6. NEW BUSINESS

6.1 Tentative Budget - INFORMATIONAL (Dr. Johns/Ms. Allard)

Dr. Johns/Ms. Allard presented information regarding the proposed tentative budget for FY26. The tentative budget will be presented for approval at the April 24th Executive Board meeting. If approved, the Governing Board will vote on the proposed tentative budget at the June 4th meeting for final approval at the August meeting.

Board members received a draft of the FY26 tentative budget which contained budget summaries with projections.

Dr. Johns/Ms. Allard reviewed each fund (Education, O & M, Debt Services, Transportation, IMRF, and Capital Projects) and highlighted areas impacting the tentative budget.

Budget Highlight Included:

Education Fund-

- Program Tuition revenue increase is 17%
- Transfer funds from the Education Fund to the Transportation Fund
- Salaries- staff realignment, currently negotiated increases, salary increases, retirement cost savings
- Benefits- reduction in major medical insurance and an increase in workers compensation claims
- Purchased Services- Net56 projected increase and agency staff contracts to increase

Operations & Maintenance (O & M) Fund-

- O&M assessment increase of 9%
- New expense line for contingencies
- Transfer funds from the O & M Fund to Capital Projects Fund
- Transfer funds from the O & M Fund to the Education Fund
- Evaluate projects by priority
- Review Life Safety evaluation

Debt Services Fund-

- Includes current SEDOL Bond on behalf of member districts to pay construction expenses for Laremont School and other construction projects included in that bond.

Transportation Fund-

- Supports field trips and community-based field trips for SEDOL students
- ISBE continues to prorate reimbursement
- Driver salaries will be charged at 100% for FY26
- Will review the fleet of vehicles for safety and cost of repairs; consider purchasing or leasing if needed

IMRF Fund-

- 6.63% cost to SEDOL
- Levy set for FY26 is for revenue used in FY27
- Reduce levy for FY26

Capital Projects Fund-

- ISBE recommends capital improvements be run through the Capital Projects Fund

FY26 tentative budget will be updated to include:

- Summary of all funds

Dr. Johns and Ms. Allard will host budget meetings in May with member districts, board members, and one with staff to review the tentative budget and answer questions or concerns.

5.2 Employee of the Month

He is reliable, cooperative, and is always ready to help wherever he is needed. He approaches each challenge with a positive attitude and is committed to the students' success.

7. **SEDOL CONTINUOUS IMPROVEMENT PLAN (CIP) UPDATE (Dr. Hackett/Dr. Thomas)**

Mr. Kurt Preble, Cyd Lash Academy Principal shared how identified objectives of the CIP are guiding the programs at Cyd Lash Academy.

CIP Goal Alignment: SEDOL CIP Goal I- Provide exceptional programs and services to meet the needs of students throughout the SEDOL community. Objective D: Develop and implement curriculum frameworks for each program.

Cyd Lash RiSK Initiative: Establishes a framework of **R**esponsible, **S**afe, and **K**ind behaviors (the "i" stands for I can be....)

RiSK Goals:

- Student goal setting with accountability and self-correction
- Support Social Emotional Learning as a curricular framework
- Professional Development fostering a culture of kindness and inclusion

What is RiSK Initiative?

- **R**esponsible: Appropriate use of technology, cleaning up after yourself, being on task, following directions
- **S**afe: Appropriate interactions, staying in designated areas with staff, hands/feet to self, communicating needs appropriately
- **K**ind: Helping classmates/staff, using kind words, saying please/thank you, greeting peers/staff

Currently:

- Full-day focus on each attribute: to reinforce positive behavior expectations.
- Raffles for students and staff: to encourage engagement and participation
- All-school assembly: to celebrate successes and build momentum for continued improvement
- Buy-in: Staff is engaged in the process and students are excited about the recognition of their efforts.

Next Steps:

- Utilize student voice: to generate new ideas and increase engagement
- Create celebratory environments: to sustain motivation and reinforce positive behaviors
- Analyze and revise: to ensure long-term success of Goal 1 and RiSK

8. OLD BUSINESS

8.1 Facilities Update - INFORMATIONAL (Dr. Johns/Ms. Allard)

Dr. Johns provided a facilities update to the Board. He informed them that we have been approved for a \$50,000 maintenance grant, our camera project has been completed, a rekeying project will happen this summer in the buildings, safety and security plans for elopers have been developed, an HVAC owner training will occur for the systems recently installed at Cyd Lash Academy and the administration building, and we are reapplying for a safety grant again this year that we were previously denied. It is not uncommon for this grant to be denied the first few times you apply. Dr. Johns also mentioned that he is currently working on long range projections through 2030 and will present those at a later date.

He exhibits kindness and is always willing to help. He fosters a positive and supportive classroom environment even when faced with difficulties.

Employee of the Month

The Board recognized Mr. Colin Rowley, Gages Lake School Teacher, as April's Employee of the Month. Mr. Rowley embraces the needs of his students and creates a great team environment. He shared the importance of great collaboration in the classroom and program. He adjusts to changes and needs to his classroom through a positive, flexible approach. He goes above and beyond in daily communication with parents.

Infinitec 2025 Outstanding Student Technology Award

Infinitec will recognize a student from Laremont School at a dinner/award celebration on April 24th. This student will also be recognized at the June 4, 2025 Governing Board meeting. Ms. Schmitt, Laremont School Principal, shared how this student uses eye gaze communication to support his learning and communication. This technology allows this student to actively participate in curriculum, in conversations with staff, and to independently express himself.

Introduce New Cyd Lash Academy Principal

Mr. Mark Kettering was welcomed as the new Cld Lash Academy Principal for the 2025-26 school year and was introduced to the Board.

Contract Renewals

Dr. Stephen Johns and Ms. Becky Allard were approved by the Board to continue as the Co-Interim Assistant Superintendents of Business for the 2025-26 school year.

PUBLIC COMMENT

There was no Public Comment.

SEDOL CONTINUOUS IMPROVEMENT PLAN (CIP) PRESENTATIONS

Ms. Andrea Rouse, Gages Lake School Principal, shared how identified objectives of the CIP are guiding the programs at Gages Lake School (GLS).

CIP Goal Alignment: SEDOL CIP Goal I- Provide exceptional programs and services to meet the needs of students throughout the SEDOL community. Objective E: Develop/clarify SEDOL curricular tools and supplemental resources.

Ms. Rouse presented via recorded presentation "Hope, the Therapy Dog". She explained that Hope is a therapy dog, not to be confused with a service dog. Hope works with her handler Ms. Huemann, GLS Social Worker. Before students interact with Hope, they are taught the appropriate way to approach her. This means not running up to her, no screaming or yelling, and that they should ask Ms. Huemann if they can pet her. They also learn that when she is at school, she is working and her job is to help her friends (students) stay calm. She does not play fetch, jump, run, or chew on toys during this time.

Parents are notified about the addition of a therapy dog and must complete a consent form for their child to interact with it. Currently, students in tier 2 & 3 schedule time to spend with Hope when she is at GLS. The school is working on having Hope visit to provide classroom assistance and crisis support. Data collected on high incident times was evaluated and Hope's services are scheduled into those times. The classrooms are already seeing a positive effect and the data shows a decline in incidents. Gages Lake School will continue to monitor the data with the hopes of increasing Hope's time and positive impact in their building next year.

OLD BUSINESS

FY26 Budget Update

Dr. Johns shared a sample of a district cost sheet and a comparison of member district rates/other services comparing FY25 and FY26. He also provided the Board with the following details pertaining to the FY26 tentative budget.

 - Revenue - No change from April 17, 2025 Executive Board meeting
 - Expenditures - No change from April 17, 2025 Executive Board meeting
 - Transfers - Added a transfer of \$1,000,000 from the Education Fund to the Transportation Fund based on anticipated reductions in state Transportation reimbursement
- Operations & Maintenance Fund
 - Shifted \$50,000 Facility Maintenance Grant from Capital Projects to the O & M Fund
 - Included \$100,000 of the Fairhaven Roof Project to comply with ISBE guidelines
- Debt Service Fund
 - No change from April 17, 2025 Executive Board meeting
- Transportation Fund
 - Reduced State Transportation Revenue by \$200,000
 - Included Transfer of \$1,000,000 from the Education Fund
- IMRF Fund
 - No change from April 17, 2025 Executive Board meeting
- Capital Projects Fund
 - Moved \$50,000 Facility Maintenance Grant Funding to the O & M Fund
 - Increased Capital Outlay by \$250,000
 - Decreased Fairhaven Roof Project by \$300,000

The Board approved the tentative budget for FY26 and recommended approval by the Governing Board at its

June 4th meeting. Pursuant to Governing Board approval at its June 4th meeting, the final FY26 budget will be presented to the Executive Board June 26th with final approval at the August Governing Board meeting. Small district, board, and staff budget meetings will be scheduled throughout May.

FY23 Audit

Ms. Allard updated the Board on the FY23 audit. She stated that it is in the final staging of being completed pending one final issue related to ESSER III and that work has already begun on the FY24 audit.

NIHIP Resolution

Last month the Board approved SEDOL to participate in the Northern Illinois Health Insurance Program (NIHIP). The Board approved the resolution to join NIHIP at today's meeting.

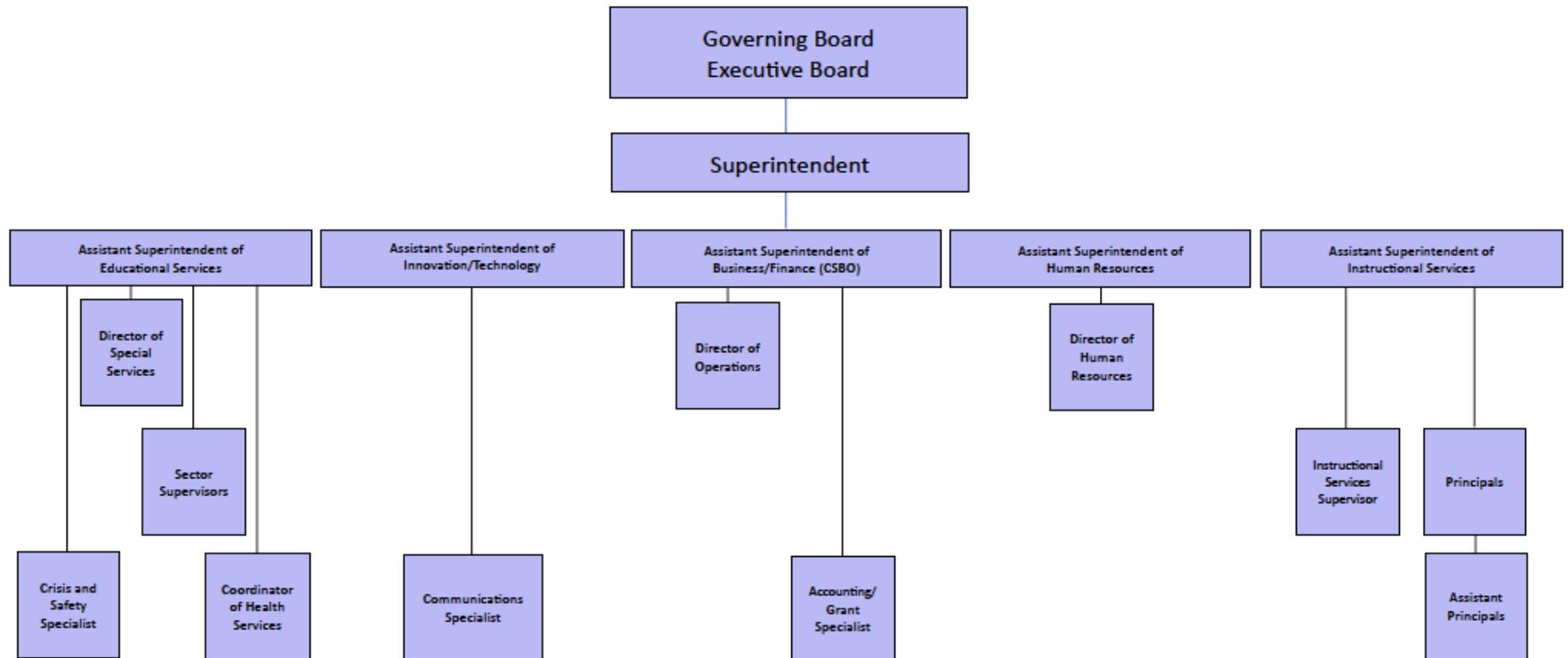

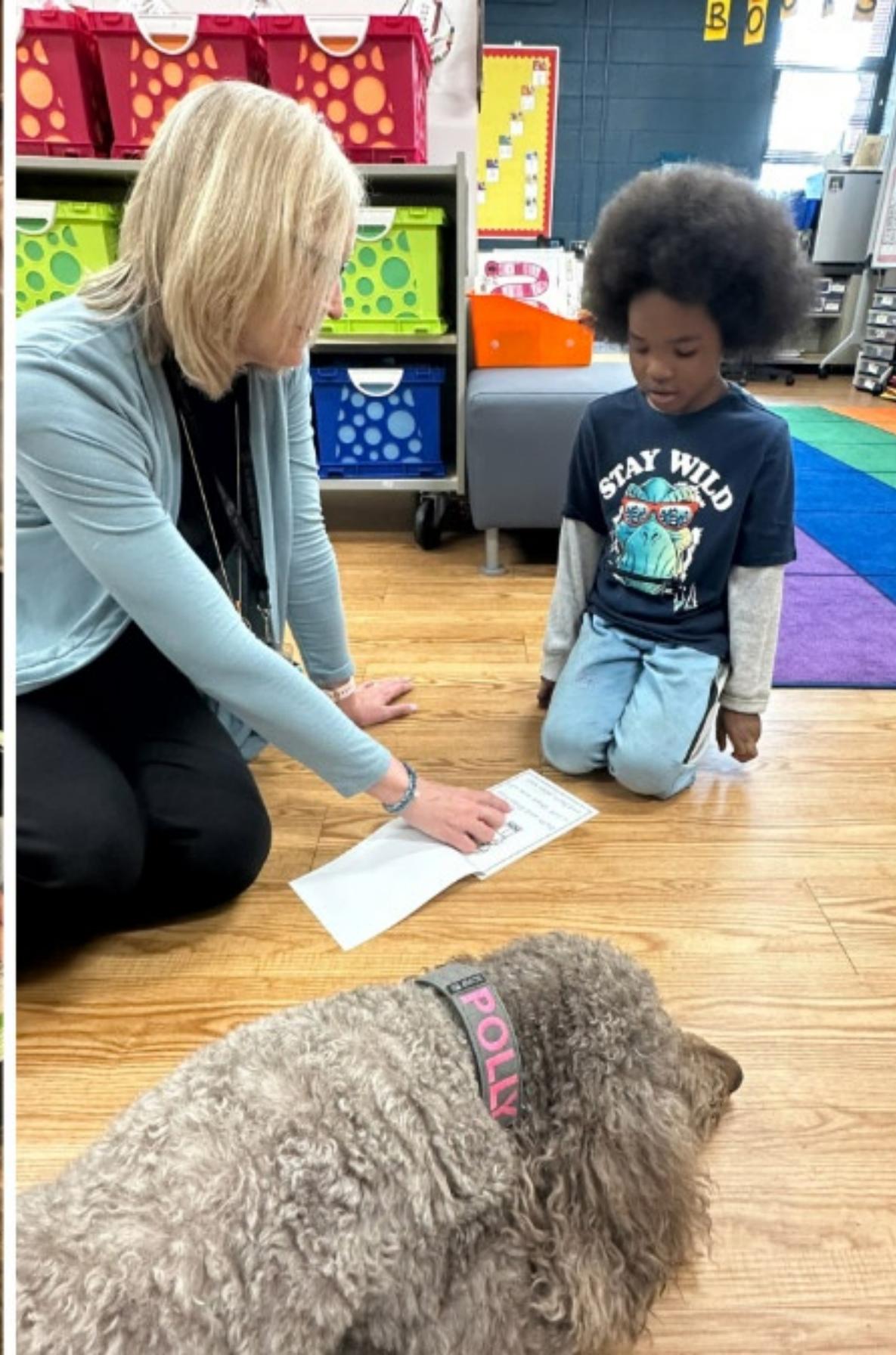
