WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of said Independent School District in action of ___ to ___ have voted to approve and grant authority to the Chief Appraiser of the Ellis Appraisal District ("EAD") and all other EAD employees, as delegated and determined by the EAD Chief Appraiser, to act as its agent regarding its protest of the Comptroller's Property Value Study for tax year 2023;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees of said Independent School District hereby authorize and otherwise grant authority to the EAD Chief Appraiser and all other employees of EAD to act as its agent in its protest of the Comptroller's Property Value Study for tax year 2023.

This resolution shall become effective upon its passage.
