<p>Background:</p> <p>During the remodel of the SSP Education Center in 2020 the boiler was not replaced due to budget constraints. This project consists of removing the existing old boiler and replacing it with two (2) high efficiency boilers so there is reliability and redundancy with the heating plant. The district will receive a rebate of \$10,500 from Xcel Energy for installing the new boilers. District staff worked the district's architects, Wold, to develop specifications and design for this project.</p> <p>The district published a call for bids for the project. The district opened bids on April 19th at 2:00 in the District Office.</p> <p>Based on the low bid that is included for approval.</p> <p>As a reminder, the funding for this project is from long-term facility maintenance budget (LTFM) and does not impact the general fund operations of the district.</p> <p>This bid award is on the regular meeting agenda for approval.</p>
Recommendation: Approve base bid as listed and reject alternates 1 and 2.
Alternatives: Do not approve bid award, delay project, and instruct district administration on next steps.

On April 19, 2022, at 2:00 p.m., bids were received from seven (7) bidders for the 2022 community learning center boiler project at the District Office. A bid tabulation is attached for your review. Kraft Mechanical, LLC from Woodbury, Minnesota submitted the low base bid in the amount of \$248,700. Selection of alternates does not affect who will be the low bidder.

Alternate No. 1 Replace Chiller Pump **Add \$27,300**
This alternate would be to replace an existing chiller pump. We recommend rejecting this alternate based upon price.

Reject this Alternate

Alternate No. 2 Add Glycol to Heating Loop **Add \$12,000**
This alternate is to add additional glycol to the heating loop. We recommend rejecting this alternate based upon price.

Based on our review of the bids with the Director of Buildings and Grounds, this project can be accomplished within the current budget.

Background:

The Equity Alliance Minnesota (EAMN) is a collaboration governed via a Joint Powers Agreement among the five-member school districts, including Roseville Area Schools, Forest Lake Area Schools, Inver Grove Heights Schools, South St. Paul Schools and White Bear Lake Schools. The EAMN board is made up of one representative from each district.

Over the last several years, the financial model at EAMN has not been self-sustaining. As a result, the organization is projected to exhaust its remaining fund balance no later than June 2023.

Recommendation: Due to the uncertainty surrounding the future of Equity Alliance MN, district administration recommends taking the following two motions:

1. Termination of the East Metro Integration District 6067 (dba “Equity Alliance MN”) Joint Powers Agreement effective June 30, 2023. Dissolution of the organizations on this date is contingent upon approval of the termination by all member districts prior to July 1, 2022.
2. Adopt the attached resolution to amend the current Joint Powers Agreement governing the East Metro Integration District 6067. The suggested amendment to the JPA is intended to protect against interpretations of the existing language that could cause issues with a district that has also submitted a notice of withdrawal.

SSPPS will continue to look for other educational equity partners that provide opportunities for our students and staff while meeting the state integration funding requirements.

RESOLUTION TO AMEND THE JOINT POWERS AGREEMENT GOVERNING THE EAST METRO INTEGRATION DISTRICT 6067 (“DBA EQUITY ALLIANCE MINNESOTA”)

WHEREAS, South St. Paul Public Schools, Special School District is a member of East Metro Integration District 6067 (DBA “Equity Alliance Minnesota”); and

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Joint Powers Agreement (JPA) among members governing the East Metro Integration District 6067 (dba “Equity Alliance Minnesota”) hereby amends the JPA as follows:

Article Ten – Membership, Section E – Withdrawal of Members, Paragraph 2, shall be amended such that the current sentence, “*A withdrawing Member shall not be eligible to participate in any distribution of assets of EMID.*”, is extended to include the phrase: “*..., except if all Member districts have approved the termination of the JPA with such termination to be effective on a date which occurs between a Member submitting a notice of withdrawal and the Withdrawal Date indicated in that notice.*”

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, Notice of approval on this resolution and the date of approval shall be communicated to the Equity Alliance Minnesota (EA-MN) Board chair and to other member district school boards. Once the EA-MN board chair has received notice of approval from all Member districts, the board chair shall cause the amendment to be recorded in the JPA, and then shall distribute copies of the amended JPA to administrators of each Member district for their signature and retention. However, the amendment will become effective immediately upon approval of the final Member district board and shall not depend upon any distribution of documents or signatures thereon. All communication and distribution of documents pertaining to this amendment may be by electronic mail.
