The Board reserves the right to edit the video recordings for the purpose of excluding any public comment regarding an individual student or a personnel issue. **Per Board of Education Bylaw 0167.3, "No interviews should be conducted in the meeting room while the Board is in session."** If members of the press/audience want to conduct an interview, they should wait until the conclusion of the meeting, or go out in the hallway or to another room.
