RECOMMENDATION:

Request to proceed on the Notice of Creation and Ordinance for a Sewer Extension District (SED) and Water Extension District (WED) on 48th Avenue from 42nd Street to Lost Creek Parkway


DISCUSSION:

In accordance with the City's Assessment Policy, the request to proceed on SED and WED on 48th Avenue from 42nd Street to Lost Creek Parkway is hereby made. The SED and WED do not have postcard survey notification requirements and cannot be voted out the property owners in the benefiting boundaries.

Proposed SED improvements are to extend the existing 12-inch diameter main to the south side of Lost Creek Parkway which will allow service lines connections to abutting and benefiting properties. Proposed WED improvements are to extend the existing 18-inch diameter main to the south side of Lost Creek Parkway which allow fire and service lines connections to abutting and benefiting properties.

Assessments for the SED and WED are in accordance with the City Assessment Policy and State Law.



MINUTES

February 11, 2019

1:30 P.M.

Bogus called the meeting to order and read the Open Meetings Act.

ROLL CALL: Rick Bogus, Captain Doug Molczyk for Chief Sherer, Tara Vasicek, Jay Nickolite and Chuck Sliva.

Approval of minutes from the October 8, 2018 meeting.

Let the record show that- Item B Didn't do anything with after consulting with the school. Got a report from the Police Department that it wasn't necessary.

Nickolite moved and Sliva seconded that the minutes of the October 8, 2018 meeting be approved. All voted "Aye". Motion carried.

A. 11th Street and 23rd Avenue Intersection Parking – Bogus update

Discussion occurred on the visibility and difficulty to see traffic from both sides of the street due to vehicles being parked in the right-of-way.

Determination made is that we need to review the downtown areas for line of sight code violations which upon completion will be a recommendation to the Public Property, Safety and Works Committee.

No action, no vote.

B. Lost Creek Parkway Delineators – Bogus update

Discussion on that Engineering has received a number of complaints that when it is a little dark, weather, etc. a person can't see the curves. Chuck thought we would need to support 6,000' approximately 77 posts with reflectors. Minimum height 4'. Use steel posts with the breakaway which are approx. \$35 apiece. There would be additional costs for the Delineators and labor costs.

May have to delay with frost in the ground and weather conditions because we don't have the post driver available for the small posts.

A motion was made by Vasicek and Sliva seconded All voted "Aye". Motion carried.

C. Review of traffic devices needs with the City

18th Avenue Pedestrian Overpass – Rick will review signage and forward to HDR Engineering for verification.

19th Ave & 12th Street – east side a portable stop sign has been put in place because the one they took down is missing.

12th Avenue Viaduct – Rick will review plan set with HDR Engineering on closure design at 12th, 21st, and 25th Avenues.

Citywide Sign Change Outs - Tara inquired about changing out of City signs. Jay indicated they are changing out signs every chance they get. Chuck stated that we need to budget extra money the next time around to help with this and would obtain a priority list as to which ones to complete first. Tara mentioned that on the arterials we should do bigger signs even on 33rd Ave & 23rd Street and referenced NDOT sign sizes on Arterials and Collectors.

Motion moved by Bogus and seconded by Vasicek. All voted "Aye". Motion carried.

ADJOURNMENT: With no further business to discuss, a motion was made by Bogus and seconded by Vasicek to adjourn the meeting. All voted "Aye". Motion carried

- A. Columbus Middle School Traffic and Pedestrian Discussion
Discussed in length the apparent CPS concept for northeast parking lot ingress and egress. It was determined that there would still be traffic capacity concerns and traffic and pedestrian issues and concerns with their apparent proposal. CPS does not have a Traffic Engineer involved in this.

It was determined that when CPS submits a request in to make changes which would amend the past approved variances and the City will require a traffic study of the entire CPS CMS campus and surrounding City streets.

- B. Traffic Lights North of the Columbus High School
Chief Sherer and Jay Z indicated they received comments on the timing of the green traffic lights on 33rd Avenue and Lost Creek Parkway. Rick discussed how the signal operates and time is extended if needed due to oncoming traffic on both 33rd Avenue and Lost Creek Parkway. Signal is one of the sophisticated systems that senses vehicles. Determined that there is no changes to timing needed at this time.

- C. Review parking in gravel lots along the UPRR
26th Avenue Platte County Parking Lot – DMV people were told by Platte County that they are not supposed to park in this parking lot and to park in the gravel lots along UPRR. DMV would be allowed to park in the paved lot in the southwest corner of 14th Street and 25th Avenue in the far southwest corner. It was understood this would be over the weekends. DMV was to come back to the City for a determination.

Chief Sherer thanked everyone for their assistance with the wind turbine pillar coming off of a trailer. Still reviewing to see if there is any damage done to the street, median, etc. Waiting for the snow to melt to get a better look.
