided by law. The District will match dollar for dollar of employee contribution, up to a maximum District contribution of \$2,000 per year.

Section 3. Conferences and Meetings: The School District shall pay all legally valid expenses and fees for the Business Manager's attendance at professional conferences and meetings with other educational agencies when such attendance is required, directed, or permitted by the Superintendent and/or the School Board. The Business Manager shall periodically report to the Superintendent relative to all meetings and conferences attended. The Business Manager shall file itemized expense statements to be processed and approved as provided by School Board policy and law.

## ARTICLE VII SALARY

The Business Manager shall be paid a salary of \$93,000 for the 2024-2025 fiscal year. The salary may be modified, but shall not be reduced, during the term of this Contract. The salary shall be paid in equal installments during each Contract year.

## ARTICLE VIII OTHER PROVISIONS

Section 1. Outside Activities: While the Business Manager shall devote full time and due diligence to the affairs and the activities of the School District, he/she may also serve as a consultant to other school districts or educational agencies, lecture, engage in writing and speaking activities, and engage in other activities if, as solely determined by the Superintendent, such activities do not impede the Business Manager's ability to perform the duties of the Business Manager's position. However, the Business Manager may not engage in other employment, consultant service, or other activity for which a salary, fee, or honorarium is paid without the prior approval of the Superintendent.

Section 2. Indemnification and Provision of Counsel: In the event that an action is brought or a claim is made against the Business Manager arising out of or in connection with his/her employment and the Business Manager is acting within the scope of employment or official duties, the School District shall defend and indemnify the Business Manager to the extent permitted by law. Indemnification, as provided in this section, shall not apply in the case of malfeasance in office or willful or wanton neglect of duty, and the obligation of the School District in this regard shall be subject to the limitations as provided in M.S. Chapter 466.

Section 3. Dues: The Business Manager is encouraged to belong to and participate in appropriate professional, educational, economic development, community, and civic organizations when such membership will serve the best interests of the School District. Accordingly, the School District will pay the membership dues for such

organizations as are required, directed, or permitted by the Superintendent and/or the School Board. The Business Manager shall present appropriate statements for approval as provided by law.

Section 4. Cell Phone Use: The District will contribute up to \$480 per year toward professional use of personal cell phone.

Section 5: Daily Rate of Pay: For purposes of this contract, the Business Manager's daily rate of pay is determined by dividing the Business Manager's annual salary by 260 days.

ARTICLE IX  
SEVERABILITY

The provisions of this Contract shall be severable, and if any such provision or the application of any such provision under any circumstances is held invalid, it shall not affect any other provisions of this Contract or the application of any provision thereof.
