their State Wrestling appearance. He also wanted to recognize the Boys Basketball team for their District win and qualification to the State Basketball Tournament, Kimmy Coffey for placing 2<sup>nd</sup> at the State Special Olympics in the 50 Freestyle. 1. Removal of the track surface will begin this week.
2. Heat pumps will begin in May
  - a. They will begin in the classroom area to ensure it is completed before fall
3. Playground will be put on hold till spring of 2021.
4. Average about 185 lunches/day
  - a. Unable to simulate what we would offer if in session
  - b. Only way we could do that is if people were to come out here and pick them up
5. Graduation update
  - a. Governor has told some that there will be a gradual release of the restrictions
  - b. Ex. After May 31st, 1st two weeks - 25 people gatherings, 2nd two weeks - 50 people gatherings, 3rd two weeks - 100 people gatherings, and so on.
  - c. If that happens, holding a “normal” graduation seems unlikely.
6. Graduation Requirements
  - a. At the board meeting, we will have to have some board action to help end the year correctly.
  - b. Attendance, community service, hours, etc. will need to be addressed to allow the school year to end properly.
