**Re: Construction Manager at Risk Guaranteed Maximum Price for Phase Three of CHS 9 Additions and Renovations – Lesley Field Concession Stand and Restrooms (Bond Project #30)**

As part of 2016 bond election projects, the request to use the Construction Manager at Risk process, as allowed under Section 44.038 of the Texas Education Code for the bond funded construction and renovation projects, was approved by the Coppell ISD Board of Trustees on January 21, 2016.

Subsequently, at the March 28, 2016, Board meeting, the Board approved Northstar Builders Group, LLC as the Construction Manager at Risk for the additions and renovations of CHS 9. Then, on December 12, 2016, the Board approved the Guaranteed Maximum Price (GMP) for Phase One of this project. Finally, on March 28, 2017, the Board approved the GMP for Phase Two of this project.

As a continuation of the additions and renovations of CHS 9, we have already completed the turf and track replacement of Lesley Field. The next and final step to be completed by our construction manager, Northstar Builders Group, is to replace the concession stand and restrooms for this facility. The original building was constructed in the 1960s and has met the end of its life expectancy.

Corgan designed the new building to be essentially the same as the new concession stand and restrooms just completed at Coppell Middle School East with the exception that this GMP includes the demolition of the existing building, including complete abatement and disposal of the old building.

Northstar put this project out for competitive bid and received sixty three (63) bids from its various highly qualified sub-contractors, a very good response for a project of this size. After careful review and analysis by Northstar Builders, Corgan, and CISD staff of the multiple qualified bidders for each trade, a final bid tabulation was prepared including the sub-contractor pricing, contingencies, contractor fee, and general conditions. Under the CM @ Risk purchasing method, we utilize the “cost plus fee with a Guaranteed Maximum Price (GMP)” method of pricing. That is, Section 44.038(b) of the Education Code provides that the CM @ Risk assumes the contractual risk for completion and delivery of the projects at or under the Guaranteed Maximum Price. In this case, the GMP Northstar Builders has presented for this Phase Three package is a total of **\$997,697.00**. We have carefully reviewed all components of this number and concur with its accuracy. The estimated completion date

for this project is July 31, 2020. This GMP includes \$64,000 in contingency dollars that will only be spent if absolutely necessary due to unforeseen conditions. The complete breakdown for all the Lesley Field renovation projects as part of the 2016 bond program are presented below in Exhibit A.

As a reminder, upon approval of a renewed Interlocal Agreement by the City of Coppell (scheduled to take place by the City Council on January 14, 2020), the City will be reimbursing the school district up to \$800,000 for the Lesley Field improvements.

Now that the actual Guaranteed Maximum Price for the Phase Three package has been determined and presented, it is necessary for the Board of Trustees to consider approval of this GMP, so that the construction contract between Coppell ISD and Northstar can be amended to include the total GMP for the construction of a new concession stand and restrooms at Lesley Field.

Northstar Builders will have staff present at the Board meeting to help answer any questions regarding the cost and construction of the building.

**Recommendation:**

**That the Coppell ISD Board of Trustees approve at the January 13, 2020, Board meeting the amending of the construction contract between Coppell ISD and Northstar Builders Group, LLC to include the Guaranteed Maximum Price of \$997,697.00 as proposed by Northstar Builders Group, LLC for Phase Three of the renovations and additions at Coppell High School Ninth Grade Campus pending final approval of the Amended and Restated Interlocal Cooperation Agreement Between Coppell Independent School District and City of Coppell, Texas, and that Sid Grant or Dr. Brad Hunt be authorized to sign the necessary documents.**

**Re: Lesley Field Bleacher and Press Box Replacement – Bond Project #30**

As part of the renovation of Lesley Field, the grandstand bleachers and press box are to be replaced. According to our records, the existing grandstand and press box structure was built in the 1960s.

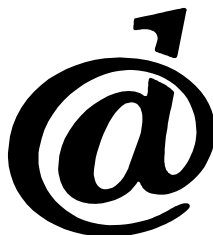
The Interlocal Contract purchasing method as provided in the Texas Education Code 44.031 was used to obtain proposals to ensure the best pricing and value. SturdiSteel, through TASB BuyBoard Contract #592-19, provided the proposal with the best value. This is the same company that provided the bleachers and press box for the new Coppel Middle School West. SturdiSteel is one of Texas's premier grandstand and bleacher providers. CISD has used this company for numerous projects over the years with great success. The size and configuration of the grandstand and press box will be exactly like the ones at CMS West. The bleachers will seat up to 834 and will be fully ADA compliant with current requirements.

The total bid for the turnkey project is \$275,000. This will be paid for out of our bond project #30 budget.

As a reminder, pending approval of the Interlocal Cooperation Agreement with the City of Coppel, the City will be reimbursing CISD for one-half of this project cost.

**RECOMMENDATION:**

**That the Coppel ISD Board of Trustees approve SturdiSteel, a division of Schultz Industries, Inc., to replace the bleachers and press box at Lesley Field for a total cost of \$275,000, plus the cost of the payment and performance bond, pending final approval of the Amended and Restated Interlocal Cooperation Agreement Between Coppel Independent School District and City of Coppel, Texas.**

The said cities and towns shall, from the nominations received, elect by a majority vote, with each city and town being entitled to one (1) vote, the fourth member of the Board of Directors.
5. Each of the School Districts, and the Dallas County Community College District, except the Dallas Independent School District, shall have the right to nominate by an official resolution one (1) candidate as the fifth member of the Board of Directors. The said school districts shall, from the nominations received, elect by a majority vote, with each school district and the community college district being entitled to one (1) vote, the fifth member of the Board of Directors.

The votes required for election to the Board of Directors in 4 and 5 hereof shall be by a majority of those authorized to vote in 4 and 5 respectively and not by a majority of the quorum, and

RUNOFF PROCEDURE FOR SUBURBAN CITIES/SCHOOL DISTRICTS REPRESENTATIVE**

The 1979 Resolution adopted by the taxing units participating in Dallas Central Appraisal District, which governs Board of Director elections and appointments, requires that a candidate for the suburban cities position and a candidate for the suburban school districts positions on the Board each receive a majority of the votes that are cast in order to be elected to the Board of Directors (BOD).

The procedures outlined below are to be used in the event that no candidate receives a majority of the votes for the election for the Suburban Cities Representative to the BOD or the Suburban School Districts Representative to the BOD.

The Property Tax Code allows for the Chief Appraiser to resolve a tie vote by any method of chance.

**RUNOFF PROCEDURE:**

**PARTICIPATING CITIES:**

1. A candidate for the Suburban Cities Representative must receive a majority of the votes from all the suburban cities participating in the BOD election.
2. After the initial ballots are submitted by December 15 of the election year, the Chief Appraiser shall count the votes and if no candidate receives a majority of the votes from the participating suburban cities, the Chief Appraiser will declare the two (2) candidates who received the largest number of votes from the field of candidates.
3. The Chief Appraiser shall prepare another ballot listing the two (2) candidates who received the largest number of votes and shall deliver a copy of the ballot to the presiding officer of the governing body of each suburban city that is entitled to vote.
4. The governing body of each suburban city that is entitled to vote shall determine its vote by resolution and submit it to the Chief Appraiser on or before January 31.
5. The Chief Appraiser shall count the votes, declare the candidate who receives the majority number of votes, and submit the results no later than February 5 to the governing body of each suburban city and to the candidates.

**PARTICIPATING SCHOOL DISTRICTS:**

1. A candidate for the Suburban School Districts Representative must receive a majority of the votes from all the suburban school districts participating in the BOD election.
2. After the initial ballots are submitted by December 15 of the election year, the Chief Appraiser shall count the votes and if no candidate receives a majority of the votes from the participating suburban school districts, the Chief Appraiser will declare the two (2) candidates who received the largest number of votes from the field of candidates.

3. The Chief Appraiser shall prepare another ballot listing the two (2) candidates who received the largest number of votes and shall deliver a copy of the ballot to the presiding officer of the governing body of each suburban school district that is entitled to vote.
4. The governing body of each suburban school district entitled to vote shall determine its vote by resolution and submit it to the Chief Appraiser on or before January 31.
5. The Chief Appraiser shall count the votes, declare the candidate who receives the majority number of votes, and submit the results no later than February 5 to the governing body of each suburban school district and to the candidates.

CISD supports creating stable, equitable, predictable and adequate funding for schools based on local, state and federal revenues that will meet the challenges of universal proficiency and provide the funding base needed to support a system which leads to success for all students, and

BE IT RESOLVED these statements exemplify the importance of enhancing educational opportunities for students, therefore:

CISD call on local, state and federal lawmakers to prioritize support for strengthening our nation's public schools and empowering local education leaders to implement, manage and lead school districts;

CISD advocates for local, state and federal policy that is committed to supporting and educating the whole child, providing support for academic and non-academic factors, including counseling, extra/co-curricular activities and mental health supports;

CISD supports the I Love Public Education Campaign to tell the good news of public education, to kick off conversation related to ensuring that every community has access to a high quality public school, and to support the leaders of our nation's public schools;

CISD affirms its commitment to these values and will be steadfast in its efforts to protect students and their families, public schools and our communities from any policies that would undermine these values;
